EXTENSION OF A MEAT AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation extend the Dandenong Meat Area, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th day of September, 1912, to include the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Dandenong and that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Berwick commencing at the north-west corner of Crown portion 1, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence easterly along the Mornington-road to north-eastern portion of Crown portion 5, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence southerly along eastern boundary of Crown portions 5, 6, 15, and 16 to the intersection of Prince's Highway; thence westerly along the Prince's Highway to south-western corner of Crown portion 20, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence northerly to north-western corner of Crown portion 19, Parish of Eumemmerring; thence westerly along the southern

boundary of Crown portion 18 to its intersection with the Dandenong Creek; thence northerly along the Dandenong Creek to point of commencement.

Notice to Boatmen, &c.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 27th October, 1928, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, with shovel or scoop, and carry a bucket with rope attached for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit is to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the River Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such boats as have permission of the River Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the River Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

All motor boats on south bank must moor bow up stream, and all motor boats on north bank must moor bow down stream.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the River Officer, 110 Spencer-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet overall, unless the River Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the River Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

Mooring or holding on to the booms or buoys is strictly forbidden.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats and canoes shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915* (No. 2650), revoke the Order of the 26th January, 1916, and published in the *Gazette* of the 2nd February following, at pages 669-680, making regulations under the said Act relating to miners' accidents relief, in so far as the said Order relates to Regulation No. 24, and doth substitute therefor the following, that is to say:—

"24. The period of appointment of the Board shall be during the pleasure of the Governor in Council. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACE- COURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH AND TOWNSHIP OF UNDERBOOL, AND KNOWN AS "UNDERBOOL RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, Walter James Westh, Andrew Wallace Maxwell, John Wisneske, Christopher Brown, and Alexander Anderson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Race-course and Public Recreation in the Parish and Township of Underbool, and known as "Underbool Race-course and Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, which is parcelled out in the following divisions, shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding sixteen in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, horse races, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the fees provided hereinafter may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to—(a) the saddling paddock; (b) the remainder of the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, cats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, or in liquidation or any liability already incurred in the erection of improvements thereon, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall be permitted to train any horse within the Reserve, or bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the Reserve, or remove any turf or other material from any part thereof, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, or wagon be driven through or within the Reserve, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management, shall ride or drive any animal, with or without vehicles, upon that part of the Reserve used for racing purposes.

12. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve :—For admission of each adult to the saddling paddock on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for racing, such a sum not exceeding Ten shillings; for admission of each adult to the remainder of the Reserve, such a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence; for admission of each adult to any part of the saddling paddock and the Reserve on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, such a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

13. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

2. 3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miner's rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, BEING ALLOTMENT 1, SECTION 110A, IN THE PARISH OF BALLAARAT, KNOWN AS THE MINERS' RACE-COURSE.

WHEREAS by Crown grant in respect of the reserve in the Parish of Ballaarat for Public Recreation, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used as and for a place for public recreation and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony, now State, of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereto, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the trustees for the time being of the said land and premises, and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 182 of the *Land Act 1915* it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved permanently any Crown land for any public purposes whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the *Land Act 1915*, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section: Now therefore we, Frederick Brawn, Christian Hager, William Ambrose Spring, William Robert Elsworth, Robert John Cooke, and Evan Jones, the trustees for the time being of the said premises, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve in the Parish of Ballaarat for Public Recreation:—

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. The divisions into which the said land, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out are as follow:—

- (1) Lawn and public grandstand thereon, together with the members' motor reserve and carriage paddock and approaches.
- (2) The reserve stand and offices, known as the members' reserve and members' stand, and approaches thereto, including also the judge's box and scratching boards.
- (3) The weighing yard, the stewards' room, the committee room, offices, jockeys' room, and approaches.
- (4) The enclosure called the bird-cage, including stalls and training sheds and approaches.
- (5) The outer enclosure or ledger reserve and buildings thereon.
- (6) The training tracks and approaches.
- (7) The course proper and approaches.
- (8) The flat, comprising all that area inside the training tracks, and covering an area of about 45 acres.
- (9) All the ground lying between the course proper and the boundary fences and not included in any of the aforesaid divisions, and comprising an area of about 15 acres, and cricket pitches, swings, or any sheds or conveniences erected thereon.

2. Except when a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring any racehorse, or racing pony, or trotting horse, or trotting pony on any part of the said Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or of some person or persons duly authorized in writing by such trustees. When a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring in any racing horse, or racing ponies, or trotting horses, or trotting ponies without the consent, in writing, of the committee or stewards of the body conducting galloping or trotting races on the day, or some person duly authorized in writing by such committee or stewards.

3. No person shall use the Reserve for the purpose of racing horses, or any other purpose whatsoever, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees being first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as may be considered reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. Upon any application being granted by the trustees, the applicant shall pay a due proportion of the following fees:—

For each race meeting, a fee not to exceed £21.

For each trotting meeting, a fee not to exceed £21.

For any other sports or holiday amusements, a fee (if any) which the trustees may fix, not to exceed a fee of £10 per day.

4. The fees for permission to exercise or train horses or ponies on the said land shall be, for each horse or pony, for each quarter or part thereof, 10s., and shall be payable to the trustees, or such persons duly authorized by the trustees. Horses and ponies shall be trained or exercised on such parts of the said reserve as the trustees or such persons duly authorized in writing by the trustees may from time to time direct. No person shall train or exercise a horse or pony on any other part of the said land. The trustees, or such persons duly authorized by them in writing, may at their discretion refuse permission to any person to train horses or ponies on the Reserve, or revoke any permit granted.

5. The moneys received as fees for the permission to train horses or ponies shall be applied in maintaining the training grounds and course proper in a fit and proper condition, and in otherwise rendering the said land convenient and suitable for racing and recreation purposes.

6. 8. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees, or such persons duly authorized in writing by the trustees, enter upon or remain within any building, shed, or other premises on the said Reserve after Seven o'clock in the evening.

No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

For the admission of every adult to the fifth division, Three shillings.

20. The fees payable for the admission of every person to the Reserve when used for sports or holiday amusements shall be such a sum as the trustees may determine, not exceeding Three shillings for each adult person.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE LEATHER-GOODS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 11th September, 1928, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing—

(a) Articles made of leather or a substitute for leather, such as—

Bags, braces, cases, cricket balls, pads, or other sporting goods, garters, pocketbook covers, portmanteaux, purses, trunks, wallets;

(b) Machine belting;

(c) Any other kind of leather goods;

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boot Board, the Rubber Trade Board, or the Saddlery and Harness Board," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 11th September, 1928, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
