## FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1929 for Free Places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of the Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers, or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

Forms of application are obtainable at this office. Each application must be made in the prescribed form, and must be forwarded through the Permanent Head of the Department in which the applicant is employed, to the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne; not later than 1st December, 1928.

Superannuation Act 1925 (No. 3408).

REGULATIONS

WHEREAS under section 82 of the *Superannuation Act 1925* the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the State Superannuation Board, make Regulations not inconsistent with the said Act prescribing all matters required or permitted to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to the Act: Now therefore his Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act, doth hereby make the following Regulations and provide that the said Regulations shall come into operation from the date of such approval:—

The following Regulation shall be inserted after Regulation No. 3 of the State Superannuation Regulations, and shall form part thereof:—

Provided further that, if an officer's salary is reduced within the meaning of section 15 of the *Superannuation Act* after the expiration of the two years referred to in this Regulation No. 3, he may elect, within three months from the pay day on which payment at the reduced rate is first actually made or if such payment was made prior to the date of this Regulation within three months from the date of this Regulation, to contribute for the number of units for which he was contributing prior to such reduction subject to a maximum number of four units.

The following Regulation shall be inserted after Regulation No. 14 of the State Superannuation Regulations:—

15. Upon the application, other than that referred to in the proviso to section 22 of the Act, of an officer to pay in instalments arrears of contributions due by him, the Board may permit payment of the arrears in such sums and at such periods as it may approve and in respect of such arrears may require the payment of interest at such rate as it may determine. Where the Board has so authorized the payment of arrears in instalments, all such arrears and interest (if any) thereon shall be paid before the officer's pension is authorized.

STRATFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1.

THE Stratford Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks district:—

CONNEXIONS WITH TRUST'S MAINS.

Services to be Separate, Except by Permission.

(1) Except with the consent of the Trust, one service pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement shall be permitted, and not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may, in special cases, consent to two or more houses or tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house or tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such service.

Extensions.

(2) No private service shall be extended, except with the consent of the Trust.

*Notice of Desire to Lay a Pipe to Connect with Main.—  
Fee Payable for Tapping.*

(3) Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe, to connect with and tap the pipes of the Trust, he shall be informed on behalf of the Trust whether it is or is not desired that such tapping should be made by an officer of the Trust, and if it be so desired such person shall not tap any such pipe but shall provide for and bear the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequences of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the Trust the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule as follows:—For  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe Seven shillings and sixpence,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch pipe Ten shillings, 1-inch pipe Fifteen shillings. Such tapplings shall not be made except under the supervision of a proper officer of the Trust.

*Depth at which Service Pipes are to be Laid.*

(4) All service pipes laid in the ground on private property shall be laid at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface. The portions of the service pipe laid along or across any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to wheel traffic, shall be laid not less than 15 inches below the surface of the ground.

*Connexions—How Made.—Bore of Service Pipe.*

(5) Connexions with the Trust's mains shall (except where otherwise directed) be made with proper stop-cock ferrules to which, for iron services, a wrought iron quarter bend or a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. For houses rated at £20 per annum and under, the bore of such service pipe shall not exceed  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch, and for houses rated at over £20 per annum the size of such service pipe shall not exceed  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch, unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the Trust and the supply be taken through a meter.

*Maximum Tapping.*

(6) The maximum tapping allowed (except by special permit of the Trust) for each size of main shall be as follows:—

- For  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch and 2 inch pipes,  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch tapping, with approved clip.
- For 3 inch and 4 inch pipes,  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch tapping.
- For 5 inch and 6 inch pipes, 1 inch tapping.
- For 8 inch pipes,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch tapping.
- For 9 inch pipes,  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inch tapping.
- For over 9 inch pipes, 2 inch tapping.

*Stop-cock and Cover Box.*

(7) A high pressure screw down stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron top, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and building line.

**MATERIALS FOR PRIVATE SERVICES, ETC.**

*Lead Piping.—Galvanized Iron Piping.*

(8) Lead piping of the following weights:—  
For piping  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch diameter, weight 6 lb. per yard,  
For piping  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch diameter, weight 9 lb. per yard,  
For piping 1 inch diameter, weight  $14\frac{1}{2}$  lb. per yard,  
For piping  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch diameter, weight 22 lb. per yard,  
For piping  $1\frac{3}{4}$  inch diameter, weight 30 lb. per yard,  
and galvanized wrought-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services.

*Quality of Material.*

(9) The quality of the material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (a) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, and the like, shall be of best galvanized wrought iron.
- (b) All pipes and pieces shall be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, clear in bore and properly coated throughout, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.
- (c) All ends of pipes, bends, and the like shall be properly and truly threaded and capable of being properly screwed into thimbles, tees, or fittings.
- (d) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, cocks, and fittings shall be sound and free from all defects and of strength to bear with safety the maximum hydrostatic pressure to which they may be subject, and if required by the Trust shall be tested.

*Fittings to be of Best Quality and Approved.*

(10) No person shall use any tap, stop-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet, cistern, service box, waste-not regulator, bath-top, or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the Trust, which is not of the best quality and approved by the Trust.

*Stop and Bib Cocks.*

(11) No person shall use any stop or bib cocks which are not screw down high pressure cocks made of hard brass or gun-metal and in every respect of the best quality and workmanship and approved by the Trust.

*Connexions—Brass Couplings.*

(12) All connexions between lead and iron pipes shall be made with brass union couplings.

*Lead Joints to be Wiped.*

(13) All joints connecting lead pipes shall be "wiped joints," and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence of the plumber who by himself or his workmen shall break these Regulations.

*Reflux Valve to be Fired in Steam Services.*

(14) No person whether licensed as hereinafter set out or not, shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

*Ball Valves for Cisterns or Tanks.*

(15) No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball valve, and the overflow pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner open to inspection and in a position approved by the Trust.

*Urinals and Water Closets.*

(16) No person shall construct or use any urinal or water closet fitting not approved by the Trust, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement though a proper closet cistern or service box fitted with approved waste preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or tap or otherwise than with the cistern of a urinal or water closet. Urinals shall be provided with 2-gallon and closets with 3-gallon cisterns.

*Baths, Sinks, Lavatory, and other Basins, &c.*

(17) All baths, sinks, lavatory and other basins, closets, and urinals served from the Trust's mains shall be of approved sanitary construction, and mounted to the satisfaction of the Trust.

*Size of Baths Restricted.*

(18) No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons, except with the permission of the Trust. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted, except where the supply is by measure.

*Water Troughs.*

(19) All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically, and for preventing overflow.

**LICENSING OF PLUMBERS.**

*Unlicensed Persons not to Interfere with Pipes or Services.*

(20) Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or meter or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, meter, or fitting as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

*Period of Licences.—Cancellation of Licences.—Fee Payable.*

(21) Each licence shall be for the period ending 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of One pound, and for each renewal Five shillings.

*Proof of Fitness to be Given.*

(22) Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to water supply, and with the Water Acts so far as they apply to town supplies. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

*Plumbers to Report.*

(23) Each licensed plumber shall report to the Trust Secretary the completion of any new work, extensions, or repairs in connexion with any service, within twenty-four hours of effecting same.

*METERS.**Hose or Pipe not to be Attached where no Meter.—  
Syphon Pumps.*

(24) No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees or plants, or washing house walls or carriages or horses or other animals, or for any similar purpose, except the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

*Meter to be Tested and Approved.*

(25) No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering any flow not less than 10, 15, and 30 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexions or wrought-iron quarter bonds above ground in a conveniently accessible position and properly protected. Wherever washers are necessary for meter connexion couplings, leather washers shall in all cases be used.

*Testing of Meters.*

(26) If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by a duly authorized officer of the Trust as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, on the basis of subsequent consumption after repairing, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service pipe and charge upon estimates from the registering thereof. Every meter removed through being out of order must be repaired, adjusted, and submitted for test and refixed with the least possible delay by a licensed plumber employed for this purpose. For any unnecessary delay in refixing the meter such licensed plumber shall be guilty of an offence.

*Hiring of Meters.—Rent.—Repairs.*

(27) The Trust will, if it so think fit but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meter ... ..	Ten shillings.
For $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. meter ... ..	Ten shillings.
For any meter of larger size than $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.	

Rents shall be payable half-yearly in advance. Such rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, the first payment to be made as from the date of installation to the end of the then current half-year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

*Delivery of Meters for Testing.*

(28) Meters, other than such as are hired from the Trust, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Trust; a fee of Five shillings shall be charged for each test.

*Meter to be Tested if Hirer Dissatisfied.—Hirer to give  
Notice of Removal.*

(29) In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

*WASTE OR MISUSE OF WATER.**Allowing Water to Run to Waste.*

(30) No person supplied with water by the Trust shall permit or suffer the same to run to waste.

*Water not to be Used or Supplied Without Written  
Permission.*

(31) No person receiving water from the Trust shall, without the written permission of the Trust, take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person.

*Unlawful Taking of Water Without Permission.*

(32) No person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe.

*Watering of Streets.*

(33) No person other than an employee of the municipal council shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs.

*Water for Parks and Gardens.*

(34) The Water Supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust, and no person unless duly authorized shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply.

*Restrictions of Use other than Domestic Supplies.*

(35) Restrictions of use other than domestic supplies:—

- Water supplied by the Trust is in all cases subject to the right of the Trust by notice to prohibit or restrict the use of the same for any purpose (other than domestic purposes) during such period or at such times or from time to time as may be fixed by the Trust and stated in such notice.
- Such notice may be given either by printed posters placed in prominent positions within the Trust district or by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in such district.
- No person shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to any such prohibition or restriction.

*MISCELLANEOUS.**Consent of Trust.—Notices to be Addressed to Secretary.—  
Consent (how given).—To be Notified to Trust.*

(36) In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Trust, the Secretary, or the Engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

*Definitions.*

(37) In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the meaning which in the Water Acts is assigned to any word shall be the meaning of the same word where occurring in this By-law, unless inconsistent with the subject-matter or context.

*Offences and Penalties.*

(38) Any person who does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence the offender shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Water Supply.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. Sub-clause B of clause 10 of By-law No. 20, which was made and passed by the Board on the fourteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and duly published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the twenty-third day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, is hereby amended as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law by the deletion of the word "three" immediately preceding the word "feet" in the said sub-clause and the substitution in lieu thereof of the word "six."

2. The first paragraph of clause 19 of the said By-law No. 20 is hereby repealed as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, and the following substituted therefor:—

19. A high-pressure screw-down stop-tap, properly secured, must be fixed on each water service in one of the following positions:—

- (a) between the main and the street alignment, and covered with an approved cast-iron box;
- (b) where a meter is fixed, between the inlet bends to the meter; or
- (c) where a meter is not fixed, on the service pipe at no greater distance than one foot inside the street alignment.

If the said stop-tap be fixed either between the inlet bends of the meter or on the service pipe inside the street alignment the owner shall, if required by the Board, and upon receiving notice, immediately fix an additional stop-tap and cover on the water service between the main and the street alignment.

3. The following paragraph is hereby added to and from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law shall form part of and be deemed to be included in clause 29 of the said By-law No. 20:—

"Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the preceding paragraph, where a water service is to be laid or renewed from a main of the Board in any street, solid-drawn copper pipes, tested and passed by the Board, may be installed from the main. Such copper pipes shall be of the following diameters and dimensions:—

4. The above-mentioned amendments and repeal shall not affect anything duly done, any rights, privileges, or powers acquired, or any liabilities, penalties, or forfeitures incurred, or any proceedings taken or commenced under the said By-law No. 20 before the coming into operation of this By-law.

## Fruit Act 1917 (No. 2919).

PART II.  
REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the  
thirty-first day of October, 1928.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for  
His Excellency the Governor, of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the *Fruit Act 1917* (No. 2919) it is provided that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to the matters therein set forth: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

## REPEAL.

1. For the purposes of these Regulations, Regulation 15, paragraph (a), and the Third Schedule of the Fruit and Vegetable Packing Regulations 1926, made on the 23rd day of November, 1926, the words "and citrus fruits" wherever occurring in the Fifth Schedule thereof, and the words "citrus fruits" occurring in Regulation 12, paragraph (c), and 14 of the said Regulations shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

## SHORT TITLE AND CONSTRUCTION.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Citrus Packing Regulations 1928, and shall be read and construed as one with the Fruit and Vegetable Packing Regulations 1926 made on the twenty-third day of November, 1926, and shall apply to the grading, packing, stacking, and arranging citrus fruits for sale, and the marking of packages containing citrus fruits for sale, and shall come into force from the date of the publication hereof.

## DEFINITIONS.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—

"Citrus fruits" means oranges, lemons, mandarins, and grapefruit.

"Dry" in relation to oranges means that the proportion of juice extractable is less than 15 per cent. by weight of the whole orange.

"Grade" shall have relation (when so required) to colour, maturity, variety, number, size, soundness, and packing, and "graded" and "grading" shall have a similar meaning.

"Matured" in relation to oranges means that not more than 23 cubic centimetres of N/10 soda solution are required to neutralize the acidity contained in 10 cubic centimetres of juice drawn from the mixed juices of not less than five oranges taken at random from any case or cases bearing a similar mark.

"Registered brand" means any brand registered with the Department of Agriculture.

"Sell" includes barter or exchange, and also includes agreeing to sell, or offering or exposing for sale, or having in possession for sale or receiving, sending, forwarding, or delivering for or on sale or exporting from Victoria to any other part of the Commonwealth, or causing, suffering, or attempting any of such acts or things, and "sale" has a corresponding interpretation.

## GRADING, PACKING, AND MARKING OF CITRUS FRUITS FOR SALE.

## General Requirements.

4. Excepting where otherwise provided, the following standards and methods are prescribed as those to be observed and followed in connexion with the grading, packing, stacking, arranging, and sale of citrus fruits.

5. Citrus fruits contained in any package of any description or size, or comprised in any lot, shall be so packed, stacked, or arranged that each external layer on the top, bottom, and sides of the citrus fruits shall be uniform in respect to grade, and shall be a true indication of—

- the average grade throughout of the whole of the citrus fruits contained in such package or comprised in such lot;
- the manner in which the whole of the citrus fruits contained in such package or comprised in such lot are packed, arranged, or stacked; and
- the presence of any foreign substances contained in such package or comprised in such lot.

6. All citrus fruits contained in any package or comprised in any lot shall be sound.

7. The package in which citrus fruits are contained for sale shall conform with one of the standards set out in the First Schedule hereto.

8. All packages containing citrus fruits shall be reasonably free from dirt, stains, or unsightly markings howsoever caused.

9. In the case of any citrus fruits contained in any package of any description, or size, or comprised in any lot—

- the proportion of foreign substances in any package containing citrus fruits for sale, or comprised in any lot for sale, shall not exceed 2½ per centum by either weight or measurement of the total contents of the package or lot.

10. Packages containing any citrus fruits for sale shall not contain a greater proportion of—

- packing material than is sufficient to cover the top and bottom of the package to a combined thickness of one half-inch;
- wrappers than is sufficient to effectually wrap or cover each citrus fruit, and the maximum number of such wrappers shall not exceed two to each citrus fruit;
- advertising matter than can be shown on one slip, label, or sheet of paper, or other suitable material of the maximum thickness of one-sixteenth of an inch, and of no greater size than is sufficient to cover the top layer of citrus fruits in any package.

11. No person (whether by himself or by an agent or servant, or on behalf of another person) shall mark any package containing citrus fruits for sale, or mark any ticket, slip, or label contained in any such package, or mark any ticket placed on any lot of citrus fruits for sale with any description, information, statement, words, or marks, or any suggestions, direct or indirect, which are likely to mislead in a material respect as to—

- the colour, maturity, kind, number, size, soundness, variety or weight of the citrus fruits, and the capacity, dimensions, or measurements of packages;
- the place or locality in or at which the citrus fruits were grown, produced, or packed, or where the packages were made;
- the name, address, and guarantee of the manufacturer of the package, or the name and address of the grower or producer of the citrus fruits, or the person by whom they were selected, packed, or in any way prepared for market.

12. All packages containing citrus fruits for sale shall have conspicuously marked on the outside of the package itself, or on a ticket or label affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of the package—

- the initials of the Christian name and full surname of the owner of the citrus fruits, or his registered brand, or in the case of a firm or corporation with the firm or corporate name or registered brand;
- the name of the variety or varieties of the citrus fruits;
- the designation of the grade or quality standard of citrus fruits, viz.:—"Special," "Standard," or "Plain."
- the number of citrus fruits contained in each package.

Such marking as aforesaid shall be in letters of not less than three-quarters of an inch in height if stencilled on the packages, and not less than one-quarter of an inch in height if printed on a ticket or label.

## EXEMPTIONS.

13. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Regulations the following exemptions relating to grading, packing, and marking of citrus fruits for sale may be permitted:—

- Open packages of a size set out in the First Schedule hereto containing citrus fruits for sale packed in accordance with the provisions of the Second and Third Schedules and Regulation 5 hereof need not be marked with the owner's name or address, nor with the grade or quality standard designation.
- The provisions of these Regulations shall not apply to any package of citrus fruits sold for manufacturing purposes to any factory, provided that the words "For factory use only" are legibly stencilled in letters of not less than 1 inch in length on a conspicuous part of such package, and provided also that such citrus fruits are sound and free from disease.

## PENALTIES.

14. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall, except where such breach is covered by the penalties provided by section 22 of the *Fruit Act 1917* (No. 2919), be liable to a penalty of not more than One pound for a first offence and of not more than Ten pounds for every subsequent offence.

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

## QUALITY STANDARDS FOR CITRUS FRUITS.

Citrus fruits intended for sale shall be packed in either of the three grades, viz.:—"Special," "Standard," or "Plain," and shall comply with the following provisions:—

- Citrus fruits described as "Special" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed fruit, and shall be mainly free from disfigurements, such as caused by scars, scratches of the skin, excessive navel segments, cavities, punctures and blemishes due to any insect or fungus pest; such disfigurements not to exceed 5 per cent. of the total fruits in the case, and of this 5 per cent. not more than 10 per cent. of the total surface area of any fruit shall be so disfigured; the fruit shall not be dry in the pulp, and shall be of one size and one variety, and packed as prescribed; oranges shall be of reasonably even colour and matured.
- Citrus fruits described as "Standard" shall consist of sound, clean fruit, disfigurements such as caused by scars, scratches of the skin, excessive navel segments, cavities, punctures and blemishes due to any insect or fungus pest may be allowed to the extent of 10 per cent. of the total surface area of any fruit; the fruit shall not be dry in the pulp, and shall be of one size and one variety, and packed as prescribed; oranges shall be of reasonably even colour and matured.
- Citrus fruits described as "Plain" shall consist of sound clean fruit; disfigurements such as caused by scars, scratches of the skin, excessive navel segments, cavities, punctures and blemishes due to any insect or fungus pest may be allowed to the extent of 25 per cent. of the total surface area of any fruit; the fruit shall not be dry in the pulp, and shall be of one size and one variety, and packed as prescribed; oranges shall be of reasonably even colour and matured.
- In order to ascertain the proportion of juice extractable from an orange, the halves of a freshly divided orange shall be rotated upon a conical glass lemon squeezer under hand pressure only. The resultant juice shall be strained through a strainer of not less than thirty meshes to the lineal inch.

## THIRD SCHEDULE.

## SIZE REQUIREMENTS FOR CITRUS FRUITS.

Citrus fruits must be sized into the following sizes, viz.:—

- "Two and one-quarter inches" shall include fruit of a size two and one-quarter inches or greater diameter, but less than two and a half inches.
- "Two and a half inches" shall include fruit of a size two and a half inches or greater diameter, but less than two and three-quarter inches.
- "Two and three-quarter inches" shall include fruit of a size two and three-quarter inches or greater diameter, but less than three inches.
- "Three inches" shall include fruit of a size three inches or greater diameter, but less than three and a quarter inches.
- "Three and a quarter inches" shall include fruit of a size three and a quarter inches or greater diameter, but less than three and a half inches.
- "Three and a half inches" shall include fruit of a size three and a half inches or greater diameter.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Fruit Act 1917 (No. 2919) it is provided that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to the matters therein set forth: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

## SHORT TITLE AND CONSTRUCTION.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Grade Standards for Mushrooms, Peas, and Beans Regulations 1928, and shall be read and construed as one with the Fruit and Vegetable Packing Regulations 1926 made on the twenty-third day of November, 1926, and shall apply to Mushrooms, Peas, and Beans for sale, as from the date of the publication hereof.

## DEFINITIONS.

2. For the purpose of these Regulations—

- "Package" means any box, case, sack, or receptacle used or capable of being used or intended to be used for containing vegetables.
- "Registered brand" means any brand which has been registered with the Department of Agriculture.
- "Sell" includes barter or exchange, and also includes agreeing to sell, or offering or exposing for sale, or having in possession for sale or receiving, sending, forwarding, or delivering for or on sale or exporting from Victoria to any other part of the Commonwealth, or causing, suffering, or attempting any of such acts or things, and "sale" has a corresponding interpretation.
- "Vegetables" means mushrooms, peas, or beans.

GRADING, PACKING, STACKING, AND ARRANGING VEGETABLES FOR SALE, AND THE MARKING OF PACKAGES CONTAINING VEGETABLES FOR SALE.

## General Requirements.

3. Excepting where otherwise provided, the following standards and methods are prescribed as those to be observed and followed in connexion with the grading, packing, stacking, and arranging vegetables for sale and the marking of packages containing vegetables for sale.

4. Mushrooms, peas, or beans contained in any package of any description or size, or comprised in any lot, shall be so packed, stacked, or arranged that each external layer on the top, bottom, and sides of the vegetables shall be uniform in respect to grade, and shall be a true indication of—

- the average grade throughout of the whole of the vegetables contained in such package or comprised in such lot;
- the manner in which the whole of the vegetables contained in such package or comprised in such lot are packed, arranged, or stacked; and
- the presence of any foreign substances contained in such package or comprised in such lot.

5. All vegetables contained in any package or comprised in any lot shall be sound.

6. All packages containing vegetables shall be reasonably free from dirt, stains, or unsightly markings howsoever caused.

7. In the case of any vegetables contained in any package of any description or size or comprised in any lot—

- the proportion of foreign substances in any package containing vegetables for sale, or comprised in any lot for sale, shall not exceed 5 per centum by either weight or measurement of the total contents of the package or lot;
- the weight of peas or beans contained in any package shall not be less than 5 per centum from that described on the ticket or label affixed to the package.

8. Packages containing any vegetables for sale shall not contain a greater proportion of—

- packing material than is sufficient to cover the top and bottom of the package to a combined thickness of 1 half-inch;
- advertising material than can be shown on one slip, label, or sheet of paper, or other suitable material of the maximum thickness of one-sixteenth of an inch.

9. No person (whether by himself or by an agent or servant, or on behalf of another person) shall mark any package containing vegetables for sale, or mark any ticket, slip, or label contained in any package, or mark any ticket placed on any lot of vegetables for sale with any description, information, statement, words, or marks, or any suggestions, direct or indirect, which are likely to mislead in a material respect as to—

- (a) the colour, kind, number, size, soundness, variety, or weight of the vegetables, and the capacity, dimensions, or measurements of packages;
- (b) the place or locality in or at which the vegetables were grown, produced, or packed, or where the packages were made;
- (c) the name, address, and guarantee of the manufacturer of the package, or the name and address of the grower or producer of the vegetables, or the person by whom they were selected, packed, or in any way prepared for market.

10. All packages containing vegetables for sale shall have conspicuously marked on the outside of the package itself, or on a ticket or label affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of the package—

- (a) the initials of the Christian name and full surname of the owner of the vegetables, or his registered brand, or in the case of a registered firm or corporation with the firm or corporate name or registered brand;
- (b) in the case of peas and beans, the weight of the vegetables.

Such marking as aforesaid shall be in letters of not less than three-quarters of an inch in height if stencilled on the packages, and not less than one-quarter of an inch in height if printed on a ticket or label.

#### EXEMPTION.

11. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Regulations, the following exemption relating to grading, packing, stacking, and arranging vegetables for sale and the marking of packages containing vegetables for sale may be permitted:—

- (a) The provisions of these Regulations shall not apply to any package of vegetables sold for manufacturing purposes to any factory, provided that the words "For factory use only" are legibly stencilled in letters of not less than 1 inch in length on a conspicuous part of the outside of such package, and provided also that such vegetables shall be sound and free from disease.

#### PENALTIES.

12. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall, except where such breach is covered by the penalties provided by section 22 of the *Fruit Act 1917* (No. 2919), be liable to a penalty of not more than One pound for a first offence and of not more than Ten pounds for every subsequent offence.

#### Land Act 1915.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, BEING ALLOTMENT 1, SECTION 110A, IN THE PARISH OF BALLAARAT (KNOWN AS THE MINERS' RACE-COURSE).

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act* 1915, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order revoke the Order in Council dated the 29th May, 1923, approving of Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of the Reserve, being allotment 1, section 110A, in the Parish of Ballaarat (known as the Miners' Race-course), and in lieu thereof doth approve of the following Regulations, viz.:—

Whereas by Crown grant in respect of the Reserve in the Parish of Ballaarat for Public Recreation, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used as and for a place of Public Recreation and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony, now State, of Victoria, for the time being with the consent of the Executive Council thereto, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Trustees for the time being of the said land and premises, and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 182 of the *Land Act* 1915 it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved permanently any Crown land for any public purposes whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the *Land Act* 1915, and has vested such land in Trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and Trustees, it shall be lawful for the Trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of the said section: Now therefore we, Frederick Brawn, Christian Hager, William Ambrose Spring, William Robert Elsworth, Robert John Cooke, and Evan Jones, the Trustees for the time being of the said premises, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve in the Parish of Ballaarat for Public Recreation:—

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. The divisions into which the said land, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out are as follows:—

- (1) Lawn and public Grandstand thereon, together with the Members' Motor Reserve and Carriage Paddock and approaches.
- (2) The Reserve Stand and Offices, known as the Members' Reserve and Members' Stand, and approaches thereto, including also the Judge's Box and Scratching Boards.
- (3) The Weighing Yard, the Stewards' Room, the Committee Room, Offices, Jockeys' Room, and approaches.
- (4) The enclosure called the Bird Cage, including stalls and training sheds and approaches.
- (5) The Outer Enclosure or Ledger Reserve, and buildings thereon.
- (6) The training tracks and approaches.
- (7) The course proper and approaches.
- (8) The flat, comprising all that area inside the training tracks, and covering an area of about 45 acres.
- (9) All the ground lying between the course proper and the boundary fences and not included in any of the aforesaid divisions, and comprising an area of about 15 acres, and cricket pitches, swings, or any sheds or conveniences erected thereon.

2. Except when a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring any racehorse or racing pony or trotting horse or trotting pony on any part of the said Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees, or of some person or persons duly authorized, in writing, by such Trustees. When a race meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring in any racing horse or racing ponies or trotting horses or trotting ponies without the consent, in writing, of the Committee or Stewards of the body conducting galloping or trotting races on the day, or some person duly authorized, in writing, by such Committee or Stewards.

3. No person shall use the Reserve for the purpose of racing horses or any other purpose whatsoever without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees being first obtained, and then only on such terms and conditions as may be considered reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. Upon any application being granted by the Trustees, the applicant shall pay a due proportion of the following fees:—

For each race meeting—a fee not to exceed £21.

For each trotting meeting—a fee not to exceed £21.

For any other sports or holiday amusements—a fee (if any) which the Trustees may fix, not to exceed a fee of £10 per day.

4. The fees for permission to exercise or train horses or ponies on the said land shall be for each horse or pony for each quarter or part thereof 10s., and shall be payable to the Trustees, or such persons duly authorized by the Trustees. Horses and ponies shall be trained or exercised on such parts of the said Reserve as the Trustees, or such persons duly authorized, in writing, by the Trustees, may from time to time direct. No person shall train or exercise a horse or pony on any other part of the said land. The Trustees, or such persons duly authorized by them, in writing, may at their discretion refuse permission to any person to train horses or ponies on the Reserve or revoke any permit granted.

5. The moneys received as fees for the permission to train horses or ponies shall be applied in maintaining the training grounds and course proper in a fit and proper condition, and in otherwise rendering the said land convenient and suitable for racing and recreation purposes.

6. In consideration of the fact that the Ballarat Miners' Turf Club has for a period of forty years erected all buildings, fencing, outhouses, sheds, and tracks, and maintained the same at their own expense, as well as removing the mullock heap from the centre of the ground and levelling the Reserve, and done all other things necessary to bring it to its present state, it shall be permissible for the Trustees to allot a sum of money to the committee of the Ballarat Miners' Turf Club not to exceed £30 per day for each trotting meeting conducted by the Ballarat Trotting Club or any galloping or trotting meeting which may be conducted by any other club on the Reserve, such money, if any, to be used by the Ballarat Miners' Turf Club and applied in maintaining the training tracks, course proper, equipment, and surroundings in a fit and proper condition, and in otherwise rendering the said land convenient and suitable for racing and recreation purposes, such sum to be a charge on the trotting or racing club conducting the meetings and payable as the Trustees may direct, in addition to the fees hereinbefore provided in clause 3.

7. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, but no person shall be allowed upon the lawns or to enter any of the buildings in the Reserve on days on which a charge for admission is not being made without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees.

8. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees, or such person duly authorized, in writing, by the Trustees, enter upon or remain within any building, shed, or other premises on the said Reserve after seven o'clock in the evening.

9. On any day on which a race meeting or trotting meeting is being held the Rules and Regulations for conducting race meetings on the Reserve known as the Ballarat Miners' Race-course and licensed under the *Police Offences Act 1912* and made in pursuance of the powers and authority conferred by the said Act and dated the 5th day of January, 1915, and duly submitted and approved, shall be binding on all parties.

10. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

11. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

12. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, gates, or buildings, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, or buildings, trees, or seats, or roll, throw stones or other missiles in the Reserve.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

14. The Trustees shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

16. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for any other purpose, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

17. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

18. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission:—

- (1) Assaulting any other person
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it during a race meeting, or when the horses are preparing, or are prepared, to start, or are running for any race.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7) Being in the Reserve and not producing, upon demand (or, if required, not surrendering), to any gate-keeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Trustees of the Reserve, or those authorized by such Trustees to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the Trustees, or those authorized by such Trustees, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him or her, and that the ticket has been lost or surrendered.
- (8) Obtaining admission to the Reserve, or part thereof, when disentitled to such admission under these Regulations.
- (9) Remaining in the Reserve, or any part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the Reserve.

19. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged for admission to the Reserve on such days as may be granted by the Chief Secretary for racing or trotting meetings shall be as follows:—

- For the admission of every adult to the first division—15s.  
 For the admission of any motor vehicle or horse, without or with vehicle, to the first division—5s.  
 For the admission of every adult to the fourth division—4s. 6d.  
 For the admission of every adult to the fifth division—3s.

20. The fees payable for the admission of every adult person to the Reserve when used for sports or holiday amusements shall be such a sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding Three shillings for each adult person.

21. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions as may be respectively set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (1) That he be registered as a bookmaker by the committee or stewards of the race club or sporting club having the use of the Reserve for the day.
- (2) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the committee or stewards of the race club or sporting club, or those authorized by such committee or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.
- (3) That he shall first obtain a bookmaker's registration certificate from the Ballarat District Racing Association.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182, *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of such Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

##### MINTON BOYS' HOME.

(Registered under the Hospitals and Charities Act 1922.)

WE, the undersigned, being the president, treasurer, and secretary of the Minton Boys' Home (Incorporated), hereby certify that the undermentioned Rules and Regulations for the government of the Home, as set out hereunder, were adopted at a special adjourned meeting of contributors held at the city office, Latrobe-street, Melbourne, on Monday, the twenty-second day of October, 1928:—

1. *Name.*—The name of the institution shall be "Minton Boys' Home."

2. *Objects.*—The objects of the institution shall be to conduct the Home already established at Frankston (and, at the discretion of the Committee, to establish other Homes elsewhere, if circumstances warrant such a course being adopted) for the amelioration of the lot of destitute, homeless, or indigent boys; to feed, clothe, and educate such boys, and generally to look after their domestic and spiritual welfare until such time as useful employment can be secured for them; and to exercise a guardianship over such boys until they reach the age of eighteen years; all or any of such objects to be obtained by such means as the Committee may from time to time determine.

3. *Governing Body.*—The institution shall be governed by a Committee of persons who shall be elected at a meeting of contributors, to be held on some day between the first day of July and the thirty-first day of August in each year. The date of such meeting shall be advertised by the secretary, at least fourteen days before the day on which such meeting is to be held, in some newspaper circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. *Definition of Contributor.*—A contributor shall be deemed to be a person who, during the twelve months ended the thirtieth day of June immediately preceding the annual meeting of contributors, shall have contributed a sum of not less than One pound (£1) to the funds of the institution, or shall have qualified as a contributor to the institution under the terms and conditions laid down in the Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 under section 4, sub-sections (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (g).

5. *Election of Committee.*—The number of members of Committee to be elected (which must not be less than seven), as fixed at the special meeting of contributors held on the twentieth day of October, 1925, shall be twelve (three of whom must be residents of Frankston, or must reside within a radius of four miles of Frankston), and such fixed number may be altered at any subsequent general meeting of contributors called for the purpose. Every such alteration shall take effect immediately before the annual election of members of the Committee next following the making of the alteration.

6. *Validity of Election.*—In all cases where the validity of the election of any person to the Committee is questioned, notice, in writing, of objection to such election, stating the grounds of the objection and signed by the person objecting, shall be lodged with the secretary, who shall give due notice of such objection, and the particulars thereof, to each member of Committee, and shall by such notice convene a meeting of the Committee for a date not less than seven days nor more than twenty-one days from the date of his giving such notice, and at such meeting so convened the Committee, if a quorum thereof shall then be present, shall consider the objection and shall hear the person objecting if such person shall then be present after notice to him by the secretary of not less than seven days of such meeting shall have been given to him in writing. The question of the validity of the election shall then be decided by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members thereof then present.

7. *Meeting of Committee.*—The Committee shall hold one regular meeting each month, provided always that the president shall have power to call further meetings at any time on a requisition signed by three members of Committee.

8. *Retiring Members.*—One-third of the members of Committee shall retire annually at the annual meeting of contributors (but shall be eligible for re-election), and the members so retiring shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election and those members temporarily appointed by the Committee, as hereafter provided.

9. *Casual Vacancies.*—In the event of any casual vacancy in the Committee, the remaining members of the Committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to the institution who shall continue to be a member only until immediately before the next annual meeting for the election to Committee, when he shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

10. *Qualification for Seat on Committee.*—No person shall be eligible to be elected or to be or continue to be a member of the Committee, or to vote at any election or at any meeting of contributors, unless he is a contributor to the funds of the institution. Should any member of Committee cease to be a contributor to the institution or should he, without the permission of the Committee, be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of Committee, his office shall thereupon become vacant.

11. *Quorum for Committee Meetings.*—At all meetings of Committee one-third of the members (and not less than four) shall constitute a quorum, and each member present in person shall have one vote. Provided always that in the event of there being an equality of votes, the chairman (president, vice-president, or chairman, as the case may be) shall have a casting vote only.

12. *Powers of Committee.*—The Committee may form rules for the admission and removal of boys, and for their domestic and general supervision, discipline, and treatment, and for carrying out of all matters undertaken by and also for the management of the Home.

13. *Honorary Office-Bearers.*—The honorary office-bearers of the institution shall be a president, vice-presidents (two), and a treasurer, a solicitor (who shall be *ex-officio* a member of Committee), medical officers (two), and dentists (two), all of whom shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors, and shall hold office until immediately before the next annual meeting.

14. *Annual Meeting.*—The secretary, under the authority of the Committee, shall call an annual general meeting of contributors, to be held on some day between the first day of July and the thirty-first day of August in each year, for the election of members of Committee and other elective officers, and for any other purposes.

15. *Nominations and Voting for Honorary Office-Bearers.*—No person shall be elected to any elective office unless at least seven days before the annual general meeting there has been delivered to the secretary a written nomination of such person to such office signed by at least two contributors, and also the written consent of such person to act in such office.

16. *Quorum for Contributors' Meetings.*—At all meetings of contributors ten members shall form a quorum, and at such meetings each contributor shall have one vote. In the event of at least ten contributors not assembling and proceeding to business within one hour from the time fixed for the meeting, no election shall be made, nor shall any business be done at that meeting. In such event, there shall be another meeting of contributors at the same place and at the same time and on the same day in the following week, and at this meeting any number of contributors exceeding seven shall constitute a meeting.

17. *Voting by Post.*—A contributor may at any election by contributors give his vote either in person or through the post, but not by proxy. The time for taking the poll at such election shall, in the case of contributors who vote in person, be from Eight o'clock in the morning to Seven o'clock in the evening, and the poll shall be taken accordingly. The time of taking the poll in the case of contributors who vote through the post shall be the same as that provided in the case of contributors who vote in person, providing that any contributor desiring to vote by post may at any time prior to the day fixed for taking the poll or between the hours fixed for taking the poll upon such last-mentioned date cause his vote to be delivered through the post to the returning officer, and all such votes received by the returning officer through the post as aforesaid up to the hour of Seven o'clock in the evening of the day fixed for taking the poll shall be accepted and recorded by him accordingly.

18. *Postal Ballot-Papers.*—A contributor desiring to vote by post at an annual election of Committee must apply for a postal ballot-paper taken either in person or by letter addressed to the "Returning Officer, Minton Boys' Home," and signed by such contributor.

19. *Appointment of Returning Officer.*—A returning officer, to be elected by a majority of the Committee convened for, *inter alia*, the purpose of electing such returning officer, shall, in the presence of such contributors who shall be present, scrutinize and count all votes cast, whether in person or through the post as aforesaid, and shall at the conclusion of the poll announce the names of the candidates for election who have been elected, and such candidates whose names shall be so announced shall be deemed to have been so elected subject to the right to objection as aforesaid.

20. *Special Meetings.*—Special meetings of the contributors shall be called by the secretary whenever it is so desired by the Committee or within seven days of the receipt of a requisition, signed by ten or more contributors, setting forth the business for which such meeting is called.

21. *Procedure.*—All notices calling a Committee meeting or a meeting of contributors shall set forth the time and place of such meeting and the business to be transacted.

22. *Notices, How Served.*—All notices to any officer or contributor to the institution shall be served by sending them in a prepaid letter to the person on whom they are to be served at his usual or last-known place of abode, and in the case of notices calling meetings of the Committee or contributors in such time as to admit of delivery in due course of post at least three days before the meeting.

23. *Procedure at Meetings.*—If at the expiration of thirty minutes after the time appointed for any meeting of Committee there shall not be a quorum present the meeting shall lapse. At every meeting, whether of the Committee or contributors, the secretary shall record all proceedings in a book kept for the purpose, which shall be laid on the table at the following Committee meeting.

24. *Chief Executive Officer.*—The chief executive officer of the institution shall be the secretary, who shall take instructions from and be responsible to the Committee by resolution of that body. He shall have complete control and management of the city office, shall deal with and sign all correspondence as the official secretary of the Home, shall convene and attend all meetings of the executive and record the minutes thereof, and shall exercise a general administrative supervision in regard to the management of the Frankston Home.

25. *Appointment of Officers.*—All officers and employees of the institution shall be appointed by the Committee and shall hold office for such time and upon such terms as the Committee shall decide. The Committee may suspend, remove, or summarily dismiss any officer or employee for any misconduct or dereliction of duty, or for any other cause which they may deem sufficient.

26. *Life Governors.*—The Committee shall have power at any meeting to elect any person a life governor of the institution when such person has subscribed to the funds of the institution the sum of Twenty pounds or over, or when, in the opinion of such meeting, such person has rendered conspicuous service to the institution. Every such person so elected shall receive a certificate setting forth the fact that he is a life governor of the institution, in such form as shall be approved by the Committee, and signed by the president, treasurer, and secretary.

27. *Custody of Trust Property.*—All property of the Home shall be vested in the incorporated institution, and shall be under the management and control of the Committee.

28. *Signing Official Documents.*—All agreements, transfers, conveyances, and other legal documents shall be sealed with the seal of the corporation, and shall be signed by the president, treasurer, and secretary on behalf of the institution.

29. *Signing Cheques.*—All cheques issued by the institution shall be signed by the president, treasurer, and secretary.

30. *Registered Office.*—The registered office of the institution shall be at 10 Latrobe-street, Melbourne, or such other place as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee.

31. *Amendment of Regulations.*—These rules and regulations may be altered with the sanction and approval of a majority of contributors for the time being present at a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose.

- The loan is to be liquidated by payment of 20 half-yearly instalments of £8,353 9s. 10d. on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year until the liquidation of the loan.

## CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

## BY-LAW 53.

## Brick Areas.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and every other power therein thereto enabling, and numbered 53, for:—

- (a) Repealing parts of By-laws 49 and 52.
- (b) Prescribing certain areas in the city as Brick Areas.
- (c) Imposing penalties for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. *Repeal.*—Section 1 of Part IX. and the Third Schedule of By-law 49, made by the Council on the 19th day of January, 1927, and gazetted on the 13th day of July, 1927, and the second last paragraph of By-law 52 (Brick Areas), made by the Council on the 23rd day of April, 1928, and gazetted on the 9th day of May, 1928, are hereby repealed.

2. *Operation.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation in all those areas which front to or abut on the streets or roads, or portions of streets or roads, set out in the schedule hereto, and for a distance of 140 feet on each side thereof.

3. *Date of Coming into Force.*—This By-law shall come into operation and have effect on its being approved by the Governor in Council, and immediately after publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

4. *Brick Areas.*—No building shall be built or erected on land fronting to, or abutting upon, any of the streets or roads, or portions of streets or roads set out in the schedule to this By-law, nor for a distance of 140 feet on each side thereof, unless the whole of such buildings are enclosed by external walls of brick or stone properly bonded and solidly put together with mortar, or of concrete, reinforced concrete, approved concrete blocks, or of other approved hard and incombustible material. And the erection and construction of such buildings shall be in all respects subject to the provisions of Building By-law No. 49 of the City of Camberwell.

5. *Exemption.*—The foregoing restriction shall, however, not apply to outhouses, stables, or motor garages, nor to additions or alterations to existing wooden buildings provided such buildings, alterations, or additions are otherwise in compliance with the provisions of Building By-law No. 49 of the City of Camberwell.

6. *Penalties.*—Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings, and not exceeding Twenty pounds, for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after written notice has been given to the offender by the council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any court (as the case may be).
