H IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of section 28 of the Censorship of Films Act 1926, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 22ad June, 1927, and in lieu thereof make the following Regulations, to take effect from the 1st day of December, 1928, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE CENSORSHIP OF FILMS ACT 1926.

PART I .- PRELIMINARY.

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Censorship of Films Regulations 1928.

- 2. These Regulations are divided into parts as follows:-
- Part I.—Preliminary.
 Part II.—Submission of Films to Censor.
 Part III.—Exhibitors and Travelling Exhibitors of Films.
 Part IV.—Distributors of Films.
 Part V.—Appeals.
 Part VI.—General.

Definitions. .

- 3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, expressions and terms defined in the Act shall have the same meaning in these Regulations—

 - all have the same meaning in these Regulations—

 "The Act" means the Censorthip of Films Act 1926.

 "Applicant" in Part II. of these Regulations means any person or body corporate applying to the Censor for his approval of a film.

 "Distributor" means any person who carries on or intends to carry on the business of selling, leasing, distributing, or otherwise disposing of cinematograph films or the right to use such films for the exhibition of cinematograph pictures therefrom in theatres.

 "Exhibitor" means any person not being a travelling exhibitor who carries on or intends to carry on the business of exhibiting cinematograph pictures in theatres.

 "Travelling Exhibitor" means any person carrying on or intending to carry on the business of exhibiting cinematograph pictures in theatres who satisfies the Censor that he does not use or intend to use any one theatre regularly in carrying on such business.
 - regularly in carrying on such business.
 "The Minister" means the Minister for the time being administering the Censorship of Films Act 1926.

PART II,-SUBMISSION OF FILMS TO CENSOR.

Applications for Censor's Approval.

4. Application for the Censor's approval of a cinematograph film shall be made in accordance with Form I in the schedule hereto, and the prescribed fee of Five shillings for each reel of such film shall be paid to the Under-Secretary, Chief Secretary's Office, at the time the application is made.

Inspection by Censor.

- 5. (1) The Censor may require any cinematograph film in respect of which an application for approval is made to be screened for his inspection at the risk and at the expense of the applicant.
- (2) The time and place of any such screening shall be as the Censor directs.
 (3) The Censor's decision shall be final as to—
- - (a) the eligibility of any person to be present at any such
 - screening;
 (b) the number of persons to be present at any such screening.

Delivery of Films for Screening.

- 6. (1) Any cinematograph film required by the Censor to be screened for his inspection, together with all copies thereof in Victoria in the applicant's possession or control at the date of his application, or which may thereafter come into Victoria within his possession or control, shall be delivered by him at such place and time as the Censor may direct.

 (2) The said film and any copies thereof so delivered to the Censor pursuant to paragraph (1) of this Regulation shall remain in the custody of the Censor at the risk of the applicant, and, if the Censor so directs, at the expense of the applicant.

Removal of Film from Custody of Censor.

- 7. (1) Any cinematograph film delivered to the Censor in pursuance of these Regulations shall be removed by the applicant within 96 hours of the receipt by him of the Censor's retificular propriate that the control of the receipt by him of the Censor's notification requiring him to do so.
- (2) In default of the removal of any film pursuant to the said notification the Censor may cause the same to be removed to and stored in such place as he may direct, such removal and storage being at the expense and risk of the applicant.

Certificates of Approval and Notice of Refusal to Approve.

- 8. Where the Censor-
- (1) approves a cinematograph film unconditionally he shall issue or cause to be issued to the applicant a-certificate in accordance with Form 2 in the schedule
- (2) approves a cinematograph film subject to any condition or restriction as to the age or sex of persons before whom the same is to be exhibited, or any other condition or restriction, he shall issue or cause to be issued to the applicant a certificate in accordance with Form 3 in the schedule hereto.

 (3) refuses approval of a cinematograph film,
- he shall issue or cause to be issued to the applicant a notice in accordance with Form 4 in the schedule hereto.

Censor May Require Alteration of Film.

9. The Censor may require any cinematograph film in respect of which an application has been made to be altered or amended as a condition precedent to the issue of his certificate of approyal.

Certificate May be Revoked.

- 10. (1) Where the Censor, pursuant to section 17 of the Act, revokes his certificate of approval he shall forthwith issue or cause to be issued to the person or persons concerned a certificate in accordance with Form 5 in the schedule hereto.
- (2) Any cinematograph film in respect of which a notice of revocation has been issued shall be deemed to be an unapproved cinematograph film.

Retention of Unapproved Films or Excisions from Films.

11. Any film or part of a film retained by the Censor pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the Act may be destroyed by order of the Censor after the expiry of one month from the date of notification to the applicant of the Censor's intention to destroy the same intention to destroy the same

PART III .- EXHIBITORS AND TRAVELLING EXHIBITORS OF FILMS. Applications for Registration.

- 12. (1) Application for registration as an exhibitor shall be made in accordance with Form 6 in the schedule hereto.
- (2) A separate application shall be made in respect of each theatre owned, controlled, or used by an exhibitor.

Registration of Travelling Exhibitors.

13. Every travelling exhibitor shall register his full name and usual place of residence or abode with the Under-Secretary, who may thereupon issue to him a certificate of registration in accordance with Form 7a in the schedule hereto.

Certificate of Registration.

- 14. (1) If the Under-Secretary is satisfied that the particulars required by Form 6 in the schedule hereto have been correctly supplied by the person making the application, he shall register the said person as an exhibitor, and shall issue or cause to be issued to him a certificate in accordance with Form 7 in the schedule hereto.
- (2) Such certificate shall be valid only in respect of the exhibitor and of the theatre specified therein, and for a period of not more than twelve months from the date of issue of the said certificate.
- (3) Within seven days from the date upon which any exhibitor ceases to own, control, or use any theatre in respect of which he has been registered, he shall surrender to the Under-Secretary the certificate of registration issued to him in connexion therewith.
- (4) The Under-Secretary may require an applicant for registration as an exhibitor or travelling exhibitor, or any person already so registered, to enter into a surety for the observance of any of the provisions of the Act or of these Regulations in such terms and in such sum as he thinks fit.

Certificate to be Produced Upon Demand.

15. The exhibitor shall make such arrangements with the 13. The exhibitor shall make such arrangements with the person having the superintendence or management of any theatre in respect of which the said exhibitor has been registered as will permit of the certificate of registration being produced for inspection immediately upon a demand for that purpose being made at that theatre by the Under-Secretary or by any person authorized by him or by any member of the Police Force. 3224

16. A travelling exhibitor shall, wherever exhibiting cinematograph pictures make similar arrongements for the production of his certificate of registration as are provided for by the preceding Regulation in respect of an exhibitor.

Exhibitor's Certificate May be Suspended or Revoked.

17. If the Under-Secretary is satisfied that any condition of the certificate of registration as an exhibitor has not been complied with he may revoke or suspend for such time as he thinks fit the certificate of the exhibitor with respect to any theatre in connexion with which the said condition has not been observed.

Travelling Exhibitor's Certificate May be Suspended or Revoked.

18. The Under-Secretary may in like circumstances revoke or suspend the certificate of registration of any travelling exhibitor.

Access to Theatre.

19. Any person authorized by the Under-Secretary or any member of the Police Force may enter any theatre where a cinematograph picture is being exhibited to ascertain if the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations are being complied with, and any person hindering such person or member of the Police Force in the performance of this duty shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

Advertisements for Films Approved with Conditions as to Age.

Advertisements for Films Approved with Conditions as to Age.

20. In any case where the Censor approves a film subject to a condition that any cinematograph picture from the film is not to be exhibited before any child over the age of six years and under the age of sixteen years, every poster, programme, advertisement, or written or printed matter in the nature of an advertisement (and whether in a newspaper or otherwise however) with respect to such film or the exhibition of any cinematograph picture from such film shall contain a statement in the following words, namely:—"Approved by the Censor subject to the condition that children over six years and under sixteen years shall not be admitted."

British, &c., Films to be Shown at Every Exhibition.

21. On, from, and after the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, there shall be exhibited at every exhibition of cinematograph pictures in any theatre at least such a length of film, not less than two thousand feet, showing cinematograph pictures produced within the British dominions, of which at least one thousand feet shall be wholly produced in Australia produced in Australia.

Monthly Return of British Films Exhibited.

22. Every person engaged in the business of exhibiting cinematograph pictures shall forward to the Chief Secretary each month a return in accordance with Form 9 in the schedule hereto, and shall supply such other information relative to the exhibition of cinematograph pictures produced within the British dominions as the Chief Secretary may direct.

PART IV .- DISTRIBUTORS OF FILMS. Applications for Registration.

23. Application for registration as a distributor shall be made in writing to the Under Secretary, and the applicant shall set out the name under which he proposes to carry on the business of a distributor and the address at which the said business is to be carried on.

Certificate of Registration as a Distributor.

24. (1) The Under-Secretary shall examine every application for registration as a distributor, and if satisfied that the personmaking the application is a fit and proper person to be so registered, shall register the said person accordingly and issue or cause to be issued to him a certificate in accordance with Form 8 in the schedule hearts.

form 8 in the schedule hereto.

(2) Such certificate shall be personal to the distributor specified therein, and not transferable or assignable, and shall be valid only for a period of not more than twelve months from

the date of issue.

(3) Within seven days from the date upon which a distributor ceases to carry on the business of a distributor-he shall surrender to the Under-Secretary the certificate of registration

issued to him as a distributor.

(4) The Under-Secretary may require an applicant for registration as a distributor or any person already so registered enter into a surety for the observance of any of the provisions of the Act or of these Regulations in such terms and in such sum as he thinks fit.

Distributor's Certificate May be Suspended or Revoked.

25. If the Under-Secretary is satisfied that any condition of the certificate of registration as a distributor has not been complied with he may suspend for such time as he thinks fit or revoke the certificate of such distributor.

Distributor to Report Transactions if so Required.

26. Every person registered as a distributor shall, if so required by the Under-Secretary, report to him the names and addresses of all persons, companies, or associations to whom cinematograph films have been or are being rented, leased, sold, or supplied by the said distributor.

Production of Certificate of Distributor.

27. Every person registered as a distributor shall, upon demand, produce to the Under-Secretary or his deputy or to any member of the Police Force, the certificate of registration issued to him as a distributor; or, alternatively, shall forward the said certificate to the office of the Under-Secretary within seven days from the date upon which such demand is made.

PART V .- APPEALS.

Appeals Against Censor's Decision.

28. (1) Any person desirous of appealing, in pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Act, shall address to the Minister a written statement setting out in full the grounds

sumster a written statement setting out in full the grounds upon which such appeal is based.

(2) The said statement shall, within fourteen days of notification to the person aggrieved of the decision giving rise to the appeal, be lodged with the Under-Secretary, who shall thereupon proceed in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 29.

(3) The appropriate fee specified in the schedule to the Act shall be paid to the Under-Secretary at the time of the lodging of the said statement.

Under-Secretary to Forward Appeal.

29. The Under-Secretary shall examine every such appeal, and, if the Regulations in this Part have been complied with, shall forward the same for hearing to the Minister or to any person authorized by him in writing in that behalf.

PART VI.—GENERAL

Exemptions.-Films Registered as at 30th June, 1927.

Exemptions.—Films Registered as at 30th June, 1927.

30. The provisions of sections 5, 13, 19, and 20 of the Act and the relative Regulations thereunder shall not apply to any cinematograph picture in respect of which a certificate of registration under the Commonwealth (Cinematograph Films) Regulations has been issued prior to the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

31. Any film which portrays solely pictures of any topical event which has happened in Australia shall be exempt from the operation of the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations for a period of twenty-one days from the happening of the said event, but after the expiration of that period the same shall not be exhibited until the Censor's certificate of approval has been first had and obtained.

Gazette and Similar Films.

Gazette and Similar Films.

32. Section 18 of the Act shall not apply to any cinematograph picture which in the opinion of the Censor may be classed as belonging to any of the classes known as gazette, topical, science, travel, or educational.

Police to Assist.

33. It shall be the duty of every member of the Police Force to assist in the enforcement of the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations and to make such inquiries as the Censor or Under-Secretary may from time to time direct.

Of fences.

34. Where any offence against the provisions of the Act or of these Regulations comes to the notice of any member of the Police Force the said member shall forthwith report the matter in writing to the Under-Secretary, who shall take such action consistent with the Act and these Regulations as he thinks fit.

Directions in Forms.

35. Where a prescribed form contains by way of note or otherwise a clear direction or indication of any requirements of the Act or of these Regulations as to—

(a) the nature or form of the information to be furnished to the Censor or Under-Secretary,
(b) any action either by way of signing a declaration or otherwise to be taken by the person concerned in the transaction in which the document is used, the requirements so indicated shall be deemed to be prescribed.

Substantive Compliance with Forms.

36. The 'Under-Secretary may accept in lieu of any prescribed form any document which is substantially in accordance with the prescribed form, and the document so accepted shall have the like force and effect to a document in the prescribed

Penalties .- Exhibitors.

- 77. Any person who carries on the business of an exhibitor or travelling exhibitor who—

 (a) has not first been registered by the Under-Secretary as an exhibitor or travelling exhibitor, or

 (b) fails to comply with the requirements of Regulations 14 (3) and 15, or

 (c) restricts in any way the free admittance to any theatre under his control any person authorized by the Under-Secretary or any member of the Police Force, or
 - (d) fails to forward the monthly return required by

(a) fails to forward the monthly return required by Regulation 22, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than One pound.

Distributors.

38. Any person who engages in the business of a distributor

- (a) has not first been registered by the Under-Secretary
- as a distributor, or

 (b) refrains from or refuses to supply any information required of him under Regulation 26, or

 (c) fails to comply with the requirements of Regulations 24 (3) and 27.

shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than One pound.

39. Any person who does not do anything directed to be done or does anything forbidden to be done by or under these regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall (if no other penalty is expressly provided) be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds therefor.

 - (i) without opening any envelopes containing absent votes enclose such envelopes in a separate parcel, endorse such parcel with a description of the contents thereof, sign and date such endorsement, and forward such parcel, together with the sealed parcels required to be transmitted by section 259 of The Constitution Act Amendment Act, to the Returning Officer for the District in respect of which the Deputy Returning Officer is appointed; and
 - (ii) furnish a report to the said Returning Officer by telegraph or by such other expeditious means as may be available indicating the total number of envelopes bearing absent voters' declarations forwarded to him as aforesaid, and specifying the number of absent votes polled for each District at the polling place controlled by such Deputy Returning Officer.
 - (b) The Returning Officer shall, on receipt of reports as aforesaid from his Deputy Returning Officers, forthwith advise the Returning Officers for other Districts by telegraph of the number of absent votes polled for those Districts within the District for which the first-mentioned Returning Officer acts, and shall transmit to the said Returning Officers in separate parcels, and by the first available mail, the envelopes containing the absent votes so polled.
 - 12. Every Returning Officer shall preserve in his custody-
 - (a) a book in which he shall record from time to time the number of envelopes bearing absent voters' declarations received by him from Returning Officers of other Districts; and
 - (b) a locked and scaled bellot-box marked "Absent Voters' Ballot-box" into which he shall forthwith place all envelopes bearing absent voters' declarations received by him from such Returning Officers.
- 3. In Regulation 13 after (a) occurring in the first line of paragraph (a) insert the words "open the ballot-box and", and in paragraph (c) of the said regulation for the word "and" occurring in the seventh line of paragraph (i) of the proviso thereto substitute the word "or".
- 4 In Form 101 the words from "or to any place" to the end of the paragraph in the directions occurring at the foot thereof are repealed.

SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

By-LAW No. 1, 1928.

A By-law of the Shire of Rutherglen, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 1 of 1928, for preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the nunicipality, or under the control and management of the Council, and for preventing damage to such building and to the fittings and the furniture thereof, and for regulating any meeting or gathering therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rutherglen order as follows:—

- 1. No person shall, in any building belonging to the municipality, or under the control and management of the Council, and whether at any meeting or gathering therein or not—
 - (a) Behave in an improper, disorderly, or indecent manner;
 - (b) Expectorate or spit upon the floor, walls, furniture or fittings of such building; or
 (c) Injure or damage the said building or any of the said furniture or fittings thereof.
- 2. No person shall at any meeting or gathering held in such building-
 - (a) Stand upon any chair or seat, or stand or sit upon any window-sill, cornice, balcony or staircase railing;
 - (b) Disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering;

- (c) Curse or swear, or use any gross, indecent, or abusive
- language; or
 (d) Be guilty of any insulting or riotous conduct; or
 (e) Be drunk; or
- (f) Take any part in any disturbance or disorder.

3. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Five shillings, for each such breach.

This By-law shall come into operation and shall apply throughout the municipal district of the Shire of Rutherglen, from the date of publication in the Government Gazette, as provided by the Local Government Act 1915.

- (b) To provide facilities for a training school for nurses.
 (c) To provide for carrying out investigation into ailments, diseases, injuries, or other matters affecting

the human body 5. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept by the secretary, and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the general committee at a meeting

at which four members at least are present at the time of making such order.

6 The incorporated institution shall consist of a president, one vice-president, and the members of the committee hereinafter referred to, honorary treasurer, governors, and con-

7. (a) Any person who was a life governor prior to the commencement of the By-laws shall continue to be such life

(b) Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on

- (b) Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscription, may be elected life governors at any meeting of the general committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

 (c) Any person who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least Twenty-five pounds in one donation shall be entitled to be elected as a life governor. A person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company, or firm which at any time has contributed Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company, or firm, or such less sum as would, pursuant to the By-laws of the institution, entitle any person contributing the same to be elected a life member or life governor thereof. thereof
- (d) Any person who at any time within the twelve months next preceding the date of any meeting or election or any other date in respect of which the question of his being a contributor arises has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least One pound in one donation or produces evidence to the committee that he has on his own behalf contributed at least One pound in donations of a less amount shall be a contributor.

In the event of a life governor having contributed One pound or over during the financial year, he shall be entitled to his ordinary vote in addition to two votes as a life governor.

MEETING OF CONTRIBUTORS.

- 11. All annual meetings of contributors shall be advertised by the secretary at least fourteen days, and all special meetings at least seven days, before the day on which such meeting is to be held, in a newspaper circulating in Mildura.

 12. The annual general meeting of contributors shall be held on some day (except the last) during the month of August in every year, at such time and place as shall be determined by the general committee, for the following purposes:—
- - (a) To confirm the minutes of the previous annual meeting and special meetings, if any, no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

 (b) To receive the report of the general committee and audited statements of receipts and expenditure for the year, to the 30th June preceding.

 (e) For the transaction of any business of which at least seven days' notice has been given.

On the day of the annual meeting of contributors, the president, vice-president, honorary treasurer, and one-third part of the number nearest to one-third part, of the elected members of the general committee shall retire from office, but may nevertheless be re-elected. - 15. No person shall be elected unless at least seven days before the day of the annual general meeting there has been delivered to the secretary a written nomination of such person, signed by at least two contributors thereto and also the written consent of such person.

 16. (a) In the event of any casual vacancy in the committee the remaining members of the committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor. Such contributor so appointed may continue to be a member of the committee until immediately before the annual meeting for the election of the committee, when he shall retire therefrom as one of those persons who are required to go out of office.
- (b) In the event of a casual vacancy in the office of president, vice-president, or of any elective officer, the committee may temporarily appoint to such office one of its members; and the person so appointed may continue in office until the next annual meeting.
- 17. If required by the committee, or upon the requisition, in writing, of ten members of the committee, or of contributors, the secretary shall, as provided for in By-law number 12, convene a special meeting of contributors, the occasion for calling such meeting being stated in such requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, excepting that for which it shall have been summoned.
- 18. At all meetings of contributors, the president, or, in his
- 18. At all meetings of contributors, the president, or, in his absence, the vice-president, shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman. The presiding officer shall have a casting vote only.

 19. If at any annual or special meeting of the contributors at least ten contributors do not assemble and proceed to business within one hour from the time fixed for the meeting, no business shall be transacted at that meeting, but in such event there shall be another meeting of contributors at the same place and the same hour of the same day in the following week, and at this meeting any number of contributors exceding seven shall constitute a meeting.

 20. At all meetings of contributors all questions, except questions involving contested elections, shall be decided by a show of hands, unless before or on the declaration of the result a ballot is demanded by seven contributors, in which event it shall be decided by a ballot. A declaration by the chairman that a resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or otherwise, and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of the fact; provided, however, that where at least seven contributors so demand, any resolution confirming a By-law shall be decided by poll as hereinafter provided.

 21. When a poll is duly demanded the chairman shall edicore.
- ever, that where at least seven contributors so demand, any resolution confirming a By-law shall be decided by poll as hereinafter provided.

 21. When a poll is duly demanded, the chairman shall adjourn the meeting, to admit of the ballot being taken, to a day fixed by him, not more than fourteen days, nor less than seven days, after the day of the adjournment, notice of which shall be advertised in a paper circulating in Mildura, at least seven days before the day so fixed. At the meeting each contributor has one vote, but on ballot each to have the number of votes to which he is entitled under By-law No. 11.

 22. At all elections or when a poll shall have been demanded as provided for in By-law No. 21, the election or poll, as the case may be, shall be conducted at the institution or at such other place as the general committee may deem advisable, at least one clear day before the day appointed for declaring such election or poll.

 Contributors shall record their votes at the polling-booth set aside for the purpose, or they may be allowed to vote by post on applying seven clear days prior to the election to the secretary, who will issue the necessary ballot-papers and special envelope, which must be signed on the inside of the flap by the governor or contributor.

 All postal ballot-papers must be in the hands of the returning officer at the close of the poll.

 Governors and contributors voting shall vote for the full number of candidates to be elected, otherwise the vote shall be declared informal.

 23. The general committee shall appoint from amongst its members a returning officer, who shall conduct the election, and he shall be empowered to appoint deputy returning officers, if such be considered advisable by him.

24. Each candidate may appoint a scrutineer for such election.

MEETING OF GENERAL COMMITTEE.

- 25. The general committee shall meet for general business on the third Monday in each month at 8 p.m., or at such other time and place as the committee by resolution may decide, and for special purposes at such time and place as may be necessary. Four members of the general committee shall form a quorum.
- 26. Notice of all meetings shall be sent to each member by the secretary at least 24 hours before the time of meeting, stating any special business to be considered.
- 27. The committee shall proceed to business as soon after the time notified as there is sufficient number of members present to form a quorum; but if at the expiry of 30 minutes from the time specified there is not a quorum present the meeting shall stand adjourned to such day as the members then present shall direct, not more than fourteen days from the day appointed for such meeting.
- 28. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed and the minutes of the house and finance committees since the previous regular meeting have been read for information, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.
- 29. No resolution of the committee shall be varied or rescinded until one month after such resolution has been passed, and then only by an absolute majority of the committee

GENERAL COMMITTEE.

- 30. Subject to the provisions of section 52 of the Act the general committee shall consist of twelve contributors, comprising the president, vice-president, and honorary treasurer ex-officio, and nine elected members.
- 31. Any general meeting of contributors called for the purpose may alter the number of the members of the general committee, and every such alternation shall take effect immediately before the annual election of members of the committee next following the making of the alternation.
- 32. The general committee shall have power to appoint such sub-committees in addition to the House and Finance Committees as may be considered necessary.
- 33. The president and vice-president shall be ex-officio members of all sub-committees, and the treasurer shall be a member of the finance committee.
- 34. No paid officer of the Institution shall be entitled to be
- on. No paid omeer of the Institution shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

 35. The maximum number of legally qualified Medical Practitioners who may be members of such committee shall be one-fourth part of the members of the committee, or the integral number correct is such one fourth part.

No person shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation or be concerned or participate in any wise in any contract with the general committee or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such general committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership or association, consisting of more than twenty, when such contract shall be entered into the general benefit of such company, partnership or association, nor to any person by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements.

But no members of the general committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the general committee in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

37. The general committee shall control the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all officials and servants, or they may at their discretion delegate other officials of the hospital to appoint or dismiss members of the staff or servants, frame rules and/or regulations for the management of the hospital, present a report to the annual meetings, and manage the affairs of the Institution generally.

38. All accounts for payment shall be passed by the general committee and the list signed at the meeting by the chairman.

House Committee.

- HOUSE COMMITTEE.

 39. The general committee shall, at its first meeting after the annual meeting of contributors, appoint from among themselves a house committee of three members—two to form a quorum. The house committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting.

 40. The house committee shall meet once at least in a week, and oftener if necessary, and shall have power to admit patients and to confirm or otherwise the admission of any cases received during the intervals between meetings; it shall assess fees payable by patients and shall inquire into all complaints, and be empowered to dismiss patients for misconduct or breach of the rules of the institution, recording in the minutes the reasons for the non-admission or the dismissal. The house committee may suspend any officer of the Institution, pending inquiry by the general committee; it may engage and discharge nurses, trainees, and servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly or yearly tenders, and recommend any to the general committee for acceptance; it shall inspect all books connected with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medical instruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies generally.

Some of its members shall weekly inspect the wards, kitchen and other portions of the institution; it shall check the tradesand other portions of the institution; it snau check the trades-men's monthly bills, and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to finance committee for payment; and generally shall supervise and regulate the internal management of the institution, under the direction of the general com-

FINANCE COMMITTEE.

- 41. A finance committee consisting of the treasurer and three other members shall be elected by and from the general committee, at its first meeting after the annual meeting of contributors. The finance committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting, and two members shall form a quorum.
- 42. The finance committee shall meet at least once in each month, and may examine the secretary's cash book and other books of account, and compare same with bank passbook; it may also compare the collectors' books and receipt butts with list of contributions and donations; check additions and see that the totals correspond with each other and with the amounts acknowledged by the treasurer; it shall give all needful instructions to the secretary and collector, with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations, and shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment, and submit the same to the general committee at the monthly meetings, and shall, in conjunction with the president or a vice-president and secretary, be empowered to make necessary special payments in the intervals between the monthly meetings; it shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly receipted, and shall also examine the returns prepared for the Government, and annual statements of accounts. 42. The finance committee shall meet at least once in each
- 43. In all cases where books and vouchers are checked by the house or finance committees, the signature of some member thereof shall be appended, with the date of examination.
- 44. The secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the institution, and issue the official receipt forthwith. Such moneys to be deposited without delay to the credit of the institution in such bank as the general committee may from time to time determine.
- 45. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president, vice-president, the treasurer, or in their absence, a member of the finance committee, and countersigned by the secretary.
- 46. Previous to signing any cheques for payment, the treasurer shall require a warrant, signed by the president or chairman of the meeting of the general committee, at which the accounts were passed and countersigned by the secretary; special payments may nevertheless be made during the month in accordance with By-law No. 42, such special payments to be included in the next warrant passed by the committee.
- 47. If any vacancy, shall occur in the office of treasurer, the general committee may appoint another to hold office until the next annual meeting.
- 48. Two auditors shall be elected at the annual meeting each year, and remuneration to be paid to them, if any, shall be then fixed.
- In default of such appointment, the general committee shall make the appointment, and in the event of any vacancy occuring the general committee shall fill the same.

 49. The auditors shall have access to the books and accounts of the institution at all times, and shall, if they consider it necessary, report to the general committee.

 50. The auditors shall, during July in each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial statement, with all books and accounts, and documents relating thereto, and list of contributions and donations, and shall verify their correctness, and make any special report thereon, which they consider necessary, to the appunct meating. to the annual meeting.

SECRETARY AND SUPERIMENDENT.

- 51. He shall have the superintendence and chief executive 51. He shall have the superintendence and chief executive control of the hospital and grounds, and be responsible to the committee for the due and efficient performance of the duties by all salaried officers and servants, save such duties as relate to matters of a purely professional character belonging to the resident medical officer, dispenser, and matron.

 52. He shall devote the whole of his time to the service of
- the hospital, and shall not engage in any business or profes-
- sion.

 53. He shall attend all committee and sub-committee meetings, and all meetings of the honorary medical staff and act as secretary thereto respectively, and furnish all information in his power on any subject which may be under discussion, and be responsible for the correct record of all proceedings thereat.
- 54. He shall see that lecturers are appointed by the honorary medical staff to the nursing school, and report to the committee any default in any course of such lectures as soon thereafter
- as possible.

 55. He shall be recognized official channel of communication
- as between committee and all officials or servants.

 56. He shall be responsible for the keeping of all books and accounts in the unanner and after the style as directed by the committee, and be responsible for their safe custody.

- 57. He shall not lend any books or papers belonging to the hospital, or permit them to be inspected or removed without permission of the committee, but all books and documents shall be produced to any member of the committee at any time required.
- 58. He shall conduct the correspondence and supervise all other clerical business of the hospital, and prepare, sign, and issue all notices and advertisements relating to it.
- 59. He shall be supplied by the honorary treasurer with sums not exceeding Twenty pounds at a time to meet petty expenses, and shall produce vouchers showing how such money has been disbursed.
- 60. He shall countersign the books of the collector, and keep an accurate check upon money received by that officer, and see that he deposits the same in the bank.
- 61. He shall order all supplies of any kind as required, and see that all such supplies are of the quality and description contracted for, and be responsible for the due issue thereof.
- 62. He shall carefully examine all tradesmen's bills, make up accounts and initial them as being correct in every particular, and present them to each meeting of the finance committee.
- 63. He shall prepare an inventory of all medical and other stores as at the 30th June of each year, and submit the same to the committee at their last meeting in July thereafter.
- 64. He shall see that all property of the hospital is carefully kept, preserved, and economically used, and that all stores are issued under a proper system, and that insurances are maintained against loss by fire. He shall promptly report to the committee any defect or deficiency in any of the buildings, grounds drainage, water and gas supply, machinery, furniture, &c., and give attention to any repairs when in progress or completed.
- 65. He shall engage and dismiss all nurses and servants, but shall only engage female nurses on the recommendation of the matron and/or house committee, and shall report all engagements, suspensions and dismissals at the next meeting of the committee thereafter.

66. He shall sign all certificates of service and character of

66. He shall sign all certificates of service and character of nurses and servants, upon the request and recommendation of the heads of their respective departments. He shall also countersign the nurses' "certificates of competency."

67. He shall keep a book called the "discipline book," wherein shall be recorded any gross misconduct of any servant of the hospital, or of the infraction of any of its important regulations by any person whatsoever, and he shall lay the same on the table at each meeting of the committee, calling their attention to all fresh entries therein.

68. He shall present a copy of all rules and By-laws to every officer who may be appointed, immediately after his or her appointment. He shall keep an interleaved book of such rules and By-laws for official use, and shall insert therein any new rule or By-law as soon as it shall have been confirmed, and shall communicate it to the person or persons to whom it may apply.

shall communicate it to the person of person of partial apply.

69. He shall receive, and take charge of, and be responsible for any property taken from patients on their admission, and show in a book to be kept for that purpose of what such property consisted and how disposed of.

70. He shall, upon receiving notice from the resident medical officer, communicate with the friends of patients who are reported as in a dangerous state, and if a minister is required take immediate steps to comply with the wishes of the natients.

COLLECTOR.

The collector shall, under the direction of the secretary and finance committee, canvass for subscriptions and donations to the funds of the institution, and shall not engage in any private business. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the committee. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipts, and once at least in every week he shall copy at entries in a duplicate book to be kept at the institution. He shall pay to the secretary once

in every week, and oftener if the receipts exceed £20, all moneys received by him, and shall furnish to the secretary a list of contributions so paid, and shall obtain the secretary's receipt in his book for such payments.

78. The books used by the collector shall be provided by the committee, and shall be deemed to be the property of the insti-tution, and the collector shall at any time, upon demand, deliver up to the secretary his books and butts, for examina-tion or retention. He shall when required be in attendance at the meetings of the finance committee, and shall act in the discharge of his duties under their instructions. He shall give as a security for the faithful discharge of his duties the sum of £150 in some guarantee company to be approved of and paid by the general committee.

106. He shall notify by letter or telephone those doctors who send surgical cases that are admitted to the hospital as to when an operation has been, or will be, performed.

110. He shall report to the secretary and superintendent any misconduct or neglect of duty that he may observe on the part of male employees, and to the matron any misbehaviour or dereliction of duty on the part of the nursing staff or female employees.

111. He shall not make reports on cases without the permission of the honorary medical officer.

114. He shall keep a record of all cases, giving a history of the case, setting out the features of the disease, the course of treatment adopted, and the result and, in the case of death, the actual cause, so far as the same is ascertainable.

He shall make the necessary entries in the out-patients' register, including a note of the date and the exact time at which each case was admitted, and the time at which it was attended. He shall enter all refusals in the refusals book.

115. He shall enter into the certificate of death book the necessary particulars of every case under his care, and attach his signature to each entry and initial the block. He shall further testify to the condition of a patient when such certificates are required for legal purposes.

116. He shall hand into the office the names of the patients who may be in a dangerous or critical state in order that their relatives or friends may be communicated with.

117. He may close any ward against visitors if such steps are deemed necessary in the interests of the patients.

- 118. He shall, on the occurrence of a death, have the body at once removed to the mortuary, and have the fact of the death communicated through the office to the relatives of the deceased, and to the honorary officer under whose charge the patient has
- 119. He shall give bedside and other clinical instruction to the pupil nurses, and he shall act as dispenser to the hospital.
- 120. He shall not discharge any in-patient without the knowledge and concurrence of the honorary officer attending the
- 121. He shall not accept any fees except those obtained for reports on infectious diseases, certificates of health, court and coroner's fees, lunacy certificates, and special death certificates for insurance purposes.
- 122. He shall not commence practice within a radius of 30 miles of Mildura within a period of five years from the termination of his appointment as resident medical officer without the consent of two-thirds of the honorary medical staff, and he shall sign an agreement to this effect.
- 123. In addition to the foregoing, he shall be amenable to the general rules of the hospital, and if his duties are not carried out to the satisfaction of the board of management and the by one month's notice.

She shall visit each ward and its offices frequently during the day, not later than 9 a.m., and occasionally at night, commencing not earlier than 8 p.m., and see that they are kept clean and in good order, that the meals are properly and punctually served, and that no ward is left without a nurse in charge.

She shall, upon receiving notice from the resident medical officer or honorary medical officer, communicate with the friends of patients who are reported as in a dangerous state; and if a minister is required to take immediate steps to comply with the wishes of the patients.

133. She shall strictly attend to the directions of the medical staf, and use her best endeavours to prevent the introduction of improper provisions and liquors to the patients.

134. Prior to the admission of any patient to the wards, she shall take care that their person and clothing is in proper state, and shall receive and hand to the secretary and superintendent for safe custody any property they may have.

135. It shall be her duty, on the reception of patients, to cause them to be placed in beds within the wards assigned to them, and she shall, as soon as convenient thereafter, visit each new patient and see that they are properly accommodated.

136. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion she shell inform the secretary and superintendent, who will take measures to have the request compiled with.

137. On the discharge or death of a patient she shall direct that the whole of the bed linen be replaced with clean articles.

138. On the death of a patient she shall at once report the circumstance to the resident medical officer.

139. She shall treat the patients with kindness, and never allow any unkindness or neglect to go unreproved.

140. She shall see that the various printed rules are hung up in their respective departments.

in their respective departments.

141. She shall be responsible for the efficient and economical management of the kitchen and laundry; she shall give the necessary directions for making and mending linen, clothing, and other articles, and take care that all are clearly marked with the name of the hospital, and that a sufficient stock of all such articles, as well as provisions, are kept in stock.

142. If she observes any irregularity in the departments under her control, or in the household generally, or in the conduct of the nurses, probationers, or female servants, she may suspend, on account thereof, any such person, and at once report the matter to the secretary and superintendent.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

143. Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as 143. Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the resident medical officer cannot be delayed may be received at any time; and the admission of patients in ordinary cases shall be daily (Sundays excepted), between the hours of 9 and 12 o'clock in the forenoon, by the secretary and superintendent and the honorary medical staff for the week, or, in the absence of such staff, by the secretary and superintendent and resident medical officer, such admission to be temporary and subject to the approval of the house committee at its next meeting. mittee at its next meeting.

144. Every in-patient and every out-patient who is admitted into, or maintained by, or receives any relief from the institution, shall be liable to contribute towards the funds of the institution according to his or her means. Patients shall pay fees as may be fixed by the house committee, and the payment of same must be made weekly. Provided that the house committee or officers of the institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases. admit such prohibited cases.

OUT-PATIENTS.

146. Persons unable to pay for private medical attention or medicine, but not requiring admission to the institution, shall be treated as out-patients and shall be charged ls. for each visit, or 2s. 6d. if medicine be provided. All persons requiring treatment as out-patients must obtain treatment cards from the office, and make payment thereto prior to proceeding to the out-patients' department. Persons in destitute circumstances will be issued with treatment cards free of charge at the office on application. The hours of attendance for out-patients shall be between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon, excepting in such cases as is otherwise arranged by the honorary medical officers or the resident medical officer. Casualties or cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the resident medical officer cannot be delayed may be treated at any time.

VISITORS.

That Sunday, Wednesday, and Saturday in each week between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. be the days and hours set apart for persons desirous of visiting the hospital or any

That on permission being first obtained from the matron or evening between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m., but in cases of extreme danger the friends of such patients may obtain admission to the hospital by an order signed by a member of the board of management or by permission of the secretary and superintendent or the resident medical officer.

The patients shall obey strictly all directions of the house surgeon and officers in charge.

No patient shall leave his or her bed or ward without per-

All patients who are considered by the medical officer to be able to work, shall assist in any work connected with the hospital when required to do so by the matron.

Patients having complaints to make are requested to com-municate them to the house committee or secretary and super-

No patient shall leave the hospital grounds without obtaining permission from the resident medical officer, or, in his absence, the matron or nurse in charge.

No male patient shall enter the female ward, nor female patient enter the male ward, without permission from the secretary and superintendent, or the resident medical officer.

Patients and their friends are prohibited from giving money or any gratuity whatsoever to the medical staff, nursing staff, or other employees of the hospital for their personal benefit. Any patient gambling, smoking in the wards, or behaving in any indecent manner in any part of the hospital premises, will be liable to immediate discharge by the secretary and superintendent or house committee.

147. All alterations, amendments, or additions to the By-laws shall be made at a meeting called specially for the purpose, such meeting to be advertised twice in one or more newspapers circulating in Mildura, at least seven days before the meeting at which the same are to be considered, and such alterations, amendments, or additions shall be made available to sub-
