- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.
- (f) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special rate.
- (g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied, otherwise than by measure.
- (h) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1929.
- (i) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1929 (No. 35.)

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law, viz. :-

The By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the said Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty pounds (£20).

2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty pounds (£20).

3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land, a rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens, or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1929, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets on which the pipes of the water supply are laid, and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter (¼) mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the above-mentioned rates, and where such lands and tenements are over a quarter (¼) of mile and within half (½) a mile thereof; a quarter of the above-mentioned rates. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Donald for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1929, commencing on the first day of January, 1929, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1929, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1929.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1.

PREVENTION OF THE WASTE AND UNDUE CONSUMPTION OF WATER.

THE Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), pursuant to and under the powers given by the Water Acts and under every other power enabling the Trust in that behalf, doth hereby, for the prevention of the waste and undue consumption of water supplied from any part of the works of the Trust, make the following By-law :-

Watering of Gardens.

Owing to the danger of shortage of water for domestic purposes in the months of December, January, and February due to the waste and undue consumption of water caused by watering gardens, the watering of gardens by persons supplied with water by the Trust (hereinafter called "consumers") is regulated as follows :-

1. In the months of December, January, and February watering of gardens by consumers is prohibited between the hours of Six o'clock and Nine o'clock in the forenoon and between the hours of Five o'clock and Seven o'clock in the afternoon on any day in the said months

2. For the purposes of the following clauses the district supplied with water by the Trust is divided into a Northern area and a Southern area divided by a line formed by Baillie-street, Horsham, commencing from the western boundary of the district and continuing along Baillie-street in an easterly direction to the eastern boundary thereof.

(a) In the Northern area watering of gardens by consumers is prohibited on each Monday, Wednesday, and Friday in the months of December, January, and February.

(b) In the Southern area watering of gardens by consumers is prohibited on each Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday in the months of December, January, and February.

Waste of Water.

3. Any person who shall wilfully or negligently allow water supplied by the Trust to run to waste shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

Penalty.

4. Every person guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for the first breach thereof to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds and for each second or subsequent breach thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Trust the fourth day of October One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven. Confirmed the first day of November One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

A rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling payable in two equal instalments on the 1st January and 1st July, 1929, shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Trust district according to the municipal valuation of such properties.

The minimum rate to be paid shall be Two pounds (£2) on all tenements; vacant land where the main passes the property or within 100 yards, 30s.; beyond 100 yards, 15s.; stand-pipe rate, 7s. 6d.

All water supplied by the Trust for other than domestic purposes shall be by meter, and charged at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons; water to Railways for engine purpose, 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and collect and recover the said rate.

4. For every public water-trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1929, and the rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1929.

7. Such person or persons as the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1929.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. *Minimum.*—Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eight pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. *Minimum.*—For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eight pounds sterling value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. *On Valuation above Minimum.*—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Eight pounds sterling, or more than Eight pounds sterling value, an amount equal to Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

4. *Special Rates.*—For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipes and being within a quarter of a mile of any standpipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenement or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such standpipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

5. *Minimum Meter Charge—Excess Meter Charge.*—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. *Public Institutions and Others.*—Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement.

7. *Irrigation.*—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

8. *Water Rate outside Trust's Area.*—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust's area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. *Water Troughs.*—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 8,000 gallons per annum, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

10. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean Nhill Waterworks Trust, and "he" shall also mean "she".

11. *Excess Payments.*—Where water meters are affixed the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

12. *Period of Rate.*—That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1929, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1929, and shall be payable in one moiety in advance, on the first day of January, 1929.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates.

BY-LAW NO. 32, FOR MAKING AND LEVYING RATES.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

(a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement: Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

(b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.

(c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Four pounds ten shillings per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.

(d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Four pounds per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.

(e) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such lands.

(f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Three pounds ten shillings per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1929, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1929, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1929, at the office of the Water Commissioners, at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in the Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Tenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such persons as the Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

BY-LAW NO. 55.—WATER SUPPLY.

A By-law for Restricting the Use of Water for other than Domestic Purposes.

THE "Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust" (hereinafter called "the Trust") pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Trust by the "Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Acts" and the "Water Acts," and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the Trust, in that behalf doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The Trust may by notice published as hereinafter mentioned prohibit or restrict the use of the water supplied by it for any purpose other than domestic purposes, during such period or at such times or from time to time as may be fixed by the Trust and stated in such notice, and for the purpose of giving effect to such prohibition or restriction the Trust may likewise prohibit or regulate the user of any hose, spray pipe, fitting, or apparatus, or the affixing thereof to any tap or pipe forming part of the consumer's service or vested in the Trust.
2. Such notice may be given either by printed posters placed in prominent positions within the water supply district of the Trust, or by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in such district.
3. Any person who shall use or permit or suffer to be used any water supplied by the Trust or who shall use or affix or permit or suffer to be used or affixed any hose, spray pipe fitting, or apparatus contrary to any such prohibition or restriction, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in a case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

- (e) For water supplied by measure—the sum of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons of water consumed, 30,000 gallons to be the minimum quantity to be charged for under this section.

2. The rate hereby made shall be due and payable on the 10th day of December, 1928, at the Shire Office, Wedderburn.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. *Waste of Water.*—Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and shall be disconnected.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. *Waste of Water.*—Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and shall be disconnected.

3. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

4. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be:—Seven pounds and under, a sum of Seven shillings and sixpence; over the annual municipal value of Seven pounds, the rate shall be One shilling in the pound per annum.

5. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the above-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from the stand-pipe, one-quarter of the above-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specifically agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 40,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to engines, for cutting firewood, to be charged at the rate of £4 per annum for each engine.

8. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1929.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

2. For water supplied by measure, One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of the quantity allowed on the ordinary rate; such allowance to be 1,000 gallons for every shilling of the rate amount.

3. On all land and tenements situated elsewhere than in a street in which water supply pipes are laid down, but being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, a charge of one-half the rates above specified, and on all such land and tenements situated over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from any such stand-pipe, a charge of one-quarter of the rate above specified.

4. The Trust may require a meter to be affixed to the service pipe of any consumer; and upon a consumer being ordered, in writing, from the Trust so to do, he or she shall forthwith arrange for a meter to be installed at his or her own cost. Should the consumer fail to comply with the request within one month after receiving notice, the Trust may cut off the water.

5. For special services the Trust may supply water by agreement at special rates.

6. The secretary of the Trust for the time being is hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover, on behalf of the Trust, the rates and charges imposed by this By-law.

(1) If for domestic or other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per annum.

(3) Such rate is made for the year 1929, commencing on the first day of January, 1929, as also the charges for every steam boiler and water supplied from the public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on the first day of January, 1929.

(4) All other charges by measurement shall be paid on the first day of January, 1929.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

- (b) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £24 or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings.
- (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Three pounds two shillings and sixpence (£3 2s. 6d.) per centum on the annual municipal valuation, with a minimum of Thirty shillings if water be laid on.
- (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Thirty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Ten shillings per annum.
- (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.
- (f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in respect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (j) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1929, and the first day of July, 1929, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1929.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law for the year 1929:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of Seventeen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate; and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half a mile, one-fourth the before-mentioned rate.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the water rate paid on such lands and tenements. All excess water supplied by measure by the Trust shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such owners or occupiers of lands or tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam-engines, or stock, who are supplied by the Trust with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using, such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the first day of January, and not later than the thirtieth day of June, 1929.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE COMMITTEE OF THE MERBEIN TURF CLUB, PURSUANT TO SECTION 153 OF THE POLICE OFFENCES ACT 1925, IN RESPECT OF THE MERBEIN RACE-COURSE.

BOOKMAKERS AND BOOKMAKERS' CLERKS.

1. No person shall carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker, or bookmaker's clerk, on any part of the said Race-course, except as shown on the plan with application for licence or permit.

2. Applications to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk shall be made to the Committee in writing.

3. If the applicant be approved by the Committee, he shall, if required, deposit with them the sum not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50) sterling, which sum shall be held until after the last race has been run, when if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Committee that he has not been a defaulter the deposit shall be returned forthwith. In the event of its being proved to the satisfaction of the Committee that the applicant has failed to pay any bets proved to have been lost by him at the meeting, in respect of which the permit or licence to bet has been issued, the amount deposited by the applicant is to be applied by the Committee in payment of such bets, or in payment pro rata as the case may be. The applicant shall, also, if approved by the Committee, pay in advance a fee or charge according to the scale hereinafter set forth before he may be permitted to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker, and the Committee shall issue to him in writing a permit to that effect.

4. The scale of fees or charges above referred to is as follows:—

Each bookmaker: Two guineas (£2 2s.), plus entrance fees. Clerks not charged for, but must pay entrance fees.

The fees hereinbefore set out shall in each instance permit the bookmaker to employ without further charge, upon the part of the Race-course to which his permit relates, one clerk permitted and approved as aforesaid. A fee to be determined by the Committee will be charged for each additional clerk.

5. Any person who carries on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk on any part of the said Race-course, without a permit from the Committee authorizing him so to do, may be prevented from so doing by the Committee, and may be removed by them from the said Race-course.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Sewerage.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts and the *Sewerage Districts Act 1915* (No. 2761), and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 26, Sewerage, dated the seventeenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, is hereby repealed as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law.

Such repeal shall not affect anything duly done, any rights, privileges, or powers acquired, or any liabilities, penalties, or forfeiture incurred, or any proceedings taken or commenced under the said By-law No. 26 before the said date.

2. Where any applicant for a plumber's licence produces a certificate of the Education Department of Victoria that he (the applicant) has passed the four courses of plumbing handicraft taught at the technical schools, and has been

awarded at the examination in each course not less than seventy-five per cent. of the maximum number of marks obtainable, or produces a certificate that he has passed the examination of a recognized examining body whose standard of examination is approved by the Board, and also produces satisfactory evidence from a licensed plumber that he has for a period of not less than five years been engaged in plumbing work in connexion with the Board's sewerage system, the Board may issue a second-class plumber's licence to the applicant without requiring him to present himself for examination by the Board's examiners.

Stopping Places on Routes.

Emerald Powder.—Consisting of nitro-cellulose, gelatinized by a suitable solvent, with or without admixture of nitrates of potassium, sodium, or barium, or any of them, hydro-carbons or resin, with or without a coating of graphite, and coloured with the oxalate variety of malachite green, and with or without diphenylamine; provided that if diphenylamine is used it shall not amount to less than 0.75 per cent. nor more than 1.25 per cent. of the finished explosive, and that the nitro-cellulose shall not be less than 70 per cent. nor more than 93 per cent. of the finished explosive.

BY-LAW No. 250.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne made under the *Health Act 1919* and numbered 250 for the purpose of regulating the conditions under which any animals (including birds) shall be kept or housed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:

1. That By-law No. 235 of the said City be repealed and the following clauses enacted in lieu thereof:
2. In this By-law "Dwelling" shall include bathrooms, kitchens, sculleries, and all rooms used for sleeping, living, cooking, or the like purpose.
3. That all fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, and/or other classes of poultry shall be kept within a coop, fence, or approved enclosure, no part of which shall be within 25 feet from any dwelling.
4. No person shall keep any fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, and/or all other classes of poultry and all classes of pigeons or doves in such a manner as to be in the opinion of the Council of the City offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.
5. This By-law shall have full force and effect throughout the whole of the City of South Melbourne.
6. Any persons who shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty provided for under section 341 of the *Health Act 1919*.

CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BY-LAW No. 88.

A By-law of the City of Williamstown made under section 75 (j) of the *Health Act 1919* and numbered 88 for regulating the conditions under which certain kinds or classes of birds shall be kept or housed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Williamstown order as follows:

"Birds" in this By-law shall mean only fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, and all other classes of poultry and all classes of pigeons and doves.

All birds kept upon any premises shall be continuously confined in an approved building or enclosure, or within or upon approved fenced land or yard, and no portion of such approved building or enclosure or approved fenced land or yard shall be within a distance of twenty-five (25) feet from any house or detached building containing either bedroom, kitchen, scullery, or any other room used or intended to be used for sleeping, living, or cooking in or for any like domestic purpose.

Birds shall not be kept upon any premises when the Medical Officer of Health or Inspector of the Council certifies in writing to the Council that the keeping thereof would be offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous, and, in the opinion of the Council, such would be the case.

Before birds can be kept upon any premises aforesaid the occupier of such premises shall obtain from the Medical Officer of Health or Inspector of the Council a certificate approving of the building or enclosure or fenced land or yard aforesaid, and setting forth therein that such building or enclosure or fenced land or yard is not within a distance of 25 feet from any house or detached building aforesaid.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the City of Williamstown.

SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

BY-LAW NUMBER 55.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 55, for controlling, managing, and preserving Public Reserves of which the management is vested in the Council and for preserving public decency.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. Every reserve situate in the Shire of Moorabbin of which the management is vested in the Council (hereinafter called "any Reserve") shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days as any reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding one shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to any such reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in any Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall bring any alcoholic drink into any Reserve.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in any reserve nor light any fire or fires therein except at such sites as may be set apart for the purpose by the Council.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or round any reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in any reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish nor roll or throw any stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
6. No person shall put any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals in any reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Shire Secretary or some other person duly authorized in that behalf first obtained.
7. The Council shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on any Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of any Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "Cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by Section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.
8. No person shall bring into any Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
9. No person shall camp in any Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.
10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in any Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in any Reserve.
12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of any Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

13. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within any Reserve on Sundays.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fetes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Council may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Council in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by this By-law and by any order given by the Council.

15. No person except labourers and workmen employed in any Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

16. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to expulsion from any Reserve.

Every person offending against this By-law shall in accordance with the provisions of Section 719 of the *Local Government Act 1915* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20).

17. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE KNITTING TRADE BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 2nd January, 1929, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria, and superseded the Determinations of the Knitters and Country Knitters Boards respectively.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the process, trade or business of knitting or crocheting any article for human wear," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That this Determination shall be operative on and after the 2nd January, 1929.

Two male improvers to every male worker receiving not less than 87s. 6d. per week of 45 hours.

One female apprentice to every three or fraction of three female workers receiving not less than 45s. 6d. per week of 45 hours.

Improvers.

Two female improvers to each female worker receiving not less than 45s. 6d. per week of 45 hours.

An indenture of apprenticeship has been prescribed by the Board.

(3) **SHIFTS.**—That—

(a) The hour of beginning and the hour of ending each shift shall be as follows:—

Saturday or the day on which the half-holiday is locally observed	7.30 a.m.	12 noon.

(b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any time-worker before or after his or her shift shall be time and a half.

(c) Piece-workers shall be paid for overtime 6d. per hour in addition to their ordinary piece-work earnings.

(d) Employees required to work overtime in excess of one hour after their usual finishing time, without being notified on the previous working day or shift of the intention to work overtime, shall be paid 1s. tea money.

(4) **ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.**—That the number of hours which shall constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 45.

(5) **PIECEWORK.**—That—

(a) The lowest piece-work price payable to any outworker for performing any of the undermentioned work, shall be as specified in the following schedule, viz.:—

NOTES.—1. The employer shall supply all necessary materials free, and shall not make any charge for delivering or collecting work.

2. (a) Every outworker is required to register with the Chief Inspector of Factories his full name and address.—Act 2650, sec. 195 (1).

(b) Every person who gives out work shall keep a record regarding the same giving certain prescribed particulars, and shall forward to the Secretary for Labour monthly a copy of such record for the preceding month.—Act 2650, sec. 23 (1), as amended by sec. 4 (1), Act 3753.

(c) No person shall give out work except to a registered outworker.—Act 2650, sec. 196 (1).

(b) Except as provided in clause (5) (a), the employer may fix piece-work prices, and such piece-work prices shall enable an employee of average capacity to earn at least the time-work wages for the class of work performed, with the addition of 10 per cent.

(c) Piece-workers shall be provided with a book, or its equivalent, in which the employee shall enter particulars regarding the work done. Such work shall be priced by the employer, and the record verified by the employee.

(6) **TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.**—That—

(a) Employment under this Determination shall be from hour to hour, except that 45 working hours' notice shall be given on either side to finally terminate employment. Such notice may be given at any time.

(b) Any employee under instructions from, or with the consent of the employer, reporting for work at the usual commencing time, shall be given at least a half-day's work, or alternatively, a half-day's pay at the time-work wage fixed for the work concerned.

(c) Nothing in this clause shall prevent an employer dismissing any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only, or to deduct payment for the whole or any part of a day an employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike, or breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause beyond the employer's control.

(7) **HOLIDAYS.**—That—

(a) All time-work employees may be absent from work without loss of pay on the following days:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day. All work done on any of the above days, or Sunday, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) All piece-work employees shall be paid for the above holidays in the same manner as time-workers—that is, at the time-work wage fixed for the work concerned.

(c) Where an employer terminates the employment of an employee within one week of a day on which any of the above holidays occur, the employee shall be paid for such holiday, providing such employee has been employed by such employer for a period of at least one month immediately prior to such termination of employment.

(d) Where an employee is absent from his or her employment on the working day or part of the working day before or after a holiday, without reasonable excuse, or without the employer's consent, the employee shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(8) **HOT WATER.**—That employees shall be provided with hot water free of charge.

(9) **TOOLS OF TRADE AND SPECIAL CLOTHING.**—That the employer shall supply the following, free of charge:—

(a) All necessary tools of trade;

(b) Materials and appliances required for the cleaning of machinery;

(c) Rubber aprons, gloves and top boots (where necessary for dye-house work, scouring, or other departments).
