STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 1986.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—PAKENHAM URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Pakenham Urban District within the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District:—

(1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty-five shillings for the period hereinafter set out.

(2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Five shillings for the period hereinafter set out.

(3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the first day of January, 1928, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1928, and shall be payable on the 20th day of April, 1928, at the office of the said Commission, at Pakenham East.

4. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

5. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Twelvepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Twelvepence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

PROPOSED ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES OF TOWNSHIP OF BOORT.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2638), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 17th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petition purports to be signed by not less than twenty-five ratepayers in a portion of the Shire of Gordon, and they desire that the said portion of the Shire of Gordon be included within the boundaries of the Township of Boort, which was proclaimed a township on the 22nd May, 1885.

PROPOSED BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BOORT.

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 18, section G, Parish of Boort, County of Gladstone; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said allotment to the north-east corner thereof; thence across a road to an angle on the southern boundary of the Boort Race-course and Recreation Reserve; thence north-easterly and northerly by the eastern boundary of the said reserve to the north-east angle thereof; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the said reserve a distance of 1,343 links; thence northerly across a road to the south-east angle of allotment 16, section F; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said allotment 16 a distance of 2,849 links; thence across a road to the south-west angle of allotment 14, section F; thence easterly along the southern boundary of the said allotment 14 to the north-west

angle of allotment 15b, section F; thence southerly along the western boundary of the said allotment 15b to a point on the eastern boundary of the Railway Reserve; thence southerly along the said eastern boundary of the Railway Reserve to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 15b, section F; thence easterly by a line bearing south 81 deg. 32 min. east a distance of 5,160 links; thence southerly by a line bearing south 26 deg. 20 min. west a distance of 2,005 links; thence westerly by a line bearing south 68 deg. 13 min. west a distance of 27 links; thence southerly by a line bearing south 26 deg. 20 min. west a distance of 1,487 links to the northern shore of Lake Boort; thence westerly and southerly by the shore of the said Lake Boort to a point opposite the south-east angle of allotment 19, section G; thence southerly by a line bearing south 8 deg. 30 min. west a distance of 200 links to the south-east corner of the said allotment 19; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the said allotment 19 and across a road to the point of commencement.*

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to alter the boundaries of the Township of Boort by including the portion of the Shire of Gordon above referred to within the boundaries of the said township.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the thirty-first day of January, 1922, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighth day of February, 1922, *re* protection of native game at the Benevolent Asylum and the Heatherton Sanatorium, Cheltenham, and in lieu thereof direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act* 1915.

PART OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

Allan Percy Dodd, John Ebbels, Charles William Reilly, Arthur Vivian Grimshaw, Walter James Breen, Thomas Alexander Dodd, Richard Bulmer Hall, Alfred Wilmot Smith, and James Thomas Roach, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Parish of Mooroolbark, at Olinda, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, excepting on such days, not exceeding sixteen in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the particular places set apart for that purpose.

No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

7. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

12. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the Reserve other than in enclosures set apart for the bookmakers, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

13. Every person carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in the enclosures shall, during the time he shall be so carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, wear a ticket, to be supplied by the Committee of Management, which ticket shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosures on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusement may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall offer for sale any goods, chattels, articles, or provisions on any part of the Reserve without having first obtained a permit, in writing, from the Committee of Management.

16. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use of the ground, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of Five pounds (£5) per day.

17. No person shall dig or remove, or cause to be dug or removed, any turf, sand, clay, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.

18. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed, or adapted to be used, for the exhibition of any regulation or notice, and fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

19. No person shall at any time ride, drive, or bring, or cause to be ridden, driven, or brought into the Reserve any beast, draught or burden, except in such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose.

22. No person shall shoot or discharge any firearms in the Reserve.

23. No person shall in the Reserve erect any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building, or structure, without the consent of the Committee of Management.

24. No person shall in the Reserve deliver any public address.

25. No person shall be on the Reserve in a state of intoxication, or behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance therein, or obstruct any servant of the Committee of Management, or interfere (not being a player) with any games or sports therein, or use insulting words or gestures, or otherwise misbehave.

26. No intoxicating liquor or material shall be brought into or used or consumed upon the Reserve, or any part thereof.

27. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price, which must be at per bushel for oats and at per ton for bran, hay, and straw, must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

Any blacksmith, wheelwright, or tradesman who requires to light or ignite any fire for the purpose of carrying out his trade or business shall notify the secretary of the fire brigade of his intention to light such fire at least twelve hours before he does so, and shall during the whole time the fire is alight keep same protected with sheets of iron, and shall cause some person to be in attendance on such fire whilst it remains alight, and, further, shall completely extinguish such fire as soon as he is finished with it.

4. No person shall light, or ignite, or cause or allow to be lit or ignited, or in any way use any fire in any open space on any premises, street, road, or right-of-way within the area described in the Second Schedule hereto, within a distance of 10 feet from any building or structure, and unless such person shall take all safeguards and precautions necessary to prevent such fire from spreading.

5. No person shall light or ignite any fire in the area described in the Second Schedule hereto unless such person shall first give notice, in writing, to the fire brigade of his intention to light such fire at least twelve hours before doing so.

6. Any person offending against this By-law or any part of it, shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than £5, nor more than £20, for each offence.

7. This By-law shall apply to the areas described in the schedules hereto, and shall take effect from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
