ELECTRIC SUPPLY (PUBLIC PROTECTION) REGULATIONS 1928.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915*, section 14, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the protection of the persons and property of the public, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electric Supply (Public Protection) Regulations 1928.
2. These Regulations shall come into force on the date on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.
3. No person shall within 50 yards of any electric line or works, or any undertakers in any street, kick any football to a height more than 15 feet above the ground or in such manner or direction that any such line, works, or apparatus may be hit.
4. No person shall fly any kite, balloon, or other object in such manner or direction that such object may come in contact with any electric line, works, or apparatus of any undertakers in any street or road.
5. No person shall without permission of the undertakers pull or interfere with any kite, string, or appendage wire or similar object improperly resting on or entangled in any electric wire or works in any street or road unless such act be reasonably necessary to obviate danger to persons or property.
6. No person shall throw or project, or cause to be thrown or projected, any missile or thing, or fire any shot or bullet with intent to hit any electric line or works or apparatus of any undertakers being in any street or road or in such manner or direction that any such line, works, or apparatus may be hit.
7. No person shall fell any tree standing or lop any branch being within 50 yards of any electric line of any undertakers unless such precautions have been taken as in the opinion of the court, having cognizance of the matter, are ample to prevent the tree or (as the case may be) the branch from striking such line.
8. Any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
9. Any member of the Police Force may act as informant in any prosecution for breach of any of these Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES AND RECREATION IN THE PARISH AND CITY OF BALLAARAT, AT "CANADIAN," BALLAARAT EAST.

WE, Philip Crick (Bishop of Ballaarat), Edward Christian Rogers, Daryl Ballantyne Tunbridge, John Keith, and David Ronaldson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Purposes and Recreation in the Parish and City of Ballaarat, at Ballaarat East, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. The Reserve shall be open to scouts and cubs at all times, provided that permission has been obtained from the scoutmaster should a camp be made.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, dams, or water-ways on the Reserve.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall enter any place thereon which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, excepting workmen, labourers, or scouts engaged in the maintenance thereof.

13. No person, other than a scout, shall light any fire or make use of any dam or water-way.

Fires may be lit in connexion with scout work, but such shall be lit in the proper place appointed therefor, and only under the direct control of a scoutmaster or cubmaster.

No person, other than a scout, shall bathe in any dam, and no scout or cub shall make use of any dam or water-way unless and only under the direct control of the commissioner, scoutmaster, or cubmaster.

14. Where the term commissioner, scoutmaster, cubmaster, scout, or cub is used, such term shall apply to a member of the Boy Scouts Association, incorporated by Royal Charter; and shall not include any person or persons not registered nor controlled by Imperial Scout Headquarters.

15. No person shall carry firearms in the Reserve, nor injure in any manner any animal or bird life thereon, except where, in the opinion of the Committee of Management, such animal or bird life is in the nature of a pest, and liable to cause damage.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of South Melbourne, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of St. Kilda, and the said Board of Land and Works: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of South Melbourne, the Council of the City of St. Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works do hereby make the additional Regulation following:—

REGULATION.

No person or persons shall ride or drive a bicycle, motor cycle, motor car, or other motor-driven vehicle within the Park recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition, and use of the road or Park, and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on the road or in the Park.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of such trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE CITY OF NORTHCOTE, PARISH OF JIKA JIKA, AND KNOWN AS "MERRI PARK."

THE Council of the City of Northcote, the duly appointed Committee of Management (hereinafter called the Committee) of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the City of Northcote, Parish of Jika Jika, and known as "Merri Park" (hereinafter referred to as "the Park"), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall, subject to the proviso hereinafter contained, be open to the public free of charge, provided that, on such of the days, not exceeding sixteen in any one year, any sports, games, entertainments, or amusements are conducted or take place in the Park as the Committee shall decide or approve, the Committee may impose, receive, and collect charges or entrance fees not exceeding the amounts respectively stated in the schedule to these Regulations for clubs, associations, or adult persons using or entering in or upon the Park.

2. No person shall enter any portion of the Park, when a charge is made for admission, without first paying the fee charged, unless authorized by the Committee.

3. No person shall pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates of the Park, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates or any of the buildings or seats in the Park, or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any such fences, gates, buildings, or seats, or roll stones or missiles, or remove any soil, or enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or plants, or commit any nuisance in the Park, or destroy any property or thing in the Park.

4. No person shall throw or deposit any filth, rubbish, or refuse, or cause any filth, rubbish, or refuse to fall or to be thrown or deposited upon or in the Park.

5. No person shall throw, distribute, deposit, or cause to be thrown, deposited, or distributed upon or in the Park any handbill or other printed matter.

6. No person shall throw or discharge in the Park any missile to the damage, danger, or annoyance of any person.

7. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Park.

8. No person in the Park shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit any act of indecency, or offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct.

9. Persons using the Park for any purpose shall, prior to leaving the area, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, scraps, or litter of any kind brought or made by them.

10. No person shall ride a bicycle or tricycle in or through the Park, and no motor or any delivery cart or vehicle shall enter or pass over or through the Park.

11. No person shall bring into the Park any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.

12. No dog shall be allowed in the Park except as provided in clause 11, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the Park shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

13. No betting or gambling shall be allowed within the Park.

14. No person shall in the Park wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Park, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.

15. No person shall remain in the Park at any time when lawfully directed by any servant of the Committee to leave the same.

16. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, sheep, or any other animal.

17. No person shall camp in the Park, nor erect in the Park any tent, booth, stand, buildings, or other structure.

18. No person shall hawk or sell in the Park anything of any description or offer the same for sale therein.

19. No persons shall assemble in the Park for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind or meeting of a like character.

20. No person shall play any musical instrument or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park.

21. No person shall play or practise cricket or football or any other game or engage in any sport in the Park.

22. When the Committee sees fit, it may authorize the doing of such acts or things as are prohibited by clauses numbered respectively 10, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, and 21, but permission shall not be given authorizing the playing of any game or sport under clause 21 hereof on a Sunday.

23. Nothing in these Regulations shall prevent the Committee from closing the Park, or any portion thereof, and excluding the public therefrom, or prevent such Committee from holding or permitting entertainments in the Park or any portion thereof, or excluding therefrom for such time as they think fit all adult persons but those who pay the sum fixed for admission thereto, on any day not exceeding sixteen in any one year, as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick, made under Part 7, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and numbered 73, for regulating street traffic, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and by the *Police Offences Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

(I.) The Council may, by notice in writing signed by the Mayor, or in his absence the Town Clerk, from time to time fix or appoint or alter in any street or lands or place under the control of the Council any of the following matters or things, namely:—

- (a) Safety zones.
- (b) Stopping places for licensed motor buses to pick up or set down passengers.
- (c) Parking areas for motor cars, motor cycles, and other vehicles; and
- (d) Stands for licensed motor cars or other licensed hackney carriages plying for hire.

(II.) Any safety zone, stopping place, parking area, or public stand as aforesaid shall be indicated by a notice or by a copy of the said notice, and shall thereupon be deemed to have been duly fixed or appointed under this By-law.

(III.) Any such safety zone, stopping place, parking area, or public stand as aforesaid, whether fixed or appointed by this By-law or otherwise, may be discontinued or abolished by the Council by order and by removal of the notice relating thereto.

2. No person in charge or control of any motor car, motor cycle, or vehicle or animal shall cause any obstruction to the traffic upon any street or land or place under the control of the Council.

3. A person in charge or control of any motor car, motor cycle, or vehicle or animal which, in the opinion of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, or person authorized in writing for that purpose by the Council, is causing or is likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street or any land or place under the control of the Council, shall forthwith, if so directed by such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, or authorized person, remove the same either from the vicinity of some such adjacent part of that or some other street, land, or place as is indicated by such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council or authorized person.

4. (1) No person in any street or footway in the municipality shall, without the written permission of the Council—

- (a) sell any goods or offer any goods for sale in such a way as to obstruct the free use of such street or footway by the public;
- (b) occupy any fixed stand.

(2) Every such person shall move on when requested to do so by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.

5. Any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be an offence.

6. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. This By-law shall apply throughout the whole of the municipal district of Brunswick.

In this Determination the expression "Good from hand" shall mean free from maker's faults at the time the articles are approved by and taken possession of by the employer prior to burning.

Faults proved to be due to the use of defective moulds supplied by an employer shall not be deemed to be maker's faults.

PIECE-WORK WHICH MAY BE FIXED BY AN EMPLOYER.

(7) The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in the glazed pipes and salt-glazed-ware, general pottery, tile, and terra-cotta sections of the trade at work for which piece-work prices have not been specified above, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.
