W HEREAS by section 11 of the Exhibitions Act 1890 the majority of the Exhibition Trustees for the time being at any general meeting assembled have power from time to time to make, repeal, alter, and re-enact such Rules and Regulations as they may think fit for the purpose of providing for—

- (I.) The conduct of their own proceedings.
- (II.) The due management of the affairs of the Corporation in its several departments, and the manner in which all moneys received by the Trustees shall be applied.

And when there are no Commissioners in existence under the said Act-

(III.) The use and terms to and on which the buildings or grounds (the subject of the Trust), or any part thereof, may be applied.

And whereas there are, at this 18th day of August, 1926, no Commissioners in existence under the said Act: Now therefore we, the undersigned, peing a majority of the Trustees for the time being, on this said 18th day of August, 1926, in general meeting assembled do, in pursuance of the said powers, make the following Rules and Regulations:—

PRELIMINARY.

- (I.) These Rules and Regulations may be referred to and cited as "The Exhibition Regulations 1926."
- (II.) All Rules and Regulations heretofore made in pursuance of the said powers are hereby repealed.
- (III.) In these Rules and Regulations and in the Schedule hereto, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Act" means the Exhibitions Act 1890.
 - "Arena" means that portion of the grounds enclosed and set apart for the purpose of a public playing-place for sports, competitions, and games, and includes the euclosures, grandstands, dressing-rooms, and conveniences adjacent and attached thereto.
 - "Buildings" means all permanent and temporary buildings creeted on the land described in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and includes, where consistent with the context, all fences, gates, and turnstiles.
 - "Corporation" means the Trustees appointed under the provisions and for the purposes of the said Act, and created thereby a body politic and corporate under the name of "The Exhibition Trustees."
 - "Grounds" means all that land set out and described in the said Third Schedule to the said Act, including all buildings erected or to be erected thereon, but does not include any building, or part thereof, for the time being in the use or occupation of the Parliament of Victoria, or any part of the grounds used or required as or for approaches thereto.
 - "Main hall" means all that part of the principal building extending from the outer doors facing east to the outer doors facing west, together with the north and south wines thereof, and including the organ galiery, the rooms under the same, and the passages thereto, the inner galleries or balconies, with the stairways thereto, and the several retiring-rooms and conveniences opening off the said parts, but does not include the organ, cellars, outer galleries, or dome above the level of the said inner galleries.
 - "Secretary" means the person from time to time appointed by the Trustees to be or act as their secretary.

PART I.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE TRUSTEES.

- (IV.) The Trustees shall meet from time to time at a place and hour to be fixed in the notice of meeting.
- (V.) Notice of any meeting of the Trustees, and of the business thereof, shall be delivered or transmitted by post to east Trustee at least 24 hours before the intended time of such meeting.
- (VI.) Three Trustees shall form a quorum. If that number be not present within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for the meeting, the Trustees present may adjourn to a particular date and receive notices of motion for the next or any other day of meeting.

- (VII.) The Trustees may from time to time appoint one of their number to be their chairman. The chairman shall take the chair at all meetings at which he is present, and on every question put to the vote of the Trustees shall have a deliberative and a casting vote.
- (VIII.) The chairman shall have power at any time to call a meeting of the Trustees, and shall, on the written request of at least three other Trustees, call a meeting to be held within three days.
- (IX.) At all meetings at which there is no chairman present, the Trustees may elect any other one of their number to take the chair, and such other shall, while in the chair, have, on every question put to the vote of the Trustees, a deliberative and a casting vote.
- (X.) All proceedings of the Trustees shall be entered in a minute took, and the first business at each meeting shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting, which shall, if necessary, be corrected, and, when confirmed, signed by the chairman.
- (XI.) No motion the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already been passed by the Trustees shall be entertained unless a call of the whole of the Trustees has been made for that purpose, and no motion rescinding any motion of the Trustees shall be again entertained unless by the consent of a majority of the Trustees.
- (XII.) The press shall not be admitted to any meetings of the Trustees, but the secretary shall supply the newspapers with the proceedings of the Trustees and a report of their meetings, first submitting the matter thereof to the chair-
- (XIII.) The Trustees may from time to time appoint any sub-committees or sub-committee of their number, and define their or its respective powers and duties, and determine the validity of their or its acts, and all acts or things done by any such sub-committee shall have the effect, unless overruled by the Trustees in general meeting, of an act or thing done by the Trustees as a whole.

PART II.

THE MANAGEMENT OF THE AFFAIRS OF THE CORPORATION.

- (XIV.) The Trustees may from time to time appoint proper persons to be their officers, agents, and servants, and all officers, agents, and servants of the Trustees who may be entrusted with the moneys of the Corporation shall find such security therefor as the Trustees may direct.
- (XV.) All receipts, income, and moneys from whatever source received by or on account of the Corporation shall be paid forthwith in the name of the Corporation into such bank or banks as the Trustees may from time to time direct, and shall be applied towards the maintenance of the grounds, the carrying out of any scheme the Trustees may adopt in con nexion therewith, the carrying on of any form of public entertainment, and as they shall from time to time direct.
- (XVI.) All vouchers for the expenditure of the moneys of the Corporation shall be certified to by the responsible officer of the Corporation as a guarantee of their correctness. All accounts shall be brought before a general meeting of the Trustees to be passed for payment, except current accounts for salaries and wages, which may be paid from time to time as they fall due. All cheques shall be signed by the chairman and any other trustee, and countersigned by the secretary.
- (XVII.) The chairman at each meeting of the Trustees shall affix his signature to the Government forms for the accounts submitted.
- (XVIII.) The seal of the Corporation shall be kept in the custody of the secretary, and shall be attached in the presence of the chairman and two other Trustees to all contracts entered into by the Trustees as evidencing the execution of such contracts by them, the attachment of the seal being attested by the secretary.

PART III.

DIVISION A.

General

(XIX.) Every Trustee shall have at all times, even when the grounds or any part thereof shall have been let for any purpose whatsoever, power and authority, with such other persons accompanying him as he shall think fit, to enter and inspect all or any portion of the grounds as he may desire.

(XX.) The public may be admitted into the grounds, or into any part thereof, or into any or all of the buildings thereon, at such times and on such terms as the Trustees may from time to time determine, provided that the Trustees shall not incur any liability whatsoever in respect of any person admitted free of charge into the said grounds.

(XXI.) Any person who gains admission to the grounds, or into any part thereof, otherwise than by the ordinary public entrances thereto, may be forthwith removed, and shall, not withstanding and in addition to such removal, be liable to prosecution, and, on conviction, to the penalties directed by section 11 of the said Act.

(XXII.) The Trustees may from time to time make agree ments with proper persons according to the tenor and effect of the form set forth in the schedule hereto and containing such other terms and conditions as they may in the circumstances think fit for the letting and hiring of the grounds or of any part thereof to such persons.

DIVISION B.

Conduct in the Grounds.

(XXIII.) No persons except the officers or servants of the Trustees in the execution of duty shall enter any gardens which may be enclosed or any building or part thereof which may be closed by the order of the Trustees to the public.

(XXIV.) No person shall enter into or be in the grounds while in a state of intoxication or behave therein in a disorderly fashion or create or take part therein in any disturbance or commit any act of indecency or damage in any property of the Trustees or of any tenant of the Trustees.

(XXV.) No dog shall be brought or allowed to come into the grounds unless properly held by a chain or cord, and any dog otherwise found in the grounds, and any other animal found therein may be impounded or destroyed.

(XXVI.) No person shall drive or bring into or through the grounds or any part thereof any bicycle, tricycle, motor car or any other vehicle except for the purposes of discharging goods or passengers in the grounds.

(XXVII.) No person shall spit or commit any nuisance in the grounds.

(XXVIII.) No person shall without the permission of the Trustees first had and obtained use explosives or light any fire in any part of the grounds or smoke or strike matches in any part of the buildings.

(XXIX.) No person shall without the permission of the Trustees first had and obtained in any part of the grounds sell or expose for sale any goods or distribute any handbill or advertisement or preach or conduct any meeting.

(XXX.) No person shall take part in or play any game of cricket or football or any similar game in any part of the gardens or buildings or take part in or play any game of chance in any part of the grounds.

(XXXI.) No person shall without the permission of the Trustees first had and obtained and then only in the place or places set apart for such purpose stick, post, or exhibit any bill, poster, or placard in any part of the grounds.

(XXXII.) No person shall without the permission of the Trustees first had and obtained deposit any rubbish or refuse or litter of any kind in any part of the grounds.

(XXXIII.) Any person contravening or offending against any of the foregoing Regulations (XXIII.) to (XXXII.) inclusive, may be removed from the grounds and shall notwithstanding and in addition to such removal be liable to prosecution and on conviction to the penalties directed by section 11 of the said Act.

DETERMINATION OF THE IRONMOULDERS BOARD.

⁽⁴⁾ SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day (26th January), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christianas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

⁽⁵⁾ DAY AND HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES. -All payments of wages shall be made within a quarter of an hour from the time of the worker ending work on each pay day.

⁽⁶⁾ TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT. -- Four hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

⁽⁷⁾ PIECE-WORE.—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915 that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
