NOTE.—H.P. means horse power as registered in accordance with regulations under the Motor Car Act.

MARYSVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following charges for the year 1928 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

- On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Eleven pounds or under, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence.
- On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Fifteen shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Eleven pounds, a rate of Fifteen per centum shall be charged on the amount of the municipal valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds except where a meter is used.
- For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be charged.
- For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.
- For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.
- No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.
- Such rate and charges shall be payable yearly in advance on the first day of July, 1928.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

Stock Diseases Act 1915.

REGULATIONS.—CONSOLIDATION.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of June, 1928.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Tunnecliffe | Mr. Webber.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1915*, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make orders and regulations for the purpose therein mentioned and to rescind same: And whereas from time to time the Governor in Council has made divers regulations under the powers conferred by the said Act, all of which, except certain regulations bearing date the 11th July, 1916; 13th January, 1923; 20th February, 1923; 29th May, 1923; 17th July, 1923; 3rd February, 1925; 7th December, 1925; 15th June, 1926; 20th May, 1927; 28th June, 1927; 6th July, 1927; 27th July, 1927; 5th October, 1927; 21st November, 1927; 21st December, 1927; have since been rescinded: And whereas it is desired to rescind such last-mentioned regulations and make other regulations in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-named Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. *Rescission of Previous Regulations.*—The Regulations of the Governor in Council expressed to be made under the powers conferred by the *Stock Diseases Act 1915* and of other powers enabling him in that behalf of the date mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby rescinded except as to acts, matters, and things made, done or commenced thereunder.

2. *What to be deemed Infectious or Contagious Disease and Diseased Stock.*—The diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule are hereby declared to be contagious or infectious diseases, and all stock affected with any such disease, or stock in direct or indirect contact with any such stock, or which shall graze or travel over lands where disease is known to exist, are hereby proclaimed to be diseased stock.

3. *Interpretation of Terms.*—In construing these Regulations the following words, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

"Australasian States" shall mean all States of the Commonwealth of Australia and all Dependencies of the said States.

"Cattle" shall include any bull, cow, ox, or calf.

"Horse" shall include any stallion, mare, gelding, or foal.

"Swine" shall include any boar, sow, barrow, or sucker.

"Sheep" shall include any ram, ewe, wether, or lamb.

"Poultry" shall include any kind of living land and water bird bred or reared in a domestic state.

"Chief Inspector of Stock" shall include officer acting for the Chief Inspector of Stock in his absence.

4. *Stock to which Part I. of the Stock Diseases Act 1915 is extended.*—All the sections of Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1915* shall extend to all stock of the kinds mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto.

5. *Prohibition of the Introduction of Stock found to be Diseased.*—The introduction of any stock mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto into the State, either by land or sea, found to be diseased stock within the meaning of the *Stock Diseases Act* and these Regulations is prohibited.

6. *These Regulations not to authorize the Introduction of certain Stock except from Australasian States.*—Nothing in these Regulations shall be taken to authorize the introduction into Victoria of stock save and except from the Australasian States and the Dependencies thereof or any part of the Commonwealth of Australia, and the introduction of stock from the Australasian States or any part of the Commonwealth will only be permitted when all the provisions of every law and these Regulations and every regulation or order of the Governor in Council has been complied with.

7. *Transgression of the Regulations Forbidden.*—No person shall do or attempt to do, cause or permit to be done or to be attempted to be done, or assist in doing, or attempting to do any act forbidden by these Regulations, or obtain or endeavour to obtain, or assist any one in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any certificate or authority under these Regulations, or forge any such certificate or authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently-obtained certificate or authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such certificate or authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of these Regulations.

PART I.—INTRODUCTION OF STOCK INTO VICTORIA.

8. *Inspector's Authority required for the Introduction of Stock.*—No one shall introduce into Victoria, either by land or sea, any stock mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto coming from any of the Australasian States or any part of the Commonwealth of Australia, or any hides, skin, hair, horns, bones, blood, or animal products without the authority in writing of an Inspector of Stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority and these Regulations; and no inspector shall grant any such authority until he is satisfied that all the provisions of every law and of every regulation or order of the Governor in Council for the time being in force with respect to the introduction of such stock have been complied with. Any Inspector of Stock, officer of Customs, or member of the Police Force may detain and prevent the travelling of stock newly introduced into Victoria, by land or sea, until these Regulations have been complied with. Provided always that any inspector may, on the authority of the Chief Inspector of Stock, refuse to issue such authority for any specified time.

9. Any Inspector of Stock may order that any stock or fittings shall be disinfected, smeared, or treated in a suitable manner prior to their introduction into Victoria, and may order such crush or other examination as he may deem fit; and the owner shall carry out such instructions and pay all expenses incidental thereto.

10. *Places at which Stock may be Introduced.*—No one, except under special circumstances, of which the Chief Inspector of Stock shall be the judge, shall introduce any stock at any place not being one of the places mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and any person so desiring to introduce such stock shall give not less than twenty-four hours or more than ninety-six hours' notice, in writing, to the inspector in charge of any such place of his intention to introduce any such stock thereat on a given date. When, under special circumstances, the Chief Inspector of Stock has authorized the introduction of stock at other than a place mentioned in the Fourth Schedule, the owner shall pay such fee and expenses as are determined by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

11. *Duties of Inspectors before Authorizing the Introduction of Stock.*—No inspector shall authorize any stock to be introduced or travel until he has inspected such stock, and is satisfied that the same are free from any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, and has counted the same, or been otherwise satisfied as to the number of stock to be introduced, and has received a statutory declaration made by the owner or person in charge as hereinafter provided.

12. *Introduction of Saddle, Draught, or Pack Horses, Mules or Asses, or Working Bullocks.*—In the case of the introduction of saddle, draught, or pack horses, mules or asses, and working bullocks used bona fide for the purpose of riding, draught, or carrying burdens having been once inspected, special authority may be granted by an Inspector of Stock, and continue in force until revoked by a notice from such inspector to enable such horses, mules, asses, or working bullocks to pass and repass without further inspection between any portion of either of the adjoining States of Victoria.

13. No Inspector of Stock shall authorize the introduction of any stock by sea unless such stock are carried on a vessel known as a "clean vessel" as hereinafter provided.

The Chief Inspector of Stock may from time to time declare any vessel to be a clean vessel under these Regulations, or may revoke such declaration; but no such declaration shall be made unless the master or the owners furnish satisfactory evidence to the Chief Inspector of Stock that such vessel has not during the preceding three months been in any port outside the Australasian States or the Dominion of New Zealand, or received on board stock from any place outside such States or Dominion, or from any vessel which during the preceding three months has been outside such States or Dominion, and every vessel not proclaimed a clean vessel shall be deemed to be an unclean vessel.

14. *Destruction of Stock found to be Diseased.*—If any stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto, whether on board any vessel on which they may be introduced, or after they may be landed, or have travelled, or been conveyed by rail, be found to be diseased stock, they may be forthwith seized and destroyed by an Inspector of Stock in compliance with section 10 of the *Stock Diseases Act 1915*, or such inspector may, in lieu of seizing and destroying such stock, by writing under his hand, order that such stock may be inoculated, dressed, or vaccinated to his satisfaction in or with such medicaments or vaccines as he may prescribe on board such vessel, or at a specified place, within a defined time to be stated in such order; or be within a further time also specified in such order removed from Victoria or Victorian waters unless the conditions of such order relative to treatment are complied with within the time named in that behalf, or such further time as an Inspector of Stock may from time to time by writing under his hand allow, any Inspector of Stock may seize and destroy all such stock in contravention of this regulation arriving in Victoria in such manner as he may think fit.

15. *Expenses to be Borne by Owners.*—All expenses connected with the detention, treatment, or slaughter of such stock from time of the arrival of such stock until the same may be destroyed or released, including the expenses of the destruction of any such stock as may be destroyed, and of the removal and disposition of the carcasses of any such stock as may be destroyed or die, shall be borne and paid by the owners thereof; and no Inspector of Stock shall authorize the introduction of any such stock until every claim for expense incurred has been satisfied by the owners of such stock. The proceeds of the sale of anything seized under these Regulations and sold shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

16. *Fodder or Fittings.*—No fodder or fittings shall be removed from any ship or vessel without the written authority of an Inspector of Stock, and any such fodder or fittings shall be subjected to such treatment as the inspector may direct.

17. *Animals for Circus or Menagerie Purposes.*—The introduction into Victoria of animals forming part of or used for circus or menageries shall be permitted after inspection from any State provided they conform with all regulations to which each of such animals are subject for the time being.

18. *Stock, exclusive of Pigs and Poultry, from New South Wales, South Australia, and Tasmania.*—The introduction of stock (exclusive of pigs and poultry) from New South Wales, South Australia, and Tasmania will be permitted provided all the requirements of these Regulations have been complied with, and they are accompanied by a declaration duly completed in the form of Schedule A.S. hereunder:—

PART II.

THE PREVENTION OF THE SPREAD OF DISEASE IN VICTORIA.

28. An Inspector may declare Premises on which he has discovered Disease a Quarantine District.—When an inspector finds any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, except the diseases known as Scab and Influenza or Catarrh in sheep, to exist in stock, he shall forthwith deliver a notice under his hand of the existence of such disease to the occupier of the premises where the diseased stock is found, and thereupon such premises and all lands and buildings contiguous thereto in the same or other occupation, and all other lands and buildings the inspector may from time to time think fit to include, and on the occupiers of which, if any, he shall serve notice shall become a quarantine district.

29. Steps to be taken by an Inspector after Discovery of Disease.—When an inspector delivers a notice of the existence of disease he shall forthwith forward a copy thereof to the Chief Inspector of Stock, and such district, or part thereof, as is therein described shall remain a quarantine district for such time as may be determined by the Chief Inspector of Stock.

30. Owners of Diseased Stock may be required to keep Notices Affixed.—The inspector may from time to time direct persons in the occupation of any premises included in a quarantine district to affix and keep affixed notices to such effect, on such portion of such premises and in such manner as the inspector may order, and such persons shall affix and keep affixed the same accordingly.

31. Inspector may Slaughter or Seize Diseased Stock.—When an inspector finds diseased stock he may either slaughter or seize the same, and take such other steps to eradicate disease as he may deem expedient, as also to insure the isolation and safe custody of any such stock, and he shall at once report the circumstances to the Chief Inspector of Stock.

32. Stock not to be Introduced into or Removed from Quarantine without Authority.—No stock shall be introduced into or removed out of any quarantine district without the written authority of an inspector, and then only in accordance with the conditions contained in such authority; and any inspector or any constable may require that any animal mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto, or thing moved out of a quarantine district in contravention of these Regulations, or of the said part of the said Act, be forthwith taken back at the cost of the owner within the limits of such district, and may enforce and execute such requisition.

33. Inspector may order Premises, Fittings, Carcasses, &c., to be Treated or Disinfected.—The inspector may direct any quarantine, or any portion thereof, or carcass, fodder, litter, or anything thereon with which diseased stock has been in contact, or any clothes of any one who has been in contact with diseased stock, to be dealt with, treated, or disinfected in

such manner as he may think fit; and all persons shall permit the same to be carried out and in such manner as directed by the inspector.

34. *Owners to Treat or Disinfect Stock for Diseases.*—The Chief Inspector may, direct the owners of any stock of the kinds mentioned in the Third Schedule to submit them to inoculation, vaccination, or any other treatment to prevent the spread, or for the cure of any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule, or for the purpose of disinfecting them, and the owner of such stock shall with all diligence carry out such directions.

35. *Use of Contagious Abortion Vaccine Prohibited.*—No person without the written consent of the Chief Inspector of Stock shall use on any stock any vaccine containing the bacillus of contagious abortion in live form.

36. *Diseased Stock not to be Exposed for Sale at Market or Travelling, &c.*—Any person who exposes in a market or other public place where stock are exposed for sale, or exposes in any sale-yard, whether public or private, or places in any lair or place adjacent to or connected with any market or where stock are commonly placed before exposure for sale, or sends or causes to be carried on a railway or on a canal or river, or by any other inland navigation, or on a coasting vessel, or carries, leads, or drives, or causes to be carried, led, or driven on a highway or thoroughfare, or keeps on any common or on the side of a highway, or unless such stock be constantly followed and kept in sight on any unenclosed land, or in any field or other place insufficiently fenced, any stock of any of the said kinds infected with any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule, shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

37. *Stock not to be Moved from or into a Quarantine District.*—No person without the written authority of an Inspector of Stock shall drive, convey, or otherwise move any stock into any quarantine district from any place without the boundaries thereof or from any place within such district to any other place therein or from within any such district across the boundaries thereof.

38. *Owners of Diseased Stock to give Notice forthwith.*—The owner or person having the charge of any stock affected with any of the diseases mentioned in the Second Schedule shall forthwith upon discovering that such stock is affected, give notice to the Chief Inspector or to the inspector of the district, and for the purposes of this section every such owner or person shall be deemed to have discovered that such stock was so affected as soon as the same was in fact so affected.

39. *Owners of Stock neglecting Notice till Discovery of Disease.*—If any inspector shall find any stock to be diseased before notice thereof has been given by the owners or persons having the charge or custody thereof, every such owner and person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

Provided that no notice if given to any inspector after he has entered upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting the stock thereon shall be deemed a notice for the purpose of this section

40. *Anthrax.—Steps to be taken on Outbreak of Anthrax.*—Upon any stock of any kind in Victoria dying of anthrax or under circumstances that might reasonably suggest that such stock was so affected, the owner of such stock, or the occupier of the land upon which the same then is, in addition to complying with every provision contained in the preceding Regulation, shall—

- (a) forthwith isolate any stock which has been in direct or indirect contact with such diseased stock;
- (b) forthwith plug, so as to prevent the oozing of blood therefrom, the nostrils and other natural openings of the carcass of any animal which has died or is suspected to have died from anthrax; with tow, wool, hay, or other suitable material, such plug in each case to be saturated with a solution of carbolic acid or other effective disinfectant;
- (c) prevent any person not being an Inspector of Stock from cutting, removing, or otherwise interfering with the skin of any animal which has died, or is suspected to have died from anthrax, except for the purpose of microscopical examination or other test, and shall report the circumstances to the Chief Inspector of Stock.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE LABELLING OF MEAT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of June, 1928.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919 (No. 3041) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby amend the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1924 as follows:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1928, and shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1924, and any regulation amending the same, and shall come into operation one week after publication in the Government Gazette.

2. For the purposes of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“ Chilled meat ” means meat which has been reduced in temperature below 36° Fahrenheit, but which has not been frozen;

“ Frozen meat ” means meat which has been reduced in temperature until it is frozen;

“ Imported ” means imported from any place outside Victoria;

“ Meat ” includes carcass.

3. Every person who sells any meat which has been chilled or frozen shall attach or cause to be attached thereto, or to the package containing the same, a label stating distinctly and legibly in printed or written characters that such meat is chilled or frozen as the case may be, and where the meat is imported the word “ imported ” shall be included in the label.

And the Honorable William James Beckett, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Poisons Act 1927.

POISONS (CYANIDE) REGULATIONS 1928.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of June, 1928.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Tunnecliffe

Mr. Webber.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Poisons Act 1927* (12 Geo. V. No. 3542) His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following, such of which apply to the sale, distribution, or purchase of cyanide of potassium to be used for mining purposes, or the possession or safe custody thereof to be so used, having been approved by the Honorable the Minister of Mines:—

Preliminary.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Poisons (Cyanide) Regulations 1928*, and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1928.

2. In the construction of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

“Act” means the *Poisons Act 1927*.

“Authorized person” means a medical practitioner, a pharmaceutical chemist, a certificated dealer in poisons under the Principal Act, a licensee, or a wholesale dealer.

“Board” means the Pharmacy Board of Victoria.

“Certificate” means a certificate by a police officer, authorizing the purchase and sale of cyanide.

“Cyanide” means cyanide of potassium as defined by this regulation.

“Licence” means a licence granted by the Board under these Regulations.

“Licensee” means the holder of a licence under the Act.

“Order” means an order by a police officer authorizing the sale of cyanide.

“Permit” means a permit granted by the Board under these Regulations.

“Principal Act” means the *Poisons Act 1915*.

“Purchaser” means any buyer of cyanide.

“Schedule” means schedule to these Regulations.

“Trade purposes” means for the purpose of any profession, trade, or industry as defined by these Regulations.

“Vendor” means any seller of cyanide.

Cyanide of Potassium.

The expression “cyanide of potassium” includes cyanide of potassium, any other metallic cyanide (such as the cyanides of potassium, calcium, mercury, zinc, or silver); all poisonous compounds of cyanogen (such as potassium ferrocyanide, yellow prussiate of potash, potassium ferricyanide, red prussiate of potash, the thiocyanides, and sulphocyanides), and any admixture or preparation thereof.

Exempted Compounds, &c.

Any compound admixture or preparation of cyanogen which by its nature is not capable of being used for the purpose of poisoning animals or native game may, on proof to the Board that it is not capable of being used in evasion of Part I. of the Act, be exempted by resolution of the Board from the provisions of the said Part, but the Board may at any time it thinks fit revoke the said resolution.

“Trade Purposes.”

Any profession, business, trade, or industry which requires to use cyanide for manufacturing purposes or for any trade process, or for any scientific purpose—but not for resale or any illegal purpose—shall be deemed to be a profession, business, trade, or industry within the meaning of section 5 (d) of the Act, and in respect of which a permit to purchase cyanide for trade purposes may be granted by the Board in pursuance of section 8 of the Act.

Licences—Application.

3. Any person desirous of obtaining a licence to sell cyanide for mining purposes shall make application to the Board in the form or to the effect of Form A in the schedule, and shall pay the prescribed fee, and shall furnish to the Board therewith two testimonials—as to his fitness to hold a licence, and as to his character—from two ratepayers residing in the district where his business is being or intended to be carried on.

Grant of Licence.

4. The Board, if satisfied that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold a licence, may grant a licence to him in the form or to the effect of Form B in the schedule, or the Board may before granting a licence call upon the applicant to furnish such further evidence as it thinks fit and to verify it by statutory declaration.

Conditions of Licence.

5. Each licence is issued subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(a) That the cyanide to be sold by the licensee shall be used solely for mining purposes.

(b) The licensee shall safely keep all cyanide in his possession in a suitable receptacle securely locked and branded legibly and distinctly “POISON” in red letters.

(c) The licensee shall not keep or sell any cyanide except in or at the premises specified in the licence.

Duration of Licence.

6. Licences issued by the Board under section 8 of the Act shall (unless cancelled) be in force from the date of issue until 31st December next following.

Renewal of Licence.

7. All licences issued by the Board shall expire on the 31st December in each year, but may be renewed on application in writing and on the payment of the prescribed fee.

Fee Payable.

8. The fee for the grant or renewal of a licence shall be Five shillings, and shall be paid on the application for the licence and for the renewal on the first day of January in each year.

Application for Permit.

9. Any person desirous of obtaining a permit to purchase cyanide to be used for mining purposes in quantities of not less than twenty-eight pounds or for trade purposes—but not for re-sale—shall make application to the Board in the form or to the effect of Form C in the schedule, and shall pay the prescribed fee, and shall furnish to the Board therewith two testimonials as to his fitness to purchase cyanide and as to his character from two ratepayers residing in the district where the mining operations are carried on, or where the business in which the cyanide is to be used is situate.

Grant of Permit.

10. The Board, if satisfied that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold a permit, may grant a permit to him in the form or to the effect of Form D in the schedule, or the Board, before granting a permit may call upon the applicant to furnish such further evidence as it thinks fit and to verify it by statutory declaration.

Conditions of Permit.

11. Each permit is issued subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(a) That the cyanide shall be used solely for the purpose or purposes specified in the permit.

(b) The holder of a permit shall keep all cyanide while not in use under safe custody in a suitable receptacle securely locked and branded legibly and distinctly “POISON” in red letters.

(c) The cyanide shall not be kept elsewhere than at the mine or business premises.

Duration of Permit.

12. Permits issued by the Board under section 8 of the Act shall (unless cancelled) be in force from the date of issue until the 31st December next following.

Renewal of Permit.

13. All permits issued by the Board shall expire on 31st December in each year, but may be renewed on application in writing and on payment of the prescribed fee.

Fee Payable.

14. The fee for the grant or renewal of a permit shall be Two shillings and sixpence.

Application for Purchaser's Certificate.

15. Any person desirous of buying cyanide (other than for mining or trade purposes) shall make application in writing for a certificate to the police officer in charge of the police station nearest to the place of business of the seller from whom he proposes to buy such cyanide. The application shall be in the form or to the effect of Form E in the schedule hereto and shall be lodged in duplicate with the said officer together with a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of Form F in the said schedule.

Order and Certificate.

16. If after reasonable inquiry such officer is satisfied that the applicant requires such cyanide for the lawful purpose specified in the application, he shall give to the applicant a written order in the form set out in Form G in the schedule, addressed to the seller, authorizing such seller to sell to the applicant the cyanide mentioned in such order, and stating therein the purpose for which it is required. He shall also give to the applicant a certificate in the Form H in the said schedule. No fee is payable in respect of any certificate or order.

Duty of Vendors.

17. No vendor shall sell or deliver any cyanide to the purchaser unless the purchaser presents the said order and certificate before the sale or delivery to him.

Procedure where Full Quantity Authorized is not Purchased at one Time.

18. Should any quantity of cyanide be sold less than authorized in the order the vendor shall at the time of sale endorse on the order and certificate particulars of the date of sale and the quantity actually sold, and shall sign the same, and the purchaser shall also sign it. At any time after the expiration of the time mentioned in the order and certificate as the period in which the poison actually sold is intended to be used the vendor may sell to the same person any quantity of the same poison sufficient to make up the difference between the amount already sold to such person and the quantity mentioned in the order, provided that the vendor shall endorse the particulars of each sale on the said order and certificate, and the purchaser shall sign such endorsement.

Validity of Order and Certificate.

19. No order or certificate shall have any validity whatsoever for the purpose of sale or purchase of cyanide after the full quantity of cyanide mentioned therein has been purchased in accordance with the provisions of the order and certificate, nor after six months from its issue.

Retention of Orders and Certificates.

20. The vendor shall retain the order and preserve it as a record for not less than three years. The purchaser shall retain the certificate as long as he has any cyanide in his possession. The vendor shall produce the order and the purchaser shall produce the certificate to any police officer or inspector of the Board on demand.

Poisons Book.

21. At the time of sale and before delivery of any cyanide the vendor shall fill in and the purchaser shall sign the entry in the poisons book kept under the Principal Act.

False Information.

22. Any person giving any false information in answer to any question prescribed by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

Possession of Cyanide.

23. No person (other than an authorized person) shall have any cyanide in his possession unless he holds a permit or a certificate in the prescribed form.

No person (other than an authorized person) shall have any cyanide in his possession, or use or cause to be used at any place any quantity of cyanide in excess of that specified in the permit or certificate.

Disposal of Cyanide.

24. No person in possession of cyanide shall dispose of any cyanide or use or permit the same to be used except in accordance with the Act and Regulations.

No Gift of Cyanide.

25. No person shall dispose of any cyanide by gift.

Custody and Labelling of Containers.

26. Cyanide shall in all cases be kept by the person who possesses it in safe custody in a closed container duly labelled in accordance with the Poisons Acts and when not in use under lock and key.

Questions to be Asked of Applicant for Certificate and Order.

27. Each applicant to a police officer for an order and certificate to purchase cyanide shall truthfully answer the questions put to him by such officer. The questions set out in Form F in the schedule or questions to the same effect shall be asked by the officer. The questions and answers shall be dated and shall be signed by the applicant, and the officer.

Vendor's Questions.

28. Each purchaser of cyanide on an order and certificate shall truthfully answer the questions put to him by the vendor. The questions set out in Form I in the schedule shall be asked by the vendor.

Conditions of Sale by Wholesale Dealers and Authorized Persons.

29. Every wholesale dealer and authorized person entitled to sell cyanide shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) Shall safely keep all cyanide in his possession in a suitable receptacle securely locked and branded legibly and distinctly "Poison" in red letters.
- (b) On sale of any cyanide shall—
 - (1) Deliver the same to the purchaser securely and safely contained in a substantial package so as to avoid risk of breakage or leakage.
 - (2) Label both the package itself and any other covering or wrapper with the words "Poison" (and in large letters) "CYANIDE OF POTASSIUM," together with the name and address of the vendor.
- (c) Shall comply with the other provisions of these Regulations with respect to the production of permits, orders, and certificates entries in the Poisons Book, and signature of purchaser, sales by correspondence, &c.
- (d) Shall satisfy himself before the sale is completed of the purpose for which the cyanide is required by the purchaser.

Conditions of Sales by Correspondence.

30. In cases where sales and purchases of cyanide are made by correspondence the following conditions shall apply:—

- (a) The purchaser shall forward the permit or order and certificate with his letter; or,
- (b) If by telegram shall—(1) state in the telegram that he holds a permit or an order and certificate; and (2) shall forward it to the vendor by the next post or produce it to him within forty-eight hours of the purchase.
- (c) The vendor must not sell or forward cyanide to any correspondent who is unknown to him.
- (d) The letter, telegram, and order shall be preserved by the vendor. The permit or certificate shall be returned by the vendor forthwith to the purchaser.

Sales by Wholesale Dealers.

31. A wholesale dealer is entitled to sell cyanide in the ordinary course of wholesale dealing, subject to the provisions of the Poisons Act 1915 of the Act and of these Regulations, to any authorized person holding a permit, or for mining purposes, or for trade purposes, but not for the sale.

Inquiries and Entries.

32. Every wholesale dealer who sells or disposes of any cyanide shall before delivery thereof to the purchaser inquire his name, place of abode, and occupation, and the purpose for which such cyanide is required, and shall thereupon make a faithful entry of such sale, specifying the cyanide and the quantity thereof, and all such particulars so given by the purchaser, together with the day of the month and the year of such sale in a book to be kept by the wholesale dealer for that purpose in the form following, namely:—

Entry to be Signed.

33. Every such entry shall be signed by the person making the same and also by the purchaser, unless he declares himself unable to write, in which event the person making the entry shall add thereto the words "Purchaser cannot write."

Poisons Book.

34. The Poisons Book required to be kept by the Principal Act by vendors of poisons shall be the book in which an entry must be made at the time of sale of any cyanide in accordance with section 7 of the Act.

Form of Warrant.

35. The warrant mentioned in section 10 of the Act may be in the form or to the effect of Form J in the schedule.

Authorized Officer.

36. For the purpose of enforcing these Regulations every police officer in Victoria and every inspector of the Board and of the Department of Fisheries and Game shall be deemed to be an authorized officer.

Penalty.

37. A person guilty of a breach of any of the preceding Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

BY-LAW No. 44.

A By-law of the City of Box Hill made under section 75 of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 44, for regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any animals in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the Municipality of Box Hill order as follows:—

1. No person shall at any time, in any portion of the City of Box Hill, keep or place, or allow to be kept or placed within thirty feet of any portion of any dwelling-house or place of living or sleeping any cow or cows, horse or horses.

2. No person shall, except as hereinafter provided, keep or place, or allow to be kept or placed at any time any cows or horses on a less area of enclosed land than 5,000 square feet per animal.

Provided, however, that more than one cow or one horse may be kept on a less area of open land than 5,000 square feet, if such animals are securely housed in a stable or confined in an enclosure which is paved in bricks, concrete, pitchers, flags, or other material to the satisfaction of the Council.

3. No person shall keep or place, or allow to be kept or placed on any land within the boundaries of the East and West Wards of the City any bull for stud purposes, unless such animal while accompanied by other cattle is confined within a structure approved by the Council.

4. This By-law shall, save as herein otherwise provided, apply to the whole of the municipal district of Box Hill, and shall come into force on the day after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

5. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law will, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty of not more than Two pounds per animal so kept or placed or allowed to be kept or placed. (Maximum penalty, £20.)

Health Act 1919.
SHIRE OF GOULBURN.
BY-LAW No. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Goulburn made under Part IV., Division 1, of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 11, for the collection, removal, and disposal of night-soil.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Goulburn, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Goulburn, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in all that area comprising the Water Trust area of the Township of Nagambie.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Inspector” means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“The Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of such pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause such pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged), cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall always provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape, and formed of galvanized iron of not less than twenty-two gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with the night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be water-tight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles. Each such pan shall have a capacity of one and a quarter cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of fourteen inches, a diameter of not less than fourteen inches, and a suitable rim or lug to permit an air-tight lid to be fixed. The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which shall be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is any pan-closet or urinal shall—(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and (b) when required by an inspector, effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within two and one-half inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or the person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council, with its contents, from the premises, and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pan shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place where the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches, such trenches shall be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in depth nor exceed two feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers of not more than six inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below the ground-level a covering of at least six inches in depth of clean thoroughly broken-up soil upon the night-soil and pan washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of night-soil and washings in the trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavating another trench in a position parallel to but not less than twelve inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed or grass or forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil shall have been deposited, provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall, immediately on being emptied, be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan, after the disposal of its contents, and after being cleansed in the manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall on every occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—(a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water, subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at sixty pounds pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight chamber; or (b) thoroughly washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in aqueous solution containing not less than one per cent. of accol, cylin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or (c) thoroughly washing or scrubbing in water, afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall be thereafter renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the depot, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any night-soil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury or cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The Inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yard, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they, for every breach, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

By-Law No. 35.

A. By-law of the Shire of Mornington made under the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 35, relating to the collection and disposal of night-soil.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in that portion of the Shire of Mornington which is bounded as follows:—On the east by Beleura Road and on or towards the south by Point Nepean-road to its intersection with Tanti Creek; thence southerly along and by the said creek to Jack's-road; thence westerly along the said Jack's-road to the Tyabb-road; thence by Tyabb-road to its intersection with Point Nepean-road; thence again by Point Nepean-road to its intersection with Strachan's-road, and bounded on or towards the west by Strachan's-road to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; and thence on or towards the north by the said shore from Strachan's-road to Beleura-road; and, unless exempted by the said Council, shall apply to every house, building, and premises in the said area.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Inspector” means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“The Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service heretofore or hereinafter provided for and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet and shall provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22 gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each such pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises and another pan, thoroughly cleansed and in good order, shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken-up soil upon the night-soil and pan-washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

(a) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of accol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or

(b) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, trade creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 292.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

1. SLEEPING BERTHS AND RESERVED SEATS.

The charges for the cancellation of sleeping berths shall be as follow:—

	Inter-state.	Local.

If notification of cancellation be given on date prior to train leaving starting point . .	5 0	2 6
If notification of cancellation be given on date for which berth is booked, but not less than one hour prior to the departure of the train from the starting point . .	10 0	5 0

The amount paid for the reservation of a sleeping berth shall not be refunded unless notice of cancellation be given as prescribed above.

No refund shall be made of the amount paid for the reservation of a seat in a train when such reservation is cancelled.

2. BOY SCOUTS AND GIRL GUIDES TRAVELLING ON INTERSTATE JOURNEYS.

The following fares shall be charged Boy Scouts and Girl Guides travelling on interstate journeys:—

Under sixteen years of age, one-third fare for single journey.
Sixteen years of age and over, two-thirds fare for single journey.
Minimum number six.

One Scout-master accompanying each party shall be charged two-thirds fare on single journey

3. PACKAGES OR PARCELS ACCOMPANYING PASSENGERS IN CARRIAGES.

One or more packages or parcels, not exceeding 14 lb. in weight, for personal use and not for disposal may be carried as portion of the free luggage allowance, subject to the conditions that—

- (a) No article shall be taken into a carriage unless it be of such a size as to admit of it being put under the seat or in the rack without danger or inconvenience to other passengers, and without encroaching on the space to which other passengers are entitled.
- (b) No article of an offensive or objectionable nature shall be taken into a carriage
