By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1915, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder as special days to be observed as Bank Holidays and Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF WYCHEPROOF.

PROPOSED RE-SUBDIVISION.

In pursuance and the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer or a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to be at least one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll of the Shire of Wycheproof, and they desire that the said shire be re-subdivided by subdivision of the existing Tyrrell Riding into two separate ridings, to be called the North Tyrrell and South Tyrrell Ridings.

The petitioners state that the reasons for the petition are:-

- That the Tyrrell Riding as now constituted is the largest riding in the Shire of Wycheproof, and its inhabitants contribute forty-two per centum of the annual revenue collected by the said Shire of Wycheproof.
- The said Tyrrell Riding is represented and served by three councilors only, whereas the three sister ridings of such shire, whose aggregate yield in revenue to the said shire equals filty-eight per centum of the rates, are each represented by three councillors, making a total of nine councillors for territory contributing fifty-eight per centum of rates as against three councillors for territory contributing forty-two per centum of the rates.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to re-subdivide the Shire of Wycheproof in accordance with the request of the petitioners.

SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF SWAN HILL AND ANNEXATION TO SHIRE OF WYCHEPROOF.

In pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Swan Hill described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Swan Hill and annexed to the Tyrrell Riding of the Shire of Wycheproof.

Area Described in Petition.

Commencing from a point on the north-west corner of the boundary of the Parish of Boorong; thence running due north to a point on the east and west road on the northern boundary of allotment nine, Parish of Pirro; thence due easterly along the northern boundary of the Parish of Pier Millan to the western boundary of the Parish of Gerahmin; thence southensterly to the edge of Lake Tyrrell; thence casterly along the northern boundary of the Parish of Lianiduck; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Lianiduck, Moortworra, Moah, and Tyrrell to a point on the south-west corner of the Parish of Waitchie; thence casterly along the northern boundary of the Parish of Berriwillock; thence southerly along the centre of the bed of Lalbert Creek to the northern boundary of the Parish of Wangie.

The petitioners state that the reasons for the proposed severance are:-

- That the seat of local government of the Shire of Swan Hill, in which the territory so sought to be annexed is contained, is situated so far distant from such territory that the reasonable wants and requirements of the ratepayers therein cannot be satisfactorily ascertained or given effect to.
- That there is a particularly strong community of interest prevailing between the ratepayers living in such territory sought to be annexed and the ratepayers of the present Tyrrell Riding of the Shire of Wycheproof.
- The commercial and social interests of both sections are concentrated in the same business centres; and, further, the main railway line from Charlton to Kulwin, together with the north-western highway, runs in a direct northerly line through a big percentage of the holdings of such ratepayers.
- That the direct rail and road service referred to in the preceding paragraph provides excellent facilities for ratepayers living in the area sought to be annexed to get in constant touch with the councillors and officers the said Tyrrell Riding, whose duties frequently bring them into immediate proximity of the territory sought to be annexed.
- The present geographical situation of the seat of the Shire of Swan Hill from the said territory sought to be annexed is such that the facilities provided by the railway and road service hereinbefore referred to are nullified and rendered useless to the petitioners, many of whom have to travel over fifty miles to consult on municipal matters.
- The costs and expenses relative to the administration of such territory sought to be annexed would be considerably reduced by virtue of the existence and availability to councillors, officers, and engineer of the rail and road facilities referred to aforesaid.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Shire of Swan Hill, and annex such area to the Tyrrell Riding of the Shire of Wycheproof.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals without the permission of the Committee of Management.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of eattle.

For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, without the permission of the Committee of Management. Management.

As No person shall have use of the Reserve or Hall without the permission of the Committee of Management. Such permission shall not be unreasonably nor arbitrarily withheld. but must be conditional on the payment to the Committee of such fees as the Committee may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

9. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, entertainments, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time

determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

10. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of these Regulations shall be held by the Committee and used for the improvement of the Reserve and Hall

That by virtue of a Writ issued by the Governor of the State of Victoria under authority of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, a poll was taken under the previsions of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1925, on the seventeenth day of November, 1923, for the election of three senators for the State of Victoria.

2. That the following six candidates, viz.:

14. The several candidates and their supporters, in opening and carrying on the political campaign, urged their respective supporters to vote in manner set forth in paragraph 11, or that set forth in paragraph 12, as the case might be.

15. On the twelfth day of November, 1928, the said John Keatly Forsyth died.

16. The Commonwealth Electoral Officer hastily caused fresh ballot-papers to be prepared, omitting the name of the said John Keatly Forsyth, and proceeded to distribute such ballot-papers as and when available among the various Returning Officers throughout Victoria, with instructions to substitute them for those previously sent forth, but in many of the more remote parts of the State, the new forms did not reach their destination before pulling day. destination before polling day.

17. The specimen cards mentioned in paragraph 11 hereof had been distributed among the electors, and could not be recalled. In many districts, supporters of the Labour Party endeavoured to correct the effect of those cards by distributing further copies of these cards with a line drawn through the figure "5" and the name "John Keatly Forsyth," leaving the cards in other respects unaltered.

18. The said John Barnes and Albert Edward Howarth Blakey, and your petitioner were the candidates supported by the Labour Party, and the said Robert Charles Dunlop Elliott, Harry Sutherland Wightman Lawson, and the said John Keatly Forsyth (until his death) were the candidates supported by the Nationalist Party, and after the death of the said John Keatly Forsyth the supporters of the Nationalist Party urged the electors to indicate their preference on polling day as follows: polling day as follows:-

14. The several candidates, and their supporters, in opening and carrying on the political campaign, urged their respective supporters to vote in manner set forth in paragraph 11, or that set forth in paragraph 12, as the case might be.

15. On the twelfth day of November, 1928, the said John Keatly Forsyth died.

16. The Commonwealth Electoral Officer hastily caused fresh ballot-papers to be prepared, omitting the name of the said John Keatly Forsyth, and proceeded to distribute such ballot-papers as and when available among the various Returning Officers throughout Victoria, with instructions to substitute them for those previously sent forth, but in many of the more remote parts of the State, the new forms did not reach their destiration before realized. destination before polling day.

17. The specimen cards mentioned in paragraph 11 hereof had been distributed among the electors, and could not be recalled. In many districts, supporters of the Labour Party endeavoured to correct the effect of those cards by distributing further copies of these cards with a line drawn through the figure "5" and the name "John Keatly Forsyth," leaving the cards in other respects unaltered.
