REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES (SWIMMING POOL) AT BRANXHOLME.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1915, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 5th June, 1929, as a site for Public purposes (Swimming Pool) in the Parish and Town of Branxholme.

REGULATIONS.

1. On week days, from 1st January to 30th April, and from 1st November to 31st December in each year, the Swimming Bath shall be open to the public from daylight to dusk. On Sundays the Swimming Bath shall be open from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. only.
 2. No person coming direct from any dirty work shall enter the Swimming Bath before washing himself.
 3. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the Swimming Bath.
 4. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the Swimming Bath, or the immediate vicinity thereof.
 5. No person shall use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the Swimming Bath may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.
 6. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the Swimming Bath.
 7. No person shall deface by writing or otherwise the fencing or any property within the Reserve.
 8. No person shall enter the Swimming Bath unless decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume.
 9. Children shall not be permitted to enter the Swimming Bath except under adequate supervision.
 10. The Swimming Bath may be set apart at stated hours for the use of males, females, or children respectively. Mixed bathing may be permitted on such days and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may at any time determine.
 11. No person shall bring any animal within the boundary fence of the Reserve.
 12. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for carnivals, matches, &c., on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AT BRIGHT.

THE Council of the Shire of Bright, being the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 26th February, 1929, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish and Township of Bright, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the places provided for the purpose.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees: nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
5. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of same, with all powers incidental thereto.
6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any tent or other building, without first obtaining the permission of the Committee of Management, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
10. No person shall commit any nuisance within the precincts of the Reserve.
11. The Committee of Management may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars and vehicles, and no cars or vehicles shall be parked in any portion of the Reserve other than on the portions set apart for this purpose. A charge of One shilling per day may be made for the admission of any vehicle to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding twenty-six in any one year, as may be determined by the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1915*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 21st September, 1896, as a site for Public Baths in the City of Richmond.

REGULATIONS.

The Swimming Baths shall be open to the public as under:—

1. On week days, other than Saturdays, from 1st January to 31st March, and from 1st November to 31st December inclusive, from daylight to 9 o'clock p.m. On Saturdays, 6 a.m. to 5 p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from 7 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m. The Hot Water Baths will be open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
2. The amounts set out hereunder shall be paid to the officer appointed by the Committee of Management for admission to the baths except as hereinafter provided in clause 3—
 - (a) For every adult (without towel)—Three pence.
 - (b) For every boy or girl under the age of fourteen years (without towel)—One penny.

Provided that the Committee of Management may exempt any school children wholly or partially from the payment of any such fees on school days during the hours of 9.15 o'clock a.m. and 12.15 o'clock p.m.

3. The Committee of Management may set the baths apart on not more than three occasions in any one year for the purpose of fêtes, sports, or carnivals, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult.
4. No person coming direct from any dirty employment shall enter the swimming bath before first washing himself under the shower bath.
5. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the baths.
6. No person shall use soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in the baths may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.
7. No person shall use obscene or profane language and actions within the bath premises.
8. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the baths.
9. No person shall deface by writing or otherwise the doors, walls, or any other portion of the baths.
10. No person shall spit in the swimming bath, or on the doors or walls, or on any other portion of the buildings.
11. No smoking shall be permitted on the platforms or in the sheds or dressing boxes.
12. No person shall enter the bath unless decently clothed in a suitable bathing costume.
13. All dogs found within the precincts of the baths shall be liable to be destroyed.
14. No person shall remain in the bath for a longer period than one hour.
15. Children shall not be permitted to enter the baths except under adequate supervision.
16. The baths may be set apart for the use of females on Tuesday and Thursday in each week between the hours of 6 o'clock p.m. and 8 o'clock p.m., but mixed bathing may be permitted on such days and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may at any time determine.
17. Any person committing a nuisance on any portion of the premises will be prosecuted.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of a guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, without consent of the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall moor or use any boat on the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

11. No person shall drive a car or other conveyance on the Reserve except over the portion set apart for that purpose.

12. No person shall swim a horse or horses from the Reserve except between the hours of eleven p.m. and seven a.m.

13. All persons making use of public conveniences shall pay the charge fixed by the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall have the right to play in any band of music on the Reserve without permission, in writing, from the Committee of Management.

15. No persons shall assemble on the Reserve for the purpose of holding any demonstration or meeting without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

16. No person shall erect any bathing box or boat house or other structure on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

17. No firearms or air guns shall be discharged on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall camp in or on the Reserve without permission, in writing, from the Committee of Management.

19. No fires shall be lighted on the Reserve or refuse burned except in such places as are set apart for the purpose.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

By-Law No. 60.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under the provisions of section 197 (sub-section 6), section 222, and section 604 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 60, for—

- (a) The management of public baths and swimming pool situated in Buckley-street, Footscray, and all buildings, furniture, fittings, appliances, and other property or effects used in connexion therewith.
- (b) Preventing damage to such baths, swimming pool, buildings, furniture, fittings, appliances, and other property used in connexion therewith, and for preserving good order and decency therein.
- (c) Fixing the hours during which such baths or swimming pool shall be available to the public, and the amounts to be charged for admission thereto.
- (d) Imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray order as follows:—

1. The baths and swimming pool will be open to the public from the 1st of November in one year to the 30th day of April in the succeeding year, during the following hours:—
On week days—6.30 a.m. to 10.30 p.m.
On Sundays—7 a.m. to 10 a.m., and from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m.
The Council may, however, by resolution, close the baths to the public on any day or days, or at any times, should it be considered necessary to do so, and may also vary the periods or hours during which the baths are open to the public.
2. No person using the baths, nor, any bath attendant or officer or servant or other person employed thereat, shall at any time bring or introduce into the baths, or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.
3. No person shall enter or remain in or on the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.
4. No person resorting to the baths shall, after using the swimming pool or any shower, loiter or remain without reasonable excuse in any passage-way to or from the swimming pool or any shower.
5. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to him or under his control to enter or remain in the baths. Any dog or other animal found in the baths may be destroyed.
6. Every person shall, before being admitted to the baths, obtain from the authorized baths attendant a ticket authorizing the admission of such person to the baths, and such person, before being admitted to use the baths, shall show to the baths attendant and place such ticket in a ticket-box provided for the purpose.
7. No officer or servant employed at the baths, other than duly authorized baths attendant, shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for the hire or use of any article or articles, or for any purpose whatsoever, without the knowledge and consent of the manager.
8. No person shall remain in the baths for a longer period than one hour, unless such person shall, upon demand being made by the baths attendant, again pay to such baths attendant the sum payable under the By-law as charge for admission to the baths.
9. No person shall, by forcible or improper means, seek admission to any dressing-room or shower or convenience which shall be occupied by any other person.
10. No man or boy above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.
11. No woman or girl above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower, or conveniences which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.
12. No child under the age of eight years will be admitted to the baths unless, in the opinion of the baths attendant, such child is in the care of a responsible person.
13. No person shall smoke in any dressing-room, convenience or passage-way, or within 15 feet of the swimming pool.
14. No person shall, while suffering from any disease of the skin, infectious or contagious disease, apply for admission to enter into or upon or make use of the baths. Any such person shall be liable, in addition to the penalties set out in this By-law, to be removed from the baths immediately and handed over to the proper authorities.

15. Every person using the swimming baths shall wear a suitable bathing gown or other sufficient dress or covering to prevent indecent exposure of the person, and during the times set apart for bathing, every such person shall wear a suitable two-piece or Canadian bathing costume.

16. No person shall use soap in the baths (except as mentioned in clause 17 hereof), or make use of such baths whilst in an uncleanly condition.

17. Every person shall, before using the swimming pool, make use of the cleansing shower-baths provided, in which the use of soap is permitted.

18. The Council reserves to itself the right at any time and from time to time of closing the baths, or any part thereof, for cleansing, repairs, or other purposes without incurring any liability to any person.

19. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the baths attendant may refuse admission to the baths to any person.

20. No person shall at any time use the swimming pool whilst using or after having used any substance or preparation whereby the water in such swimming pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.

21. No person shall spit in the baths, or deface any wall, fittings, or any portion of the baths by cutting or writing thereon.

22. No person shall wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water in the swimming pool, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing trunk, or drawers, or bathing dress belonging to the Municipality, or any dressing-room, convenience, or passage-way, or any furniture or other article therein.

23. Every person supplied with a towel and/or bathing gown shall, before leaving the baths, return the same to the baths attendant.

24. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing gown, bathing trunk, or other article supplied for use in the baths.

25. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure, or improperly interfere with, the due and efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, pipe work, or engine or machinery in connexion with the baths, or carelessly or negligently injure any furniture, fittings, or conveniences of any dressing-room, shower, or conveniences.

26. No person shall at any time, while being in the baths, use indecent, offensive, or abusive language, or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

27. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with the baths attendant or any officer or servant employed at the baths in the performance of his duty at the baths.

28. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any dressing-room or in any other part of the baths shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to the baths attendant or other person acting on his behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of same, and all particulars relating thereto, in the book kept for that purpose, and any person who shall have lost such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the baths attendant or other person authorized to receive such article upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.

29. The Municipality, or any of its officers or employees, shall not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

30. The charges for admission to and for the use of the baths shall be as follows, provided always that, when the swimming baths are in use for galas or other entertainments, such charges will be suspended, and tickets and passes will not be available for use:—

Ladies.—The baths will be reserved for use of females only at the above rates on Wednesdays, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon and 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.; on Fridays, from 9 a.m. till 12 noon.

School Children Free.—In organized parties from schools within the Municipality—Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays, for boys, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon; and on Wednesdays, and Fridays for girls, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon.

31. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such breach on conviction.

32. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of that part of the Municipal District of Footscray wherein are erected or may be erected public baths and buildings used in connexion therewith.

33. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the *Local Government Act 1915*, in the *Government Gazette*.

SHIRE OF KORUMBURRA.

By-Law No. 19.

A By-law of the Shire of Korumburra, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered nineteen for or with respect to—

- (a) The placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances.
- (b) The granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor.
- (c) Licences and conditions to be contained in licences.
- (d) Prescribing fees—
 - (1) For the granting or renewal of a licence.
 - (2) For the transfer of a licence.
- (e) Providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) Insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Korumburra, order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Korumburra.

“Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Licensee” shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Korumburra.

“Petrol pump” shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

“Portable petrol pump” shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels, and is not fixed in or on the footway, and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

“Regulations” shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of Korumburra, used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition, and free from leakage, and in accordance with this By-law, all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force or effect.

(a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump other than a portable petrol pump in or on any footway a licence-fee of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum.

(b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purposes of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence-fee of One pound one shilling (21s.) per annum.

(c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

7. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence-fee hereinbefore prescribed.

8. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

9. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application in writing to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence in writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of Ten shillings.

10. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given the policy of insurance hereinafter referred to taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee, or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

11. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or, if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company of good repute, against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump, in the sum of at least £250. Every licensee shall on demand produce to the Council, or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance, and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed, or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, shall within seven days after such expiry or cancellation remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence, and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in, on, or under the footway.

14. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Korumburra.
