ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

Midwives Act 1928.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the *Midwives Act 1928* (No. 3587) it is provided that on, from, and after such date as is fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*—

- (a) the powers and duties of the Midwives Board under the *Midwives Acts*, or any other enactment, shall be exercised and performed by the Nurses Board constituted under the *Nurses Registration Act 1923*;
- (b) any reference in the *Midwives Acts* or any other enactment to the Midwives Board shall, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, be read and construed to take effect as if it were a reference to the Nurses Board aforesaid;
- (c) the Midwives Board constituted under the *Midwives Acts* shall be hereby abolished, and the chairman and members thereof shall go out of office;
- (d) without affecting the generality of the foregoing provisions, the *Midwives Acts* shall be hereby amended as follows:—
 - (i) In section 2 of the Principal Act, for the interpretation of "Board" there shall be substituted the following interpretation:—
"Board" means the Nurses Board constituted under the *Nurses Registration Act 1923*, or any amendment thereof for the time being in force"; and
 - (ii) Section 4 of the Principal Act as amended by any Act shall be hereby repealed;
- (e) in section 3 of the *Nurses Registration Act 1923*, for the words "Midwives Board under" there shall be substituted the words "Nurses Board pursuant to"; and
- (f) the following provisions shall have effect:—
 - (i) The Registrar appointed under the *Nurses Registration Act 1923* shall be the Registrar for the purposes of the *Midwives Acts*;
 - (ii) Section 7 of the Principal Act shall be hereby repealed;
 - (iii) At the end of paragraph (a) of section 6 of the *Nurses Registration Act 1923* there shall be inserted the words "under this Act and the *Midwives Acts*"; and
 - (iv) In allocating the general expenses of the Board for the purposes of section 16 of the Principal Act and of sections 17 and 26 of the *Nurses Registration Act 1923* regard shall be had as to whether the said expenses have been incurred in the administration of the *Midwives Acts* or the *Nurses Registration Act 1923* respectively.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Friday, the first day of March, 1929, for the purposes of the said section 2 of the said Act.

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1929 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust, also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Lillydale, but no such rate for tenements of £20 net annual value and under shall be less than Twenty-five shillings per annum.

2. A rate of Five shillings per annum shall be charged on all vacant lands facing the mains.

3. Where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied. Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half yearly shall be 10,000 gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on the 1st January and 1st July, 1929.

4. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1929.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

BOROUGH OF STAWELL WATER SUPPLY.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Amendment of By-law No. 3 Relating to Water Supply.

THE Council of the Borough of Stawell doth hereby, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1. Minimum Meter Charges—Excess Meter Charges.—Clause 5 of By-law No. 3, passed and adopted by the said Council on the 27th day of October, 1926, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 23rd December, 1926, is hereby repealed and the following clause substituted therefor:—

Such owners or occupiers as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate from time to time fixed by the Council up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessments and at the rate fixed by the Council from time to time for any water used in excess of that quantity, and the Council may by Resolution at any ordinary meeting from time to time fix the charge to be made for water so supplied by meter, and such charges shall not be less than Ninepence nor more than Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

2. Fixing Times of Watering.—Clause 26 of the said By-law No. 3 is hereby repealed and the following clause substituted therefor:—

The Council may by Resolution at an ordinary or special meeting from time to time limit the quantity of water to be supplied, and may define certain days and hours during which water may be supplied and/or used, whether the water is charged for by measure or otherwise. The foregoing to apply to the whole of the Borough of Stawell or any part or parts thereof as may be set out in the Resolution so to be passed.

TRAFALGAR WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1929.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Trafalgar Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following rate for the year ending 31st December, 1929, upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, also for dealing with charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Narracan, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than Two pounds (£2).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.). When such value is over Five pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound.

3. For every public water trough, the sum of Two pounds (£2).

4. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the rate named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

5. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for the minimum quantity of 300,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of Threepence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

6. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

8. The foregoing rates are payable on the first day of April, 1929.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR DECLARING WEIGHT OF GOODS
BY MEASUREMENT.

UNDER the powers conferred by section 570 of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (as incorporated in the *Country Roads Act* 1915 and the *Highways and Vehicles Act* 1924, by sections 59 and 9 respectively of such last-mentioned Acts) to make Regulations for declaring the weight of any specified descriptions or classes of goods by measurement carried by means of any vehicle on a main road within the meaning of the *Country Roads Act* 1915, or on a State highway within the meaning of the *Highways and Vehicles Act* 1924, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Weight of Goods by Measurement Regulations 1929," and shall be deemed to be in substitution for and shall be applied in lieu of any Regulations heretofore in force for the computation by measurement of the weight of the load carried on vehicles on main roads, and shall apply to the several descriptions or classes of goods specified in the schedule hereto carried by means of a vehicle on a main road under the *Country Roads Act* 1915 or on a State highway under the *Highways and Vehicles Act* 1924 within any municipal district to which the Governor in Council has by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declared, or to which he may hereafter so declare, that the provisions of Division 2 of Part XXII. of the *Local Government Act* 1915 are to apply.

2. For the purpose of declaring the weight of goods of a description or class specified in the first column of the schedule hereto carried by means of a vehicle on any main road or State highway to which these Regulations apply, the measure-

ments or quantities set opposite the description or class of goods specified in the first column of the schedule hereto shall respectively be and be taken and are hereby declared to constitute one ton of that particular description or class of goods.

3. Where the measurement of any description or class of goods specified in the first column of the schedule hereto is given in cubic feet, such measurement shall be deemed to be the measurement of the space occupied by the load comprising such goods, together with the spaces (if any) between the individual items of such goods.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES IN THE PARISH OF NUNAWADING, CITY OF BOX HILL, KNOWN AS "BOX HILL PARK," "MIDDLEBORO PARK," AND "NUNAWADING PARK."

WHEREAS by the Crown grants in respect of the Reserves in the Parish of Nunawading, City of Box Hill, as set out hereunder, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used as sites for the several purposes mentioned and offices and conveniences connected therewith, and for no other purpose whatsoever: And whereas by section 182 of the Land Act 1915 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the said Land Act 1915, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section: And whereas Crown grants in respect of the Reserves set out hereunder have issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading (now called the City of Box Hill): Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Box Hill do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of—

The Reserve for Recreation and other Public purposes, being allotment 24c, Parish of Nunawading, containing 7a. 2r. 16p.

The Reserve for Recreation and other Public purposes, being allotment 23c, Parish of Nunawading, containing 12a. 0r. 31p.

The Reserve for Public Park and for General Recreation purposes, being balance of allotment 24a and part of allotment 24a, Parish of Nunawading, containing 12a. 0r. 3 5-10p.

REGULATIONS

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding twenty (20) in any one year, as the Reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserves.

2. The trustees shall have power to let any of the Reserves for the purposes of holding cricket or football matches, sports, entertainments, or performances on such terms and conditions as may be considered reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the charge therefor shall not exceed the sum of Ten pounds per day.

3. No person, except the trustees or employees of the trustees on duty, shall enter any of the Reserves when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged.

4. No person shall damage any building, or the furniture or fittings thereof, in the Reserves, or interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates, or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats, or other

structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange or banana peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatever, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structure therein, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

5. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Reserves, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds or animals therein, unless by authority of the trustees.

6. No person shall sell or offer for sale within the Reserves any article of food or drink or other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement, without the written permission of the trustees.

7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or laid out for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall engage in any game or sport in the Reserves on Sunday, nor on Good Friday or Christmas Day or Anzac Day.

8A. No person shall engage in training or take part in any game, amusement, or entertainment within the Reserves without the permission of the trustees first obtained.

9. No person shall bet publicly or carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in any of the Reserves, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserves or enclosures.

10. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves, shall ride or drive any horse or vehicle of any kind in or through the Reserves, except as hereinafter provided, without the permission of the trustees, and no person shall ride any bicycle or motor cycle therein, except on the tracks set apart for the purpose.

11. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency in any of the Reserves or the buildings therein, and any person found in a state of intoxication or otherwise offending against this Regulation shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserves, notwithstanding that such persons shall have purchased a ticket for admission thereto and shall also be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

12. No person shall remain in any of the Reserves at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the trustees to leave the same.

13. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserves.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.

15. No horses or cattle shall be allowed in the Reserves without the authority of the trustees, and all goats, fowls, ducks, geese, or other poultry found within the Reserves will be destroyed, and the owner thereof shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done.

16. No person or persons shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserves except at such parking areas as are set apart by the trustees for that purpose, and every person

using such parking area shall, on demand, pay a fee, not exceeding One shilling per motor car or motor cycle, for entrance to and use thereof.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of such trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
