## AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1929.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Trust shall pay for the year 1929 in respect of water supplied by the Trust:—

1. A rate of Three shillings in the £1 on the annual municipal valuation of all rateable property valued at Twenty pounds and upwards.
2. On all rateable property of the annual municipal valuation of under Twenty pounds, a sum of Three pounds.
3. For each vacant allotment of land on which no service pipe has been laid, a rate of Three shillings in the £1 on the annual municipal valuation. Vacant allotments on which a service pipe is laid shall be charged double rate. Minimum charge, Ten shillings.
4. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:— For each trough in an allotment of five acres or under, Fifteen shillings per annum; more than five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre in addition to Fifteen shillings for the first five acres.

The above rates and charges are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1929, and the rates shall be payable in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1929.

Such person as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

## BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

## BY-LAW NO. 49, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR THE YEAR 1929.

THE Inglewood Borough Council doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates from the 1st day of January, 1929, to the 31st day of December, 1929, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Inglewood as defined, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the valuation of every house or tenement, with a minimum of two pounds ten shillings sterling. On vacant allotments in streets where the Council's mains are laid the rates shall be One pound on each such allotment.
2. The foregoing rates shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, 1929.
3. Such person or persons as the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Inglewood may appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.
4. Owners of steam engines or other property, not being dwellings, requiring water for same may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council; and all persons whose tenements and property are outside the Water Supply District may be supplied by making special arrangements with the Council.
5. Water-troughs and stand-pipes on the footpaths, streets, or outside property will not be permitted without the permission of the Council.
6. The owner of any tenement or property permitting or allowing any person to carry away water, excepting for the use of the tenement or property belonging thereto, will be liable to have the water cut off.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1929 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings.
2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Eighteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling; the minimum rate shall in no case be less than Two pounds ten shillings.
3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than One pound five shillings be charged.
4. For all the lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half a mile of such stand-pipe, one-fourth of the full rate shall be paid.

5. Water supplied to the Government Department, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District, and those being supplied off rising main, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

6. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1929.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATIVE PURPOSES AT MURCHISON.**

WE, Edward John Gregory, John Cloney, William Gillan, William Matthews, and William George Wagoner, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreative purposes at Murchison, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows, sports, fetes, cricket, football, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the native or other trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, trees, gates, fences, or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any paper, glass, straw, manure, or any rubbish, nor throw stones or missiles of any kind to the danger of any person.

5. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

6. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle, horses, or sheep trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.



8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the Reserve other than in enclosures set apart for bookmakers, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall dig or remove any sand, soil, or other material in or from the Reserve.

13. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations, or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

14. No person shall shoot or discharge any firearms in the Reserve.

15. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time to grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of grounds so set apart.

16. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or disturb any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

## CITY OF GEELONG.

## BY-LAW No. 100.

A By-law of the City of Geelong to appoint stands for country motor omnibuses, and to regulate the use, control, and management of such stands.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by Division 2 of Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and of section 32 of the *Motor Omnibus (Urban and Country) Act 1927*, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, it is hereby enacted by the Council of the City of Geelong as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"The Act" means the *Motor Omnibus (Urban and Country) Act 1927*.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Geelong.

"The Inspector" shall mean any person who by appointment of the said Council shall be an Inspector or Assistant Inspector to carry out the provisions of the Act, or of the *Carriages Act 1915*, or of any By-law thereunder.

"Omnibus" shall mean a "country motor omnibus" within the meaning of the Act.

2. The place described in the schedule to this By-law shall be a stand for omnibuses.

3. Every omnibus arriving at the said stand shall take up its position as near as may be to the eastern limit of the said stand, and immediately behind any omnibus already thereon, and as near to the north kerb as conveniently may be, and facing in an easterly direction, and as any omnibus in front departs those behind shall keep their order and move on as near as may be to the said eastern limit of the said stand.

4. No omnibus shall stand or remain or ply for hire on any other stand or place within the City of Geelong, or within eight miles of the corporate limits thereof other than that appointed by this By-law.

5. All drivers, conductors, or other persons in charge of an omnibus on the said stand shall obey the directions of the inspector in relation to the position, order, precedence, control, and management of such omnibus while on or arriving at or departing from such stand.

## CITY OF HAWTHORN.

## BY-LAW No. 102.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 102, for the purpose of repealing By-law numbered 65, and for the purpose of regulating and controlling blasting operations.

**I**N exercise of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. No person or corporation shall fire or cause to explode a charge of any explosive substance which charge when it explodes casts or projects or deposits on or across or over any street, road, lane, or highway, or on to any land other than the land which immediately surrounds the spot on which such charge explodes, and is owned by or is under the control of the owner or occupier of the land upon which such charge explodes any wood, iron, earth, clay, gravel, marl, sand, rock or stone.

2. The person or corporation intending to conduct a blasting operation shall make such preparations and take such precautions as will ensure that no breach of the foregoing clause will occur.

3. No person or corporation shall fire or cause to explode a charge of any explosive substance for the purpose or having the effect of moving or loosening any wood, iron, earth, clay, gravel, marl, sand, rock or stone unless notice in writing of an intention so to do, with the full name and address of the person who will actually fire the charge or cause it to explode, shall have been given to the Council at least twenty-four hours before the explosion takes place: Provided nevertheless that it shall be a sufficient compliance with this clause if such notice is given generally and not separately in anticipation of each separate explosion if the person who actually fires the charge or causes a particular explosion is the person whose full name and address were stated in the last notice given to the Council as aforesaid.

4. No person or corporation shall fire or cause to explode a charge of any explosive substance except between the times of twelve o'clock and the next following half-past twelve

o'clock of the same day, and between the times of five o'clock in any afternoon and the next following half-past five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

5. The minimum penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be Ten pounds on the first conviction, and on the second conviction for a similar offence Fifteen pounds, and on every subsequent conviction for a similar offence Twenty pounds.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Hawthorn.

## CITY OF PRAHRAN.

## BY-LAW No. 173.

*Dwellings and Private Motor Garages.*

A By-law of the City of Prahran, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 173, for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran order as follows:—

1. No person shall build, or erect, or commence to build or erect, any dwelling house or building intended to be used as a dwelling house which shall be attached to more than one other such dwelling house or building, or which shall be constructed otherwise than in accordance with this By-law.

2. The exterior walls of every such dwelling house or building shall be constructed of brick, concrete, reinforced concrete, or other fireproof or incombustible material approved by the surveyor.

3. Every such dwelling house or building shall be so built or erected that there shall be a clear space of not less than four feet in width along one side of each of the buildings so attached.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in By-law No. 137, no person shall in any street of a greater width than 25 feet erect any dwelling house or building intended to be used as a dwelling house nearer than 20 feet from the building line of such street or the average distance—but in no case less than 10 feet—from such building line at which the dwelling house or houses in such street have been erected within a space of 500 feet on each side of the allotment on which such first-mentioned dwelling house or building is being erected: Provided that in computing such average distance any house or dwelling erected at a greater distance than 40 feet from such building line shall be excluded from such computation.

5. Nothing herein contained shall affect or repeal the provisions of clause 10 of Part 2 of By-law No. 137.

6. No person shall in any residential area build or erect, or commence to build or erect, any motor garage or building capable of being used or intended to be used as a motor garage which shall be nearer to the street building line than the front of the dwelling erected or in course of being erected on the same or any adjoining allotment, or nearer than 15 feet from such building line if there shall be no such dwelling.

7. By-law No. 146 is hereby repealed.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

7. Any person (hereinafter called the stall-holder) occupying, using or enjoying any portion of the said market, under the leave, licence, and permission as aforesaid of the said Council shall, within one hour of the closing of the said market, thoroughly cleanse or cause to be cleansed his or her portion of the said market and the gutter, roadway, and footpath abutting thereon.

8. No person shall sell, offer, or exhibit for sale in any part or portion of the said market any goods, wares, merchandise, and/or marketable commodities without having first obtained the written leave, licence, and permission of the said Council so to do.

9. No person shall sell or exhibit, or expose for sale, in any part of the said market, any goods, wares, merchandise, and/or marketable commodities before the time appointed for opening or after the time appointed for closing the said market.
