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WARRNAMBOOL HARBOUR BOARD.

REGULATION No. 2.

A REGULATION made under Part V., section 103, of the Harbour Board Act 1927, for the Regulation of Proceedings of the Board and its officers.

Standing Orders.

- 1. From and after the date of this Regulation coming into operation, the proceedings and business of the Warrambool Harbour Board shall be conducted and regulated according to the following standing orders.
- 2. The usual place of meeting shall be at the offices of the Board for the time being, and the Board shall hold ordinary meetings for the transaction of business on such day and hour as the Board from time to time appoints.
- 3. The business of the Board and Committee meetings shall commence as soon after the time fixed as there shall be a sufficient number of members present to form a quorum. If, at any meeting of the Board, there is not present, within half-an-hour after the time appointed for such meeting, the number of members sufficient to form a quorum, those present or the major part of them, or if no members be present, the Secretary may adjourn such meeting to any time not further distant than seven (7) days from the date of such adjournment.
- 4. All meetings of the Board shall be summoned by the Secretary of the Board by a notice to each member sent by post, and addressed to his usual or last known place of abode, not less than four (4) days before the date of meeting.
- not less than four (4) days before the date of meeting.

 5. Special Meetings of the Board may be called by the Secretary, by direction of the Chairman, or on the written request of any three of the members of the Board. But no such meetings shall be held unless four (4) days' notice thereof at the least shall be given by the Secretary as hereinbefore provided for ordinary meetings, except in the case of emergency, such emergency to be confirmed and recognized at the next regular meeting of the Board. At such special meetings no business shall be transacted except such as is notified in the notice convening the meeting.
- 6. The order of business of an Ordinary Meeting shall be as follows:---
 - Reading and Confirmation of Minutes of the proceedings, at the preceding meeting.
 - II. Reading of outward correspondence.
 - III. Reading of letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - IV. Presentation of reports, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - V. Accounts to be passed for payment.
 - VI. Ordinary business not elsewhere included.
 - VII. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from former meetings.
 - VIII. Extraordinary business, and other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- 7. The reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any previous meeting shall not be made the occasion of any further discussion, except as to the accuracy of the minutes as a record of the proceedings of such previous meeting.
- 8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Board. Any member of the Board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given to the Secretary, in writing, either at the previous meeting, or at least seven (7) days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.
 - 9. The members in speaking shall address the Chairman.
- 10. No notice in the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him, be present when the business is called in order; and in case he is not present, either himself or by proxy, the notice shall be struck out of the paper.
- 11. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign and deliver it to the Secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Board.
- 12. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it is seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Board by simply noticing that it is disobeyed.
- 13. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise in his place and address the Chairman; no member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which

- case the member calling to order shall be heard thereupon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered upon.
- 14. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the Board in support thereof.
- 15. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which of them is entitled to pre-audience.
- 16. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion or seconded amendment of which he may have been the mover, unless by consent of the Board, the mover of the original motion in that case speaking last, and after his reply the amendment or original motion, as the case may be, shall he immediately put to the vote.
- 17. The Chairman or other presiding member shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
- 1\$. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.
- 19. The Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final in each case.
- 20. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered as highly disorderly.
- 21. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any member shall, if required by the Chairman, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the Board, under a penalty, in case he refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the Board, not less than One nor more than Ten pounds.
- 'A member called to order by the Chairman shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.
- 22. Any member may require the Secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being spoken.
- 23. At all meetings of the Board, all members present shall vote, and if there is an equal division of votes upon any question, except the election of Chairman and the suspension of Standing Orders, the Chairman of such meeting shall, in addition to his own vote as a member, have a second or easting vote. The Chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands, as to which party has the majority, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
- 24. The Board shall vote by show of hands, except in cases of elections, when the vote shall be by ballot. Any member of the Board may call for a division on any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall stand up, and those in the negative shall retain their seats until the vote is recorded.
- 25. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote.
- 26. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the Board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.
- 27. No resolution at any meeting of the Board shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless the intention to propose such alteration is given to each member of the Board seven (7) days at least before the holding of the meeting, and unless such revocation or alteration is carried by a majority of the whole number of members of the Board.
- 28. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the Board.
- 29. Any member of the Board may enter his protest against any resolution of the Board. Notice of intention to protest, however, must in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution to be protested against; and the protest signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reason for the protesting, must be entered by the Secretary before the next regular meeting of the Board, in the minute book in the usual way.

30. The Standing Orders of the Board shall be observed in all Committees of the whole Board, except the rule limiting the number of times of speaking; and on the discussion of any motion of the Board, if it shall deem expedient, may resolve itself into committee for the purpose of better discussing the subject-matter or such motion.

31. Any member may of right require the production of any document of the Board relating to the question or matter under discussion.

32. At all elections for offices at the disposal of the Board, the voting shall take place by ballot.

33. The common seal of the Board shall be deposited in a secure place in the Harbour Board Office, and, on a resolution of the Board, shall be attached by the Chairman to any deed or document, in the presence of the Secretary, who, with the Chairman, shall sign the deed or document so sealed, and the same shall be recorded in the minutes.

34. Any one or more of the Standing Orders of the Board may be suspended, pro tempore, in case of emergency, provided that six (6) members at least be present, and that not less than five (5) are in favour of such suspension.

The foregoing Standing Orders were adopted at a full meeting of the Board held on the 5th day of March, 1929.

The alteration to clause 34 was agreed to at a full meeting of the Board held on 26th March, 1929.

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Braybrook described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Braybrook and annexed to the City of Footscray.

Area Described in the Petition.

All that part of the Shire of Braybrook bounded on the north by a line commencing at the centre of Mitchell-street at its intersection with the centre of Rosamond-road and running west along the centre of Mitchell-street to the centre of Ashley-street; thence on the west by a line running south along the centre of Ashley-street to a point opposite the centre of Suffolk-street; thence on the south by a line running east along the centre of Suffolk-street to the centre of Churchalong the centre of Sulfolk-street to the centre of Church-street; thence by a line running north-easterly along the centre of Church-street to a point opposite the centre of North-road; thence by a line running east along the centre of North-road to the centre of Summerhill-road; and thence on the east by a line running north along the centre of Summerhill-road and Rosamond-road to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the reasons for the proposed severance are as follows:—

That-

(a) By reason of its geographical position the said area is more closely connected with Footscray than with Braybrook.

braybrook.

(b). All gas, electricity, and telephone services are supplied to the area through Footscray.

(c) All postal facilities are controlled from the Footscray Post Office.

(d) The shopping centre for residents of the area is Foots-

(d) The shopping centre for residents of the area is Footscray.
(e) The Footscray tram service provides the most convenient means of transit from the area.
(f) All water services in the area have been secured through the efforts of the representative of the Footscray City Council on the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.
(g) The Shire of Braybrook is a rural shire, whilst the area in question is suburban in character.
(h) The Council of the Shire of Braybrook has entirely failed to appreciate the requirements of the ratepayers in the area.
(i) During the past thirty years the Braybrook Council has caused the construction of only about one mile of streets in the area, although many miles of streets have been urgently required to be made.

of streets in the area, although many miles of streets have been urgently required to be made.

(j) The area is only four and one-half miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, and is the most backward residential area within a radius of ten miles from such General Post Office. The rate-payers in the area believe that this want of progress is due entirely to the neglect of the area by the Braybrook Shire Council. The area is capable of improvement and development, but under present to consider securities in the locality, and owners are thereby hampered in their efforts to improve their properties. The standard of comfort and convenience is therefore lower than residents are entitled to expect, and values are depreciated. The rate-payers believe that they would benefit greatly if to expect, and values are depreciated. The rate-payers believe that they would benefit greatly if the area were annexed to the Municipality of Foots-

cray.

(k) To reach the Sunshine Township it is necessary for residents of Maidstone to take tram to Footscray (14 miles), then train to Sunshine (3 miles). The only alternative being 3 miles walk of open country along the main Ballarat-road. No footpaths. Accidents have occurred through people walking on this road. There is a heavy motor traffic, and in wet weather the side tracks are impassable.

(1) Residents requiring medical aid seek same from Footscray. Owing to the through roads not being connected such services are frequently delayed.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Shire of Braybrook and annex such area to the City of Footscray.

Stopping Places on Routes.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, calculated to the nearest higher penny.

His Excellency doth by this Order further provide, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 11 (1) (b) of the Motor Omnibus Act 1924 (No. 3378), that the Orders in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 18th December, 1928, and 6th February, 1929, prescribing routes within the metropolitan area along which motor omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the said Act may ply for hire, shall be amended in the manner following:—

For Route No. 154 there shall be substituted the following route:—"Commencing at Moonee Ponds Railway Station, via Holmes-road, Waverley-street, and Alma-street to Vida-street."

Route No. 32a.—Under the heading "Maximum number of Motor Omnibuses to be licensed on route", for the figure "2" there shall be substituted the figure "1".

Route No. 46a.—Behind building line on near side of cross streets and 100 feet behind kerb on near side of Tyler, Gower, and Bell streets.
