PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act to amend the Justices Acts and for other purposes."
- "An Act to amend the Marriage Acts and for other purposes."
- "An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament."
- "An Act to amend the Closer Settlement Acts and the Discharged Soldier Settlement Acts and for other purposes."
- "An Act relating to the Sale of certain Crown Lands in the County of Polwarth for the purposes of the Construction of a Highway known as the Great Ocean Road."
- "An Act to provide for the Reservation for the Recreation Convenience and Amusement of the People of certain Land vested in The Geelong Harbour Trust Commissioners."
- "An Act to relieve certain Municipalities from certain Payments in respect of certain Permanent Works carried out under the Country Roads Acts in the Shire of Wodonga."
- "An Act to amend Section Five of the *Land Act 1923*."
- "An Act to amend the Black Rock to Beaumaris Electric Street Railway Acts."
- "An Act to amend the *Public Accounts Committee Act 1922*."

PROCLAMATION OF "PROCLAIMED PERIOD" AND "PROCLAIMED AREAS" WHERE SERIOUS DANGER FROM FIRES EXISTS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Forests Act 1927* (No. 3549), it is enacted that—

Whenever the Commission with respect to any period of twelve months reports to the Minister that, whether owing to climatic conditions or otherwise there is a serious danger of fire or of the spread of fire in any part or parts of Victoria, the Governor in Council may from time to time for the purpose of this section declare by proclamation:—

- (a) any specified portion of such period to be a "proclaimed period"; and
- (b) any specified area of Victoria to be a "proclaimed area";

And whereas under this section it is provided that any person who during any proclaimed period within any proclaimed area lights or kindles or knowingly causes or permits to be lighted or kindled any fire in the open air except—

- (a) in such positions as are prescribed by regulations under this section or are indicated by notices in the prescribed form issued under the authority of prescribed persons (including the holders for the time being of any prescribed offices as such) or bodies of persons; and
- (b) with such precautions as are prescribed—

shall be liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than two years or to a penalty of not more than Two hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and penalty.

And whereas the Commission has reported to the Minister that owing to climatic conditions a serious danger of fire exists throughout Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare—

- (a) that the "proclaimed period" shall be from the first day of January, 1929, to the thirty-first day of March, 1929, both days inclusive; and
- (b) that the "proclaimed areas" shall include the counties set forth in the schedule hereunder:—

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1927* (No. 3546) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft regulations for or with respect to the matters set out in sub-sections (1) (b), (1) (c), and (1) (d) of section 38 of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Carpentry and Joinery Regulations (No. 1)."

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

"Act" means the *Apprenticeship Act 1927*.
"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.
"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the apprenticeship trades of carpentry and/or joinery.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the said Act.

Applicants may be Examined.—Applicants may be Exempted if Possessing Certain Educational Qualifications.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission, to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades; provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination if he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

- (a) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (b) The satisfactory completion as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (c) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the Elementary Schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission: Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall remain in operation until the 31st day of December, 1929 only, and no longer.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.
