- 2. No driver or person in charge or control of a vehicle shall 2. No driver or person in charge or control of a vehicle shall between the hours of 10 a m. and 9 p.m. on any Friday leave any such vehicle unattended for more than half an hour in that portion of Gray-street, Hamilton, which is between Cox and Kennedy streets, or cause or permit or allow any such vehicle to stand or remain in that portion of Gray-street, Hamilton, which is between Cox and Kennedy streets for more than half an hour at a time.
- 3. No driver or person in charge or control of a vehicle shall, except at the intersection of streets, turn or cause or permit to be turned any such vehicle in that part of Gray-street, Hamilton, which is between Cox and Kennedy streets, Hamilton, but every such vehicle shall for the purpose of turning be taken or driven to a street intersection.
- 4. No driver or person in charge or control of a vehicle shall 4. No driver or person in charge or control of a vehicle shall, except at the intersection of streets, turn or cause or permit to be turned, any such vehicle in that part of Thompson-street, Hamilton, which is between Lonsdale and French streets, but every such vehicle shall for the purpose of turning be taken or driven to a street intersection.
- 5. For the purpose of this By-law "vehicle" means and includes any convevance drawn, propelled, or driven by human, animal, or mechanical power, and includes a motor car and/or motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.
