THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1915*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 27:—

27. (1) No vessel having a draft of seven or more feet of water or having engine-power of 25 horse-power nominal or greater shall be navigated at a higher speed over the ground than—

(A) From Queen's-bridge to west side of entrance to Appleton Dock—four nautical miles.

(B) From west side of entrance to Appleton Dock and through the remainder of Coode Canal—five nautical miles.

(C) From west end of Coode Canal to beacons at entrance to River Yarra—seven nautical miles.

(D) Within any other part of the port—eight nautical miles.

(E) When passing works in progress on banks of a river, sunken vessels, vessels aground or at anchor, tugs with train in tow, or vessels moored at any wharf—four nautical miles.

(2) A vessel having a draft of less than seven feet of water and having engine power of less than 25 horse-power nominal shall not be navigated at a higher speed than ten nautical miles per hour over the ground in any part of the port.

2. Regulation 27A is hereby made as follows:—

27A. Every motor boat or motor launch shall be fitted with an effective silencer for the purpose of preventing offensive noise from the machinery or engine of such boat or launch.

27A. The owner and the person in charge of any vessel emitting an offensive noise shall be guilty of an offence.

3. Regulation 89A is hereby made as follows:—

The use of flare-up lamps or naked lights of any sort or design whatsoever in the holds of vessels lying at any of the wharfs or jetties of the port, whether for the purpose of working cargo or for any other purpose, is prohibited.

4. Regulation 276 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By repealing paragraphs numbered 9 and 10.

(b) By inserting after paragraph numbered 8 the following paragraphs:—

9. Ride or drive upon or along any wharf, street, or road negligently or in a manner or at a rate of speed dangerous to or without proper regard to the safety of the public on or who might reasonably be expected to be on such wharf, street, or road.

10. Ride or drive at a rate of speed greater than four miles per hour on any wharf.

11. Except for some justifiable cause ride or drive on the right-hand side of any wharf, street, or road on which riding or driving is not restricted to one direction.

12. Without the permission of the Harbor Master, drive or conduct two or more vehicles at the same time on any wharf, street, or road, whether or not such vehicles are coupled or fastened together.

13. Without the permission of the Harbor Master, bring on to or cause to move or be moved on any wharf a vehicle drawn by three or more horses.

14. Bring or cause to be brought on to or move or cause to be moved upon any wharf any vehicle of a construction likely to damage any part of such wharf.

15. Ride or drive upon or along any footpath of any wharf, street, or road.

16. Place any obstruction on any wharf, street, or road whereby any person is likely to be caused bodily injury.

17. Except with the permission in writing of the Harbor Master, and then only subject to the Regulations of the Commissioners and to the conditions and stipulations contained in such permit, bring or cause to be brought on to or move or cause to be moved upon any wharf any vehicle the weight borne on any wheel of which, together with the weight of such wheel, exceeds the weight for the time being fixed by resolution of the Commissioners in respect

of the part of the wharf where such wheel shall be, and specified in a notice placed—

- (a) on or near the ramp or other approach leading to such wharf if vessels can berth at either side of such wharf; or
- (b) on the wharf or part of a wharf affected by such resolution if vessels can berth on one side only of the wharf.

18. Being the driver or person in charge of a vehicle on any wharf the weight borne on any wheel of which vehicle, together with the weight of such wheel, exceeds the weight for the time being fixed by resolution of the Commissioners in respect of the part of the wharf where such wheel shall be, and specified in the notice mentioned in paragraph 17 of this Regulation, shall fail or refuse to produce to any officer of the Commissioners, whenever requested by such officer so to do, the permit which shall have been issued by the Harbor Master to such driver or person to bring such vehicle on to and move the same on such wharf.

19. Being the driver or person in charge of a vehicle on any wharf, shall neglect or refuse to immediately proceed with such vehicle and the load (if any) carried therein or thereon to the nearest available weighbridge or weighing apparatus, and permit such vehicle with any such load to be weighed at the expense of the Commissioners upon being requested so to do by an officer of the Commissioners.

20. Being the driver or person in charge of a vehicle on any wharf, shall neglect or refuse to immediately move such vehicle (whether loaded or not) to some other position, whenever directed so to do by an officer of the Commissioners.

- (c) By renumbering all paragraphs after those hereby inserted so that all paragraphs will be numbered consecutively.

5. Regulation 276A is hereby made as follows:—

276A. In any case where a vehicle is brought on to or moved upon a wharf in contravention of paragraph 18 of Regulation 276—

- (a) The Harbor Master or any officer of the Commissioners may require the driver or the person in charge of such vehicle to unload so much of the load carried as is in excess of the weight prescribed by the said paragraph 18, or by the permit (if any) issued to such driver or person by the Harbor Master pursuant to the said paragraph 18; and
- (b) Any such driver or person who fails, neglects, or refuses to unload the same shall be guilty of an offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PORTION OF THE RESERVE ALONG THE RIVER MURRAY AT MILDURA KNOWN AS THE "MURRAY RIVER FRONTAGE PARK."

THE Council of the Town of Mildura, being the duly appointed Committee of Management of such portion of the Reserve along the River Murray at Mildura as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked M.16.10.24 with Lands Correspondence C.74988, but excepting the rights of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust and the Mildura Urban Water Trust, and known as the "Murray River Frontage Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of

Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twelve in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except at the special fireplaces provided therein. Such fires lit at the duly appointed places must be completely extinguished before the person lighting same leaves the Reserve.
 4. 4. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Health Act 1919.

SHIRE OF DIMBOOLA.

BY-LAW RELATING TO THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF NIGHT-SOIL.

By-law No. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Dimboola, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 26, for repealing certain By-laws, and for the purpose of carrying into execution certain provisions of the said *Health Act 1919*, and, *inter alia*, the provisions of section numbered 312 of the said *Health Act 1919*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and in further pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Dimboola, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Dimboola, for the purpose of carrying the said *Health Act 1919* into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Dimboola, viz.:—Being the Townships of Rainbow, Jeparit, and Dimboola, the townships being defined as follows for the purpose of this By-law:—

Rainbow.—The whole of the area contained in the Water Supply Urban District for the Township of Rainbow, as defined from year to year by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

Jeparit.—The whole of the area contained in the Water Supply Urban District for the Township of Jeparit, as defined from year to year by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

Dimboola.—The whole of the area contained in the Water Supply Urban District for the Township of Dimboola, as defined from year to year by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises, on which there is erected a pan-closet, shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape, and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22 gauge, or other approved material or materials, presenting on the outside and inside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come in contact with the night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be water-tight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each such pan shall have a capacity of $1\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an air-tight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil, which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet, to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause, or permit, to be placed, any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) Maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) When required by the inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal, and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and, in any case, as often as may be necessary, to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within two and a half inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises, and another pan, thoroughly cleansed and in good order, shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pan shall report to the Council, at the earliest available opportunity, the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be thoroughly cleansed.

14. The contractor, or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose, shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to an approved depot.

15. The contractor, or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil, shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be deposited in trenches such trenches shall be not less than nine inches or more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed two feet width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than six inches deep, and shall be left at such depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least six inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken-up soil upon the night-soil and pan washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than twelve inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass, or any forage or cereal crops, or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve, shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited, provided that vegetables, or seeds of vegetables, shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan, after the disposal of its contents, and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground, shall, on every such occasion, be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

(a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber; or

(b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of accol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or

(c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or

(d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan, before it is first used, shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor, or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil, shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the depot and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any person shall not remove any night-soil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor, or any person within the area defined by this By-law, shall not bury or cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yard, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall, for every breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Dimboola, the 11th day of December, 1928, and confirmed at a meeting of the said Council held on the 12th day of February, 1929.
