SHIRE OF GLENLYON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES, PARISH OF FRANKLIN.

WE, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Glenlyon, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the Parish of Franklin, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

Regulations.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1915.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not

exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF RICHMOND.

By-LAW No. 103.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act*, and numbered 103, for the control and management of reserves known as "Children's Playgrounds in the City of Richmond."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

Definition.—"Children's Playground" shall include any land reserved or set aside by the Council of the City of Richmond, or by the said Council with the authority of the Minister of Public Instruction, upon which swings, see-saws, slides, joy wheels, or any other fixtures or appliances are erected or provided for the exclusive use of children.

1. No person above the age of 14 years shall enter a Children's Playground, or use any of the fixtures or appliances erected or provided thereon. Provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter a Playground to watch over children who are in their charge.

2. No such fixture or appliance shall be used by the same child for a longer period than five minutes if any other child is waiting to use it.

3. No child shall use any such fixture or appliance except for the purpose for which it is provided.

4. Cricket or football shall not be played on a Children's Playground.

5. Any paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets or other receptacles provided by the Council for the purpose.

6. Every person on a Children's Playground shall obey the directions of any officer or servant of the Council in respect of his or her conduct thereon.

7. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any such fixture or appliance.

8. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle on any part of a Children's Playground, or bring any animal thereon.

9. Any member of the Police Force, and duly appointed officer or servant of the Council, shall have the right to remove or exclude from a Children's Playground any person who wilfully commits a breach of this By-law, or who wilfully damages any of the fixtures, appliances, or property on a Children's Playground, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

10. This By-law shall apply to the undermentioned Children's Playgrounds:—

- Swan-street.

DETERMINATION OF THE STOREMEN, PACKERS, AND SORTERS BOARD.

This Determination on the 24th May, 1929, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since the 20th April, 1926, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed—

- (a) as a Storeman, Packer, or Sorter,
- (b) in assisting a Storeman, Packer, or Sorter,
- (c) as an assembler, collector, or checker of goods in course of receipt or despatch,

but not including any person subject to the jurisdiction of any of the following Boards:—

(5) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Anzac Day (in industries named in the schedule to the Anzac Day Act 1925), King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the days so substituted.

(6) TIME RATE.—Any person (other than those in potato or onion stores, on wharfs, or in wharf sheds, customs railways sheds or fumigating sheds) employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this determination be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.

(7) RESTRICTION AS TO FEMALES LIFTING HEAVY WEIGHTS.—The maximum weight to be lifted by any female over 18 years of age, employed in an Egg Store, shall be thirty pounds.

(8) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(9) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, No. 2650, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices for wholly or partly packing or sorting any articles for which wages rates are fixed, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

DETERMINATION OF THE FACTORY ENGINE-DRIVERS BOARD.

NORRS.—(A) This Determination on the 1st June, 1929, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(B) On the 22nd June, 1914, and 17th August, 1920, respectively, the powers of the Factory Engine-drivers Board were extended to enable it to "fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the occupation of—

(a) a boiler cleaner;

(b) an engine-driver or attendant in connexion with the use of internal combustion engines or electrical engines other than internal combustion engines or electrical engines connected with mines."

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the occupation of a fireman, boiler attendant, or engine-driver, in connexion with the use of steam-boilers or steam-engines other than steam-boilers or steam-engines connected with mines," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st June, 1929, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) DEFINITIONS.—Engine-driver or fireman in charge of plant means the driver or fireman invested with superintendence or responsibility when two or more drivers or two or more firemen are employed at the plant at one time, or when the driver or fireman being the only person of his class employed on the plant does the general repair work of the plant in addition to the work of engine driving or firing but not when he merely assists the fitter or engineer to do such work.

An engine-driver or fireman shall be deemed to be in charge of an Electric Generator or Dynamo if under the instructions of his employer or his immediate responsible officer he performs any of the duties of oiling or cleaning or attending to the commutators, brushes, fuses, or switches of same.

Lofty cranes or hoists means any crane or hoist, the driving platform of which is situated more than 25 feet above the level of the ground.

First-class engine-driver means a driver of a steam stationary engine or engines having a single cylinder with a bore exceeding 12 inches in diameter, or having singly or together two or more cylinders, the sum of the areas of whose bores exceeds the area of a circle 12 inches in diameter.

Second-class engine-driver means a driver of a steam stationary engine or engines having a single cylinder with a bore which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter or having singly or together two or more cylinders, the sum of the areas of whose bores does not exceed the area of a circle 12 inches in diameter.

Third-class engine-driver means a driver of a steam stationary engine or engines having a single cylinder with a bore which does not exceed 6 inches in diameter or having singly or together two or more cylinders, the sum of the areas of whose bores does not exceed the area of a circle 6 inches in diameter.

A trimmer shall mean any person employed in supplying fuel to the fireman, either from storage bin or from stocks on the premises, or in assisting the fireman in clearing the ash-pit.

(5) OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

In reckoning the time of duty any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, shall be included except in the case of country saw mills, in which case each engine-driver or fireman shall be allowed the following time at ordinary rates for preparing and closing down engines or for raising steam and banking fires when he performs such duties—

- (a) if such engine-driver or fireman be resident on the mill site, one hour per day;
- (b) where such engine-driver or fireman resides away from the mill site, one hour and a half per day.

(6) SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.—That time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, and double time shall be the special rate for all work done on the undermentioned public holidays:—Christmas Day; Boxing Day; New Year's Day; Foundation Day; Good Friday; Easter Monday; Eight Hours Day; and King's Birthday—or such other days not less than eight as the employer may prescribe for the employees; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
