In accordance with the custom followed at Levees held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the Service and all public bodies group themselves together as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so.

On the occasion of the celebration of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting their names or appointments to facilitate in announcing them to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 (No. 3260).

REGULATION.

It is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that Regulation No. 5, relating to the conditions for the payment to the subsidized institutions or benevolent societies of any sums out of the Hospitals and Charities Fund, made on the fourteenth day of August, 1923, under the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 (No. 3260)*, and published in the *Gazette* of the 22nd idem, at page 2215, be rescinded, and that a new Regulation be substituted in lieu thereof, viz.:—

5. Conditions for the payment to the subsidized institutions of benevolent societies of any sum out of the fund for the financial year—

- (a) That all forms of returns (financial, statistical, claims for grant, &c.), as may be prescribed be properly completed and verified as set out on each form, and lodged at the office of the Charities Board of Victoria on or before the dates indicated on such forms. That the prescribed form of ticket of admission of patients shall be used, and that in each published annual report issued to subscribers a comparative return be included covering the last preceding five years, and setting out an abstract of receipts and expenditure, and general statistics. The prescribed form of ticket, however, shall not be used with respect to patients referred to in clause (m).
- (b) That accounts and records of transactions be kept as in the forms formerly prescribed by the Treasurer of Victoria compiled under what is known as the Burdett system, subject to such alterations, additions, or amendments as from time to time may be directed by the Board, and shall be subject to such audit as the Board may direct.
- (c) That the Board shall, in case of necessity, have power to transfer to any suitable institution in which there is available accommodation any destitute, aged, or infirm person who has been sent to gaol merely for medical treatment or shelter, and not for crime; or any destitute, aged, or infirm person confined in a hospital for the insane who has regained sanity; or to send to any such institution any destitute person whose case may, after due inquiry, be certified by a police magistrate to be that of a person who should be maintained in a charitable institution; or transfer persons more suitable for a benevolent asylum from a hospital to a benevolent asylum where there is available accommodation.
- (d) That all amounts under £100 received as legacies or bequests without any condition attached shall not be placed to Endowment Account, but shall be utilized towards the maintenance of the institution.
- (e) That the mortuary attached to any institution at any place where there is no public morgue may be utilized by the Government for the reception of dead bodies pending inquest.
- (f) That in contracts for burials of destitute persons from institutions a provision be made for procuring the services of a minister of religion of the denomination named in the order for burial.
- (g) That no payment by way of retiring allowance or gratuity shall be made from the funds of an institution.
- (h) No medical or other officer attached to any institution shall be allowed to accept from patients either directly or indirectly any fee for his own use for services rendered at the institution. This must be made clear to patients who receive treatment or relief. This condition is not to apply in respect to patients referred to in clause (m).
- (i) That the erection of new buildings or alterations to existing buildings involving an expenditure of more than £300 be not undertaken without the approval of the Charities Board, to whom all plans and specifications must be submitted, and that copies of all plans approved by the Board be lodged with the Board for filing.
- (j) That in computing the number of days a patient has been in an institution the day of admission and the day of discharge must be counted as only one day. A case admitted and discharged on the same day must not be counted as an in-patient. A case admitted within a month of discharge is not to be counted as a new case; but, if the institution be a hospital and the patient is re-admitted suffering from an ailment other than that for which he was first treated, he may be counted as a new case.
- (k) That no member of committee of an institution shall directly or indirectly supply goods to the institution when such goods can be satisfactorily obtained elsewhere locally.
- (l) That no hospital shall make any agreement or arrive at any undertaking with any municipality or group of municipalities in respect to the treatment of infectious diseases without having first obtained the concurrence of the Treasurer of Victoria.
- (m) That, subject to the approval of the Charities Board, any hospital may provide, on such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Board, approves, wings, wards, or parts for patients who are able to pay in whole for hospital attention, including accommodation, medical, and nursing fees (who shall be known as private patients), and wings, wards, or parts for patients who are able to pay in part for hospital attention, including accommodation, medical, and nursing fees (who shall be known as intermediate patients). The Board shall have power to require any hospital to make provision for the accommodation and treatment of such patients.

Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 (No. 3260).

No. 7.—REGULATION RELATING TO COMMUNITY HOSPITALS.

It is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that the following Regulation, relating to the admission of "private patients" and "intermediate patients" to Public Hospitals, be made:—

1. For the purposes of this Regulation—

"Private Patients" shall mean patients who are able to pay in whole for hospital attention, including accommodation, medical, and nursing fees; and

"Intermediate Patients" shall mean patients who are able to pay in part for hospital attention, including accommodation, medical, and nursing fees.

"Board" shall mean the Charities Board of Victoria.

2. The Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Board, may prescribe the form of application for admission to public hospitals by private and intermediate patients.

3. The committee or a sub-committee of the hospital concerned shall be the authority, on a recommendation by a medical practitioner, to determine the admission of such patients.

4. The fees to be charged by any medical practitioner for services rendered by him to any private patient shall be a matter solely between the medical practitioner and the patient.

5. The maximum fee to be charged by any medical practitioner for services rendered by him to any intermediate patient shall be according to a scale of fees approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of some association or body of medical practitioners which represents the majority of medical practitioners practising in Victoria.

6. The fees payable by private and intermediate patients to a public hospital for accommodation and nursing shall be such as are approved by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Board after consultation with the hospital concerned.

7. All reputable medical practitioners in districts served by a public hospital shall be entitled to render services to private and intermediate patients in such public hospital.

For the purpose of this clause the municipalities set out in the Fourth Schedule to the *Hospitals and Charities Act* shall be the districts served by all hospitals situate in those districts.

8. Any approval granted by the Board to the committee of any public hospital within the municipalities set out in the Fourth Schedule of the *Hospitals and Charities Act* to provide accommodation for private or intermediate patients shall be subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

(a) That the committee of the hospital concerned shall appoint a sub-committee from its members to manage the part or parts of the hospital set apart for paying or intermediate patients, and shall give to such part or parts a distinctive name or names.

(b) That the proposed duties and powers of such sub-committee shall be submitted by the committee of the hospital to the Board for approval.

(c) That separate accounts of all transactions of the part or parts of any such hospital set apart for paying or intermediate patients shall be kept in detail, and an annual statement thereof, with the auditors' certificate, shall be furnished to the Board.

(d) That any balance at credit at the end of each year shall, except for any special reasons approved by the Board, be paid in full to the treasurer of the hospital for use of the general purposes of such hospital.

- (e) That an agreement shall be entered into between the sub-committee and the committee of the hospital, and such agreement shall be approved by the Board, and shall provide the rates of charges to be made by the committee to the sub-committee for the service to be rendered in respect of:—Power, laundry, steam, hot water, domestic and general services, nursing (except "specials"), and house medical staff; also all drugs, dressings, kitchen services, and renewals and replacements of all domestic and establishment supplies.
- (f) That no portion of the funds of any public hospital shall be used for maintenance expenditure, or on structure, equipment, furnishing, or any other purpose connected with the requirements or needs of the section of the hospital under the control of the sub-committee.

9. Any approval granted by the Board to the committee of any public hospital, within any municipality other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule of the Hospitals and Charities Act to provide accommodation for private or intermediate patients, shall be subject to the terms set out in paragraph 8 hereof, with the exception that powers and duties mentioned therein shall be applicable to the committee instead of to the sub-committee of such public hospital.

10. That if any dispute arises as to the interpretation of this Regulation the matter shall be decided by the Board, provided that an appeal may be made to the Treasurer of Victoria against any ruling of the Board, and the Treasurer's decision shall be final.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1929 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes:—

1. For every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of less than £41, the sum of One pound ten shillings, (£1 10s.).

2. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of £41 and upwards, the sum of Ninepence (9d.) in the pound of such municipal value.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant unoccupied allotments of land shall also be Ninepence (9d.) in the pound of such municipal value, provided that no rates be less than Fifteen shillings.

4. The minimum rate to be charged in livery stables shall be as follows:—

Where there are not more than six horses, the sum of Two pounds.

Where there are more than six horses, the sum of Four pounds.

5. Where water is laid on to a vacant block of land the minimum charge, if trough with ball-tap is provided, shall be Two pounds; without ball-tap, Four pounds.

6. The minimum charge for septic tanks shall be as follows:—

For private houses, the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.).

For boardinghouses, the sum of Two pounds (£2).

7. Water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by special agreement at such price as may be fixed by the Trust.

The foregoing rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of July, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

MARYSVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1929.

THE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following charges for the year 1929 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Eleven pounds or under, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence.

2. On every vacant allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Fifteen shillings, and on every vacant allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Six pounds or over, a rate of 15 per centum on the municipal annual value shall be charged.

3. On every house or tenement above the municipal annual value of Eleven pounds, a rate of Fifteen per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation shall be charged, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds except where a meter is used.

4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be made.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

7. The charge for septic tanks shall be Two pounds exclusive of the ordinary rate except in such cases as the annual rate is £20.

8. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

9. Such rate and charges shall be payable yearly in advance on the 30th day of May, 1929.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rate and charges hereby made.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

1. A rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of all tenements valued at Twenty-four pounds and upwards (except in the case of meters and special arrangements with the Trust).

Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to the amount equal to that which the Trust should be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per thousand for any quantity of water used beyond such amount aforesaid.

6. Water supplied to Government Departments, sporting grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, of the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

7. In the case of any land or tenement of which no part is situated nearer to a main than five chains, and to which no water is supplied from the Trust's mains, a special charge of not less than one-half the amount payable under the annual valuation of such land or tenement may be made by arrangement with the Trust.

8. Such rates are hereby made for the year ending 31st December, 1929, and are payable on the 1st day of January, 1929, excepting those by measure or special arrangement, which shall be paid as the Trust directs.

9. Interest at the rate of six per cent. shall be charged on all rates unpaid on the thirtieth day of June.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF QUARRY RESERVES IN THE PARISH OF CHARLTON EAST.

THE Council of the Shire of Charlton, being the duly appointed Committee of Management of—Firstly, the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 2nd August, 1880, as a site for a Quarry in the Parish of Charlton East; secondly, the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 20th January, 1914, as a site for the Supply of Material for Making Roads in the Parish of Charlton East, having framed the following Regulations for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserves, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
 5. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserves, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserves (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1915.
 7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserves without the permission of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
 8. No person shall camp in the Reserves, nor erect therein any dwelling without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
 9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission the Committee may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of every half year.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against these Regulations, and who, after he has been

warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

Resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Charlton on the 25th February, 1929, and was confirmed on the 25th March, 1929, by special order.

No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the Contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while awaiting themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail, unless directed otherwise by the police. Bodies to be buried at Williamstown or Footscray will be conveyed by road. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 15.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the River Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue. Burials in the Williamstown-Footscray sub-districts shall be made in the Williamstown or Footscray Cemeteries, as the police may direct.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and respective Cemeteries Regulations.

9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor or deducted from the contract security money.

10. When burials are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any Hospital for the Insane, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities will be repaid to the Contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Should the religious belief, however, of the deceased preclude the burial being carried out in conformity with the above clause as regards the attendance of the officiating clergyman, the friends of the deceased shall, if practicable, be notified by the police with respect to the service. In the case of foreigners, the Consul of the country to which he is reputed to belong shall also be notified by the Police Department of his decease, in which case, when practicable, he may provide for such service as he may consider necessary.

13. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will, on report of the Tender Board, subject the Contractor to the immediate cancellation of his contract, the forfeiture of the security money, or such other disqualifications as the Hon. the Treasurer may direct. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

14. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

15. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the

security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

16. Under no circumstances will a Contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 4—BUTCHERS, COUNTRY.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination on the 27th May, 1929, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; such portions of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorpanyal and Peak Ridings of the Shire of Corio.

(b) On the 16th day of March, 1914, the power given to the Country Shop Assistants Board to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in or in connexion with a butcher's shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," was conferred exclusively on this Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(4) **OVERTIME.**—The following rate shall be paid for all work done :—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause 3 } Time and a half.
- (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause 3 in excess of 48 hours, in any week }

(5) **MEAL INTERVALS.**—(a) One hour shall be allowed for a meal between noon and 2 p.m.

(b) Where an employee is required to commence duty before 7.30 a.m., one hour shall be allowed for breakfast.

(6) **PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.**—All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay :—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Anzac Day, and one Picnic Day in each year.

(7) **ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.**—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted six days' holiday in each year on full pay.

(8) **SICK LEAVE.**—All employees necessarily absent on account of sickness shall be allowed six days' sick leave each year on full pay, providing satisfactory evidence is produced to the management or employer within 24 hours of the usual hour for commencing work.

(9) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

In the event of one holiday occurring in a week and not being worked, overtime rate shall be paid for any time worked in excess of 40 hours.

In the event of two holidays occurring in a week and not being worked, overtime rate shall be paid for any time worked in excess of 32 hours.

(4) DEFINITION.—Shift worker means any person employed in a continuous process where three shifts are worked for six days a week, and in which alternative weekly shifts are worked by such person.

(5) MEAL ALLOWANCE.—A meal allowance of 1s. 6d. shall be paid to any male employee over 16 years of age, when ordered to work overtime without notice the day before such overtime is required, and provided a minimum of 4 hours' overtime per day is worked.

(6) PAYMENTS FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Eight hours' pay at ordinary rates shall be paid for the following holidays, if not worked:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day, or such other days as are observed in lieu of any of the above days, excepting—

(a) In the event of Anzac Day falling on a Sunday, no payment shall be made for that day.

(b) In the event of a holiday falling on a Saturday, and not being worked, day workers shall be paid ordinary rates for 4 hours 40 minutes, to make up a full week of 48 hours.

(c) In the event of any of the above holidays not being worked, day-workers shall have the option of working three-quarters of an hour at ordinary rates, to make up a full week of 48 hours.

(7) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Anzac Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Foundation Day (26th January); but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PAINT AND COLOUR BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on 1st June, 1929, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the trade of preparing any kind of paint, varnish, enamel, or colour, either wet or dry," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st June, 1929, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, but if any day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) TIME RATES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.
