Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE PAINT AND COLOUR BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on 1st June, 1929, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the trade of preparing any kind of paint, varnish, enamel, or colour, either wet or dry," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st June, 1929, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, but if any day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) TIME RATES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

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Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 9th June, 1929, applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and such portion of the City of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; the township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and of Strathfieldsaye; the township of Spring Gully in the Shire of Strathfieldsaye; and such portions of the Shire of South Barwon and of the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio as are within a radius of five miles of the Geelong Post Office.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest price or rate of payment for bread-making or baking," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 9th June, 1929, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

That the number of hours to be worked on each night (including the time spent at the doughmaking necessary for such night's work) shall be:—

- (4) OVERTIME.—(a) That any employee (other than an apprentice) who works either
(i) for any time in excess of the number of hours fixed in Clause 3, or alternatively,
(ii) during any week for any time in excess of 44 hours,
shall be paid for such extra time at the wages rate of double time.
- (b) That any apprentice who works on any one night for any time in excess of the number of hours fixed in clause 3 shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of 5s. per hour.
- (5) Weekly hours—
That the number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 44.
- (6) TIME RATE.—That any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 22 hours, be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum.
- (7) SPECIAL RATES FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—That payment for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be at the rate of time and a half; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
- (8) DEFINITION.—“Foreman or single hand” shall mean the person responsible for the output and the quality of the bread.
