Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CHAR WORKERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 1st June, 1929, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; such portion of the City of Sandringham as is not included within the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Warrnambool; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board, which since the 29th May, 1928, has had the power "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boarding Houses Board and of the Hotel and Restaurant Board) employed at office cleaning or general cleaning work in or about any building in which any process, trade, business, or occupation is carried on," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st June, 1929, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) OVERTIME.—That the following rates shall be paid for overtime:—

- (5) Casual Labour.—Casual employees, i.e., persons who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work, shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.
- (6) PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.—All employees other than casual employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Anzao Day, Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
- (7) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Anzac Day, or Christmas Day; and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), King's Birthday, Boxing Day, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
