Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE CHAFF-CUTTERS BOARD.

Note. -(a) This Determination on the 13th October, 1930, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) When the Order in Council appointing this Board was passed, the words printed below in italies were not included. The Governor in Council, by order dated 3rd August, 1921, added to the Board's powers, and for convenience of reference these powers are printed in this form.

I N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the process, trade, or business of chaff-outting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder; or in the trade of corn

cleaning or corn grading;

(b) employed in carting or driving, or assisting in carting or driving, in connexion with the trade or business of chaff-cutting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder;"

has made the following Determination, namely :-

(1) That on the 13th day of October, 1930, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (7) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.
- (8) Termination of Employment.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.
 - (9) PIRCE-WORK.—The lowest piece-work prices payable to any person employed on a travelling plant shall be—
