BOUNDARY AT THE MOUTH OF THE TAMBO RIVER.

It is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to revoke so much of the Proclamation made the eighteenth day of July, 1919, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the twenty-third day of July, 1919, pages 1673-4, as relates to the Tambo River, and in lieu thereof to prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing for the whole of each year within an area at the mouth of the Tambo River bounded as follows:—Commencing at a post on the eastern shore of Swan Bay in Lake King distant 400 yards north-easterly from the most seaward point of the western side of the mouth of the Tambo River; thence by lines bearing N. 33 deg. W. 200 yards, S. 52 deg. W. 726 yards, S. 26 deg. 7 min. E. 989 yards, N. 49 deg. E. 850 yards, and N. 33 deg. W. 200 yards from the most seaward point of the eastern side of the mouth of the Tambo River; thence by a line bearing N. 33 deg. W. to the point of commencement. # REGULATIONS UNDER THE FOOTWEAR REGULATION ACT 1928 (No. 3684).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of February, 1930.

#### PRESENT :

W HEREAS by the Footwear Regulation Act 1928 (No. 3684) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, make Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order repeal the Regulations made on the fourth day of July, 1917, under the provisions of the Footwear Regulation Act 1916 (No. 2869), and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. Stamps on Soles which do not Consist Entirely of Leather.

#### (Section 4.)

The markings required by the Act to be placed on the outer surface of all soles which do not consist entirely of leather shall be either impressed or embossed or stamped in indelible permanent ink on the waist, and the type of the lettering shall be of the form and at least as large as the example as follows:—

#### LEATHER AND CARDBOARD SOLE.

Provided that where the sole is composed of material which cannot be impressed, embossed, or stamped in indelible permanent ink, a label bearing the required markings may be attached to the waist instead.

2. The Seller's or Manufacturer's Name or Registered TRADE MARK.

#### ٨ (Section 5.)

The markings of the seller's or manufacturer's name or registered trade mark which the Act requires to be placed upon the soles of all footwear manufactured in Victoria for sale or supply shall be impressed or embossed or stamped in indelible permanent ink on the outer surface of the sole, and shall be of the form usually adopted by the seller or manufacturer.

Provided that where the sole is composed of materials which cannot be impressed, embossed, or stamped in indelible permanent ink, a label bearing the seller's or manufacturer's name or registered trade mark may be attached to the sole instead.

#### 3. SHANKS.

(Section 4 (b) (iii).)

Shanks may be made of leatherboard, papier-mache, scandia, or wood, or combination of those materials, and may be strengthened with steel, and shall be used only for the purpose of strengthening the part of the sole of a boot or shoe known as the maist

#### 4. WEIGHTING SUBSTANCES.

#### (Section 6 (i).)

The following weighting substances are prohibited:-

- (a) Lead. (b) Antim Antimony.

- Magnesium sulphate.

  Magnesium sulphate.
  Glucose and sugar in any quantity exceeding 3 per cent. (taken together).

#### 5. PENALTY.

(Section 12 (i) (d).)

The penalty for any breach of these Regulations shall be not less than £2 nor more than £10.

#### BY-LAW NO. 85.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under Part VII., Division 11, and section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915, and section 75 of the Health Act 1919, and numbered of Section 197

(a) suppressing nuisances, and
(b) prescribing the times for the removal or carriage through the streets of any night-soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid, whether into or out of or through the Municipal District: Providing that the utensils, receptacles, and vehicles used therefore shall be properly constructed and covered so as to prevent any leakage therefrom or the escape of any such matter or of any offensive effluvia, and compelling the cleansing of any place whereon such night-soil matter or liquid has been dropped or split in such removal or carriage.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915 and the Health Act 1919, and of every other power it enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—

1. No person shall carry through any street in the City of Sandringham any night-soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid except between the hours of 11 p.m. of any day and 8 a.m. of the following day.

o a.m. of the following day.

2. Every vehicle used for the carriage of any night-soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid shall be properly constructed and covered so as to prevent any leakage therefrom, or the escape of any such matter or liquid or of any offensive effluvia, and in case of any vehicle being so used which does not comply with these provisions of the By-law the owner of the vehicle and the person driving the same and the person in charge of the vehicle shall each be guilty of an offence against the By-law.

3. Should any night-soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid be dropped or spilt on any street, footpath, or public place in the City of Sandringham, the person in charge of the vehicle in which the same has been carried shall forthwith remove the same and effectually cleanse the street, footway, or public place on which the same has been dropped or spilt.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Sandring-

5. Any person who is guilty of any act, breach, or default contrary to the above provisions shall be liable for every offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

#### SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

#### BY-LAW No. 48.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale made under the Local Government Acts 1915 and 1921 and the Petrol Pumps Act 1928, and numbered forty-eight, for or with respect to—

(a) The placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, and appliances;

(b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences, and applications therefor;

(c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;

(d) prescribing fees—

(ii) for the prescript and wards and the second and the sec

(i) for the granting or renewal of a licence;(ii) for the transfer of a licence;

(a) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months;

(f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Governments Acts 1915 and 1921 and the Petrol Pumps Act 1928, and any other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette, and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality.

2. In this By-law"Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

Council shall mean the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

Licence shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.

Licence shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.

Municipality shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

Petrol pump shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

Dual pump shall mean any pump connected by pipes with two tanks and no more.

Single pump shall mean any pump connected by pipes with one tank and no more.

Portable petrol pump shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels, and is not fixed in or on the footway, and is not allowed to romain on the footway.

Regulations shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.

No petrol pump shall be creeted in any portion of the

3. No petrol pump shall be creeted in any portion of the municipal district until the consent of the Council is first had and obtained.

4. All works done and all material used in connexion with the installation and upkeep of petrol pumps, tanks, and pipes, must comply with the requirements of the Regulations made and to be made from time to time under the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.

Act 1928.

5. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipality.

6. A licence must be obtained from the Council for every petrol pump placed in or under any footway in any highway within the municipality prior to the making of this By-law.

Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law.

7. Any person may apply to the Council for a transfer of a

7. Any person may apply to the Council for a transfer of a licence

licence.

8. Every application for a licence shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereto and shall be accompanied by the necessary fees.

9. The fees payable to the Council in respect of licences and transfers of licences shall be as set out hereunder:

(a) There shall be said to the Council in respect of every

(a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every petrol pump situated on the frontage to the Mainstreet in the Township of Bairnsdale—
for every dual pump, Five pounds per annum; for every portable pump, One pound one shilling per annum.

(b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every petrol pump situated within the municipality, excepting such pumps as are situated on the frontage to Main-street in the Township of Bairnsdale—for every dual pump, Three pounds per annum; for every single pump, Two pounds per annum; for every portable pump. One pound one shilling per annum.

per annum.

(c) For every transfer of any licence in any portion of the municipality, Five shillings shall be paid.

(d) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve, a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

10. Any person desiring to transfer a licence shall make application on the form provided by the Council and shall enclose therewith a transfer of the licence in writing signed by the licensee and the acceptor of such transfer.

11. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall before the petrol pump is crected in respect of which such licence is granted, or, if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company of good repute, against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump, in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall on demand produce to the Council, or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance, and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

14. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of One pound per day on which the offence is continued after conviction by any Court, and after written notice of any offence from the Council.

Building Regulations.

It is hereby notified that the Council of the Shire of Bass, at meetings held on the tenth day of June, 1929, and the fourteenth day of October, 1929, passed a Resolution adopting a By-law, No. 20, regulating and restraining the erection of buildings within certain parts of the Municipality of Bass, and that such Resolution was confirmed at meetings of the said Council held on the eighth day of July, 1929, and the eleventh day of November, 1929, and that such By-law was approved of by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of November, 1929.

And it is hereby further notified that a copy of the By-law is deposited at the office of the said Council and is there open for inspection free of charge.

The By-law will operate within the boundaries of the Township of North Wonthaggi and the Township of San Remo, and the following is a summary of the provisions it contains, viz.:—

#### PART I. PROVIDES-

That the plans of every new building must be first submitted to the Council for approval and how such plans are to be submitted, and the requirements respecting same, and that

That the site upon which a building is to be erected must be in a healthy condition, graded, and properly drained.
That buildings removed to the area defined or from one place to another within the area must be re-erected to comply with the By-law.

That all buildings, with certain exceptions, must be erected a defined distance from the building line and back line of the allotment intended to be built upon.
That wooden buildings shall be erected a defined distance from side streets or from other wooden buildings.
That roofs shall be of incombustible coverings.

For the minimum area to be covered by buildings.
That the allotment upon which the dwelling is to be erected shall have a superficial area of not less than 5,200 feet, and a frontage to the street or road of not less than 40 lineal feet,

except in the case of existing subdivisions having a frontage of not less than 33 feet and a depth of 150 feet, and that the dwelling house and other buildings to be creeted on each such allotment shall cover not more than a certain area of the.

That the By-law shall apply to alterations and additions to

That the Dy-law shan apply to alterations and adoltons to existing buildings.

For the height of the habitable rooms, the ventilation and lighting and the thickness of walls and the construction of staircases of buildings.

That bath heaters and stoves must be properly constructed

and set.

PART II. PROVIDES-

For the height of buildings.

#### PART III. PROVIDES-

For the construction of public buildings, and for the stairs, egress space, accommodation, exit from stage, kind of doors, internal approaches, ventilation, fire extinguishing appliances, and sanitary accommodation for same.

#### PART IV. PROVIDES-

For security against fire in public buildings, hotels, and lodging houses.

PART V. PROVIDES-

For seclusion of privies and distance of fowl houses, stables,
