BY-LAW No. 81.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick, made under the provisions of section 719 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and numbered 81, for regulating the management and use of the Municipal Baths in Dawson-street, within the City, and for fixing the amounts to be charged for admission to and for the use of same, and for fixing the penalty for any breach of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

1. No person shall be allowed to use the swimming bath until he or she has cleansed himself or herself at the cleansing shower baths provided for the purpose.

2. No person shall use the swimming bath whilst in an uncleanly condition or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the Baths immediately upon being requested so to do by any of the attendants on duty in the Baths.

3. No person shall use soap in any part of the Baths other than in the cleansing shower baths.

4. No person shall smoke or expectorate in any portion of the Baths premises.

5. No person using the Baths, or any officer or servant or other person employed thereat, shall at any time introduce into the Baths any spirituous or intoxicating liquor.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the Baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

7. No person shall at any time while in the Baths use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the swimming bath may be discoloured or rendered unfit for proper use of bathers.

8. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the swimming bath or the shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing trunk or drawers, or bathing dress, or any bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, or any part of the Baths premises, or any furniture or article therein.

9. Every person shall, before being admitted to the Baths, pay to the authorized money taker the price of payment to the Baths as set out hereunder, and shall, when furnished with any Council property, return same to the attendant in charge, who will issue a ticket for the return of the deposit or deposits lodged.

10. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap, or fittings in connexion with the Baths, nor carelessly, negligently, or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fittings, towels, or other articles supplied for use in the Baths, nor write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the Baths.

11. Any person hiring any towel, bathing trunk, bathing gown, or any article from the attendant or person in charge of the Baths shall return same on leaving the Baths.

12. No person shall at any time while being upon the Baths premises use indecent or offensive language, nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

13. All persons using the swimming bath must wear proper bathing gowns.

14. No person shall knowingly occupy any dressing-room or the swimming bath for a longer period than one hour, or the shower baths for an unreasonable time, unless such person shall, upon demand being made by the attendant in charge, again pay to such attendant the sum payable under this By-law as a charge for admission to the Baths.

15. No person shall bring any dog or other animal into the Baths.

16. Any person finding any article in the Baths shall immediately thereafter deliver same to one of the attendants in charge, who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in the book kept for that purpose, and any owner losing such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof thereof receive such article from the attendant in charge upon entering his or her signature and address and a receipt for such article in the book referred to.

17. The Council will not be responsible for any articles lost by or stolen from any persons whilst in the Baths. Valuables may be handed to the cashier or officer in charge for safe keeping, and will be locked in the cloak room.

18. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Baths by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the Baths when required to do so by the officer in charge of the Baths for the time being.

19. No person shall engage in any organized game or competition in the Baths on a Sunday.

20. No incompetent swimmer shall enter any portion of the swimming pools beyond his or her depth unless there shall be securely fixed to such person an approved floating device or life belt, and such person is accompanied by a person holding a life saver's certificate.

21. The Baths shall be open on every day in the year, except Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Anzac Day, during the following hours:—

Sundays, 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.,
Other days, 7 a.m. to 9.30, p.m.,

provided that the Council shall have the right to close during the winter months the open pool and allot the use of the covered pool between the sexes as it may think fit.

22. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
