TALBOT WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

BY-LAW NO. 7.

A By-law for the Purpose of Preventing the Waste, Undue Consumption, or Misusing of Water.

THE Council of the Shire of Talbot (hereinafter called "the Authority"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Authority by the *Water Act* 1928, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the Authority in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The Authority may by notice published as hereinafter mentioned prohibit or restrict the use of water supplied by it for any purpose during such period and/or at such times or from time to time as may be fixed by the Authority and stated in such notice, and for the purpose of giving effect to such prohibition or restriction the Authority may likewise prohibit or regulate the use of any hose, spray pipe, fitting or apparatus or the affixing thereof to any tap or pipe forming part of the consumer's service or vested in the Authority.

2. Such notice may be given either by printed posters placed in prominent positions within the water supply district of the Authority or by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in such district.

3. Any person who shall use or permit or suffer to be used any water supplied by the Authority, or who shall use or affix or permit to be used or affixed any hose, spray pipe, fitting, or apparatus contrary to such prohibition or restriction, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Authority.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1928*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1930 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of under Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not be in any case less than One pound eight shillings per annum.

2. For any house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Seven shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Fourteen shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, twenty-one shillings if more than half an acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre, with a maximum charge of One pound eight shillings sterling for any parcel of land within the Urban District.

Where any horses or cows are wholly or partially kept on or at any land or tenement not supplied by the Trust with water by measurement there shall be payable for every such animal (exceeding one in number) wholly or partially kept as aforesaid (in addition to the assessment rate) a special rate of Six shillings per head per annum.

5. For water in excess of the quantity covered by the above rate supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust). One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons. The quantity covered by the rate shall be 1,000 gallons for every One shilling and ninepence in the amount of rates payable.

When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for the minimum quantity of 300,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of Three pence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

6. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

8. The foregoing rates are payable on the first day of April, 1930.

6. Should any owner or occupier fail to provide a meter when required to do so, the Trust may provide one on hire, and shall charge such owner or occupier a rental of Sixpence per month for the hire of such meter.

For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the rate named in the preceding clauses hereof, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges, except those mentioned in clauses seven (7) and eight (8) hereof, shall be payable in one sum yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1930.

REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and peddlers) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the Shire of Seymour, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the municipal district of the Shire of Seymour shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

(a) Five o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

(b) Six o'clock on the evening of Friday.

ENTERTAINMENTS TAX ACT 1929.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Entertainments Tax Act* 1929, No. 3846, it is provided that the Governor in Council may make arrangements with the Governor-General of the Commonwealth for the collection by the Commonwealth on behalf of the State of Victoria of the Entertainments Tax: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of an agreement in the form set forth in the schedule hereunder, for the collection of the Entertainments Tax by the Commissioner of Taxation for the Commonwealth on behalf of the State of Victoria, to be entered into between the Governor in Council of the said State of Victoria and the Governor-General of the said Commonwealth of Australia:—

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT made the day of One thousand nine hundred and thirty between His Excellency Lieutenant-Colonel the Right Honorable Arthur Herbert Tennyson Baron Somers Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Companion of the Distinguished Service Order Military Cross Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State (hereinafter called the Governor in Council of the said State) of the one part And His Excellency the Right Honorable John Lawrence Baron Stonehaven a Member of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Companion of the Distinguished Service Order Governor-General and Commander in Chief in and over the Commonwealth of Australia (hereinafter called the Governor-General) of the other part: Whereas there has been enacted in the State of Victoria an Act to provide for the Imposition of a Tax upon Payments for Admission to Entertainments such Act being intitled the *Entertainments Tax Act* 1929 (hereinafter referred to as the State Act): And whereas by section 7 of the said Act it is provided as follows:—

"1. The Governor in Council may make arrangements with the Governor-General of the Commonwealth for the collection by the Commonwealth on behalf of the State of Victoria of entertainments tax.

"2. The Governor in Council may make regulations for carrying into effect any arrangement made under the provisions of the section."

And whereas pursuant to the provisions of the said section 7 the Governor in Council of the said State has arranged with the Governor-General in manner hereinafter appearing: Now it is hereby agreed as follows:—

1. Subject to the provision of this agreement the Commissioner of Taxation for the Commonwealth (hereinafter called the "Commonwealth Commissioner") shall during the currency of this agreement collect the said entertainments tax for and on behalf of the State and for the purposes of such collection the Commonwealth Commissioner shall exercise and discharge the powers duties and functions conferred or imposed by the State Act and the Regulations thereunder upon the Commissioner appointed under the State Act (hereinafter called the "State Commissioner"): Provided that questions involving interpretation of the State Act shall be subject to the rulings of the State Crown Solicitor.

2. (a) The Commonwealth Commissioner shall pay to the State Commissioner on each and every day of receipt or as soon thereafter as may be practicable the amount of the said entertainments tax collected by him or by way of his officers under the State Act and shall forward weekly an analysis of collections to the State Commissioner.

(b) Refunds in respect of the State Entertainments Tax shall be made by the Treasurer of the State after the necessary refund voucher has been certified to by the Commonwealth Commissioner or any of his officers duly authorized in that behalf and such refunds shall be duly authorized by the State Commissioner.

3. The State Commissioner or any officer of the State authorized in writing by him shall at all times have full and free access to all books, documents, records, and other papers relating to the collection of the said State Entertainments Tax, kept by or for the Commonwealth Commissioner, and may make extracts from or copies of any such books, documents, records, and papers.

4. The Commonwealth shall discharge all the costs and expenses of collection of the said State Entertainments Tax but the State will for the period of the first six months of the operation of this agreement pay to the Commonwealth half the cost of collection of both the Commonwealth and State Entertainments Taxes in Victoria as determined by agreement between the Commonwealth Commissioner and the State Commissioner or in default of such agreement as certified by the Auditor-General of the Commonwealth, and after the expiration of the said period of six months the State shall pay to the Commonwealth the actual cost of collection of the State Entertainments Tax as determined by agreement between the Commonwealth Commissioner and the State Commissioner or in default of such agreement as certified by the Auditor-General of the Commonwealth. On the 30th June of each year from the commencement of the operation of this agreement the amount of the payment to be made by the State to the Commonwealth shall be reviewed as to the advisability of alteration. Payments by the State to the Commonwealth under this clause shall be made quarterly.

5. The Commonwealth Commissioner in the collection of the said Entertainments Tax shall be free from interference or control by the Commonwealth and if and when he desires to employ a solicitor in connexion with such collection or for any prosecution he shall employ the Crown Solicitor for the State.

6. Where any act or omission constitutes an offence which might be prosecuted under both the Commonwealth and State law and action is taken under only one such law any penalty recovered shall where the offence relates to the amount of tax be apportioned between the Commonwealth and State in proportion to the amount of Commonwealth and State tax evaded, and in all other cases the amount of the penalty shall be divided equally.

7. Any reference herein to "the State Act" and to "Entertainments Tax" (other than Entertainments Tax imposed by any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth) shall be deemed to include a reference to any Act of the Parliament of the State amending the State Act or passed in substitution thereof and any regulation made thereunder or to any tax thereunder respectively.

8. (a) This agreement shall continue in force until determined by either party hereto giving at any time to the other party hereto six calendar months' notice in writing of its intention to terminate same, and on the expiration of such notice the agreement shall terminate.

(b) Any such notice shall be deemed to have been duly given if in the case of the Commonwealth it is signed by the Commonwealth Treasurer or the Minister for the time being acting as such and if in the case of the State it is signed by the Treasurer of the State or the Minister for the time being acting as such.

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-widths of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purpose to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material

deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbour or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the Council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbour or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin:

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the nineteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, No. 69, made under the Local Government Acts, and particularly under section 10 of the *Local Government Act* 1921, No. 3167, as amended by Act No. 3388, for prescribing Residential Areas within the Municipal District of Collingwood and for other purposes, as set out in the said By-law and the Schedule attached thereto.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

BY-LAW No. 83.

Parking of Vehicles in Hampton-street and Thomas-street.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under Part VII. Division 11, and section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act* 1915, and numbered 83, for regulating traffic and for keeping order in the carriage and foot-paths and public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915 and the *Police Offences Act* 1915, and of every other power it enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—

Definition of Vehicle.

1. In this By-law, "vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal or mechanical or other power, and includes a motor cycle.

Vehicles not to be left in certain parts of Hampton-street and Thomas-street.

2. The driver of a vehicle shall not leave the same or any part thereof unattended, or keep the same or any part thereof in one position for the space of five minutes or upwards in the following parts, or any portion of the following parts of Hampton-street and Thomas-street, in the City of Sandringham, viz.:—

All parts of Thomas-street, Hampton, which are within a distance of sixty feet from the building line of Hampton-street.

All parts of the eastern half of Hampton-street, Hampton, which are within forty-feet of the building line of the south side of Thomas-street.

All parts of the eastern half of Hampton-street, Hampton, which are within forty feet of the building line of the north side of Thomas-street.

All parts of the western half of Hampton-street, Hampton, which are within sixty feet of the centre line of the north and south sides of Thomas-street, at its intersection with Hampton-street.

3. All members of the Police Force and all officers and employees of the City of Sandringham are authorized to take steps to prevent any breach of this By-law, and to take steps for the recovery of penalties thereunder.

Application of By-law.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout such parts of the City of Sandringham as are specified in clause two hereof.

Penalty.

5. Any person who is guilty of any act breach or default contrary to the above provisions shall be liable for every offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

SHIRE OF GRENVILLE.

BY-LAW No. 14.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1919, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Grenville, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Linton, and all properties within a radius of 60 chains from the Shire Office, Linton.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of nightsoil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being fitted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape, and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22 gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with nightsoil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each such pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises, and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause such nightsoil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such nightsoil be disposed of in trenches, such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the nightsoil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean thoroughly broken-up soil upon the nightsoil and pan-washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of nightsoil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the nightsoil and washings in any trench such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the nightsoil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which nightsoil has been deposited, provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of nightsoil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of nightsoil shall, immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the nightsoil.

21. Every pan, after the disposal of its contents, and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid, and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water, subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steam-tight box or chamber; or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of acrol, cyllin, kerol, izal, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the depot, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any nightsoil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury, nor cause to be buried, any nightsoil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other places therein or thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

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SHIRE OF KYNETON.

By-LAW No. 35.

A By-law of the Shire of Kyneton, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act* 1915 and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928 and numbered 35, for and with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways or roadways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in or under footways or roadways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such pumps, pipes, or appliances.
- (b) The granting, renewal, and transfer of licences, and applications therefor.
- (c) Licences and the conditions contained in such licences.
- (d) Prescribing fees—
 - (1) For the granting or renewal of a licence.
 - (2) For the transfer of a licence.
- (e) Providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months.
- (f) Insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915 and the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kyneton order as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this By-law—
 - "Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Kyneton.
 - "Licence" shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928.
 - "Licensee" shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928.
 - "Municipality" shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Kyneton.
 - "Petrol pump" shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable pump.
 - "Portable petrol pump" shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footway and is not allowed to remain on the footway.
 - "Dual or double" pump shall mean a pump which supplies motor spirit from one or more tanks, and shall be considered as two separate pumps, and shall be charged as such.
 - "Regulations" shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the Shire of Kyneton used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form prescribed by the Council, and every licence issued shall be in the form prescribed by the Council.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928 to maintain in a safe and efficient condition, and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence issued shall expire on the 30th day of September next after the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force or effect.

5. There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump (other than a portable pump) in or on any footway on the Calder Highway a licence-fee of Two pounds two shillings per annum, and all or any other road in the municipality the sum of One pound one shilling per annum, and for a portable petrol pump there shall be paid a fee of

One pound one shilling per annum, provided that where a licence is granted for a petrol pump or a portable petrol pump for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

6. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the prescribed fee in such cases has first been paid.

7. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it on the authorized form, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

8. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of such licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence-fee as hereinbefore prescribed.

9. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

10. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions, viz.:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application in writing to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with the application a transfer of the licence, in writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon such transfer being approved by the Council) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer-fee of Five shillings.

11. Immediately upon the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given, the policy of insurance hereinafter referred to taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee, or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

12. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall, before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company of good repute against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such pump in the sum of at least Two hundred pounds (£200). Every licensee shall, on demand, produce to the Council, or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

13. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump, or any part thereof, or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

14. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed, or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, shall within seven days after such expiry or cancellation remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence, and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in or under the footway.

15. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing.

16. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Kyneton.

SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

MODEL BY-LAW RELATING TO THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL, AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE (No. 29).

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Township of Maffra, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said township, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Township of Maffra, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Refuse” includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge, or other approved material, in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor shall cause, at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way, except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, where as soon as possible the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method as may be approved by the Commission and in such manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved material so as not to create any nuisance.

21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
