NOTICE OF INTENTION RE PROHIBITION OF MORE THAN TWO RODS AND LINES OR HAND LINES IN FISHING.

I T is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gasette, paoneation of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prescribing that no person shall use at the same time more than two lines, whether attached to rods or not, for the purpose of fishing in or taking fish from any inland waters of Victoria.

For the purposes of the Proclamation, "inland waters" shall not include any waters directly affected by tidal influence.

Petrol Pumps Act 1928. CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW No. 54.

Petrol Pumps.

- A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under Part VII. of the Local Government Act 1928 and section 6 of the Petrol Pumps Act 1928, and numbered 54, for or with respect to—
 - (a) The placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances. appliances;
 - (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
 (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
 (d) prescribing fees—

 - - for the granting or renewal of a licence;
 for the transfer of a licence;
 - (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
 (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1928 and the Petrol Pumps Act 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

- 1. In this By-law-

- Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Camberwell.
 "Licence" shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.
 "Licensee" shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.
 "Municipality" chell

- Act 1928.

 "Municipality" shall mean the municipality of the City of Camberwell.

 "Petrol pump" shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

 "Portable petrol pump" shall mean a petrol pump.

 "Portable petrol pump" shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the lootway, and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

 "Regulations" shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.
- 2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol 2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the City of Camberwell used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to this By-law.
- 3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the Petrol Pumps Act 1928 to maintain in a safe and efficient condition and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law all petrol pumps. apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.
- 4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect.

- (a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump other than a portable petrol pump in or on any footway, a licence fee of Sixty-three shillings (£3 3s.) per annum.
- three shillings (£3 3s.) per annum.

 (b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purposes of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence fee of One pound one shilling (£1 ls.) per annum.

 (c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

 No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence.
- 5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.
- 6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

 7. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

 9. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with

No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application in writing to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence in writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of Ten shillings.

Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given the policy of insurance hereinsfer referred to taken out by the transferce shall be transferred to the transferce, or the transferce shall effect a new policy in an insurance company of repute to the same effect.

Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump, in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall on demand produce to the Council or any duly appointed officer of the Council the said policy of insurance and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence. of the licence.
- 12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.
- 13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928, shall within seven days after such expiry or cancellation remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence.
- 14. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

CITY OF GEELONG. BY-LAW No. 103.

NOTICE is hereby given that a By-law, No. 103, for regulating and restraining the erection of buildings, &c., has been made by the Council of the City of Geelong, and approved by the Governor in Council.

The title and summary of the provisions of such By-law are as follow:—

A By-law of the City of Geelong, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 103, for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting upon or within 10 feet of any street or road;
- (b) requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting upon or within 10 feet of any street or road;
- or within 10 feet of any street or road;

 (c) authorizing the Council to pull down and remove huildings, erections, or hoardings, or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by this By-law and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;

 (d) appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council;

- (c) regulating and restraining the removal and re-erection within the municipal district of wooden buildings;
- (f) prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house or any shop, or any dwelling-house and shop combined, may hereafter be erected;
- (g) providing that every dwelling-house bereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land.
- (h) prescribing the distance of buildings from boundaries;
- (i) providing with respect to buildings hereafter erected

 - (1) regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
 (2) means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fires in buildings;
 (3) the ventilation and lighting of buildings;
 (4) exits from, and stairways, in buildings other than private dwelling-houses;
 (5) the minimum size of any dwelling rooms;
 (6) the minimum area to be covered by any dwelling-house, or any dwelling-house and shop combined;
- (j) requiring any work or thing to be executed or done, of such materials, within such time, or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person autho-rized in that behalf by the Council;
- (k) prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such residential area the use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures are repulsed to the contraction of the contraction factures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in this By-law;
- (t) authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings erected or constructed or adapted for use or used contrary to any By-law of the City of Geelong, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under any such By-law;
- (m) carrying out of purposes provided for in the Schedule to the Local Government Act 1915;
- (n) regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, steneilling, placing, or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath, street, or road, or upon any building, fence, or other property vested in the magnificality. fence, or other property vested in the municipality or under the control and management of the Council
- (a) regulating, restricting, or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the ameni-ties of a public park or pleasure promenade, or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape;
- (p) regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or affixed to or painted on any hoardings, or on any building, or on any fence, rock. cliff, or tree;
- (q) regulating sewerage and drainage
- (r) leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by Resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case;
- (s) repealing By-laws, Regulations, and parts thereof, re-spectively, heretofore in force in the municipality, inconsistent with or repugnant to this By-law.

 "Parking area" means any standing place for motor cars within the meaning of section 197 (7) of the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720) appointed by the Council pursuant thereto.

3. The areas described in the schedule to this By-law are hereby fixed and appointed as parking areas.

4. A driver may park his motor car in any such parking areas at such times and subject to such conditions as are hereinafter mentioned, and not otherwise.

5. The Council may from time to time appoint such officers

a. The Council may from time to time appoint such officers as it thinks proper to supervise such parking areas, and every driver shall park his car as and where he shall from time to time be directed by any such officer, and not otherwise or elsewhere, and shall pay to such officer (who is herely authorized to receive the same) a fee of One shilling per day or portion of a day for each motor car so parked.

6. No person shall obstruct any opaning that may be left

6. No person shall obstruct any opening that may be left or appointed by the Council or any such officer for the purpose of facilitating traffic by placing or permitting any vehicle to be or remain therein or otherwise howsever.

7. A driver shall in any parking area park his car-

- (1) as directed by the officer in charge of the parking
- area;
 (2) if no such officer be present, shall take up his position f no such officer be present, shall take up his position in the order of his arrival at such parking area and in such manner as will enable him to leave such position without disturbance to other motor cars, and also in such a way as will permit such other motor cars to leave their respective positions without difficulty, and as will not obstruct or interfere with any traffic, and shall, when requested by any such officer so to do, remove his motor car to any position and in such manner as may be directed by such officer. uch officer.
- S. Any person not being a duly appointed or authorized officer of the Council who, without authority, shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant or other officer of the Council, or who shall in any way assume the duties of a parking area attendant or other officer of the Council, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any parking area attendant or other officer of the Council as aforesaid in the execution of his duty under this By-law, shall be guilty of an officer or grainst this Br-law.

9. Any contravention of any of the provisions herein contained by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-

10. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING PIECE-WORK SCHEDULES.

Work to be taken as completed after passing foreman's inspection.

Material for workman to be rough cut out and printed, also web to be strained and hair and flock

Material given out to be cut to length required.

Machine sewing to be done for workman, preparing for same to be done by workman.

Machine sewing to be tied off for workman.

Where length is specified, increase or deduction in quantity of stitching, or stitching and finishing, to be according to scales on pages 2351 and 2352.

Materials—such as hemp, wax, jet, tallow, &c.—to be found for workman free of charge by employer. "Full price" shall mean the price fixed for an article without extras or deductions.

"Extra" or "extras" shall mean any work (not specified in the general description of an article), the price of which is to be added to the full price.
"Deduction" or "deductions" shall mean any work the price of which can be deducted from the

full price fixed for an article.

Where a lower price is stated for a specified quantity the materials for the whole number specified shall be given out at one time, and the full number shall be finished in one lot or the full single price shall be paid for each article.

(7.) The Board determines, under the provisions of section 150 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which this Board has not fixed piece-work prices but has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE FACTORY ENGINE-DRIVERS BOARD.

NOTES.--(A) This Determination on the 1st September, 1930, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

- (B) On the 22nd June, 1914, and 17th August, 1920, respectively, the powers of the Factory Engine-drivers Board were extended to enable it to "fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the occupation of—
 - (a) a boiler cleaner;
 - (b) an engine-driver or attendant in connexion with the use of internal combustion engines or electrical engines other than internal combustion engines or electrical engines connected with mines."

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the occupation of a fireman, boiler attendant, or engine-driver, in connexion with the use of steam-boilers or steam-engines other than steam-boilers or steam-engines connected with mines," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st September, 1930, the last Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) Definitions.—Engine-driver or fireman in charge of plant means the driver or fireman invested with superintendence or responsibility when two or more drivers or two or more firemen are employed at the plant at one time, or when the driver or fireman being the only person of his class employed on the plant does the general repair work of the plant in addition to the work of engine-driving or firing but not when he merely assists the fitter or engineer to do such work.

An engine-driver or fireman shall be deemed to be in charge of an electric generator or dynamo if under the instructions of his employer or his immediate responsible officer he performs any of the duties of oiling or cleaning or attending to the commutators, brushes, fuses, or switches of same.

Lofty cranes or hoists means any crane or hoist, the driving platform of which is situated more than 25 feet above the level of the ground.

ground.

First-class engine-driver means a driver of a steam stationary engine or engines having a single cylinder with a bore exceeding 12 inches in diameter, or having singly or together two or more cylinders, the sum of the areas of whose bores exceeds the area of a circle

12 inches in diameter.

Second-class engine-driver means a driver of a steam stationary engine or engines having a single cylinder with a bore which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter or having singly or together two or more cylinders, the sum of the areas of whose bores does not exceed the area of a circle 12 inches in diameter.

Third-class engine-driver means a driver of a steam stationary engine or engines having a single cylinder with a bore which does not axceed 6 inches in diameter or having singly or together two or more cylinders, the sum of the areas of whose bores does not exceed the area of a circle 6 inches in diameter.

A trimmer shall mean any person employed in supplying fuel to the fireman, either from storage bin or from stocks on the premises, or in assisting the fireman in clearing the ash-pit.

(5) OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

In reckoning the time of duty any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, shall be included except in the case of country saw-mills, in which case each engine-driver or fireman shall be allowed the following time at ordinary rates for preparing and closing down engines or for raising steam and banking fires on boilers when he performs such duties—

(a) if such engine-driver or fireman be resident on the mill site, one hour per day;
(b) where such engine-driver or fireman resides away from the mill site, one hour and a half per day.

(b) where such engine-driver or freman resides away from the mini site, one nour side a data per day.

(6) Sundays and Holidays.—That time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, and double time shall be the special rate for all work done on the undermentioned public holidays:—Christmas Day; Boxing Day; New Year's Day; Foundation Day; Good Friday; Easter Monday; Eight Hours Day; and King's Birthday—or such other days not less than eight as the employer may presente for the employees; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
