#### Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

##### EXTENSION OF THE POWERS OF THE HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM ATTENDANTS BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by Order made on the 17th day of June, 1931, extend the powers of the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board so that it may fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (not including professional employees or nurses) employed in or about a hospital or home for the treatment of the mentally afflicted doing any kind of work connected with the carrying on of such a hospital or home, the part of the trade covered by this extension being, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, of the same or similar class or character as that for which the said Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board was appointed.

**U**NDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928* (No. 3697) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby amend the Boarding and Lodging House Regulations 1930 as follows:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Boarding and Lodging House Regulations 1931, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

"(4) Mark or cause to be marked on the entrance door of every bedroom used for the accommodation of any boarder or lodger in legible and durable characters an identification number or letter, and immediately below such number or letter a figure indicating the number of persons that may occupy such bedroom under the provisions of clause 7 (1) (a) as amended."

4. Repeal clause 7 (5) and substitute—

"(5) Not use or allow or suffer any room to be used as a bedroom which is in direct communication with a kitchen, servery, or any room where food is kept or stored."

5. Amend clause 21 (1) by inserting after the words "common lodging house" the words "or boarding house".
