## COUNTY COURT ACT 1928.

## RULES OF COURT—AMENDMENT.

WE, three of the Judges of the County Court, under the powers vested in us by the *County Court Act 1928*, have made the following rules and amendments of rules in respect of the purposes mentioned in Section 87 of the said Act.

## COUNTY COURT RULES 1930.

For Order XXXI. of the County Court Rules 1930 there shall be substituted the following:—

## ORDER XXXI.—INTERPLEADER BY BAILIFF.

1. If any claim is made to or in respect of any goods or chattels taken in execution under the process of any County Court or in respect of the proceeds or value thereof by any person not being the party against whom such process has issued, it shall be lawful for the Registrar of such Court or for any Justice, upon application of the officer charged with the execution of such process, as well before as after any action brought against such officer, to issue a summons calling before the Judge of the said Court or before any Court of Petty Sessions as well the party issuing such process as the party making such claim; and thereupon any action which has been brought in the Supreme Court or in any County Court in respect of such claim shall be stayed; and the Court in which such action has been brought or any Judge thereof, on proof of the issue of such summons and that the goods and chattels were so taken in execution, may order the party bringing such action to pay the costs of all proceedings had upon such action after the issue of such summons; and the Judge of the County Court or such Court of Petty Sessions shall adjudicate upon such claim, and make such order between the parties in respect thereof and of the costs of the proceedings as to him or it seems fit.

2. Where any such claim is made, the claimant shall forthwith or within twenty-four hours after making his claim deliver to the bailiff particulars of the goods and chattels alleged to be the property of the claimant, and the grounds of his claim, or in the case of a claim for rent of the demand thereof and for what period and in respect of what premises the same is claimed to be due, and the name, address, and description of the claimant shall be fully set forth in such particulars; and money paid into Court (if any) under the execution shall be retained by the Registrar until the claim has been adjudicated upon, and by leave of the Judge or Court of Petty Sessions such particulars may, at any stage of the case, be amended, or by consent may be altogether dispensed with.

3. Interpleader summonses shall be issued by the Registrar or Justice on the application of the bailiff without leave of the Court, and may be made returnable before the Judge sitting either in Court or Chambers or in the Court of Petty Sessions on any day fixed by the Registrar if returnable before a Judge, or by the Justice if returnable before a Court of Petty Sessions, and shall be served in the same manner as ordinary summonses in the County Court not less than two clear days before the return-day, but by consent in writing, indorsed on the summons, the same may be made returnable forthwith so soon as the same may be heard, and service may by like consent be dispensed with.

4. Where the claim is decided against the claimant the costs of the bailiff allowed by the Judge or Court of Petty Sessions shall be retained by him out of the amount levied, unless the Judge or Court of Petty Sessions otherwise orders, but without prejudice to the right of the execution creditor against the claimant for the sum so retained, if the Judge or Court of Petty Sessions orders the same to be paid by the claimant to the execution creditor.

The above rules and amendments of rules shall be in force and come into operation from the day on which they are published in the *Government Gazette*.

CONSENT OF GUARDIANS TO THE MARRIAGE OF  
MINORS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 48 of the Marriage Act 1928, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following Regulations with respect to applications to guardians of minors and the service thereof and prescribing forms for the purposes of section 40 of the Marriage Act 1928:—

- (1) These Regulations may be called the Guardians of Minors Regulations.
- (2) The consent of a guardian of minors to the marriage of a minor pursuant to paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the Marriage Act 1928 shall be in the Form A in the schedule hereto.
- (3) An application to a guardian of minors pursuant to the proviso (i) of sub-section (1) of section 40 of the Marriage Act 1928 shall be in the Form B in the schedule hereto.
- (4) (a) An application to a Judge of the Supreme Court or a Judge of County Courts or to a guardian of minors being a police magistrate pursuant to the proviso (ii) of sub-section (1) of the said section 40 of the Marriage Act 1928 shall be in writing in the Form C in the schedule hereto.
- (b) Notice of such application shall be served personally upon the person who has refused consent to the marriage, or, failing personal service, in such manner as may be directed by the Judge or police magistrate to whom the application shall be made.
- (c) Such service shall be effected at least twenty-four hours before the application is made.
- (5) The refusal or consent (as the case may be) of the person to whom application is made in accordance with Regulation 4 hereof shall be in the Form D in the said schedule, and shall be endorsed on or written at the foot of the application made pursuant to Regulation (4).

(a) Insert part of Victoria for which appointed.

(b) If a female, here insert "and is not a widow."

(c) Insert "there is no parent or guardian of the said or person to whom the custody of the said has been committed by the Court in the said State," or "though there is a parent or guardian of the said or a person to whom the custody of the said has been committed by the Court in the said State authorized to consent, such parent (or guardian or person as aforesaid) is incapable of duly consenting by reason of

(Insert grounds, e.g., "absence," "mental incapacity," or otherwise setting out the fact relied on, which must be a substantial cause.)

(a) (in circumstances mentioned in the column headed 'Circumstances' in the schedule to the Marriage Act 1928) the written consent of the person or persons mentioned in the corresponding portion of the column headed 'Person or Persons whose consent is required' or, as the case may be, 'Person whose consent is required' in the said schedule; or

By parents guardians &c. Schedule to Marriage Act 1928.

(b) where either party is a ward of the Children's Welfare Department or of the Department for Reformatory Schools, the written consent of the secretary of the Children's Welfare Department or of the Department for Reformatory Schools, as the case may be; or

In case of wards of the Children's Welfare Department &c.

(c) in other circumstances as hereinafter provided, the written consent of a Judge of the Supreme Court or of County Courts or of a guardian of minors:

By guardian of minors.

Provided that—

(i) if the person about to celebrate the marriage is satisfied that the consent of any person whose consent is required pursuant to paragraph (a) of this sub-section cannot be obtained by reason of absence or inaccessibility or by reason of his being under any disability the necessity for the consent of that person shall be dispensed with, if there is any other person whose consent is also required pursuant to the said paragraph (a); and, if the consent of no other person is required, a guardian of minors may on application in the prescribed form being made to him consent to the marriage;

Where consent cannot be obtained.

(ii) if any person whose consent is required pursuant to the said paragraph (a) refuses his consent, any Judge of the Supreme Court or of County Courts, or any guardian of minors being a police magistrate, on application in the prescribed form being made to him and upon being satisfied that notice of the application has been served on the person who has so refused consent, may consent to the marriage.

Where consent refused.

(2) A Judge or a guardian of minors shall before giving his consent to any marriage pursuant to this section make inquiry on oath or solemn affirmation as to the facts and circumstances of the case.

Inquiry by guardian of minors.

(3) The consent of a Judge or a guardian of minors given to any marriage pursuant to this section shall have the same effect as if it had been given by the person whose consent cannot be so obtained or, as the case may be, is so refused.

Effect of consent by guardian of minors.

(5) Nothing in this section shall dispense with the necessity of obtaining the consent of the Supreme Court to the marriage of a ward of court."

Saving as to wards of court.

(c) if one parent has been deserted by the other;	The parent who has been deserted.
(d) if both parents deprived of custody of infant by order of Court.	The person to whose custody the infant is committed by order of the Court.
2. Where one parent is dead—	
(a) if there is no other guardian;	The surviving parent.
(b) if a guardian has been appointed by the deceased parent.	The surviving parent and the guardian if acting jointly, or the surviving parent or the guardian if the parent or guardian is the sole guardian of the infant.
3. Where both parents are dead.	The guardians or guardian appointed by the deceased parents or by the Court under section 138 of the <i>Marriage Act 1928</i> , or, if no such guardians or guardian have or has been appointed, a guardian of minors.

## II. Where the Infant is Illegitimate

Circumstances.	Person whose consent is required.
If the mother of the infant is alive.	The mother, or, if she has by order of the Court been deprived of the custody of the infant, the person to whom the custody of the infant has been committed by order of the Court.
If the mother of the infant is dead.	The guardian appointed by the mother, or, if no such guardian has been appointed, a guardian of minors.

*Marriage Act 1928*, Section 43.—Every consent to the marriage of any person who is under the age of twenty-one years shall be in such form as may be prescribed in rules and regulations made pursuant to this Part or to the like effect.

## The Penal Clauses Referring to the Marriages of Minors are as follow:—

*Marriage Act 1928*, Section 50.—Every person guilty of a misdemeanour within the meaning of this Part shall be at the discretion of the Court before which he is convicted be liable to—

- a penalty of not more than Five hundred pounds; or
- imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term of not more than five years; or
- both such penalty and imprisonment.

Section 59.—If any minister or the Government Statist or any registrar of marriages celebrates or professes or attempts to celebrate marriage in the case of any person (not being a widower or widow\*) under the age of twenty-one years without some written consent as aforesaid, knowing him or her to be under that age or knowing that the consent produced is not by the appropriate

persons or person, or wilfully celebrates or professes or attempts to celebrate any marriage in any other case contrary to any of the provisions of this part of this Act, or where any provision of such Part has not been complied with, knowing the same not to have been complied with, every person so offending shall, except as is otherwise by this Act provided, be guilty of a misdemeanour.

Section 60.—If any person marries a person (not being a widower or widow\*) under the age of twenty-one years without having previously obtained the appropriate written consent as aforesaid, or induces or endeavours to induce any minister or the Government Statist or any registrar of marriages to celebrate marriage between parties one of whom (not being a widower or widow\*) is under age, without such consent, or abets or assists in any illegal marriage, every person so offending shall, except as is otherwise by this Act provided, be guilty of a misdemeanour.

\* A divorcee is to be regarded as a widower or widow.

NOTE.—Every consent must be in writing and on the prescribed form or to the like effect.

## DECLARATION OF THE NEW CLANCY'S ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF KORUMBURRA.

**W**HEREAS by sections 21 and 78 of the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Act has taken the land necessary for constructing a road or deviation it shall as soon as it thinks such road or deviation is fit to be used as a public highway by Resolution declare the road or deviation to be a developmental road or part thereof and that upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order of the Governor in Council confirming such Resolution such road or deviation shall thereupon be a developmental road or part thereof within the meaning of the Country Roads Act: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the road on the land described in the schedule to such Resolution to be part of a developmental road: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State,

and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*.

4. No person shall climb or jump over any fence or gate, or stick any bills thereon, or cut any name or sign on any fence, gate, tree, or seat, or in any way damage any building, gate, fence, or other property in or around the Reserves, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, or other property.

5. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserves, nor give out or distribute any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper in the Reserves, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper.

6. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, or other property in the Reserves, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserves any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect in the Reserves any building, booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the purpose of any game or amusement, or for any other purpose, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserves, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management thereof.

15. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

16. No person shall camp in the Reserves.

17. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone, missile, or any hard substance in the Reserves, and no person shall play cricket, hockey, football, golf, rounders, tennis, or any other organized game in the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

18. No person other than players and officials connected with any game, and competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground or oval during the course of such game or sport.

No person shall engage in cricket, football, lacrosse, baseball, or any other organized game in the Reserves without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, unless such person is at the time a playing member of any club which is duly authorized by the Committee of Management to play therein.

20. No person shall enter the Reserves on any day set apart for cricket, or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, or any club, association, or person authorized to issue such ticket of admission, or by any club, association, or person renting the Reserves or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced, and, if for one day only, surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.

21. Upon application to the Committee of Management, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of any one of the Reserves for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of these Regulations and shall pay to the Committee of Management such charges as the Committee of Management may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

22. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, horse races, fêtes, coursing, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

Tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at .." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated; the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Messmate wood will not be accepted.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 6 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, but the contractor must have 48 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

## SHIRE OF GOULBURN.

## BY-LAW No. 12.

A By-law of the Shire of Goulburn, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 12, for or with respect to—

(a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;

(b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;

(c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;

(d) prescribing fees—

(1) for the granting and renewal of a licence;

(2) for the transfer of a licence;

(e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and

(f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Goulburn order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Goulburn.

“Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Licensee” shall mean a holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Goulburn.

“Petrol Pump” shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit and shall include a “portable petrol pump.”

“Portable petrol pump” shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footway, and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

“Regulations” shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the Shire of Goulburn used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect.

(a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump other than a portable petrol pump in or on any footway, a licence fee of One pound one shilling (£1 1s.) per annum.

(b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purpose of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence fee of Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule of this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

7. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

8. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

9. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application in writing to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence in writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of Ten shillings (10s.).

10. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given the policy of insurance herein-after referred to taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee, or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

11. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application before the petrol pump is used for the supply or sale of motor spirit, insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence, and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company of good repute against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump, in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall on demand produce to the Council or any duly appointed officer of the Council the said policy of insurance and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed or whose licence has been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, shall within seven days after such expiry or cancellation remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence, and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in, on, or under the footway.

14. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Goulburn.

## SHIRE OF GOULBURN.

By-Law No. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of Goulburn made under sub-section 27 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and numbered thirteen, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 647 of the said Act for regulating the conditions on which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

## TRACTION ENGINES, ETC.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Goulburn order as follows:—

## Bars, Spikes, Grips, or Other Projections on Wheels.

1. No person shall use, or cause, or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least 2½ inches in width and not more than 1-16 of an inch in thickness and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed 5 inches; or

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth soled and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than 3 inches in width nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness, and extending the full width of the tire, and the space intervening between such cross bars not exceeding 3 inches, providing in such last-mentioned case—

(I.) That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit, in writing, specifying the public highways on which it may be used and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

(II.) That the owner has agreed, in writing, to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

(III.) That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles, exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

(IV.) That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

(V.) That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed 3 cwt. for each half inch of bearing surface of the tire or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

*Weight of Engine, &c., to be Painted Thereon.*

2. Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than 1 inch long on a plate, attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

*Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine Contains in Itself Sufficient Motive Power to Move It.*

3. So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

*Taking Engine Across or Along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*

4. No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine or any person with a horse or vehicle drawn by a horse.

*Engines Not to Halt on Certain Parts of the Highway.*

5. No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances not preventable by reasonable means or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least 20 feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road or the middle of the surveyed road, if unmade.

*Engines Not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*

6. No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water or for any other purpose whatever.

*Driving Engine Between Sunset and Sunrise.*

7. No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by the written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf, defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one at each side of the front and one on the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

*Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, &c.*

8. No person shall use, or cause, or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine, or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks at least 12 inches in width, 4 inches in thickness, and at least 12 feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

*Skidding of Wheels of Engine.*

9. The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

**PENALTIES.**

10. Any person shall, for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law, be liable for the following penalties:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds.
- (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds.
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

**EXTENT OF OPERATION OF BY-LAW.**

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

## DETERMINATION OF THE MUSICIANS BOARD.

This Determination on the 29th August, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed as a player of any musical instrument," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 29th August, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination, which shall apply to all persons other than those—

(a) Bound by an Award or Agreement of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration, viz., persons employed in—

Grand opera, grand ballet, concerts, or religious performances.

General theatrical entertainments, inclusive of pantomime, variety show, vaudeville, revue, comic opera, musical comedy, drama, burlesque, minstrel show, and other entertainments similar to any of these.

Picture shows.

Stage bands.

Broadcasting and relaying.

Circuses.

Cafés, hotels, restaurants, and similar places.

Skating rinks and other like forms of entertainment.

(b) Playing without any remuneration whatever to assist charity.

**(3) ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.**—The number of hours to constitute a week's work shall be—

- (i) 18 in the case of a week's work of six performances to consist of one performance not to exceed three consecutive hours on each of six calendar days.
- (ii) 36 in the case of a week's work of twelve performances to consist of two performances on each of six calendar days, each performance not to exceed three consecutive hours.
- (iii) 30 in any other case.

**(4) TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT.**—The weekly wage prescribed by this Determination shall be paid to each weekly employee (i.e., any employee other than one engaged on casual work) who is ready and willing to perform the work provided for by the Determination during any week whether he is required to perform such work or not.

An employee to become entitled to the weekly wage is to perform such of the work provided for as the employer shall from time to time require, during the hours usually worked by the class of employee affected.

The employment of a weekly employee is to be terminated on either side only by a week's notice, which notice may be given at any time during the week at or before the beginning of work on any day.

Where the period of employment of a weekly employee includes in addition to one or more complete weeks, a part of a week, the employee shall be paid for each whole or fraction of a calendar day included in the part of a week one-sixth of his prescribed weekly wage.

Nothing in this Determination shall affect any legal right to dismiss without notice any employee for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct, and in the case of such dismissal moneys due under this Determination shall be payable for the employment up to, but not after, the time of dismissal.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Determination any employer may in the case of any employee deduct payment of wages on any day on which an employee cannot be usefully employed because of—

- (i) any strike;
  - (ii) any stoppage of work unavoidable by the employer other than a stoppage due to weather.
- (5) CASUAL WORK,** i.e., work during any week for not more than one half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work. The casual wages rates set out hereunder shall be paid to persons playing for—

- (a) Day picnics .. .. £1 2s. 6d. per day (one meal to be provided).
- (b) Processions .. .. 13s. 6d. per day.
- (c) Gramophone recording .. 9s. per hour, with a minimum of payment as for 2 hours (provided the employee does not receive any royalty).

**(7) EXTRA RATES.**—A conductor-leader, or bandmaster where there is an orchestra or band of three or more players shall be paid the following extra rates:—

Em and on quads, or whatever may be used at the beginning or end of lines, to be reckoned in the width. Bastard founts to be cast up to the width of the smaller body of the founts to which they belong, provided that the multipliers shall not be less than in Appendix C.
- All persons employed on column or tabular matter cast on one bar :—Two columns—two justifications or arrangements to constitute half measure—6½d. per 1,000 ens. Three columns—three justifications or arrangements—7½d. per 1,000 ens. Four columns—four or more justifications or arrangements—9½d. per 1,000 ens. Not more than three introductory lines attached to table to be charged as part of table. See Appendix A.
- Matter consisting of subscribers' names, with the sums of money run out to the end of the line, names of horses, with st. and lb. run out; measurements of land, with acres, roods, and perches run out; market reports, and matter of a similar nature take no extra charge. See Appendix B.
- Matter requiring two bars to complete one measure (not being tabular matter), 6½d. per 1,000 ens; three, 7½d. per 1,000 ens; four or more, 9½d. per 1,000 ens.
- All lines cast by the machine shall be charged as full lines, but payment only to be made for lines actually set on the machine.
- Matter in all types up to brevier inclusive set to measure under 12 ems pica, 6½d. per 1,000 ens; under 9 ems pica, 7½d. per 1,000 ens. All types above brevier set to less than 13 ems pica to be charged by brevier multiple.
- All matter with a border round, whether formed of rules, letters, or otherwise, 9½d. per 1,000 ens.
- Matter of and above four lines composed in other than ordinary English (e.g., dialects), 7½d. per 1,000 ens; and foreign languages 9½d. per 1,000 ens.
- One line extra shall be charged for each word of small caps, italic, clarendon, fed in by hand, but where such words are set on the keyboard one line extra shall be charged for each line containing such words, excepting small caps, which shall be charged one line extra, for each word.
- Matter having to be transposed by the operator (i.e., which is not set up in the order in which it appears in copy), 6½d. per 1,000 ens. Illegible or indistinct copy, 6½d. per 1,000 ens. Notice of intention to make extra charge to be given to the proprietor before the matter is set.
- All first-proof and revise corrections (marks left undone in the first proof) to be done by the operator: "House" marks to be charged 9½d. per 1,000 ens if done by the operator. All "stugging" to be done by the "house."
- Alterations from copy in the first proof to be charged at the rate of 9d. per 1,000 ens for every line affected by such alterations. Author's proofs to be charged at the same rate. The "house" shall be entitled to correct all revises or author's marks on time.
- Alterations from copy in the first proof to be charged in measures under 12 ems, 1s. 1½d. per 1,000 ens. Under 9 ems measure, 1s. 2½d. per 1,000 ens. Author's proofs to be charged at the same rate. The "house" shall be entitled to correct all revises or author's marks on time.

## DETERMINATION OF THE LEATHER-GOODS BOARD.

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boot Board, the Rubber Trade Board, or the Saddlery and Harness Board," has made the following Determination, namely:—
