Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE FARRIERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on 2nd day of October, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said district; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677)*, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 2nd day of October, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

PROPORTION (within any place).
One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 97s. per week of 44 hours.

(3) TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK within the *Metropolitan District*, as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act*:—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
8.30 a.m.	8.30 a.m. on Saturdays.
8.30 a.m.	5 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

(A) *Within the Metropolitan District*, as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act*:—

1. Outside the times of beginning and ending work:—

On Saturdays—

Between 8.30 a.m. and 11 a.m. Time and a half.

2. Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours in any week Double time.

(B) *In any other place*:—

In excess of 44 hours in any week Time and a half.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Treble time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, and on 28th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Royal Agricultural Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule to the *Public Service Act 1928*), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) DAY AND LATEST HOURS FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—The day and latest hour when payment of wages is to be made shall be Friday at 4.30 p.m.

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PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-second year of the reign of His present Majesty King George V. intituled the *Financial Emergency Act 1931*, it is enacted by section 2 thereof that save as otherwise provided in the said Act the several Parts, Divisions, and Sections thereof shall come into operation on such dates as are respectively fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by Proclamation dated the 28th day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, was fixed as the date of commencement of sections 1, 2, 3, and 4, Part I. (save as otherwise expressly provided in section 5 thereof), Part II., Part III., and Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is provided by section 16 and sub-section (2) of section 18 that the provisions of Division 1 of Part III. of the said Act shall apply to the matters in the said sections referred to only on and after such day as is fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published as aforesaid but in respect of the matters referred to in the said section 16, being a day not earlier than the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one: And whereas by section 25 it is enacted that the provisions of Division 2 of the said Act shall apply to the matters referred to in the said section only on and after a day not being earlier than the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, as is fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published as aforesaid: And whereas by section 35 it is enacted that Division 5 of Part III. of the said Act shall come into operation on such day (not being earlier than the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one) as is fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the aforesaid section 16, sub-section (2) of section 18, section 25, and section 35 of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation fix the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, as the day upon which the said Divisions 1 and 2 shall come into operation in respect of the various matters and things referred to in the said section 16, sub-section (2) of section 18, and section 25, and as the day on which the said Division 5 shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this 29th day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and in the twenty-second year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
