Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE CHAR WORKERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 20th February, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677); such portion of the City of Sandringham as is not included within the Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Warrnambool; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board, which since the 18th June, 1929, has had the power "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boarding Houses Board, of the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board, or of the Hotel and Restaurant Board) employed at office cleaning or general cleaning work of a like character in or about any process, trade, business, or occupation is carried on for profit." has made the following Determination,

(1) That on the 20th February, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this

(3) Times or Beginning and Ending Work (other than casual employees)-

(4) OVERTIME—That the following rates shall be paid for overtime :--

- (5) Casual Labour.—Casual employees, i.e., persons who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work, shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.
- (6) PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.—All employees, other than casual employees, shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day; Foundation Day, Anzac Day, Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
- (7) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Anzac Day, or Christmas Day; and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, 25th January (Foundation Day), King's Birthday, Boxing Day, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
