Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.—To pay the money coming to the hands of such trustees by virtue of any such power of disposition to the treasurer for the time being of The Presbyterian Church of Victoria, to be by him applied first in payment of all incidental costs, next in payment to the said Presbyterian Church of Victoria, of all deductions heretofore or hereafter to be authorized, by the General Assembly of the said Church, and, as to the residue, for such purposes as the said Assembly has heretofore authorized or may hereafter authorize.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 312.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Railways Act, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflict therewith:—

General Merchandise railed between Melbourne, Geelong, and/or Ballarat and Adelaide shall be charged at the rate of £6 10s. per ton, provided a guarantee is furnished to the Commissioners as follows:—

- (i) That the whole of such General Merchandise from one consignor or for one consignee shall be forwarded by rail.
- (ii) That such General Merchandise shall amount to at least 300 tons per annum.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as on and from 1st August, 1931.

In witness whereof the common seal of the Victorian Railways Commissioners was affixed hereto this twenty-fifth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 35 FOR MAKING AND LEVYING RATES.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

- (a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20, and not exceeding £300, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300, and not exceeding £500, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (e) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store, used exclusively for such purposes, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store, as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made, and shall be levied, for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1932, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1932, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1932, at the office of the Water Commissioners, at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in the Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ten pence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such persons as the Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1932.

THE Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1928*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates for 1932 which owners or occupiers of land and tenements within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds and under, a rate of One pound five shillings.
2. For every tenement of more than Thirteen pounds, and not exceeding Twenty-four pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.

3. For every tenement of more than Twenty-four pounds, and not exceeding Thirty-three pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Thirty-two shillings and sixpence.

4. For every tenement of more than the annual municipal value of Thirty-three pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be:—Seven pounds annual municipal value and under, a sum of Seven shillings and sixpence; over the annual municipal value of Seven pounds, the rate shall be One shilling in the pound.

6. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the above-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from the stand-pipe, one-quarter of the above-mentioned rate.

7. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specifically agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 40,000 gallons.

8. Water supplied to engines, for cutting fire-wood, to be charged at the rate of £4 per annum for each engine.

9. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the 1st January, 1932.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

For water supplied from the works of the Trust by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity charged for shall be 23,333 gallons per annum for dwellings, shops, offices, &c.; 5,333 gallons for vacant lands; and 13,333 gallons for land with small shed thereon.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1932.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

(a) For every house and tenement within the reticulation area, whether supplied or not—in the Borough of Ararat, a rate of twenty-four pence in the pound on the municipal valuation with a minimum of Two pounds; in the Shire of Ararat, a rate of Thirty pence in the pound on the municipal annual valuation, with a minimum of Three pounds ten shillings.

(b) Allotments within reticulation area, where no water is supplied, a minimum charge of Five shillings within the Borough of Ararat for each quarter acre, and Ten shillings within the Shire of Ararat for each quarter acre.

(c) For water supplied by measure within the Borough of Ararat, the sum of One shilling per thousand gallons of water consumed. Twenty thousand gallons to be the minimum to be charged.

(d) Within the Shire of Ararat each tenement supplied shall be allowed 70,000 gallons as allowance for rate; all water supplied in excess shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

2. Where there is a waste of water, the supply will be disconnected.

3. The rate hereby made shall be due and made payable on the 2nd day of January, 1932, at the Town Hall, Ararat. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

RATING BY-LAW No. 1, MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF BET BET, UNDER THE POWERS CONFERRED BY THE WATER ACT 1928.

THE following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of houses and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year ending 30th September, 1932, in respect of water supplied by the Bet Bet Shire Council within the Township of Tarnagulla, that is to say:—

On every occupied private tenement connected by pipe with the Council's main, and on all stores and business places where one horse only is kept, a sum of One pound two shillings and sixpence sterling.

On every tenement not connected with the main, and on every unoccupied tenement, Ten shillings, and on vacant land not connected with the main, five shillings.

On every store-room, Five shillings.

On every store or business place where two or more horses are kept, on all butchers' premises, and all bank premises, Two pounds five shillings sterling.

On all hotels, including attached stables and domiciles, Two pounds sixteen shillings and threepence sterling.

On all government buildings, including quarters, Three pounds seven shillings and sixpence sterling.

In all the above cases water shall be for domestic purposes only.

For every boiler used to generate steam for milling or other industrial purpose, a charge of Eleven pounds five shillings shall be made, the Council reserving the right to discontinue the supply when necessary to conserve a domestic supply for householders.

No person shall attach a hose to any tap or pipe for the purpose of watering gardens. Any person so using water without written permission from the Council will be liable to be prosecuted.

The above rate shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1932, and such person as the Bet Bet Shire Council may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the above said rates.

RATING BY-LAW No. 9 FOR YEAR 1932.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1928, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1932 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the Shire of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District, also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound.

2A. For all unoccupied allotments of land and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement is erected, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound on the net annual value, with a minimum charge of Five shillings (5s.) (within the reticulation area).

3. For every hotel, a rate of Eight pounds (£8) per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.

4. For Government departments, railways, and other properties supplied by meter, a charge of Three shillings (3s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.

5. For Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Council, the following shall be the charges made:—

Post Office.—Three shillings (3s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons; minimum, 20,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station.—Three shillings (3s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons; minimum 30,000 gallons per annum.

State School.—Three shillings (3s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons; minimum, 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for each load of 400 gallons or less.

7. For every water trough connected with hotels, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory, mill, tenement where steam machinery is attached and working, the rate shall be Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound on the annual municipal value of each property, or the water may be supplied and charged for by agreement, whichever the Council may decide on.

9. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards, a charge of Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre where supplied from open race, with a minimum charge of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.). Where two or more acres are irrigated, the charge for the second and succeeding acres will be Fourpence (4d.) per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum quantity of 200,000 gallons per acre when supplied from open race.

10. For water supplied for irrigation by pipe service for market gardens, orchards, and lucerne plots, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value of the land:—

For one half-inch service, £2 per acre; minimum, One pound (£1).

For two half-inch services, £3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For one three-quarter inch service, £3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For two three-quarter inch services, £4 per acre; minimum, Two pounds (£2).

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For water supplied for filling tanks and dams, a charge of Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, with a minimum charge of £1 10s.

13. For water supplied to mining companies, dredges, &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

14. For water supplied for stock purposes to owners of property adjoining race frontages, a minimum charge of Three pounds (£3).

The annual value of lands and tenements shall mean the net annual value of the properties as appearing in the valuation or rate-book of the Shire of Talbot adopted for the year ending 30th September, 1932.

The before-mentioned rates shall be due and payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1932, and the first day of July, 1932, and the charges for water shall be paid half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Interest at the rate of six (6) per cent. will be charged on all rates not paid six months after they become due.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law No. 9 was made and adopted by the Council of the Shire of Talbot this 2nd day of November, 1931.

DECLARATION OF THE NEW ALLAMBEE ESTATE ROAD, IN THE SHIRE OF NARRACAN.

SHIRE OF DIMBOOLA.

BY-LAW NO. 29.

A By-law of the Shire of Dimboola made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 29, for or with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in on or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
 - (1) for the granting or renewal of a licence;
 - (2) for the transfer of a licence;
- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dimboola order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Dimboola.

“Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Licensee” shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Dimboola.

“Petrol pump” shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

“Portable petrol pump” shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footway and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

“Regulations” shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the Shire of Dimboola used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect.

(a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump other than a portable petrol pump in or on any footway a licence fee of One pound one shilling (£1 1s.) per annum, and an additional fee of Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) per annum for each make of petrol exceeding one passed from the pump.

(b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purposes of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence fee of One pound one shilling (£1 1s.) per annum.

(c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law renew such licence for a further term of one year.

7. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

8. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof, or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* shall, within seven days after such expiry or cancellation, remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in, on, or under the footway.
