Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE LEATHER-GOODS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 25th February, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not within the said district; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Schastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of manufacturing—

(a) Articles made of leather or a substitute for leather, such as-

Bags, braces, cases, cricket balls, pads, or other sporting goods, garters, pocketbook covers, portmanteaux, purses, trunks, wallets:

(b) Machine belting;

(c) Any other kind of leather goods;

but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boot Board, the Rubber Trade Board, or the Saddlery and Harness Board," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 25th February, 1931, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
