IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation varying the Proclamations made the seventeenth day of April, 1924, and the eighth day of June, 1927, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of April, 1924, and fifteenth day of June, 1927, respectively, regarding prohibition of fishing in certain waters, by deleting from such Proclamations all reference to the Lang Lang River, and in lieu thereof prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters for the periods mentioned:—

1. From the Lang Lang River and its tributaries between the Yannathan Butter Factory bridge and the mouth of such river—From 1st May to 31st August in each year, both days inclusive.

2. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries (except O'Mahony's and Pheasant Creeks) above or upstream from the Yannathan Butter Factory bridge, including what is known as the Lang Lang straight cut.—From 1st May to 15th December in each year, both days inclusive.

IN pursuance of the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:-

1. Regulation 4 of Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 3) shall be and the same is hereby repealed as on and from the 17th day of June, 1932.

2. Such appeal shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said repealed Regulation before the commencement of this Regulation.

3rd year—at the rate of 24s. 3d. per week.  
4th year—at the rate of 33s. per week.  
5th year—at the rate of 43s. 9d. per week.  
6th year—at the rate of 60s. 3d. per week.

(b) In respect of the term of apprenticeship of five years—  
1st year—at the rate of 18s. 6d. per week.  
2nd year—at the rate of 24s. 3d. per week.  
3rd year—at the rate of 33s. per week.  
4th year—at the rate of 43s. 9d. per week.  
5th year—at the rate of 60s. 3d. per week."

(2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers, and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the trade of manufacturing, assembling, or maintaining radio appliances, parts, or accessories (other than batteries), but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of any Wages Board heretofore appointed.

Also, that such Wages Board may, in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding, be described for all purposes as the Radio Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District and the Geelong District, as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), and the Order in Council thereunder extending such Metropolitan District, such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Warrnambool, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

**W**HEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 5th October, 1885, 22nd July, 1908, and 10th June, 1931, as a site for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Ringwood (Ringwood East Recreation Reserve).

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, or amusements, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

For admission of every motor car, motor cycle, cart or other vehicle drawn by one horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

For the admission of every additional horse, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove from the Reserve any soil, sand, or manure.

6. No person shall disfigure, damage, injure, or destroy in any way, or take into or remove from the Reserve, or have in his possession while in the Reserve any dead or live timber, trees, shrubs, flowers, grass, ferns, or other vegetation or parts thereof.

7. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or other missiles therein, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter.

8. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk, or offer for sale therein, any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

11. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a cord or chain, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, except as herein provided, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management be first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.

14. No person shall engage in any game, or sport, or dancing, in the Reserve on Sundays.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve.

16. Every person hiring or erecting in the Reserve any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Committee of Management shall from time to time deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and the reservation.

17. No person shall bathe in any pool or artificial lake within the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 10th February, 1926, as a site for the Supply of Gravel in the Parish of Raglan at Waterloo.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission the Committee may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, and gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half year.

The Council of the Shire of Ripon has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF RESERVE AT CHARLTON,  
KNOWN AS "GORDON PARK."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 20th January, 1885, and 26th November, 1929, as sites for Public Recreation at Charlton, Parish of Charlton West, and also such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes along the Avoca River, in the Township of Charlton, Parish of Charlton West, as is indicated by blue colour on plan marked C.5/5/32 with Lands Department correspondence Rs. 3085, together known as "Gordon Park," hereinafter referred to as the Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in such places as may be appointed for that purpose.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills therein, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental thereto) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. 9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.
11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
13. No persons except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantations of young trees or shrubs.
14. No persons shall discharge firearms within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. Any person committing a nuisance on any portion of the premises will be prosecuted.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

17. No person shall fence off any portion of the Reserve, debar, or attempt to prevent or regulate traffic along the river frontages.

18. On week days, from 1st January to 30th April, and from 1st November to 31st December in each year, the swimming pool shall be open to the public during such hours as the Committee of Management may provide. On Sundays, the swimming pool shall be open from such times as such Committee may direct.

19. No person coming direct from any dirty work shall enter the swimming pool before washing himself.

20. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the swimming pool.

21. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the swimming pool or the immediate vicinity thereof.

22. No person shall use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the swimming pool may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

23. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the swimming pool.

24. No person shall deface, by writing or otherwise, the fencing or any other property within the Reserve.

25. No person shall enter the swimming pool unless decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume.

26. Children shall not be permitted to enter the swimming pool except under adequate supervision.

27. The swimming pool may be set apart at stated hours for the use of males, females, or children respectively. Mixed bathing may be permitted on such days and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may at any time determine.

The Council of the Shire of Charlton has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who,

after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
