ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 4027. "An Act to authorize the Raising of Money by the State for the purposes of the Commonwealth Acts known as the *Loan (Unemployment Relief Works) Act 1932*, and relating to the Provision by the State of certain Moneys in respect of Interest on Amounts borrowed in accordance with the said Acts by certain Authorities and Bodies of Persons and for other purposes."

No. 4028. "An Act to authorize the Shire of Moorabbin to expend the Balances of certain Moneys for purposes other than the purposes for which the said Moneys were borrowed by the said Shire."

No. 4029. "An Act to amend Divisions Nine and Ten of Part XIX, and Division Five of Part XXI. of the *Local Government Act 1928*."

No. 4030. "An Act relating to the Establishment of an Industrial Tribunal with Power to determine the Rates of Pay and Conditions of Employment at or in connexion with the State Coal Mine at Wonthaggi."

No. 4031. "An Act relating to the Borrowing Powers of the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital Board."

No. 4032. "An Act to amend Section Thirty-five of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928*."

No. 4033. "An Act to provide for the Imposition of a Tax upon Payments for Admission to Entertainments."

No. 4034. "An Act to authorize the Treasurer of Victoria to guarantee the Payment to the Commonwealth Bank of Australia by the Amalgamated Freezing Company (Victoria) Proprietary Limited of Moneys advanced by the said Bank to the said Company by way of Overdraft for the purposes of its Undertakings at Ballarat and Bendigo during the Financial Year 1932-1933, and the Payment of Interest on such Moneys."

No. 4035. "An Act to amend Section Ten of the *Income Tax Acts Amendment Act 1931*."

No. 4036. "An Act to provide for the Exchange of certain Crown lands in the Town of Buchan for certain other Lands in the said Town and for other purposes."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVES OF EMPLOYEES ON THE FIBROUS PLASTERERS BOARD.

Every such return shall be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the State Income Tax Office, 436-450 Lonsdale-street, Melbourne, C.I.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is, under the said Acts, liable to be prosecuted, and to pay a penalty of not more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

On and after the day to be fixed by the Commissioner and notified in the Government Gazette (hereinafter called the proclaimed day), all stamped tickets of admission value from Fourpence to Ninepence halfpenny shall be supplied by the Commissioner only, and may be obtained by proprietors of an entertainment from or through a Post Office.

26a. Until the proclaimed day—

(a) tickets stamped with the value of One penny tax at present in use in cases where the admission value is not less than Tenpence nor more than One shilling may be used in all cases where the admission value is not less than Fourpence nor more than One shilling;

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and under the provisions of Sections 541 and 542 of the *Crimes Act 1928* (19 Geo. V. No. 3664), doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

CITATION.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Probation Officers Regulations 1932."

REPEAL.

2. The Regulations relating to the appointment and duties of Probation Officers made on the fourth day of July, 1916, under the *Crimes Act 1915*, are hereby repealed.

INTERPRETATION.

3. In these Regulations—

"Act" means the *Crimes Act 1928*.

"Board" means the Indeterminate Sentences Board.

"Minister" means the Minister for the time being administering that part of the *Crimes Act 1928* relating to indeterminate sentences.

GENERAL.

4. Nominations of persons to be probation officers shall be made by the Board to the Minister.

5. There shall be a Chief Probation Officer, who, for the purposes of the Act, shall be a probation officer for the whole of the State of Victoria. The Chief Probation Officer shall perform the duties of a probation officer as prescribed by the Act and these Regulations. He shall visit a person released on recognizance and placed under his supervision in accordance with the requirements of the Court's direction.

6. Subject to the direction of the Board the Chief Probation Officer shall have authority to—

- (a) exercise a general supervision over the work of other probation officers;
- (b) inquire into and report on the work of any probation officer;
- (c) require returns and reports from any probation officer;
- (d) make recommendations and submit reports concerning probation work;
- (e) collect statistics in relation to probation work under the Act.

7. Each probation officer other than the Chief Probation Officer shall be assigned to such city, town, district, or place as the Governor in Council may direct.

8. It shall be the duty of a probation officer immediately a case is committed to his supervision to furnish full particulars of the case to the Board in the form or to the effect of form No. 1 contained in Schedule A hereto.

9. On or before the fifteenth day of the month following each quarter ending on the last day of the month of March, June, September, or December in each year, each probation officer shall forward to the Board a return in the form or to the effect of form No. 2 contained in Schedule A hereto of all persons under his supervision, stating the steps he has taken to satisfy himself that the conditions imposed by the Court are being observed, and giving information as to the general conduct and surroundings of each probationer.

10. Each probation officer shall keep a register in which he shall record in the form or to the effect of form No. 3 contained in Schedule A hereto full particulars of each person placed under his supervision. He shall also record periodically particulars of all matters ascertained by him in regard to the conduct, associations, and environment of each probationer.

16. The recognizance to be entered into under sections 532 to 534 of the Act shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in Schedule B hereto.

DEVIATION FROM THE THORPDALE EAST ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF MORWELL AND DISCONTINUANCE OF PART OF THE OLD ROAD.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Act has by Resolution declared a deviation to be a developmental road the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such Resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such Resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a developmental road or be discontinued as provided in the Resolution: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a developmental road and, has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to the said Resolution and that such part of the said existing road as is described in the Third Schedule shall be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

Resolution for Declaration of a Deviation under the Country Roads Act.
