PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of His Majesty King George V., intituled the *Motor Car Act 1930*, it is amongst other things enacted that section 11 of the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the second day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, as the day upon which section 11 of the said *Motor Car Act 1930* shall come into operation in the State of Victoria.

Motor Car Acts.

GENERAL IDENTIFICATION MARKS ASSIGNED TO MANUFACTURERS OF OR DEALERS IN MOTOR CARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of His Majesty King George V., intituled the *Motor Car Act 1930*, it is amongst other things enacted that every general identification mark assigned by the Chief Commissioner of Police to a manufacturer of or dealer in motor cars shall after a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* be displayed by means of a special identification plate fixed on any car when it is being used as specified in paragraph (b) (ii) of the proviso to section 4 of the *Motor Car Act 1928* as amended by the *Motor Car Act 1930*: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the second day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, as the date after which every general identification mark shall be displayed as aforesaid.

MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO SUPPLY OF WATER BY MEASURE.

THE Morwell Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require the person to, at his own expense, within one month provide and install a meter. Where water is so supplied by measure, a charge shall be made of One shilling per 1,000 gallons of water used, provided that in no case shall the charge so made be less in any year than the amount that would be payable if water were supplied otherwise than by measure. Such charge shall be payable on demand at the office of the said Trust.

LAWLOIT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1932 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF KANIVA. THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Lawloit Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act*, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rate and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1932 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Kaniva, as such District has been proclaimed and defined:—

1. For the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, a rate is hereby made of Three shillings and three pence in the Pound on the annual municipal valuation of such lands and tenements: Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Sixty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Fifteen shillings.

2. *Special Rates*.—For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

3. *Minimum Meter Charge*.—Excess Meter Charge.—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per One thousand gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of Two shillings per One thousand gallons for anything over that quantity.

4. *Public Institutions and Others*.—Water supplied to all Government Departments, charitable and other institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure at Two shil-

lings and sixpence per One thousand gallons, or by special agreement. For water supplied to cricket, bowling, or tennis clubs, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

5. *Water Rate Outside Trust's Area*.—Such occupiers and owners of tenements not within the Trust's area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per One thousand gallons.

6. *Water Troughs*.—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for Four thousand gallons per annum, at Two shillings and sixpence per One thousand gallons.

7. *Excess Payments*.—Where water-meters are affixed, the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Period of Rate.—That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year commencing the 1st day of January, 1932, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1932. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1932.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE GINQUAM SOUTH RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 10th June, 1925, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Ginquam, and known as Ginquam South Recreation Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the places provided for the purpose.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good

any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

15. No person or persons shall park a motor car or motor cycle or other vehicle within the Reserve except at such parking areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and every person using such parking area shall, on demand, pay a fee not exceeding One shilling per motor car or motor cycle or other vehicle for entrance to and use thereof on such days only as a charge is being made for admission.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 29th July, 1930, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Waddallah, Town of Lethbridge.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, excepting on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No persons, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MOOROOPNA WEST (LANCASTER RECREATION RESERVE).

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 24th April, 1893, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Mooropna West (Lancaster Recreation Reserve).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones, or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

15. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, amusements, or sports, and, from time to time, grant to any club, or association of clubs, the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

16. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve, or any portion thereof, for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed £2 2s. per day.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES (SWIMMING POOL) IN THE TOWN OF MALDON.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 18th December, 1930, as a site for Public purposes in the Town of Maldon.

REGULATIONS.

1. On week days from 1st January to 30th April, and from 1st October to 31st December in each year, the Swimming Pool shall be open to the public from daylight to dusk. On Sundays the Swimming Pool shall be open from daylight till 10.30 a.m., and from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m.

2. No person coming direct from any dirty work shall enter the Swimming Pool before washing himself.

3. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the Swimming Pool.

4. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the Swimming Pool, or the immediate vicinity thereof.

5. No person shall use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the Swimming Pool may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

6. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the Swimming Pool.

7. No person shall deface by writing or otherwise the fencing or any property within the Reserve.

8. No person shall enter the Swimming Pool unless decently clothed from neck to knee in a bathing costume.

9. Children shall not be permitted to enter the Swimming Pool except under adequate supervision.

10. The Swimming Pool may be set apart at stated hours for the use of males, females, or children respectively. Mixed bathing may be permitted on such days and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may at any time determine.

11. No person shall bring any animal within the boundary fence of the Reserve.

12. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for carnivals, matches, &c., on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

13. No person resorting to the Pool shall, after using the Swimming Pool, or any shower, loiter or remain without reasonable excuse in any passageway to or from the Swimming Pool, or any shower. No person shall resort to or use the Pool except for the proper purposes thereof.

14. No person shall cause or allow any dog or animal belonging to him or under his control to enter or remain in the Pool. Any dog or animal found in the Pool may be destroyed.

15. This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

 (g) Providing with respect to buildings thereafter erected—

- (1) For regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
 (2) For means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fire in buildings;
 (3) For the ventilation and lighting of buildings;
 (4) For exits from and stairways in buildings other than private dwelling-houses;
 (5) For the minimum size of any dwelling rooms;
 (6) For the minimum area to be covered by any dwelling-house or any dwelling-house and shop combined.

- (h) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials, within such time, or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council.
 (j) Requiring that vacant land within the area within the municipal district hereinafter set forth in this By-law and declared thereby to be populous or residential area shall be enclosed with a substantial fence constructed of such material and in such manner as is hereinafter prescribed.
 (k) Prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or vacant land for the purposes of trade or industry or the like.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon, with the approval of the Governor in Council, hereby order (*inter alia*) as follows:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, By-law No. 38, relating to the regulation of buildings, which
