Medical Act 1928.—Part II. (Dentists).

DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS under section 43 of the *Medical Act 1928* the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make Regulations prescribing the mode in which elections of members of the Dental Board by dentists shall be conducted, and generally for carrying Part II. of the said Act into effect: Now therefore the Dental Board of Victoria does, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations relating to such elections, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations the "Board" means the Dental Board of Victoria.

2. *Appointment of Returning Officer.*—The Board shall from time to time appoint some fit and proper person who, not being a member of the Board, is registered as a dentist in the State of Victoria to be the Returning Officer to conduct elections of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf, and such person may be removed by the Board.

3. *Expense of Elections.*—The Board shall pay to the Returning Officer for his own use, out of the moneys accrued or accruing under Part II. of the *Medical Act 1928*, a fee of £2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such Returning Officer, together with a sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.

4. *Election of Members.*—In the month of February in every year in which the vacancies on the Board are filled by election by the dentists, the Returning Officer shall proceed to the election of persons eligible to be members of the Board to fill all such vacancies, and such elections shall be styled "periodical elections."

5. *Extraordinary Vacancies, how Filled.*—When any member who has been elected by the dentists to be a member of the Board dies or by notice under his hand delivered to the President or Registrar resigns his office as member, or becomes incapable of being a member, or is declared ousted from such office by the Supreme Court, then in every such case the office of such member shall become vacant, and such vacancy, as well as any vacancy pursuant to sub-section (9) of section 38 of the *Medical Act 1928*, shall be an extraordinary vacancy, and shall be notified to the Returning Officer by the Board, and the Returning Officer shall, upon receiving such notification, proceed to the election of a person eligible under the Act to fill such extraordinary vacancy: Provided that any such vacancy occurring at any time between the first day of December and the day fixed for the next periodical election may, at the option of the Board, be filled at such periodical election.

6. *Returning Officer to give Notice of Day of Election and Day of Nomination.*—Time and Place when and where Nominations will be Received.—At every election of a member or members to serve on the Board the Returning Officer shall give twenty-one days' notice, by advertisement in such paper or papers as may be approved of by the Board of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of a fit and proper person or fit and proper persons (as the case may be) to serve as a member or members of such Board; and the Returning Officer shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than fifteen days nor more than eighteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

7. *Who may Nominate, and How.*—Any person registered as a dentist in the State of Victoria desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at the election, and the person therein named as a candidate shall signify his acceptance of such nomination by notification in writing to the Returning Officer. Such acceptance may be inserted at the foot of the nomination paper.

8. If the number of duly nominated candidates be reduced by death to the number or less than the number to be elected, the Returning Officer shall declare the remaining candidates duly elected. If the Returning Officer is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate before the voting papers are printed, he shall omit the name of such candidate from the voting papers, or if any of such papers have been printed but not issued, he shall strike out therefrom the name of the deceased candidate. If the Returning Officer is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate after the voting

papers are issued and before the day of the election, the name of the deceased candidate and the figure placed opposite such name as hereinafter provided, shall be regarded as having been deleted from all such voting papers, and every such voting paper shall be given effect to as if the numbers opposite the names of the remaining candidates were altered to the appropriate numbers indicated by the voters' order of preference in respect of such remaining candidates.

9. *When Returning Officer may Declare Members Elected Without a Poll.*—When a Poll shall be Taken.—*Preparation of Roll, &c.*—The Returning Officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than is required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Registrar of the Board, and declare such person or persons duly elected a member or members of the Board, but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken. For this purpose the Registrar shall prepare a Roll of Registered Dentists in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall prefix to each name on the roll a number, beginning at the first name with the number one, and continuing the numbers in regular arithmetical series to the last name on the roll, and the Returning Officer shall, at least ten days before the date named for holding the election, forward to each dentist entitled to vote, at the address stated in the roll, a voting paper in the form indicated in the Second Schedule hereto, enclosed in a small envelope endorsed "Voting Paper"—to be placed in this envelope and then enclosed in the addressed envelope endorsed "Voting Paper," on the inside of the flap of which latter envelope is to be placed the signature of the voter, together with a larger envelope (herein referred to as the "addressed envelope") endorsed "Voting Paper," and addressed to the Returning Officer, and such dentist shall mark his vote according to the directions on the voting paper, shall write his signature inside on the flap of the addressed envelope, shall enclose the small envelope (containing the voting paper) in the addressed envelope, and shall post or deliver the same so that it shall be received by the Returning Officer before Ten o'clock of the morning of the day fixed for holding such election.

10. *Voting Papers Invalid if Unsigned.*—If any voter fails to write his signature on the addressed envelope as prescribed in clause 9 of these Regulations, or to comply with the directions on the voting paper, the vote given by such voter shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the Returning Officer.

11. *Appointment of Scrutineers.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer, to be present when the Returning Officer opens the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day of the election.

12. *Returning Officer to Ascertain Number of Voters for each Candidate in Presence of Registrar and Scrutineers.*—*Candidates Declared Duly Elected.*—*Casting Vote of Returning Officer.*—The Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the Registrar, or, in his absence, in the presence of any person appointed in that behalf by the Board, and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidates, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, open the addressed envelopes which have been returned to him, and in the case of all such envelopes as contain the signature of the voter on the flap thereof, take out the small envelopes (enclosing the voting papers) therein contained and insert such small envelopes in a separate ballot-box; and when all such small envelopes have been so inserted he shall open the same, extract the voting paper contained therein, and in accordance with clause 13 of these Regulations, count the votes properly given for each candidate.

13. (a) Where it is required to elect one candidate only and there are only two candidates, the candidate who has received the greater number of first preference votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary) shall by the Returning Officer be declared duly elected.

(b) Where it is required to elect one candidate only and there are more than two candidates, and also where it is required to elect more than one candidate, then, for the purpose of filling the vacancy or the first vacancy (as the case may be), the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes, if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary), shall by the Returning Officer be declared duly elected.

(ii) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes, the Returning Officer shall exclude the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes, and each voting paper counted to him shall be counted to the candidate next in order of the voter's preference, and the process of excluding the candidate who has the fewest votes and distributing his voting papers amongst the remaining candidates shall be continued until one candidate obtains an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary), and such candidate shall be declared duly elected.

(c) Where it is required to elect more than one candidate, the second and all other vacancies shall be filled one by one in the following manner:—

The Returning Officer shall place all the voting papers under the names of the respective candidates in accordance with the first preference indicated thereon, except that each voting paper on which a first preference for an elected candidate is indicated shall be placed in the parcel of the candidate next in order of the voter's preference, and if a candidate then has an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary), such candidate shall be declared elected, and if no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the scrutiny shall proceed as required in sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of this clause.

(d) When a candidate is elected or excluded, each voting paper counted to him shall continue to be counted so long as there is indicated on it a next preference for one of the remaining candidates, and next preference includes the first of the subsequent preferences marked in regular arithmetical series on the voting paper which is not given to an elected or excluded candidate.

(e) In any count of votes the Returning Officer shall decide which of two or more candidates having an equal number of votes is to be excluded or shall give a casting vote in any final count where two candidates have an equal number of votes.

14. As soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the Returning Officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of first preference votes given to each candidate, and (if the case so requires) the details of the distribution of preference votes, and shall declare the result of the election.

15. All previous Regulations relating to the election of members of the Board are hereby cancelled.

RESTRICTED HOUR COMMERCIAL POWER AND HEATING AND RESTRICTED HOUR WATER HEATING TARIFFS AUTHORIZED.

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf reserved in the respective Orders in Council hereunder cited, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby orders that, subject to the relevant provisions of the Orders, and of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1928*, the respective undertakers named in those Orders in Council may charge for energy supplied by them to any consumer by the following method, that is to say:—

For energy supplied through a meter through which it can only be taken between hours predetermined by the supply authority with the consent of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, and used for power or heating purposes, Twelve shillings and sixpence for any number of units up to 500 units used between those hours in the period between two successive monthly readings of the meter and decimal three of a penny (0.3d.) for each unit used between those hours in such period over 500 units; and may charge for energy supplied by them to any consumer through a meter through which it can only be taken between hours predetermined by the supply authority with the consent of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, and used for heating and at a continuous and unaltered rate (subject, if desired, to thermostatic control), Five shillings for any number of units up to 160 units used between those hours in the period between two successive monthly readings of the meter and decimal three seven five of a penny (0.375d.) for each unit used between those hours in such period over 160 units.

- (a) When made by or on behalf of or in respect of any child or children for whom assistance is being received from the Children's Welfare Department; or

 - (ii) any person engaged in business wholly or partly on his own account; or
- (c) until after the expiration of two weeks from the date upon which the application was received unless the said committee is satisfied that such delay would cause undue hardship; or
- (d) when made by or on behalf of or in respect of any person who has been employed for a period of not less than six months prior to the date of the said application, until after the expiration of a period of one month following the date when such person was last employed.

Provided further that where any child or children as referred to in paragraph (a) hereof forms or form part of a family living together in respect of which family an application for sustenance is made, particulars regarding such child or children and the amount being received in respect thereof shall be shown in the application.

Tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at .. ." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Messmate wood will not be accepted.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement, in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 6 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, but the contractor must have 48 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case, or on application to the Commission.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each offer.
3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 2nd December, 1932, and the second payment covering all bark stripped by 28th February, 1933, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, a valid reason.
8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.
9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.
11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.
12. No live trees, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.
13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Chairman being made known.

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CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

By-Law No. 282.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 719 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 282, for the purpose of amending By-law No. 251 of the said City.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

That the following sub-clause be added to clause 4 of By-law No. 251 of the said City, that is to say:—

- (n) Enter, remain, or bathe in that portion of the Middle Park Baths, outside of the part set apart for dressing and undressing in the said baths, within a distance of twenty-five yards from the western wall of the main buildings, unless dressed in the costume in accordance with the Council's Open Sea Bathing Regulations.

Resolution adopting this By-law agreed to by Council on the 1st day of June, 1932, and confirmed on the 27th day of July, 1932.

CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

REGULATION No. 281.

A regulation of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 1 of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928*, adopted by the Council by By-law No. 108, and numbered 281, for the purpose of regulating bathing within the City.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. That Regulations numbered 244, 249, 257, and 266 be repealed and the following clauses enacted in lieu thereof:—

Bathing Places.

(2) No person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing in any part of the City, except at the following places which are hereby set apart as bathing places, viz.:—

- That part of the foreshore of Hobson's Bay commencing at the centre of Fraser-street, north-westerly along the shores of Hobson's Bay to a point distant 100 yards south-easterly from the south-eastern boundary of the Middle Park Baths.
- From a point 100 yards north-westerly from the north-western side of the Middle Park Baths, north-westerly along the shores of Hobson's Bay to a point distant 100 yards south-easterly from the south-east side of Kerferd-road Pier.
- From a point distant 100 yards north-westerly from the north-western boundary of the South Melbourne Municipal Baths, north-westerly along the shores of Hobson's Bay to a point 100 yards distant south-easterly from the south-eastern side of the Pickles-street Drainage Pier.
- At all other places within the City bathing is prohibited except in the baths permanently provided for that purpose; namely, Hot Salt Water Baths, South Melbourne Municipal Baths, and the Middle Park Baths.

Time.

(3) No person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing at any of the places set apart by the Council, and other than those permanently provided as aforesaid between the hours of 10.30 p.m. and 5 a.m. on every day of the week.

Dress.

- (a) No person shall bathe unless dressed in two-piece Canadian bathing, or similar skirted costume.
- No person clothed only in a bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on, or run along the beach or sea shore.
- No person shall dress or undress, or remove or disarrange or cause or permit to be removed or disarranged any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

Trespass:

5. No male over the age of six years shall trespass on any dressing shed reserved for the use of females, and no female shall trespass on the dressing shed reserved for males, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in cases of accident.

Playing Games, &c.

- (a) No person shall play games in, loiter, bring any rubbish, filth or other offensive matter into, or write upon any of the dressing sheds or enclosures set apart by the Council.
- No person or persons shall play cricket or football or any other game or games on any portion of the beach.

Sun Basking.

7. No person shall engage in sun basking on the beach unless his or her bathing costume is covered by short knickers, overcoat, kimono, or other suitable covering.

Bathing of Horses, &c.

8. (a) Bathing of horses or other animals is prohibited within the limits of the City of South Melbourne, except on that part of the foreshore between the Pickles-street Drainage Pier, and a point 75 yards distant south-east therefrom, and then only between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8 a.m. in this area.

(b) No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal upon or along any part of the sea shore at any other than a walking pace.

General Rules.

9. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the dressing rooms, closets, showers, compartments, or appurtenances, and shall not damage, deface, write upon or cut any part of the fittings or buildings whatever.

10. No person shall—

- Climb or attempt to climb on any roof, fence, or other portion of the premises.

- (b) Behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner, to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner in or upon any part of the beach, foreshore, dressing shed, or water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, or in connexion with such purpose.
- (c) Enter or remain on the premises whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (d) Use any portion of the premises whilst suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease.
- (e) Wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water from the showers in the dressing room or any portion of the premises.
- (f) Carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any portion of the premises, furniture, fittings, showers, or conveniences thereof or therein.
- (g) Offer any articles for sale on the premises without the consent of the Council or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the premises.
- (h) Bring cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter or remain on the premises.
- (i) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the premises.

11. 12. The Council reserves to itself the right of closing the premises for cleansing, repairs, or other purposes without incurring any liability to any person.

13. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the Bathing Inspector may refuse admission to the premises to any person.

14. If any person break any bottle or any article of glass or earthenware in any public bathing place, he shall collect and remove all portions of such bottle or article either to a receptacle (if any) provided by the Council therefor, or to some place beyond the public bathing place.

15. The Council is duly empowered by these Regulations to fix by special order, charges for the use of shelters, lockers, or other conveniences.

16. This regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne, and to within 300 yards seawards from the boundary of South Melbourne on the shore of Hobson's Bay, as set forth in Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928*.
