## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 4041. "An Act to authorize the City of Brunswick to expend the Balance of certain Moneys for purposes other than the purposes for which the said Moneys were borrowed by the said City."
- No. 4042. "An Act to provide for the Closing of Portion of a certain Street in the Township of Charlton and for the Issue of a Crown Grant of the said Portion to the Country Fire Brigades Board."
- No. 4043. "An Act to provide for the Temporary Reduction of the Rate of Interest payable to the State under certain Enactments."
- No. 4044. "An Act to provide for the Revocation of the Reservation of certain Crown Land in the Township of Gormaudale, in the Parish of Willung, reserved as a site for a Mechanics' Institute and for the Sale of the said Land and the Application of the Purchase Money therefor."

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-law No. 2740.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

**T**HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1928, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban System of Waterworks for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the annual municipal valuation whereof does not exceed £13 6s. 8d.—Twenty shillings per annum.

- (3) Of lands on which there is no building—Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1932, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1933, and shall be payable on the 1st day of October, 1932, at the office of the said Commission, at Bendigo or Castlemaine.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.
