STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 2007.

COMPLIANCE WITH PROVISIONS OF VERMIN AND NOXIOUS WEEDS ACTS IN RESPECT TO LANDS SUBJECT TO WATER EASEMENTS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1928, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

The occupier or owner of any land or in the case of Crown lands the lessee or licensee thereof out of in respect of or over which any water easement is vested in the Commission for the purposes of the Water Act 1928 is hereby required to carry out the provisions of any Act for the destruction of thistles or other noxious weeds or of rabbits or other vermin on such land provided such land is not fenced off as if such easement were not vested in the Commission.

STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL ACT 1932.

AWARD No. 2 OF 6TH DECEMBER, 1932, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY.

THE State Coal Mine Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932* (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder dated 19th July, 1932, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. The rates to be paid to contract miners shall be those which were payable on the 19th November, 1930, less a deduction of 25 per cent., provided that no such miner shall be paid less than the basic wage hereinafter prescribed together with a margin of 1s. 7d. per day, and a further margin of 1s. 6d. per day for underground work.
2. Adult male employees comprised in Part I. of the Schedule to the Act hereinafter enumerated working on a basis of twelve shifts a fortnight shall be paid a basic wage of 11s. 6d. per day, and 12s. 6d. per day if working on a basis of less than twelve shifts a fortnight and in addition the margins prescribed hereunder.
3. Where any such adult employee (except contract miner other than miner, probationary, and miner, shift work) works underground on any day or part of a day the sum of 1s. 6d. shall be added to the rate herebefore prescribed for such employee.
4. The rates for labourer (boy) shall be those specified hereunder.
5. Existing practices relating to matters within the powers of the Tribunal shall continue until further Award.
6. This Award shall not apply to any worker engaged at the Montague Coal Depot.

## Public Service Act 1928.

## REGULATION XA.—JUNIOR TEACHERS RESCINDED AND RE-MADE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of December, 1932.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.  
Colonel Cohen | Mr. Manifold.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Service Act 1928, hereby rescind Regulation XA.—Junior Teachers—made on the 5th September, 1932, and as amended on the 19th September, 1932, and in lieu thereof substitute the following Regulations, that is to say:—

## REGULATION XA.—JUNIOR TEACHERS.

1. The conditions for appointment as junior teachers in elementary schools shall be—

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, candidates must be not less than sixteen years of age, and must hold the Leaving Certificate of the University of Melbourne or an approved equivalent or higher qualification;
- (b) They must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character;
- (c) They must produce a certificate satisfactory to the Director that they possess aptitude and general suitability for the work of a teacher;
- (d) Before appointment as junior teachers, candidates must submit a certificate from a school medical officer or a medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director that they are of sound constitution and are free from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.

2. In determining the order of precedence for appointment as junior teachers consideration will be given to the number and value of the subjects of the examinations passed by candidates who comply with the conditions of clause 1, and also to evidence adduced of aptitude for teaching. Provided, however, that the Director may determine the proportionate number of males and females to be appointed, and provided also that holders of teaching scholarships under clause 12 of Regulation XXI, who hold the qualifications set out in clause 1 of this Regulation shall have a preferential right of appointment over other qualified candidates.

3. Where a vacancy for a junior teacher exists and there is no candidate qualified as in any clause above, the vacancy may be filled by the appointment of the candidate having the highest qualifications who in the opinion of the Director is qualified for such an appointment. If it is considered necessary, the appointment shall be determined by competitive examination.

4. Junior teachers shall be divided into three grades—

- (a) Candidates qualified as in clause 6 below shall be classified as junior teachers of the First Grade.
- (b) Candidates who hold the School Leaving Certificate or an equivalent qualification shall, upon appointment, be classified as junior teachers of the Second Grade.
- (c) Candidates qualified as in clause 3 above, upon appointment, shall be classified as junior teachers of the Third Grade.

5. The conditions necessary for promotion of junior teachers to the Second Grade shall be as follow:—

- (a) To have completed a year as junior teacher of the Third Grade, and to have received satisfactory annual reports from the district inspector and half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.
- (b) To have passed a satisfactory examination in at least six subjects of the School Intermediate or approved equivalent or higher examination, and
- (c) To have passed a satisfactory examination in drawing, Part I., and in the theory and practice of teaching, as prescribed for junior teachers of the Second Grade in the instructions appended to this Regulation.

6. The conditions necessary for promotion of junior teachers to the First Grade shall be as follow:—

- (a) To have completed a year as junior teacher of the Second Grade, and to have received satisfactory annual reports from the district inspector and half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.

- (b) To have passed the School Intermediate examination of the University of Melbourne or an approved equivalent or higher examination in at least eight subjects, including one branch of science.

- (c) To have passed in the following subjects in the annual examinations conducted by the Education Department:—

- (a) Arithmetic (if not previously passed under (b) above).
- (b) Drawing, Part I. and Part II.
- (c) Penmanship.
- (d) Music.
- (e) Theory of teaching, Parts I. and II.
- (f) Practice of teaching.
- (g) Nature study.
- (h) Grammar.

As prescribed by the Director.

7. (a) The course of training prescribed for junior teachers shall be completed by serving a year as a junior teacher of the First Grade and by being certified during such year by a medical officer approved by the Director as free from any physical defect likely to impair his efficiency as a teacher and as suitable for permanent employment in the Public Service.

(b) On completion of the course, each junior teacher shall be recorded in the *Employment Register*, and may be required to take up a position as assistant teacher or head teacher.

(c) In the event of any First Grade junior teacher refusing to take up such a position, the services of such junior teacher shall be dispensed with, unless such junior teacher is a female and satisfies the Classifiers that the position she is required to take up is one which it would not be fit and proper for a female teacher to accept, or that there are good and sufficient reasons for not requiring her to take up such position, or unless such junior teacher is a male and satisfies the Classifiers that in his case there are exceptional circumstances under which he should not be required to take up such a position, and in any case where the Classifiers are satisfied as aforesaid they shall furnish to the Minister a written report of their decision stating the reasons for such decision.

8. During their course, junior teachers may be required to attend such classes of instruction as the Director may from time to time determine.

9. (a) The appointment of all junior teachers shall be on probation during the full term of the course of such junior teachers.

(b) The services of any junior teacher may be dispensed with for misconduct or for repeated failure to pass annual examinations prescribed for promotion or for failure to obtain satisfactory reports from a district inspector. The services of any junior teacher appointed subsequent to 1st July, 1920, who at the end of his fourth year of service has not passed in all the subjects for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, Second Class, as prescribed in Regulation XI. (B), may be dispensed with.

(c) Each junior teacher will be examined from time to time by a medical officer approved by the Director, and, if the medical report is not satisfactory in any case, the services of such junior teacher may be dispensed with.

10. All junior teachers who have been appointed not less than a year will be required to attend the annual examinations prescribed for junior teachers.

11. To enable junior teachers to pass their examinations for promotion and for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class, head teachers and assistant teachers are required to give to the junior teachers in their schools instruction outside of the ordinary school hours as follows:—

In a school having but one junior teacher, two hours per week; in a school having more than one junior teacher, at least three hours per week. Of this instruction, a satisfactory proportion shall be given by the head teacher. The time for such instruction, and the names of the teachers giving the instruction, must, in all cases, appear on the time-table. Among the subjects of such instruction within the school shall be theory of teaching, Part I.; theory of teaching, Part II.; theory of teaching, Part III.

The time actually given to the instruction shall be entered in the teachers' time-book by such head teacher or assistant as the case may be. The exercise-books kept by the junior teachers, showing the work done under the direction of the head teachers and assistants, shall be dated from day to day, and shall be produced to the district inspector at his half-yearly visits.

12. Special classes for the instruction and training of junior teachers may be formed in the principal centres of population. Junior teachers employed in schools situated at convenient distances from the places in which these classes are held will be required to attend such classes at such times as the Director may from time to time determine. Head teachers shall supervise the work done by junior teachers for these special

classes and supplement this instruction. In all cases, the head teacher shall train the junior teachers in the theory and practice of teaching.

13. At each visit the district inspectors shall include in their reports on head teachers reports on the character of the instruction of the junior teachers, and on the arrangements made for their practical training in the art of teaching.

14. Candidates for appointment as junior teachers in district high schools and higher elementary schools, in addition to holding the qualifications mentioned in clause 1, must have passed the School Leaving or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne, and must also have had at least one year's experience as junior teachers in elementary schools, and have passed in the theory and practice of teaching, Part I, as prescribed by the Director.

15. A junior teacher who for any reason has left the service of the Education Department may be re-appointed as a junior teacher and placed in such grade as the Director may determine.

16. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation any First Grade Junior Teacher whose services have been dispensed with under section 130 of the *Public Service Act 1928* may be re-appointed to a position corresponding in status and salary with that occupied by him immediately prior to the termination of his service and in the re-appointment of any such teacher preference over all candidates for first appointment shall be given.

17. Subject to his teaching record being satisfactory, any junior teacher whose services have been dispensed with owing to the operation of section 130 of the *Public Service Act 1928* shall, upon passing the prescribed examinations for First Grade Junior Teachers, be given preference for appointment as junior teacher, notwithstanding any other conditions prescribed for the appointment of Junior Teachers.

And the Honorable John Warburton Pennington, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

- (a) That the amount of loan moneys to be borrowed by such Sewerage Authority shall be Five thousand pounds (£5,000) for detail survey, revised estimates, and report on the scheme.
- (b) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Sewerage Authority shall consist of reticulation and branch sewers, main sewers, pumping plant, and treatment works.

## SHIRE OF STAWELL.

## BY-LAW No. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Stawell made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 11, for or with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, or on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences, and applications therefor;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
  - (1) for the granting or renewal of a licence;
  - (2) for the transfer of a licence;
- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Stawell order as follows:—

## 1. In this By-law—

- “Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Stawell.  
 “Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.  
 “Licensee” shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.  
 “Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Stawell.  
 “Petrol pump” shall mean any pump for supplying spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.  
 “Portable petrol pump” shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footway, and is not allowed to remain on the footway.  
 “Regulations” shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed in, or on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the Shire of Stawell used, or to be used, by such person for the purpose of the business carried on, or to be carried on, by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence is granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition, and free from leakage, and in accordance with this By-law, all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect.

- (a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump, other than a portable petrol pump, in or on any footway, a licence fee of £1 1s. (One pound one shilling sterling).
- (b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purposes of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence fee of £1 1s. (One pound one shilling sterling).
- (c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months, a proportionate reduction of the fees, based on the number of months unexpired, shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence, or renewal of a licence, or transfer of a licence, shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire, the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

7. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

8. The Council may refuse to grant, or renew, or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed, or proposed to be placed, in front of premises occupied, or to be occupied, by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

9. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application, in writing, to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence, in writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of Ten shillings.

10. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given, the policy of insurance hereinafter referred to taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee, or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

11. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall, before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence, and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company of good repute, against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump, in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall, on demand, produce to the Council, or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance, and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump, or any part thereof, or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed, or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, shall, within seven days after such expiry or cancellation, remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence, and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith or in, on, or under the footway.

14. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design, or position, without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Stawell.
