RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.
Award No. 31.

(To come into operation as from the 17th day of January, 1932.)

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the Railways Act 1928 (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

For the clauses indicated in the undermentioned divisions of award No. 8. of 7th June, 1923, viz.:—

- Division 1.—Preliminary.—“Suburban Area.”
- Division 13.—Relieving Expenses.—Clauses 1, 2, and 3.
- Division 14.—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.—Clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, 13, and 14.
- Division 15.—Transfer Expenses, &c.—Clause 1.
- Division 17.—Youths Living away from Home.—Clauses 1 and 2—

there shall be substituted the following clauses:—

DIVISION 1.—PRELIMINARY.

“Suburban area” shall be deemed to include the lines from Melbourne to Ashburton, Croydon, Broadmeadows, Glenwaverley, East Kew, Campbellfield North, Flemington Racecourse, Fitzroy, Eltham, Kew, Frankston, Dandenong, Port Melbourne Pier, Thomastown, Sandringham, St. Kilda, St. Albans, Altona, Williamstown Racecourse, Williamstown Pier, Newport to Sunshine, Albion to Broadmeadows, and the tramway tracks from St. Kilda to Brighton Beach inclusive, and from Sandringham to Beaumaris inclusive.

DIVISION 13.—RELIEVING EXPENSES.

Country.

(1) Country relieving expenses shall be as follows, viz.:—

Officers whose rate of salary is £300 per annum (disregarding any emergency deduction) or over—36s. 6d. per week;
Officers whose rate of salary is less than £300 per annum (disregarding any emergency deduction), and all employees—33s. per week;
and shall be paid to any officer or employee on the regular relieving staff when engaged on relieving duty outside the suburban area.

Suburban.

(2) (a) Suburban relieving expenses at the rate of 2s. per day shall be paid to—

Any officer or employee on the regular relieving staff, when engaged on relieving duty in the suburban area;
Any signalman or block recorder engaged on regular relieving duty in the Melbourne yard;
Provided that any officer or employee in receipt of suburban relieving expenses who is obliged to remain away from home overnight and incur expenses shall in addition be granted expenses on the basis of the travelling scale, subject to a maximum of 4s. 6d.

(b) Any officer or employee on the regular relieving staff whose head-quarters are outside the suburban area shall, when engaged on relieving duty in the suburban area, be granted country relieving expenses.

(c) Any officer or employee performing relieving duty inside and outside the suburban area on the one day (calculated from midnight to midnight) shall be paid the suburban relieving allowance if he be for the greater portion of the day in the suburban area, and country relieving expenses if he be the greater (or an equal) portion of the day outside the suburban area.

General.

(3) No single officer or employee engaged for a period in excess of one month on relieving duty, and no married officer or employee engaged for a period in excess of two months on relieving duty—

- (a) at any one place; or
- (b) at different places between North Melbourne and Richmond inclusive (excluding any signalman or block recorder on regular relieving duty in the Melbourne yards).

shall be allowed any expenses in respect of the period after the one month in the case of the single officer or employee, and after two months in the case of the married officer or employee, except with the sanction of the Commissioners.

DIVISION 14.—TRAVELLING AND INCIDENTAL EXPENSES.

(1) The following shall be the scale of travelling and incidental expenses, viz.:—

Officers whose rate of salary is £300 per annum (disregarding any emergency deduction) or over, and special inquiry officers and special ticket checkers (country)—10s. 4d. per day (i.e., 2s. 6d. for each meal and 2s. 10d. for each bed) for the first seven days at the same place; 6s. per day thereafter;

Officers whose rate of salary is less than £300 per annum (excluding any emergency deduction), and all employees (except special inquiry officers and special ticket checkers (country))—8s. 6d. per day (i.e., 2s. for each meal and 2s. 6d. for each bed) for the first seven days at the same place; 4s. 9d. per day thereafter;

and, except as hereinafter provided, such scale expenses shall be granted to—

- (a) any officer or employee whose head-quarters are within the suburban area, and who is required to travel on duty away from his head-quarters to a place outside of the suburban area and distant at least ten (10) miles from his head-quarters; or
- (b) any officer or employee whose head-quarters are outside of the suburban area, and who is required to travel on duty away from his head-quarters, to a place distant more than ten (10) miles from his head-quarters.

(2) For the purposes of this Division, the first seven days at the same place shall not be deemed to include the day of departure from head-quarters unless a full day's expenses are payable for each day.

(3) Subject to the provisions of clauses 4 and 11 of this Division, no allowance for breakfast, dinner, or tea, as the case may be, shall be granted to any officer or employee unless he commence travelling from his head-quarters earlier than the time specified in the second column hereunder, and/or does not return until after the time specified in the third column hereunder:—

Payment Allowed for—	If Departure be before—	If Return be after—
Breakfast	7.0 a.m.	8.0 a.m.
Dinner	12.30 p.m.	1.30 p.m.
Tea	6.0 p.m.	7.0 p.m.

(4) Subject to the provisions of clause 11 of this Division, no allowance shall be payable to any officer or employee for being absent from his head-quarters when he leaves and returns on the same day, provided that any officer or employee who is required to leave before 7 a.m. shall be granted an allowance for breakfast, and that any officer or employee who is unable to return until after 7 p.m. shall be granted an allowance for tea.

(13) The travelling scale allowance for meals shall be granted to any head office clerk for each day whilst engaged away from his head-quarters in paying the staff or checking pay-rolls, provided that any such clerk is required to commence duty by at least 7 a.m.

(14) Camping allowance—

- (a) Any employee “camped out” and provided with sleeping accommodation by the Department for at least three (3) days either in a continuous period or in any one working week shall be granted a “camping” allowance of 2s. if he be married and 1s. if he be single in respect of each day on which he is “camped out.”
Any such employee whose duties necessitate his absence from the place where he is “camped out” shall be treated on the basis prescribed in respect of the “trip” allowance as if such place were his head-quarters.
- (b) Any employee, provided with sleeping accommodation by the Department and obliged to “camp out,” but otherwise not coming within the provisions of (a), shall be treated on the basis prescribed in respect of the “trip” allowance.

DIVISION 15.—TRANSFER EXPENSES, ETC.

(1) Any officer or employee shall, when transferred, be granted—

- (a) a free pass for himself and his wife and family (if any) and any relatives solely dependent upon him for support; and
- (b) free transport by rail of his household effects and any other effects which may be sanctioned by the Commissioners.

DIVISION 17.—YOUTHS LIVING AWAY FROM HOME.

(1) Any junior clerk in receipt of a salary of less than £86 per annum who, in the opinion of the Commissioners, is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a board and lodging allowance on the basis of the difference between his annual salary and £86 per annum.

(2) Any lad or apprentice in receipt of a wage of less than 5s. 6d. per day who, in the opinion of the Commissioners, is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a daily board and lodging allowance for six (6) days per week equivalent to the difference between his daily wage and 5s. 6d. per day.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (19 Geo. V. No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs: And that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby repeal the definition of the Port of Westernport, which definition appeared in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th February, 1896, page 1146, and do substitute therefor the following definition. (That is to say):—

WESTERNPORT.

The Port of Westernport shall include all inlets, rivers, bays, harbours, and navigable waters north of and within a line bearing south 69 degrees east from West Head to the southern end of Round Island, and also north of a line bearing north 45 degrees east from Cape Woolamai to the opposite shore!

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BATHING AND RECREATION RESERVE AT MONTGOMERY BAY IN THE PARISH OF SALE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council, 24th February, 1931, as a site for Bathing and Recreation in the Parish of Sale, known as "Montgomery Bay Bathing and Recreation Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency in dress, conduct, or language shall remain on the Reserve.

1A. All persons bathing from the Reserve shall be attired in a suitable bathing costume.

2. No person shall permit any cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals to enter in or upon the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

4. No person shall destroy, disfigure, break down, carry away, or otherwise injure or damage any buildings, fences, seats, or other erections, trees, shrubs, plants, or other vegetation in or upon the Reserve, or post bills upon, or write, paint, or carve any word or other device upon such buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, seats, or other erections.

5. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or other structure upon the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, in writing, and no such permission will be given to any person until such person has submitted, and the Committee of Management has approved of, the plans and specifications of such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or other structure.

5A. All buildings on the Reserve must conform to plans and regulations as to position and design approved by the Committee of Management.

6. No person after having obtained such permission, in writing, shall use, or cause, or permit to be used, any bathing box, boathouse, or other erection for residential purposes.

7. No person shall camp or erect any tent for residential purposes in or upon the Reserve except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management shall determine.

8. No person shall bring or place any motor car, cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle in or upon the Reserve except in or upon such portions thereof as shall from time to time be set apart as parking areas.

8A. All persons using such parking areas for the accommodation of any motor car, motor cycle, cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle shall pay such fees as shall be from time to time fixed by the Committee of Management, but the maximum fee shall not exceed the sum of One shilling (1s.) per day.

9. No fires shall be lighted or material burned upon the Reserve unless by express order, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure for the sale of goods or wares of any kind upon the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained in writing.

13. No assemblies or meeting for fêtes, galas, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship or preaching, or public speaking, or meetings of a like character, shall take place upon the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall play or perform in any band of music or take part in any entertainment of any kind in or upon the Reserve for the purpose of gain or otherwise without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stones or hard substance on the Reserve.

16. No person shall play cricket, football, hockey, rounders, baseball, golf, or similar game with a hard or solid ball on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management.

17. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air-gun, or any firearms in or upon the Reserve, except by permission of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall engage or take part in any motor car or motor cycle racing upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and it shall be an offence for any person to ride or use any motor cycle, car, or other vehicle on the Reserve in any way or manner that may endanger the safety or cause bodily harm to any person.

19. No person shall moor and/or use any boat in and upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

20. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, any paper, bottles, fruit skins, food, or other litter or refuse in or upon the Reserve, except in receptacles provided for that purpose.

21. No person, except a workman or labourer duly authorized by the Committee of Management, shall enter upon any enclosure or plot upon the Reserve set apart or enclosed for the plantation of trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, or other vegetation.

22. No person shall break any glass of any kind upon the Reserve, or shall leave thereon any substance likely to cause injury to another.

23. All fees payable and received for camping, agistment, parking of vehicles, use of bathing boxes, sites for sheds, tents, booths, bathing boxes, or other structures, or for any other purpose or purposes, shall be expended in the maintenance, upkeep and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

24. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of

guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he or she has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
