ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 3995.—“An Act to authorize the City of South Melbourne to expend the Balance of certain Moneys for purposes other than the purposes for which the said Moneys were borrowed by the said City.”
- No. 3996.—“An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Railways and for other purposes.”
- No. 3997.—“An Act to amend the *Fisheries Act 1928*.”
- No. 3998.—“An Act to amend Part VII. of the *Instruments Act 1928*.”
- No. 3999.—“An Act to approve adopt authorize and ratify an Agreement between the Commonwealth of Australia and the State of Victoria relating to the varying of the Agreement set out in the Schedule to the *Federal Aid Roads Act 1926* and approved adopted authorized and ratified by that Act.”
- No. 4000.—“An Act to amend and continue the Unemployment Relief Acts and to continue the Stamps (Unemployment Relief) Acts and to make provision with respect to Collections for Unemployment.”
- No. 4001.—“An Act to amend Sections Nineteen and Thirty-nine of the *Licensing Act 1928*.”
- No. 4002.—“An Act to relieve the First Mildura Trust of Part of its Indebtedness for Moneys borrowed from the State for Water Supply and for other purposes.”
- No. 4003.—“An Act to authorize the City of Malvern to expend the Balances of certain Moneys for purposes other than the purposes for which the said Moneys were borrowed by the said City.”
- No. 4004.—“An Act to enable Advances to be made on certain Terms to Cultivators of Land and for other purposes.”
- No. 4005.—“An Act to amend the *Companies Act 1928*.”
- No. 4006.—“An Act to amend the Law relating to Cemeteries.”
- No. 4007.—“An Act relating to Betting by way of Wagering on certain Sports Grounds.”

No. 4.—13997. —Price 6d.; Quarterly, 7s. 7d.; Half-Yearly, 15s. 2d.; Yearly, 30s. 4d.

No. 4008.—“An Act to further amend Section Nineteen and Section One hundred and ninety-seven of the *Closer Settlement Act 1928*.”

No. 4009.—“An Act to approve an Agreement between the Commonwealth of Australia of the First Part and the States of New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, and Tasmania of the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Parts respectively relating to the Compulsory Conversion of the Internal Debts of the Commonwealth and the States in certain cases and to refer to the Parliament of the Commonwealth a certain Matter in connexion with the Compulsory Conversion of such Debts, and for other purposes.”

No. 4010.—“An Act to amend the *Health Act 1928*.”

No. 4011.—“An Act to make provision with respect to certain Payments under the Licensing Acts.”

No. 4012.—“An Act to declare the Rates of Income Tax for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two and to continue the Income Tax Acts.”

No. 4013.—“An Act to declare the Rate of Land Tax for the year ending the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.”

No. 4014.—“An Act to amend the Law relating to Stamps and Stamp Duties.”

No. 4015.—“An Act to amend the Income Tax Acts.”

No. 4016.—“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three million nine hundred and twenty-one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one and One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.”

No. 4017.—“An Act to continue Part III. of the *Finance Act 1930* and to increase the Duties payable under Part VI. of the *Administration and Probate Act 1928* and under the *Administration and Probate Duties Act 1929* and under the said Part III.”

MEDICAL ACT 1928 (PART II.) AND THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the *Medical Act 1928* (Part II.), hereby repeal the Regulations made by the Dental Board on the twenty-second day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, and approved by the Governor in Council on the thirty-first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, provided that such repeal shall not apply to students who have been previously to the repeal of the Regulations made by the Dental Board of Victoria on the fifth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and approved by the Governor in Council on the seventeenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, apprenticed by virtue of such Regulations to dentists under clause 5 thereof, and as to such students, such Regulations shall continue in full force and effect, and in lieu of the Regulations hereby repealed, and to the extent of such repeal, doth make the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Candidates for the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria, and for registration as dentists under the *Medical Act 1928* (Part II.), shall produce evidence of having—

- (a) passed the prescribed preliminary examination;
- (b) pursued the prescribed course of professional study.

(a) Preliminary Examination.

2. Every candidate, before he enters upon the course of professional study prescribed for the time being by Regulation, shall produce to the Registrar of the Dental Board of Victoria a certificate that he is entitled to matriculate in the University of Melbourne, or a certificate that he has matriculated in the University of Melbourne, or a certificate that is recognized by the University of Melbourne as equivalent to its certificate of matriculation.

(b) The Course of Professional Study.

The course of professional study for the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria shall be the course in force for the time being for the Degree of Bachelor of Dental Science of the University of Melbourne, and the Board shall accept the certificates of examination of the examiners appointed by the University of Melbourne for each year of the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Dental Science as the certificates of examination for the corresponding year of the course for the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria.

(c) Fees.

The fee for the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery shall be One guinea.

Candidates who have complied with the foregoing conditions, and have paid the prescribed fee, shall be entitled to the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria, and to registration as dentists.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria, held on the fourth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

BY-LAW No. 53.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook, made under the provisions of section 767 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 53, for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in the Recreation Reserve known as Selwyn Park.

WHEREAS by section 767 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, power is given to the Council of any municipality, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make By-laws or Regulations (*inter alia*) for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or places as have been purchased or otherwise provided by the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation: And whereas the said Council has provided the land known as Selwyn Park Recreation Reserve, being the land comprised in certificate of title, volume 5727, folio 1145337, as a pleasure ground or place of public recreation: Now therefore the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook (hereinafter called the Council), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following By-law in respect of the land provided as aforesaid, and which has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management appointed by the Council, with full power and authority to enforce the provisions of this By-law on behalf of the Council:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public on such days as the same may be set apart for cricket or football matches, cycling, or other sports, shows, fêtes, &c., on any of which occasions a charge for admission may be fixed by the Committee of Management:

2. No person who offends or may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall enter, be, or remain in the Reserve.

3. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve or any part thereof without consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over any fence or gate, or stick any bills thereon, or cut any name or sign on any fence, gate, tree, or seat, or in any way damage any building, gate, fence, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water therein, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, manure, or other property.

5. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserve, nor give out or distribute any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall interfere with any tree, shrub, or other property in the Reserve, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottle, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the purpose of any game or amusement, or for any other purpose, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve (excepting in some place set apart for the purpose), or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.

9. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall walk upon any flower-bed or enter any plot therein which may be enclosed or used for plantations for young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a cord or chain, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

12. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "Cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

13. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport in the Reserve on Sunday, Anzac Day, or Good Friday.

14. No person shall play any unlawful game, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management thereof.

15. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

16. No person shall camp in the Reserve.

17. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone, missile, or any hard substance in the Reserve, and no person shall play cricket, hockey, football, golf, rounders, tennis, or any other organized game in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

18. No person, other than players and officials connected with any game, and competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground or oval during the course of such game or sport.

19. No person shall engage in cricket, football, lacrosse, baseball, or any other game in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, unless such person is at the time a playing member of any club which is duly authorized by the Committee of Management to play therein.

20. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket, or football matches, cycling, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, or any club, association, or person authorized by the said Committee of Management to issue such ticket of admission, or by any club, association, or person renting the Reserve, or any part thereof, duly authorizing the admission of such person, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail, except on the date or during the period provided thereon, and every such ticket shall be produced and, if for one day only, surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect the same.

21. Upon application to the Committee of Management, any club, association, or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements, and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of this By-law, and shall pay to the Committee of Management such charges as the Committee of Management may deem to be reasonable and consistent with this By-law.

22. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, horse races, fêtes, coursing, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by this By-law and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

23. Every person who by act or omission shall contravene any of the foregoing provisions shall be guilty of an offence.

24. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Braybrook on the third day of August, 1931.

No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act 1928* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.
