BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1932.

THE Boort Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Boort Urban District.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY, AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF EMU.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Township of Emu within the South Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Kara Kara of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke (in so far as such Regulations relate to the said Township of Emu within the said South Riding of the said Municipal District), the Regulations made on the eleventh day of January, 1916, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the South Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Kara Kara, shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST THE DETERMINATION OF THE ASPHALTERS BOARD.

WHEREAS—

- (a) the Wages Board (herein referred to as the Asphalters Board) appointed under the *Factories and Shops Act* to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of asphaltting or tar-paving, did by a certain determination made on the 24th day of January, 1924, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 4th day of February, 1924, following, determine such lowest prices or rates;
- (b) on the 29th day of February, 1932, a group of employers who employ not less than twenty-five per centum of the total number of workers in the trade affected lodged an appeal, in the prescribed manner, against the determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677);
- (c) on the date of receipt of the appeal and during periods of twenty-one days and a further fourteen days thereafter, there were not any representatives of employers or of employees on the said Asphalters Board to nominate persons to represent them on the Court as prescribed; and
- (d) no nominations of persons for appointment as representatives on the Court have been received:

Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Act, that a Court of Industrial Appeals, consisting of the President, His Honour Mr. Justice Mann, sitting alone, be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the determination of the Asphalters Board, and to revise or alter the said Court's own determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

And the Honorable Robert Williams, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3836) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Boot Trades Regulations (No. 1)".

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

"Act" means the *Apprenticeship Act 1928*.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz:—

Clicking,
Stuff-cutting,
Making,
Finishing,

as carried on in the bootmaking industry within the Metropolitan District.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Act.

Applicants may be Examined.—Exemptions.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades: Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—

(a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

- (i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.
- (iii) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the Elementary Schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Act, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

And the Honorable Robert Williams, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

60c. Within the limits of all ports in Victoria, other than the ports of Melbourne, Geelong, and Warrnambool:—

- (i) No person shall take on to the foreshore or into the sea any dog unless such dog is controlled by a leash, chain, or cord, and if vicious securely and efficiently muzzled.
- (ii) Any dog not so controlled shall be liable to be seized, detained, and destroyed, and the owner thereof shall make compensation for any damage done by such dog.
- (iii) No person shall take a dog into the sea within 100 feet of any person bathing.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (19 Geo. V. No. 3723) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs; and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby repeal the Regulation No. 58 for ports in Victoria having reference to horse-bathing at Brighton, which Regulation was made by Proclamation dated 4th April, 1910, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th April, 1910, and do substitute the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

58. Except as hereinafter provided, bathing or exercising horses is prohibited from or on that part of the foreshore, or within 400 yards seawards of low-water mark in that part of the sea extending from an imaginary line, being the continuation seawards of the centre line of Head-street, Brighton, southerly and south-easterly to an imaginary line, being the continuation seawards of the centre line of New-street, Brighton:

Provided that on days other than Sundays and public holidays, bathing or exercising horses shall be permitted from or on that portion of the foreshore, or in that portion of the sea between the line of the south side of the North-road pier, or an extension of this line and an imaginary line parallel to and 75 yards south thereof, between the hours of sunrise and 9 a.m. during the months September to April inclusive, and between the hours of sunrise and 10 a.m. during the months May to August inclusive.

The person in charge of any horse shall be responsible for the removal and disposal of all manure left by such horse.

Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps); jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge and (except for the gaols) the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. 12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service,

will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word Treasurer shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.

BY-LAW No. 64.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under Part 7, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and No. 64 for appointing standing places for motor cars.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray order as follows:—

1. The streets and public places or parts thereof respectively mentioned or set forth in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter called "Parking Areas") shall be and are hereby appointed by the Council as standing places for motor cars within the City of Footscray.

2. A driver may park his car in any parking area within such times only as are prescribed by the Council upon payment of the prescribed fee, and not otherwise. The days and hours during which such parking areas shall be available for parking shall be as follows:—

Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, from 10 a.m. until 5.30 p.m.

3. Every driver shall pay to the officer or attendant appointed by the Council of the City of Footscray for any standing place a fee of One shilling for each vehicle parked by such driver in such parking area or areas within the hours hereunder mentioned. Provided that the person next driving or taking charge of any such motor car or the registered owner of any such motor car shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to be the driver who parked such motor car on any such parking area.

4. Any person who, upon any parking area or upon any street, without authority shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant or other officer appointed by the Council to receive fees from drivers for parking motor cars, or who shall in any way assume the duties of a parking area attendant or such other officer as aforesaid, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any parking area attendant or other officer as aforesaid in the execution of his duty under this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

5. A driver shall in any parking area park his motor car—

(a) as directed by the officer in charge of the parking area; or,

(b) if no such officer be present, shall take up his position thereon in the order of his arrival thereat, and in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other motor cars already parked, and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty, and not otherwise.

6. It shall be lawful for the Council, by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Mayor, or in his absence of the Town Clerk, from time to time, as may be convenient or necessary, to fix or appoint openings through any such parking area to permit of cross traffic, and also from time to time to vary the same or any of them, and also in like manner, pursuant to any resolution of the Council in that behalf, from time to time to alter or vary the hours during which such parking areas or any of them shall be available for use, or to discontinue the same or any of them.

7. No person shall obstruct any such opening as aforesaid by placing his vehicle therein or otherwise.

8. Any wilful contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act of omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

9. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
