STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 2734.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—
MITIAMO URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE LODDON UNITED
WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1932, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1932, and shall be payable on the 29th day of April, 1932, at the office of the said Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 2735.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—
QUAMBATOOK URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE AVOCA WATER
TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Urban District within the Avoca Water Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

(2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands.

(3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1932, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1932, and shall be payable on the 29th day of April, 1932, at the office of the said Commission's Collector, at Charlton.

3. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 2736.—RATE.—AVOCA WATER TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. A rate of Fourpence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Avoca Water Trust, except within any Urban District thereof, is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all such lands and tenements.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1932, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1932, and shall be payable on the 29th day of April, 1932, at the office of the said Commission's Collector, at Charlton.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

Masseurs Registration Act 1298 (No. 3728).

VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE MASSEURS
REGULATIONS 1923.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Masseurs Registration Act 1928* (No. 3728), and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Masseurs Registration Board doth, with the approval of the Governor in Council, hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Masseurs Regulations 1932*, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. These Regulations shall apply to all persons who have not completed, and to all persons who are eligible to begin, the prescribed courses of training: provided that those persons who were permitted to begin such courses prior to thirtieth day of December, 1930, shall not be required to undergo the course prescribed for the third year in respect of muscle re-education.

3. Regulation 14 of the *Masseurs Regulations 1923* is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

14. The curriculum for the prescribed courses of training shall include—

FIRST YEAR.

Introductory Science.

(i) A course of at least twelve lectures and demonstrations on Introductory Science, comprising the elementary principles of Physics, Chemistry, and Biology.

Junior Anatomy.

(ii) A course of at least 90 lectures and 60 demonstrations on Junior Anatomy, in accordance with the details as prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

Practical Anatomy.

(iii) A course of practical dissections as prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

Physiology.

(iv) A course of at least 30 lectures and demonstrations on Physiology as prescribed by the Professor of Physiology at the University of Melbourne.

FIRST AND SECOND YEARS.

Medical Gymnastics.

(v) A course of at least 20 lectures and demonstrations on Medical Gymnastics, comprising definitions of terms, principles of movements, physiological effects of movements, normal movements, and therapeutic application of movements in the treatment of disease.

Practical Medical Gymnastics.

(vi) A course of practical instruction on practical Medical Gymnastics for not less than 100 hours, extending over a period of not less than six months.

SECOND YEAR.

Senior Anatomy.

(vii) A course of at least 90 lectures and demonstrations on Senior Anatomy in accordance with the details prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

Practical Anatomy.

(viii) A course of dissections in accordance with details prescribed by the Professor of Anatomy at the University of Melbourne.

Theory of Massage.

(ix) A course of at least fifteen lectures on the Theory of Massage, comprising History of Massage, Classification, and Definition of Procedures, Physiological Effects of Massage, and its Therapeutic Application.

Pathology and Therapeutics.

(x) A course of at least fifteen lectures and demonstrations on Elementary Pathology and Therapeutics, comprising a description of the cause, pathology, symptoms, and treatment of such diseases as are susceptible to treatment by Massage and its allied arts.

Bandaging.

(xi) A course of at least twelve demonstrations, each being at least of one hour's duration, on Bandaging. The student is required to attain proficiency in the application of the roller bandage and in the removal and replacement of splints.

SECOND AND THIRD YEARS.

Practice of Massage.

(xii) A course of at least twenty lectures and demonstrations on the practice of Massage, comprising instruction in regional massage and practice on models, and requiring attendance for practical work for at least 300 hours.

Medical Electricity.

(xiii) A course of at least fifteen demonstrations and lectures on Medical Electricity, extending over a period of at least six months, and comprising a description of Faradic, Galvanic, and Static Electricity, and the apparatus required, their use, care, and maintenance, and their applications in cases of disease.

THIRD YEAR.

Muscle Re-education.

(xiv) A course of at least six lectures and demonstrations on Muscle Re-education, each of one hour's duration.

4. Every applicant for registration under the provisions of section 18 (1) (d) of the Act who before the eighteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, was being or had been trained in the practice of massage shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he completed a course of training substantially equivalent to that prescribed in these Regulations and passed the necessary examinations: Provided that in any case in which it thinks fit the Board may require such applicant to be examined and pass in all or any of the subjects prescribed before granting registration.

REGULATION REDUCING WEIGHT TO BE CARRIED ON THE BALLARAT-DAYLESFORD ROAD IN THE SHIRES OF CRESWICK AND GLENLYON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MALLACOOTA NATIONAL PARK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of an area of 11,225 acres, more or less, being the remaining portion of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 12th October, 1909, as a site for a National Park in the Parishes of Mallacoota, Maramingo, Wau Wauka, Wau Wauka West, and Betka (Mallacoota National Park).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be at all times open to the public free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, animals, or birds in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the written permission of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon; or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only when the dog is led on a chain or cord.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect thereon any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
11. No person while in the Reserve shall have in his possession any gun, net, trap, gin, snare, or any substance or instrument used for the capture or destruction of birds or animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MOUNT DANDENONG ARBORETUM, IN THE PARISH OF MOOROOLBARK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the area indicated by green tint on plan marked A/24.2.1931, with Lands Department Correspondence Rs. 4116, being the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 21st October, 1901, for Public Recreation in the Parish of Mooroolbark, and portion of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 27th November, 1896, for Public Recreation in the said parish, and together known as the "Arboretum."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the "Arboretum" who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the "Arboretum" any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals, and any such found therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.
3. No person shall camp in the "Arboretum," nor erect therein any booth, tent, or dwelling, or other structure, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the "Arboretum" any article, fruit, or merchandise.
5. No person shall deposit in the "Arboretum" any rubbish, litter, or refuse of any kind, nor stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, nor cut or paint names, letters, marks, or other matter on the trees, rocks, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface same, nor shall he break, cut, dig up, damage, or injure in any way, or take away the whole or any portion of any trees, shrubs, plants, seeds, scrub, undergrowth, ferns, flowers, property, soil, or any vegetation in the "Arboretum."
6. The lighting of fires in the "Arboretum" is strictly prohibited, except in the fireplaces made and provided by the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall shoot, trap, or destroy any bird or native game in the "Arboretum," nor shall he, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management, carry, use, or discharge any firearms therein.
8. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the "Arboretum" without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall play at, or engage in, any game or athletic sport or gymnastic exercise in the "Arboretum" without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person in any part of the "Arboretum" shall wilfully disturb, obstruct, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the same, nor wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management.
11. No vehicle, motor car, or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter, or pass over, or through the "Arboretum" without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

The area has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after having been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

By omitting from the said Third Schedule the following paragraph:—

"Hope-street or Corporation-lane Number 13 and that portion of Hope-street south of Corporation Lane Number 13 which is less than thirty feet in width, being part of Crown portion 15 at South Yarra, Parish of South Melbourne, the whole extending from Domain-road to a point four hundred and seventy-five feet south of south building line, Domain-road."

and substituting therefor the following paragraph:—

"Hope-street, that portion known as Corporation-lane Number 13, being part of Crown portion 15 at South Yarra, Parish of South Melbourne."

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII, of the *Local Government Act* 1928 and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928, and numbered 213, to amend and add to By-law No. 207.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928 (19 George V., number 3720) and the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928 (19 George V., number 3613), the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall, from and after the date of the same coming into operation, be read and construed as one with By-law No. 207 intitled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made

under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act* 1928 and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act* 1928, and numbered 207, for or with respect to the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances; the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor; licences and conditions to be contained in licences; prescribing fees for granting or renewal or transfer of a licence; providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps."

2. Sub-clause (a) of clause No. 4 of By-law No. 207 shall be amended by inserting therein, at the commencement thereof, and before the words "there shall be paid", the following words, "except as provided in the next sub-clause."

3. The following sub-clause shall be inserted in By-law No. 207, after sub-clause (a) of clause No. 4 of By-law No. 207:—
"(aa) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence granted after the coming into operation of this By-law for a petrol pump (other than a portable petrol pump), placed or to be placed in or on any footway in front of the premises described in the first column of the schedule referred to in clause 4 of this By-law, the respective fees per annum set out in the second column of such schedule."

4. There shall be inserted in By-law number 207 a Fourth Schedule, as follows:—
