BY-LAWS OF THE QUEEN'S MEMORIAL INFECTIOUS DISEASES HOSPITAL, FAIRFIELD, VICTORIA.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Infectious Diseases Hospital Act 1928* (No. 3704), the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital Board hereby makes the following By-laws:—

1. All By-laws and Rules in force prior to the date of the coming into operation of these By-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

2. These By-laws shall come into force at the expiration of one month after the same have been confirmed by the Governor in Council, and on their publication in the *Government Gazette*.

I. PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

3. The Board shall meet fortnightly or otherwise as may be determined by the Board, and on such days and at such time or times as may from time to time be agreed upon.

4. Special meetings may be held at any time, and shall be convened by the Secretary, either at the request of the Chairman or of any three members of the Board.

5. The Chairman shall be empowered to advise and instruct officials of the Hospital, when necessary, between meetings of the Board.

6. Notice of motion on all matters of importance shall be given in writing, and no Resolution or act authorized at any meeting shall be rescinded or amended unless notice in writing be given to the Secretary and sent to each member at least two days before the meeting at which such motion is to be proposed.

7. The conduct of every meeting shall be in the hands of the Chairman, whose decision on all points of order or procedure shall be final.

8. The Board shall appoint annually a House Committee and a Finance Committee, and may appoint such other sub-committees of any number as it may think fit, with such powers, and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may determine, and the Chairman for the time being shall *ex officio* be a member of all committees.

9. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the office of the Board, in the custody of the Secretary, and shall only be affixed to documents upon a Resolution of the Board authorizing the same. The affixing of the seal shall be attested by the Chairman for the time being or any two members of the Board and the Secretary. The Secretary shall keep a record of all documents to which the seal has been affixed.

10. Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings at all meetings of the Board and of all committees appointed by the Board.

II. HOUSE COMMITTEE.

11. The House Committee shall consist of six members, and three shall form a quorum, and it shall elect its own Chairman, who shall have a casting vote.

12. The Committee shall meet at the hospital fortnightly, or at such times as may be determined by the Board, and at such other times as the Committee may deem necessary.

13. The Committee shall—

- (1) Inspect the various parts of the hospital, including buildings, plant, furnishings, and equipment, and consider all requirements necessary for the proper conduct and maintenance of the Hospital.
- (2) Consider and investigate any complaint which cannot be dealt with by the Medical Superintendent, Secretary, or Matron, with regard to the conduct of the staff, or any other matter which shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary for submission to the Committee.
- (3) Deal with all requisitions for current supplies and arrange for the calling of tenders for all necessary supplies, and receive and examine such tenders.
- (4) Report the result of its deliberations and recommendations to the next meeting of the Board.
- (5) Perform such other functions as the Board may from time to time determine.

III. FINANCE COMMITTEE.

14. The Finance Committee shall consist of six members, and three shall form a quorum. It shall elect its own Chairman, who shall have a casting vote.

15. The Committee shall meet fortnightly and at such other times as it may deem necessary.

16. The Committee shall—

- (1) Examine all accounts, including salaries and wages, submitted by the Secretary, and, if approved, the same shall be initialed by the Chairman or one member of the Committee, and recommended to the Board for payment.
- (2) Check the Secretary's statement of receipts and expenditure, and compare the balance shown with the bank pass-book, and receive the auditors' monthly report.
- (3) Issue all needful instructions to the Secretary with reference to keeping of books of accounts and matters of finance generally.
- (4) Report the result of its deliberations and recommendations to the next meeting of the Board.

IV. FINANCE.

17. The Secretary shall receive all moneys on behalf of the Board and issue the official receipt forthwith. All such moneys shall be deposited without delay to the credit of the Board in such bank as the Board shall from time to time determine.

All accounts shall be paid by cheque and in no circumstances shall payments be made out of cash receipts.

All cheques must be signed by two members of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary.

V. SECRETARY.

18. The Secretary shall be appointed by the Board, and shall be the executive officer of the Hospital, and shall be responsible for the general business management of the Hospital.

19. He shall—

- (a) Attend all meetings of the Board and Committees, take minutes of the proceedings, and record them in proper books, he shall see that all necessary records are kept, control all official correspondence, call meetings, give proper notice thereof, with the business to be transacted, and carry out the directions given by the Board or Committees.
- (b) Be responsible for the conduct of all clerical work pertaining to his own office, and the keeping of all necessary books of accounts. All books kept by him shall be open for inspection or audit at any time by a person appointed by the Board.
- (c) Compile all returns and statements, except medical, required under the Act, or for the information of the Board or Committees.
- (d) Devote his time exclusively to the service of the Board, and be responsible for the due observance of all By-laws and Rules of the Hospital pertaining to his office.
- (e) Enter into a fidelity guarantee for the sum of £500 with a company approved by the Board, which shall be responsible for the payment of the premium on such guarantee.
- (f) Engage all casual employees required in his department, and shall have power to suspend any member of his staff, and shall report any such action to the House Committee at the following meeting.
- (g) Requisition for all supplies required in his department, and shall see that the invoices for all goods requisitioned in all departments are certified by the person receiving such goods, and be responsible for the submission of all accounts to the Finance Committee for payment.
- (h) Receive all moneys, issue the proper official receipts for same, and deposit such moneys in the bank as occasion may require.
- (i) Countersign all cheques, and be responsible for the prompt payment of accounts authorized by the Board, including salaries and wages.
- (j) Work under the direction of the Board, and shall be responsible to the Board for the proper discharge of his duties.
- (k) Be responsible for the good order of the buildings, grounds, plant, and equipment, and report to the House Committee at each meeting.
- (l) Receive for safe custody all money and valuables brought to the Hospital by patients, and keep a record of same.
- (m) Bring under the notice of every officer and employee immediately after appointment the particular rules governing his or her position, and keep a copy of same posted in a conspicuous place for their inspection.
- (n) Be the channel of communication between the Board and all members of the staff under his control.
- (o) Be in control of all staff other than those under the Medical Superintendent and Matron.
- (p) Be responsible for taking stock of all plant, equipment, and property, for the purpose of the balance-sheet required for the annual report.
- (q) Be responsible for the proper registration of all deaths occurring in the Hospital.
- (r) Confer, when necessary, with the Medical Superintendent and Matron on all matters in their departments affecting the proper conduct of the Hospital.

20. His appointment may be terminated on three months' notice on either side.

VI. MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT.

21. The Medical Superintendent shall be appointed by the Board, and shall be a medical practitioner registered in the State of Victoria.

22. He shall—

- (a) Be in entire charge of patients and of all wards and buildings connected with the reception, care, and discharge of patients, and shall be responsible to the Board in all matters of a professional nature.

- (b) Devote his whole time to the service of the Hospital, and shall not engage in private practice: provided that he may, in cases of urgency, act as a consultant when requested by private practitioners.
- (c) Exercise supervision over all matters connected with the conveyance, admission, treatment, nursing, and discharge of patients, and in so far as it affects the well-being and care of patients, he shall have authority to direct and instruct all persons employed in the Hospital.
- (d) Visit, or cause to be visited by a competent medical officer, all wards at least once a day.
- (e) Keep all necessary records of patients, and shall supply all prescribed or required statistical matter in his annual report.
- (f) Give or cause to be given to relatives or guardians of patients all necessary information as to the condition of patients, and due notice of patients about to be discharged or dangerously ill, and immediate notice upon the death of a patient.
- (g) Give instruction to nurses and medical students, and may give post-graduate lectures and demonstrations if requested.
- (h) When possible, attend all meetings of the Board and its Committees.
- (i) Confer, when necessary, with the Secretary or Matron on all matters in their departments affecting the welfare of patients or the work of the Hospital.
- (j) Have power to suspend any officer or servant under his control, and report to the Board at its next meeting.
- (k) Examine, correct, and submit to the Board all requisitions for drugs, instruments, medical stores, and equipment.
- (l) Have full discretion and power to admit or refuse to admit persons suffering from diseases gazetted as admissible, and in the latter event shall report the circumstances to the Board.
- (m) Have full power to admit or refuse to admit the friends of any patient, as he may think fit, and may at his discretion forbid admission of visitors to wards at any time.
- (n) Keep or cause to be kept a record of all illness occurring among the medical, nursing, and domestic staffs.
- (o) Have control of all officers and servants in the carrying out of their respective duties, in so far as it affects the well-being and care of patients.
23. His appointment may be terminated on three months' notice on either side.

VII. RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICERS.

(a) General.

24. Resident medical officers shall be qualified medical practitioners registered in the State of Victoria, and shall reside in the Hospital.

25. They shall—

- (a) Be appointed by the Board, with the exception of junior resident medical officers, who shall be appointed by the Medical Superintendent as occasion may require.
- (b) Devote their entire time to the service of the Hospital, and shall not engage in private practice.
- (c) Act under the direction of the Medical Superintendent, and shall be responsible to him for the carrying out of the duties assigned to them.
- (d) Examine daily, or as often as is necessary, all patients placed under their care, and shall record on the charts or cards all essential details as to their condition and treatment.
- (e) Be considered to be on duty when within the Hospital precincts, and shall report immediately to the Medical Superintendent or his deputy if unable to discharge their duties through illness.
- (f) Cause a senior medical officer to be informed of any serious change in the condition of patients under their care, and shall consult with a senior medical officer in all serious cases.
- (g) Obtain the permission of the patient or the parent or guardian of a patient about to be operated on, excepting in cases of extreme urgency.

26. A junior medical officer shall not refuse to admit any person suffering from a disease which is gazetted as admissible to the Hospital, nor admit any person suffering from a disease not so gazetted, except after consultation with the Medical Superintendent or his deputy.

27. Their appointments may be terminated on either side as hereunder:—

Deputy Medical Superintendent—Two months' notice.
 Pathologist and Bacteriologist—Two months' notice.
 Senior resident medical officers—One month's notice.
 Junior resident medical officers—One month's notice.

(b) Deputy Medical Superintendent.

28. During the absence of the Medical Superintendent, the rules, powers, and duties of the Medical Superintendent shall devolve on the Deputy Medical Superintendent.

29. He shall—

- (a) Assign the hours and times on duty of all resident medical officers to the approval of the Medical Superintendent, and shall not be at any time absent from the Hospital unless at least one other senior medical officer be on duty.
- (b) Take particular note of the care, treatment, and comfort of individual patients, and shall confer with the Medical Superintendent on such matters when necessary.
- (c) Be in complete charge of the Hospital during the night or at other times during the absence of the Medical Superintendent and Secretary, and shall at such times enforce complete discipline.

VIII. PATHOLOGIST AND BACTERIOLOGIST.

30. The Pathologist and Bacteriologist shall act under the direction of the Medical Superintendent, and shall be in direct charge of the laboratories, and all fittings, stores, and equipment therein.

31. He shall—

- (a) Make all post-mortem examinations, and shall keep a record of such, with all necessary notes, in a book provided for the purpose.
- (b) Make all bacteriological, biochemical, and microscopic examinations which are ordered, and shall keep records of such in books provided for the purpose.
- (c) Keep the laboratories, equipment, and appliances in good order; with due regard to economy, and be responsible for the proper care and feeding of animals used in relation to the laboratory.

IX. DISPENSER.

32. The Dispenser shall be appointed by the Board, and shall be a qualified pharmacist registered in the State of Victoria.

33. He shall—

- (a) Act under the direction of the Medical Superintendent, and shall be responsible to him for the maintenance of a proper stock of drugs, serum, disinfectants, dressings, appliances, and other dispensary stores.
- (b) Requisition to the Medical Superintendent fortnightly for all necessary stores.
- (c) Make and keep an inventory of all goods in his department, and shall check this once every twelve months.
- (d) Receive and check all requisitions for the stores under his care, and shall check all articles supplied on such requisitions.
- (e) Dispense the medicines prescribed, and shall take care that every bottle containing powerful drugs has cautionary or poison labels affixed.
- (f) Keep poisons, serums, and dangerous or rare drugs under lock and key, and shall lock the dispensary when leaving it.
- (g) Have immediate control of the dispensary porter, shall allocate his duties, and be responsible for their efficient performance.

34. His appointment may be terminated on one month's notice on either side.

X. LABORATORY TECHNICIAN.

35. The Laboratory Technician shall be appointed by the Board, and shall act under the direction of the Pathologist and Bacteriologist.

36. His appointment may be terminated by one month's notice on either side.

XI. CONSULTING MEDICAL OFFICERS IN EAR, NOSE, AND THROAT SURGERY.

37. Consulting medical officers in ear, nose, and throat surgery shall be appointed by the Board for a period not exceeding two years, and shall not be eligible for re-appointment.

38. They shall—

- (a) Attend the Hospital regularly for routine work at least once a week, and, if leave for any period is desired, they shall, if required, provide a competent *locum tenens*.
- (b) Hold themselves in readiness to perform ear, nose, and throat surgery in cases of emergency when called upon.

XII. MATRON.

39. The matron shall be a fully qualified nurse registered in the State of Victoria, shall hold the Certificate of Infectious Diseases Nursing, and shall be appointed by the Board.

40. She shall—

- (a) Have full charge of the nursing and domestic staff of the Hospital.
- (b) Have power to engage, suspend, or dismiss any servant under her control not appointed by the Board, and to suspend any officer under her control and report such action to the Board.
- (c) Be empowered to engage such extra nurses as are necessary to meet any sudden or serious emergency which may arise, and to each meeting of the Board she shall report on the total number of nurses and domestics employed.
- (d) Have the care of all the domestic and nursing properties of the Hospital, and shall see that they are kept in good repair and sufficient quantities. Once every year she shall make and submit to the Board an inventory of all such properties.
- (e) Visit, or cause to be visited by the Sub-matron, all wards, kitchen, laundry, and nursing and domestic quarters once a day, and all other offices and buildings as often as is necessary, seeing that cleanliness and order are everywhere observed.
- (f) Supply from her stores any furnishings, clothing, hardware, textiles, or other articles requiring replacement, first satisfying herself of the necessity for such replacements. She shall file and keep all requisitions for this purpose. She shall see that all textiles are in good repair and duly marked with Hospital stamp.
- (g) Control all food supplies, and shall see that the food for patients and staff is of good quality, properly cooked, and punctually and comfortably served, and that no waste exists. She shall see that accurate checks are made as to weight and quality of all food stores received.
- (h) Arrange the daily routine of the female servants, and see that every servant's time is fully and properly occupied.
- (i) Make requisition to the House Committee fortnightly for such articles as are required for her departments.
- (j) Keep a register showing the various duties each nurse has performed during her training or employment at the Hospital.
- (k) Give all necessary instructions to nurses by means of lectures and demonstrations.
- (l) Confer, where necessary, with the Medical Superintendent on all matters in her department affecting the welfare of patients or the work of the Hospital.
- (m) Not be absent from the Hospital unless the Sub-matron or Acting Sub-matron be on duty.
- (n) Arrange the annual leave of absence of the nursing and domestic staff, and exercise her discretion in the issue of passes for special purposes.

41. Her appointment may be terminated by three months' notice on either side.

XIII. NURSING STAFF.

(a) *Sub-matron.*

42. The Sub-matron shall be appointed by the Board, and shall act under the direction of the Matron.

43. During the absence of the Matron, the rules, powers, and duties of the Matron shall devolve on her.

44. Her appointment may be terminated by two months' notice on either side.

(b) *Sisters and Staff Nurses.*

45. Sisters and staff nurses shall be fully qualified nurses registered in the State of Victoria, and shall hold a Certificate of Infectious Diseases Nursing.

46. They shall—

- (a) Be responsible for the nursing, care, and nourishment and comfort of the patients in the wards of which they are placed in charge.
- (b) While on duty, be in constant attendance in the wards. They shall not leave the ward at any time when on duty, without permission, and unless a competent senior nurse is in attendance, and except in the carrying out of their duties.
- (c) Be responsible for the carrying out of the orders of the medical officers as regards treatment of patients. They shall not give, nor instruct to be given, any medicines, serum, or hypodermic injections, except on the order of a medical officer.
- (d) Exercise supervision over the use of water, gas, food, and light, other articles of consumption, and prevent any undue waste.
- (e) Except in case of emergency, not enter any ward but those in which their duties are to be performed.
- (f) Take charge of, and make a list of all articles of clothing received by or for patients in their ward, shall send the same to be disinfected when required, and shall hand to the Secretary any money or articles of value belonging to patients.

(g) See, whenever a patient is discharged, that the bed or cot be then cleaned, and the mattress disinfected.

(h) See that all friends of patients visiting the ward wear the wrappers or coverings provided, and that before leaving they wash their hands.

(i) Assist and teach probationers in acquiring a knowledge of duties of a nurse.

(j) Before going off duty, enter in the report book all necessary information regarding the condition of individual patients, particularly with reference to any pronounced change.

(k) On the death of a patient, immediately notify the Lodge Attendant, and deliver the prescribed slips to the Medical Superintendent, Matron, and Secretary.

47. The sister in charge of a ward shall arrange daily hours of duty for the nurses, subject to the Matron's approval.

48. Their appointments shall terminate on a month's notice on either side.

(c) *General.*

49. The nursing staff shall—

(a) Be punctual in attending their respective wards and offices at the appointed hours.

(b) Reside in the quarters allotted to them, and when on duty shall wear such uniform as the Matron may direct.

(c) Not enter the wards except in uniform, and shall take all possible precautions to avoid infecting any article of outdoor dress.

(d) Not leave the Hospital wearing uniform, and before leaving shall take a bath and change all clothing.

(e) Not take any article of food into the sleeping apartments, except by special permission of the Matron, and no member of the nursing staff shall bring into the Hospital any cigarettes, wine, spirit, or intoxicating liquor.

(f) Be respectful and obedient to all in authority, and carry out the duties assigned to them without hesitation or comment.

(g) Be courteous and tactful in dealing with relatives or friends of patients, shall not give any information or opinion regarding any patient's disease or treatment to relatives, friends, or other patients, unless directed by the medical officer. They shall not send nor cause to be sent outside any messages from patients.

(h) Not be absent from the Hospital without permission from the matron.

(i) Immediately report to the Matron any symptoms of illness in themselves, however, slight, particularly as regards feverishness, skin eruption, or sore throat.

50. Annual leave shall, subject to the approval of the Board, be granted to the members of the nursing staff, but no such leave shall be granted except upon the report of the Medical Superintendent and the Matron that the applicant has satisfactorily performed her duties, and that proper arrangements can be made for the discharge of her duties during her absence.

XIV. OFFICERS, SERVANTS, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES.

General Rules.

51. The general rules shall apply to all officers and employees of the Hospital, and shall be read in conjunction with, but subordinate to, any industrial award or agreement.

52. Each member of the staff of the Hospital shall in all respects conform to the rules and obey the directions of the head of his or her department.

53. No person employed in the Hospital shall take, directly or indirectly, a fee or reward from any patient, visitor, or person supplying, or desirous of supplying, the Hospital, and no person shall remove or permit to be removed any articles the property of the Hospital without the sanction of the Secretary or medical officer in charge.

54. No person shall purchase or obtain any goods for the Hospital without an official order from the Secretary or his Deputy.

55. Members of the staff needing medical advice shall make application for same through their respective heads, and in cases of sickness occurring outside the Hospital, a medical certificate shall be submitted to the Secretary.

56. Officers in charge of departments shall guard against any waste or extravagance of stores or property. Each employee shall be responsible for any articles entrusted to his or her care, and where loss or damage is caused by carelessness, such loss or damage shall be made good by the person responsible.

57. All persons employed at the Hospital shall take every care and precaution to prevent the carriage therefrom of infection on their persons or clothing.

58. No employee of the Hospital is permitted to approach members of the Board of Management or Committees without the sanction of his or her superior officer, but shall have the right of appeal to the Board, such appeal to be submitted in writing through the Secretary.

59. Any officer, servant, or other employee of the Board being guilty of any misconduct may be summarily dismissed, or his appointment terminated at such reduced notice as the Board may, in its discretion, deem reasonable.

XV. GARAGE SUPERINTENDENT.

60. He shall be responsible to the Medical Superintendent for the prompt, efficient, and economical running of all ambulances, and to the Secretary for that of all trucks and other transport vehicles, and shall carry out all duties laid down by the Board.

61. He shall—

- (a) Allot the times on and off duty of all ambulance and transport drivers, and supervise the carrying out of their duties.
- (b) Be responsible for the proper upkeep and control of all garages, workshops, and plant, and of all ambulances, trucks, and cars, and keep them in good, serviceable, and safe condition, and carry out all necessary repairs, and prevent any undue waste in the use of petrol, oil, and other stores.
- (c) Requisition through the Secretary all necessary supplies for the maintenance, repair, and running of all ambulances, trucks, and cars, and for the garages and workshops.
- (d) Keep all necessary records of the running of all ambulances, trucks, and cars, and such other records as may be required.
- (e) Furnish to the Board quarterly a full report on the running of all ambulances, trucks, and cars in such form as may be required.

XVI. AMBULANCE DRIVERS.

62. Ambulance drivers shall be under the control of the Garage Superintendent in all matters pertaining to the care of ambulances and cars, and shall carry out all such duties as may be laid down for the proper maintenance and upkeep of all ambulances, cars, garages, and workshops.

63. They shall—

- (a) Keep themselves clean and neat, and shall be prompt and courteous in the carrying out of their duties, and shall not smoke when in charge of an ambulance.
- (b) Keep the ambulances clean and neat and properly equipped with all necessary requirements for the conveyance of patients, and exercise all due care in driving.
- (c) Record the times of departure from and arrival at the Hospital in the time-book provided for the purpose, and immediately on arrival at the Hospital hand to the Lodge Attendant the admission slips for each patient.
- (d) Carry all patients to the ambulance, unless such patient is reported by the doctor attending or ambulance nurse as being a walking case.
- (e) See that the proper labels are carried in the ambulance for all children under three years of age, and that such labels are attached to such children, together with their names and addresses, on their entering the ambulance.

XVII. TELEPHONE ATTENDANTS.

54. Telephone attendants shall—

- (a) Strictly attend to the switchboard during the hours they are on duty, and under no circumstances leave the switchboard unattended.
- (b) Be courteous and tactful in dealing with all inquirers, and only give such information to inquirers as to the condition of patients as has been supplied in writing by the medical officers.
- (c) Obtain from all persons requiring the admission of patients all the prescribed data, including the name, address, age, and sex of the patients, and the disease from which they are suffering, and promptly notify the ambulance station of patients requiring to be sent for, and supply such particulars in writing to the ambulance driver.
- (d) Accept for admission to Hospital as cases for ambulance all cases of disease which have been gazetted as admissible to Hospital from within the prescribed districts for service by ambulance, unless otherwise instructed by the Medical Superintendent, and in all cases of doubt refer such matters to the medical officer in charge.

- (e) Note on the medical officer's daily report of the condition of patients any changes that may have been notified after the receipt of the report, and on changing shifts fully inform the attendant taking over of all necessary matters, including any deaths that have been notified and cases that have been reported and not yet sent for, and any other particulars necessary to enable such attendant to fully carry out her duties.
- (f) Immediately refer any apparent clerical error or omission in any record or report concerning any patient to the medical or other officer concerned, and have same rectified.

XVIII. LODGE ATTENDANTS.

65. The lodge attendants shall—

- (a) Be in strict attendance during the hours they are on duty, and under no circumstance leave the lodge unattended.
- (b) Control the admission and exit of all persons to and from the Hospital, and only permit authorized persons to enter or leave the same.
- (c) Record the names and times of all persons entering or leaving the Hospital in the books provided for the purpose.
- (d) Refer to the medical officer on duty any casual applicant for admission to Hospital, as a patient.
- (e) Be courteous and tactful in dealing with all visitors and inquirers, and only give such information to inquirers as to the condition of patients as has been supplied in writing by the medical officers.
- (f) Promptly send out all messages relating to the condition of patients; all notices that patients are ready for discharge, all notifications to relatives of the death of any patient, and all other messages as may be required by the medical officers.
- (g) Record in the prescribed form the discharge of all patients from the Hospital, and obtain the signatures of all discharged patients or their relatives in the discharge book, and report any complaints recorded therein to the Medical Superintendent. Hand to all discharged patients or their relatives such printed matter as may be required by the Medical Superintendent.
- (h) Duly observe and carry out the rules and duties relating to the office of telephone attendants.

XIX. ANNUAL LEAVE.

66. Annual leave of absence on full pay may be granted, as under, to the officers, servants, and other employees after the completion of twelve months' service. Such leave shall be taken subject to the convenience of the Board and the Medical Superintendent:—

XX. VISITORS.

67. No person shall be admitted to visit the patients except on such days, and at such hours, and under such conditions as the Board may appoint, provided that the Medical Superintendent shall have full power to admit or refuse to admit visitors to any patient as he may think fit, and may, at his discretion, forbid the admission of visitors to wards at any time.

Ministers of religion in their attendance on the spiritual needs of patients shall be admitted to see patients at the discretion of the Medical Superintendent, and under such conditions as he may direct. Provided that no Minister shall have the right to visit any patient not of his denomination except by the express wish of such patient.

XXI. ADMISSIONS.

68. The admission of patients shall be under the control of the Medical Superintendent, whether such person seeking admission is suffering from a disease which has been gazetted or from a disease which has not so been gazetted.

XXII. NOTIFICATIONS.

69. Prompt notification shall be sent to the relative appearing in the Hospital records of any patient whose condition, in the opinion of the medical officer attending, has become dangerous.

XXIII. DEATHS.

70. On the death of any patient in Hospital, notification shall be at once communicated to the relative of the patient appearing in the Hospital records. The body of any patient who dies in the Hospital shall not be removed without the approval of the medical officer in charge.

The staff of the Hospital shall give every consideration in the recognition of any rites peculiar to the religion of any patient who dies in the Hospital.

XXIV. RULES.

71. The Board may make rules not inconsistent with the Act or these By-laws for the control, supervision, and guidance, and the regulation and discipline of all officers, servants, and employees, and for all matters of detail affecting the internal management of the Hospital.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1932.

THE Borough Echuca Water Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a Rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Twenty pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Borough Echuca Water Trust Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1932, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1932, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by two half-yearly tenements payable on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July of the said year, without prejudice to its rights to recover the whole year's rate when due.

MERRIGUM WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-LAW No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Merrigum Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1928*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, the charge for every 1,000 gallons or portion of same shall be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of Sixpence for any one tank or load.

2. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

3. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons. The charges for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

4. Supplies of water for any purpose not specified herein and otherwise than by measure must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made to the Trust before a supply can be taken.

5. Water will be supplied for gardens under a garden licence at the rate of Ten shillings for each hundred square yards of garden, with a minimum of Ten shillings, no water to be used between the hours of nine o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m.

6. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall permit or suffer water to run to waste, or use it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be re-connected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of nine o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving the supply during dry weather the Trust, in its discretion, may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

7. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house, or cars, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter or agreement, and any person committing a breach of this shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

8. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away water from the premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. The Trust may, by notice, intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the supply

is to be charged for by measure, and by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within one month from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner within the time specified, at his own expense, shall provide such meter with a certificate from some approved authority that same is in proper order, and shall so maintain same, and if any person shall neglect to comply with such notice, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said charges.

The charges for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT SAWTELL'S INLET, TOORADIN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

FUNERALS OF DESTITUTE PERSONS.

Under the *Cemeteries Act 1928* (No. 3652), cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the Contractor receives or arranges for any payment, whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while awaiting themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail, unless directed otherwise by the police. Bodies to be buried

at Williamstown or Footscray, to be conveyed by road. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 15.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position; and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the River Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue; and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue. Burials in the Williamstown-Footscray sub-districts shall be made in the Williamstown or Footscray Cemeteries, as the police may direct.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and respective Cemeteries Regulations.

9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred; if any, will be charged to the Contractor or deducted from the contract security money.

10. When burials are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any Hospital for the Insane, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities will be repaid to the Contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Should the religious belief, however, of the deceased preclude the burial being carried out in conformity with the above clause as regards the attendance of the officiating clergyman, the friends of the deceased shall, if practicable, be notified by the police with respect to the service. In the case of foreigners, the Consul of the country to which he is reputed to belong shall also be notified by the Police Department of his decease; in which case, when practicable, he may provide for such service as he may consider necessary.

13. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will, on report of the Tender Board, subject the Contractor to the immediate cancellation of his contract, the forfeiture of the security

money, and such other penalties as the Hon. the Treasurer may direct. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

14. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

15. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

16. Under no circumstances will a Contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the Contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the Contractor may be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

17. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

This contract is not to be considered as having been broken, infringed, or vitiated by such removal having been effected by other than the Contractor.

5. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and water-tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The Contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Morgue.

6. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but, in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

7. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession, or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will, on report of the Tender Board, subject the Contractor to the immediate cancellation of his contract, the forfeiture of the security money, or such other disqualification as the Hon. the Treasurer may direct. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne.

9. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the removals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money.
