MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS ACTS, WHICH INCLUDE METROPOLITAN DRAINAGE AND RIVERS ACTS.

BY-LAW No. 30.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and pursuant to and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. Clause 58 of By-law No. 29, which was made and passed by the Board on the seventeenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and duly published in the *Government Gazette* on the eighth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, is hereby repealed as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, and the following substituted therefor:—

58. (a) *Buoyancy.*—No motor boat shall be licensed under these Regulations unless such boat is provided with internal buoyancy fittings equal to 25 per cent. in excess of the weight of the propelling machinery, ballast, and all equipments of a non-buoyant nature, either in the form of muntz metal or copper casings, or enclosed watertight air spaces. Sealed oil drums secured in position to the boat will, according to their capacity, nevertheless be accepted as portion or the whole of the buoyancy fittings required, provided they are painted or otherwise prevented from rusting, and are readily removable for periodical inspection and testing.

Air cases not exceeding thirty-nine inches (39 in.) in length shall be constructed of muntz metal or copper of not less than seventeen ounces (17 oz.) to the superficial foot, and those exceeding thirty-nine inches (39 in.) in length shall be constructed of similar metals of not less than eighteen ounces (18 oz.) to the superficial foot.

Any air case exceeding twenty-four inches (24 in.) in length constructed of seventeen-ounce (17 oz.) metal shall be supported by a diaphragm in the middle of its length.

All joints of air cases must be rolled hook joints, and soldered.

(b) *Engine to Stand in Metal Tray.*—The engine of every motor boat and every motor sailing boat shall stand in a metal tray which can be readily cleaned, such tray to project three inches (3 in.) all round the engine, and be turned up at least three inches (3 in.) at the edge in such a manner as to prevent the oil from saturating the woodwork or spreading to the bilges.

The engine and tray shall be enclosed in a well-fitting casing rendered fire-resisting, if of wood, by metal lining throughout. The flooring boards shall be removable in order to facilitate cleaning and inspection.

(c) *Petrol Pipes and Fittings.*—The pipe conveying the petrol to the carburettor shall be of solid drawn copper, and shall be provided with a flexible bend or bends; a cock or valve shall be fitted to each end of the pipe, one at the tank and the other at the carburettor or float chamber. All joints and couplings must be readily accessible, and shall be such that they can be made and kept perfectly oil-tight. The cock at the carburettor end of the petrol pipe must be outside the motor-casing as near as possible to the carburettor, and easily accessible in the event of fire in the carburettor.

(d) *Ventilation when Engine is in an Enclosed Space.*—When the engine or petrol tank of any motor boat, or any motor sailing boat, is fitted in an enclosed space, such space shall be ventilated in such a manner as will effectively prevent the accumulation of oil vapour therein.

2. The following sub-clause is hereby added to and from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law shall form part of and be deemed to be included in clause 59 of the said By-law No. 29:—

(e) An improved chemical fire extinguisher.

3. The above-mentioned repeal and addition shall not affect anything duly done, any rights, privileges, or powers acquired, or any liabilities, penalties, or forfeitures incurred, or any proceedings taken or commenced under the said By-law No. 29 before the coming into operation of this By-law.

REGULATIONS.

VICTORIAN DRIED FRUITS BOARD ELECTION.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Dried Fruits Acts that all elections of members of the Victorian Dried Fruits Board shall be held at such times as are prescribed: And whereas the Governor in Council is empowered under the said Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to the election of members of the Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Nominations from candidates for election to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board shall be lodged with the Returning Officer before or not later than Twelve noon on Monday, the fifteenth day of February, 1932.

2. The time and date for the close of the election shall be Four o'clock in the afternoon on Monday, the fourteenth day of March, 1932.

3. The term of office of the members so elected as above shall be until the thirty-first day of December, 1933.

These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Dried Fruits Acts (Election of Board) Regulations.

VICTORIAN DRIED FRUITS BOARD ELECTION.

APPOINTMENTS OF RETURNING OFFICER AND DEPUTY RETURNING OFFICER.

WHEREAS by section 6, sub-section (3) (b) of the *Dried Fruits Act 1928* (No. 3670), the Governor in Council is empowered to appoint Returning Officers in connexion with the election of members of the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, and whereas an election is to take place closing on the fourteenth day of March, 1932: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint—

WILLIAM LESLIE ROWE, Chief Electoral Officer for the State of Victoria,

to be Returning Officer for such election.

And whereas the Governor in Council is further empowered by Regulation under the Dried Fruits Acts to appoint a Deputy Returning Officer to act under the direction of the Returning Officer: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint—

ADAM VAUGH BIRCHALL, an officer of the Chief Secretary's Department,

to be Deputy Returning Officer for such election.

These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Dried Fruits Acts (Election of Board) Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

VICTORIAN DRIED FRUITS BOARD ELECTION.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Dried Fruits Acts that all elections of members of the Victorian Dried Fruits Board shall be conducted in all respects whatsoever in such manner as is prescribed, and upon rolls of growers prepared in accordance with the Regulations: And whereas the Governor in Council is empowered under the said Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to the election of members of the Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Dried Fruits Acts (Election of Board) Regulations.

2. For section 5 of the Dried Fruits Act (Election of Board) Regulations there shall be substituted the following sub-sections:—

5. (1) The Returning Officer shall arrange for the preparation of rolls of growers in the State of Victoria entitled to vote at the elections and shall certify by writing under his hand that the same are correct.

(2) Growers producing dried fruits from fruit grown by them on land within the area comprised by the municipal districts of the Shire of Mildura and the Town of Mildura shall be deemed in No. 1 District.

(3) Growers producing dried fruits from fruit grown by them on land elsewhere in Victoria shall be deemed in No. 2 District.

(4) The rolls shall be conclusive evidence of the right of the persons named therein to vote at the election.

And the Honorable William Slater, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799).

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN ORDERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-widths of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purposes to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbour or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the Council of the municipality in the municipal district of which such harbour or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of all vermin:

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be):

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, as the day on from and after which the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

"BAG" LIMIT FOR WILD DUCKS AND TEAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the thirteenth day of January, 1931, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of January, 1931, respecting the "Bag" Limit for Wild Ducks and Teal, and do hereby prescribe ten birds as the maximum number of birds whether wild ducks or teal of any kind either alone or together which any person may kill or destroy or have in possession on any one day during

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CAMPING AND WATER RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF NARIEL.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 5th of February, 1930, as a site for Camping and Watering purposes in the Parish of Nariel.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, flowers, or shrubs in the Reserve.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No fires shall be lighted, except where directed by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve, nor erect therein, any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
10. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice, fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
11. This Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Upper Murray as a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

12. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CRICKET AND RECREATION RESERVE AT SHEPPARTON.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 17th September, 1877, as a site for Cricket Ground and other Recreation purposes in the Township of Shepparton, and known as "Shepparton Recreation Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations, "outer enclosure" means the whole of the Reserve except the grandstand enclosure.

2. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, athletic, cycling, or other sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be made for admission of each adult person to the outer enclosure, and a further charge of not exceeding 2s. 6d. may be made for the admission of each adult person to the grandstand enclosure.

3. Subject to clause 2 hereof, the Committee of Management shall be at liberty from time to time to authorize the issue of tickets of admission to the grandstand and outer enclosure respectively, and in any such case no person shall enter at any time into either the grandstand or outer enclosure except upon production of a proper ticket so issued.

4. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

5. No person shall damage in any way any buildings, fences, gates, asphalt, netting, posts, trees, shrubs, flowers, tracks, pitches, courts, water pipes, water taps, drainage pipes, erections, enclosures, or fittings in the Reserve, and no person shall light or tend any fire therein except in the fireplaces provided for that purpose.

6. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or in any way injure or disfigure any of the fences, gates, seats, buildings, erections, or fittings in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, fruit peel, or rubbish, no roll or throw stones or any missiles therein.

7. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. All moneys received for agistment shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall camp on the Reserve.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, tracks, or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Anzac Day.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized sport, including tennis, football, cricket, foot racing, or any other game, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

13. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle or on horseback without

the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the ground.

14. No person shall enter any plots on the Reserve which may be enclosed for the plantations of young trees, flowers, plants, or shrubs, except under the authority of or with the permission of the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.

16. Every person or club using the tracks, pitches, courts, yards, seats, buildings, rooms, erections, enclosures, and conveniences provided and erected in the Reserve may be charged such fees and rents for the use thereof as the Committee of Management may from time to time consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. The moneys received in fees and rents shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and a statement thereof shall be forwarded annually to the Board of Land and Works.

17. Persons renting or hiring any site, stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fête, games, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such site, stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such site, stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee.

All persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall publicly address any assembly, or assemble with any other person or persons for the purpose of hearing any public address within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

19. No male person shall enter or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any place, room, or building set apart for the use of males. The provisions of this clause shall not apply to a male person under the age of seven years.

20. No person shall intrude or enter upon any playground or oval within the Reserve while any organized game or sports is being played or conducted thereon. The provisions of this clause shall not apply to any player, competitor, or official actually taking part, competing, or assisting in the conduct of any organized game or sport.

21. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve, or in any of the buildings, structures, or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person;
- (b) being drunk;
- (c) crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during any cricket match, football match, cycling race, or sports, or during practice at football, cricket, cycling, or sports;
- (d) using profane, indecent, or obscene language;
- (e) using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words;
- (f) behaving improperly or riotously;
- (g) improperly interfering with or interrupting any cricket match, football match, cycling race, or any athletic or other sports or holiday amusements, or any practice thereat;
- (h) obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

22. Any person, club, or society having obtained permission of the Committee of Management to use any dressing-shed, pavilion, or other structures, shall maintain and leave the same in a clean and tidy condition. No water tap or shower shall be left running, nor shall any room or enclosure be left unlocked after use.

23. No person shall force open any locked gate or door to any enclosure, room, or building in the Reserve, nor shall any person use any unauthorized key to open any lock on such gates or doors.

24. Should any person receive from any member, officer, or employee of the Committee of Management any key or keys for the unlocking of any doors or gates in the Reserve, he shall return such key or keys in good order and condition.

25. All keys shall be returned to the caretaker of the Reserve, or to the Town Clerk of the Borough of Shepparton, before sunset of the day on which such keys were received, unless otherwise allowed or directed by the Committee of Management.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Borough of Shepparton as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.
