Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE PAINT AND COLOUR BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 3rd June, 1932, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the trade of preparing any kind of paint, varnish, enamel, or colour, either wet or dry," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 3rd June, 1932, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

⁽³⁾ OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

⁽⁴⁾ Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day; but if any day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

⁽⁵⁾ TIME RATES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.
