Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE FARRIERS (COUNTRY) BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 13th day of June, 1932, applied to the whole of the State OUTSIDE AND EXCEPTING the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677)* and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677)*, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of a farrier," has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (1) That this Determination shall come into force on the 13th day of June, 1932.

One apprentice to every worker receiving not less than 67s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.										
One improver to every worker receiving not less than 85s. per week of 48 hours.										

- (3) OVERTIME.—All work done in any week in excess of 48 hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (4) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (5) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than 24 hours) shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (6) DAY AND LATEST HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—The day and latest hour when payment is to be made shall be Friday at 5.30 p.m.
