Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 15 (GROCERS).

Nors.—This Determination on the 27th January, 1933, applied to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business of a grocer, including a seller of tea," has made the following Determination, namely:—

The following rate shall be paid for overtime :--Stablemen-For all work done in excess of 51 hours in any one week ... All others-Time and a half. ORDINARY WERE'S WORK. The number of hours which shall constitute an ordinary week's work shall be as follow :--Stablemen 51 hours All others 48 hours TIME RATE. Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid, for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed in this Determination for an ordinary week's work, at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of forty per centum. ALLOWANCE. Where, in conformity with the custom of the trade, an employee wears, when at work, a washable outer garment, the laundering of which is not paid for by the employer, such employee shall be paid 2s. 6d. per week in addition to the ordinary rate. TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT. Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker. SPECIAL RATES. Time and a half shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Royal Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day or Boxing Day; but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
