ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

No. 4109. "An Act to continue the Operation of certain Provisions of the Financial Emergency Acts, the Provisions of the *Pensions Reduction Act 1932*, and certain Provisions of certain other Acts."

Income Tax Acts.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the Income Tax Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for the twelve months 1st July, 1932, to the 30th June, 1933, consisted of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation or retiring allowance, stipend, rents, interest, dividends, or annuity, and whose gross income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts amounted to £50 or upwards, and every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Act or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of August, 1933.

Every such return shall be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the State Income Tax Office, 436-450 Lonsdale-street, Melbourne, C.I.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return is, under the said Acts, liable to be prosecuted and to pay a penalty of not more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

Medical Act 1928.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Medical Act 1928*, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth make the following Regulations and also the following amendments to Regulations heretofore made:—

GENERAL.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1933," and shall be read and construed as one with "The Pharmacy Regulations 1930" and "The Pharmacy Regulations 1931."

2. Except Regulations numbered 3 and 4 hereof these Regulations shall take effect on publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, and the said Regulations numbered 3 and 4 shall come into force on the first day of March, 1935.

EXAMINATIONS.

3. From Regulation 42 of "The Pharmacy Regulations 1930" omit the words "School Intermediate or".

4. For paragraph (a) of Regulation 43 of "The Pharmacy Regulations 1930" as amended by "The Pharmacy Regulations 1931" substitute the expression "(a) The Melbourne University School Leaving Examination", and for the word "Intermediate" in paragraph (c) thereof substitute the word "Leaving".

APPRENTICESHIP INDENTURES.

5. In Regulation 60 of "The Pharmacy Regulations 1930", after the expression "Appendix 'D' hereto" add the expression "as amended by The Pharmacy Regulations 1933".

6. At the end of the said Regulation 60, under "Duties of the Employer" the following sub-clause shall be added, namely:—

"(c) Every pharmaceutical chemist who takes an apprentice after the coming into operation of "The Pharmacy Regulations 1933" shall provide for use in his pharmacy during the currency of the indentures the following standard equipment and books, namely:—

Standard Equipment—

Graduated dispensing measures, Imperial (from minim upward) and metric.

Pestles and mortars—Metal for bruising roots, &c.; small glass for powders; wedgwood for general use.

Pill machine, pill rounder, ointment slab, tincture press, evaporating dishes (two), Berlin basins, suppository mould, funnels (various, of glass or enamelware), percolator, sieves of varied sizes, scales and weights (both Imperial and metric), spatulas (varied assortment for powders and ointments), spatulas in bone or vulcanite (for mercurials), Florence flask, beakers (two—100 c.c. and 500 c.c.), cachet machine (optional), pipette for resinous tinctures, glass stirring rods, saucepans (varied sizes), infusion jar (or teapot) for infusions, cork press, specific gravity bottle, test tubes of various sizes, tripod stand, burette, and thermometer.

Books—

British Pharmacopoeia (current edition), *British Pharmaceutical Codex* (latest edition), and the *Official Handbook of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria*."

7. At the end of paragraph 2 of the form of apprenticeship indenture contained in Appendix "D" to "The Pharmacy Regulations 1930" insert the following further covenant by the employer and the following proviso, namely:—

"(g) That (10) will permit the apprentice to dispense in the third and fourth year of the term of (8) apprenticeship at least Five hundred prescriptions and will provide in (8) pharmacy during the currency of this indenture the standard equipment and books prescribed by the Pharmacy Regulations for the time being in force.

Provided always, and it is hereby further agreed between the parties hereto that, if the apprentice during the third or fourth year of the term of (8) apprenticeship desires that this indenture should be assigned to a Melbourne, Ballarat, or Bendigo employer to enable the apprentice to attend lectures, the employer shall either obtain an assignment or at (8) option refund to the parent or guardian the sum of pounds for each year of the term then unexpired, and the employer shall be under no further obligations hereunder, and paragraph 2 hereof shall be modified accordingly."

8. No medicine shall be dispensed, compounded, or made up by any registered pharmaceutical chemist in any premises, store, building, market, or public place unless the part thereof

where any such medicine is so dispensed, compounded, or made up is completely isolated and shut off from every other place where any goods, wares, or merchandise not belonging to himself are stored, or kept, or offered for sale or disposal.

The above Regulations were made at a meeting of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria held at Melbourne on the fourteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE USE OF LONG LINES IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of July, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of July, 1930, regarding the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay, and prohibiting the use of long lines and the method of fishing known as "Long Lining" in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays) during the whole of each year, provided that in the waters west of an imaginary line running in a south-easterly direction from the mouth of Little River to Indented Head, near St. Leonards, the use of long lines for taking ling shall be permitted from the first day of April in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following, both days inclusive, subject to the following conditions:—

1. Raw beef shall be the only bait used.
2. Not more than 800 hooks shall be used at the same time by any one person.
3. The snoods to which the hooks are fastened shall be attached to the long line at intervals of not more than twelve feet.
4. Each hook used shall not exceed the size known as 3/0.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, in pursuance of the provisions of section 18 of the *Education Act 1928*, hereby—

REGULATION IV.—PUPILS' CERTIFICATES.

Rescind the figure "VII," after the word "grade" in the note of Regulation IV.—Pupils' Certificates—made on the 20th June, 1933, and in lieu thereof doth substitute the figure "VIII."

REGULATION X.A.—JUNIOR TEACHERS.

Rescind clauses 2, 5, and 6 of Regulation X.A relating to Junior Teachers, and in lieu thereof doth substitute the following clauses:—

2. In determining the order of precedence for appointment as junior teachers, consideration will be given to the number and value of the subjects of the examinations passed by candidates who comply with the conditions of clause 1, and also to evidence adduced of aptitude for teaching. Provided, however, that the Director may determine the proportionate number of males and females to be appointed, and provided also that holders of teaching scholarships under clause 12 of Regulation XXI, who hold the qualifications set out in clause 1 of this Regulation shall have a preferential right of appointment over other qualified candidates.

Provided further that where a vacancy for a junior teacher occurs in a school outside a radius of twenty miles from the Melbourne General Post Office, special consideration will be given to candidates who have received their secondary education in the district and to candidates whose parents reside in the district, and who are specially recommended by the Director.

5. The conditions necessary for promotion of junior teachers to the Second Grade shall be as follow:—

- To have completed a year as junior teacher of the Third Grade, and to have received satisfactory annual reports from the district inspector, and half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.
- To have passed an examination in at least six subjects of the School Intermediate or approved equivalent or higher examination; and
- To have passed a satisfactory examination in drawing, Part I., and in the theory and practice of teaching, as prescribed for junior teachers of the Second Grade in the instructions appended to this Regulation.

6. The conditions necessary for promotion of junior teachers to the First Grade shall be as follow:—

- To have completed a year as junior teacher of the Second Grade, and to have received satisfactory annual reports from the district inspector and half-yearly reports from the head teacher of the school in which they are employed.
- To have passed in at least eight subjects (including English, one branch of science and history, or a second language) of the School Intermediate examination of the University of Melbourne, or an approved equivalent or higher examination.
- To have passed in the following subjects in the annual examinations conducted by the Education Department:—

- Arithmetic (if not previously passed under (b) above.
- Drawing, Part I. and Part II.
- Penmanship.
- Music.
- Theory of teaching, Parts I. and II.
- Practice of Teaching.
- Nature-Study.
- Grammar.
- Needlework (female junior teachers).
