SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1933.

The Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a Rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of One shilling and threepence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Shepparton Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the first day of January, 1933, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1933, at the office of the said Trust.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council under the provisions of section 43, sub-section (h) of the Medical Act 1928, Part II., make such Regulations as the Board thinks fit for or with respect to the practice of dental surgery or dentistry by dentists and the conduct of such practice. Now therefore the Dental Board of Victoria does, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations for or with respect to the practice of dental surgery or dentistry by dentists and the conduct of such practice.

A dentist shall not in connexion with the practice of dental surgery or dentistry—

(A) Pay or agree to pay any commission or other form of remuneration for or in respect of the direct or indirect introduction of patients or for the services of any person acting as an intermediary for the purpose of procuring the supply of dental services.

(B) Advertise by means of wireless.

(C) Solicit personally or by canvassers or by distribution of cards or otherwise patients or work, nor employ nor engage any persons therefor. Provided that a dentist practising in the country may by letter or circular through the post notify persons of the time and place of his intended visit to the town or towns where he practises.

(D) Advertise in any publication unless the advertisement—

(a) Appears in a specially classified column in a part of the publication devoted to professional notices.

(b) Contains only the dentist's name, his qualifications, professional designation, address, hours of practice, telephone number, notification of absence from or return to practice, and of the dates, hours, and places of professional visits, does not exceed $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches by $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches in size, and is in type not exceeding in size and heaviness 12-point light face, unless with the written consent of the Dental Board.

(c) Contains no unusual form of printing, does not take the form of a display, nor include any qualification, degree, or diploma other than appears opposite the dentist's name in the Dentists' Register.

(E) Use, exhibit, publish, or display—

(i) Any sign or plate outside or in connexion with his professional premises—

(a) More than sufficient, in the opinion of the Dental Board, to enable patients to locate or identify the premises in which he carries on practice and the entrance thereto.

(b) Containing other matter than he is permitted to insert by way of advertisement in a publication.

(ii) Any show-case or other method of display on or about or in connexion with his professional premises. Provided that the restriction herein contained as to any show-case shall not come into operation until the eighth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

(iii) Any advertisement, announcement, or other method of display on or in any public hoarding, advertising space, theatre or picture theatre screen, programme of any kind, circular, label, or in any printed or written matter used or intended for public circulation.

Provided that wherever the professional premises are off a street or thoroughfare a dentist may by a sign on such street or thoroughfare indicate where such professional premises are.

Nothing in this sub-section shall apply to notices in a form approved by the Dental Board to—

(a) Patients of a dentist.

(b) Persons entitled to the services of a dentist as being members of a friendly society or of a trade union clinic controlled by a dentist, or any other bona-fide association of persons which has arranged with a dentist for the treatment of its members. Provided that a scale of fees may be included in notices under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this sub-section.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria held on the eighth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.

BAG LIMIT FOR BLACKFISH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation made the thirty-first day of August, 1927, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the seventh day of September, 1927, respecting the "bag limit for black fish," and in lieu thereof provide that no person shall, during the open season for blackfish, take or have in his possession on or during any one day, more than ten (10) such fish, provided that such restriction shall not apply as regards blackfish in streams flowing north from the Great Dividing Range.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AT MINIMAY.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 29th April, 1908, and 4th August, 1931, for Public Recreation in the Parish and Township of Minimay.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.
8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and

such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall take part in any organized games, sports, or entertainments of any sort in the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful sports or games, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds so set apart.

14. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of £5 5s. per day.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
