## PUBLIC SERVICE EXAMINATION.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination of candidates for appointment to the Clerical Division of the Public Service of Victoria will be held in conjunction with the University examinations, commencing on Monday, the 27th November, 1933.

The examination will be open to youths who are under nine years of age on the 1st December, 1933.

A candidate will not be eligible for appointment unless he shall have obtained a pass in (a) Intermediate Arithmetic, (b) Leaving English, (c) four other Leaving subjects, and (d) Handwriting.

The conditions and subjects of examination are set out on the printed entry form, obtainable at the Office of the Public Service Commissioner, 61 Spring-street, Melbourne.

One hundred and fifty (150) candidates will be selected for appointment as vacancies occur. Fifty places will be reserved for candidates who qualify in Leaving Pass subjects only, provided that, if a number less than fifty so qualify, the number of places reserved will be reduced accordingly.

Subject to percentage reduction under the Financial Emergency Act, the commencing salary is £91, rising to a maximum of £299 a year, with a long-service increment of £13 a year.

Entries for examination must be lodged at the Commissioner's Office, on or before Wednesday, the 11th October, 1933.

Each candidate must also lodge an entry with the Registrar, Melbourne University, on the University printed form, obtainable at the Registrar's Office.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of July, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of July, 1930; regarding the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay, and prohibiting the use of long lines and the method of fishing known as "long lining" in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays) during the whole of each year, provided that in the waters west of imaginary lines running in a south-easterly direction from the mouth of Little River to Indented Head, near St. Leonards, thence to the West Channel Pile Light, and thence south-westerly to Point Nepean, the use of long lines for taking ling shall be permitted from the first day of April in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following, both days inclusive, subject to the following conditions:—

4. The snoods to which the hooks are fastened shall be attached to the long line at intervals of not more than twelve feet.
5. Each hook used shall not exceed the size known as 3/0.

## GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 60.

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year Commencing on the 1st day of July, 1933.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust") in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Water Acts, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works.

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:—

- On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £18—Twenty shillings per annum.
- On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £18—One shilling and one penny in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation.
- On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £4—Five shillings per annum.
- On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £4—One shilling and one penny in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1933, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1934, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the ninth day of September, 1933, and the first day of January, 1934.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

## CITY OF BRUNSWICK.

## BY-LAW No. 90.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, numbered 90, for the purpose of regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and prescribing the minimum area and minimum width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house or any dwelling house and shop combined may be erected, and providing that every dwelling house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land, and providing with respect to buildings hereafter to be erected for—

- (a) regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
- (b) means of escape from buildings in case of fire and the prevention of fire in buildings;
- (c) the ventilation and lighting of buildings;
- (d) exits from and stairways in buildings other than private dwelling houses;
- (e) the minimum size of any dwelling rooms;
- (f) the minimum area to be covered by any dwelling house or any dwelling house and shop combined;
- (g) requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

1. No person shall erect or construct, or cause to be erected or constructed, any residential flats or any building to be used or occupied wholly or in part as flats, nor alter or adapt any existing building to be used or occupied wholly or in part as flats unless such building or buildings when so erected or altered do comply with all the following conditions:—

- (a) Such building or buildings shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, or other hard fire-resisting material approved by the surveyor.
- (b) The height of such building shall not be less than two stories nor more than three stories.
- (c) Such building shall not cover more than three-fifths of the area of the allotment of land on which it is erected.
- (d) No flat shall contain a dwelling room of less superficial area than 120 square feet, and no such room shall have a smaller dimension than 9 feet.
- (e) No such building shall be erected, constructed, or altered in an unsewered area.
- (f) Each flat must be in itself a complete dwelling of not less than 800 square feet floor area, and shall be provided with all necessary lavatory and sanitary accommodation as may be required in dwelling houses.
- (g) Each flat must have a separate entrance to the open air for the use of the occupants thereof.
- (h) The walls between each flat shall be constructed of brick at least 9 inches thick or cement concrete not less than 6 inches thick. All such walls shall be carried up to the reinforced concrete floor above any such flat, but in the case of the top floors of residential flats exceeding one story in height such walls shall be carried at least up to the top of the rafter line. Floors of residential flats other than the ground floors shall be constructed of reinforced concrete of such thickness as may be approved by the surveyor. Provided that nothing herein contained shall preclude the covering of such floors other than those of bathrooms and water-closets with wood or such other material as may be approved by the city surveyor. Provided also that the floor of every bathroom and water-closet shall be constructed of or covered with such impervious material as may be approved by the surveyor.
- (i) All stairs in residential flats shall have a clear heading of not less than 7 feet, and balustrades not less than 2 ft. 10 in. in height, and shall be effectively lighted and ventilated to the satisfaction of the city surveyor.



- (j) Where there is access to any flats through the inside, the porch and any stair landings shall have a total floor area of not less than 64 square feet, and the floors of such landings shall be constructed of reinforced concrete of such thickness as may be approved by the surveyor.
- (k) Each room in a flat shall have one or more windows opening through a side wall or walls directly into the open air with a total superficies clear of the sash frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room and so constructed that a portion equal to at least one-twentieth of such floor area can be opened, and the opening shall extend to at least 7 feet above the floor level. Provided that the surveyor may in cases where he shall consider necessary direct the installation of ventilators of such type as he shall approve.
- (l) The distance of such building from the building line of the street shall be not less than 10 feet and from any other boundary 2 ft. 6 in. Such distance shall be measured from the point of the greatest projection of the building, including eaves.

2. "Flat" means a suite of two or more rooms occupied or designed or intended or adapted to be occupied as a separate domicile. "Residential flats" means a building more than one story in height which contains two or more flats.

3. Save as modified by this By-law all building regulations and By-laws of the City of Brunswick shall apply to residential flats and flats therein.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the commission of the offence has been given to the offender by the Council, or after a conviction or order of any Court (as the case may be).

5. If any person after the coming into force of this By-law erects or constructs, adds to, or alters, or causes to be erected, constructed, added to, or altered any building, erection, or structure that is erected or used or adapted for use contrary to the provisions of this By-law the Council may—

- (a) Give to the owner of such building a notice in writing under the seal of the Council requiring the owner, builder, or occupier to bring such building, erection, or structure into conformity with the provisions of this By-law, or alternatively requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, erection, or structure within a reasonable time limited in such notice.
- (b) Should default be made in complying with such notice within the time limited, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council by its surveyor to enter upon such building and upon the site thereof, or upon any part thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen and to demolish and pull down the said building, erection, or structure, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place and to sell the materials and to apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such building, erection, or structure.
- (c) All expenses incurred by the Council or its surveyor in doing such acts as are hereby authorized, together with all fees and/or penalties due to the Council by the owners of such building, erection, or structure, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale.
