Health Act 1928.

PREMISES IN WHICH DANCING IS ENGAGED IN DECLARED AS PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND REGISTRABLE PUBLIC BUILDINGS WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE HEALTH ACT 1928.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

D's virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928 (No. 3697), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare any building or part of a building, including boarding houses and eating houses, wherein persons (other than the occupier thereof and his family, employees, boarders, or guests) engage in dancing at any time whatsoever, to be a public building within the meaning of the Health Act 1928: And I do further declare any such building as is of a permanent character to be a registrable public building within the meaning of section One hundred and seventy-seven of the said Act:

Provided that this Proclamation shall not apply to-

- (1) The licensed premises or part of the licensed premises of a licensed victualler, in respect of which special leave for dancing has been granted by a Licensing Court: or
- (2) The premises of any bona fide club, association, or similar body the rules of which include the following conditions:—
  - (a) The business and affairs are under the management of a committee elected by the general body of members for not less than twelve months;
  - (b) The names and addresses of persons proposed as ordinary members are displayed in a conspicuous place in the premises for at least a week before their election, and an interval of not less than two weeks clapses between nomina-
  - week before their election, and an interval of not less than two weeks clapses between nomination and election of ordinary members.

    (c) All members are elected by the general body of members or by a general or an election committee, and a record is kept by the secretary of the members voting in respect of each election.
  - (d) Provision for the payment of a subscription of not less than Five shillings per annum payable by members quarterly, half-yearly, or annually in advance.

(e) Honorary members or guests shall be admitted (if at all) without any payment by or or behalf of such honorary member or guest.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Fungicides Act 1928 (19 George V. No. 3688), 1, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare to be fungicides within the meaning and for the purposes of the Fungicides Act 1928, the following preparations, namely:—

"Any copper compound or mixture containing copper sold, prepared, or offered for sale for the dry control or prevention of any fungus disease of cereals."

And I further prescribe as the standard for these particular fungicides the standard constituted by the requirements set out hereunder: And I further require, with respect to the said fungicides, that the specified constituents indicated hereunder together with the percentage of such constituents, shall be stated on the label and on the invoice or statement on the sale of the said fungicides, and that there shall be attached to every package thereof the label prescribed hereunder:

#### STANDARD.

All such fungicides shall conform to the following stan-

(a) It shall contain not less than 50 per cent, copper (Cu) in the form of basic carbonate and/or basic sulphate or oxychloride.

or oxyeldoride.

(b) It shall contain not more than one-quarter per centum of copper in a form soluble in water.

(c) Not more than two and a half per centum of the material shall be retained on a standard J.M.M. 200-mesh sieve when 10 grams of the material are shaken by hand for five minutes with 150 e.c. of water in a stoppered 500 e.c. Erlenmeyer flask and sieved in a gentle stream of water poured from the flask or a wash bottle.

CONSTITUENTS THE PERCENTAGE OF WHICH ARE TO BE STATED ON SALE AND SHOWN ON LABEL.

Total copper (Gu) and the form in which it occurs. Water-soluble copper (Cu). Amount retained on 200-mesh sieve.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

### DETERMINATION OF THE TANNERS (FURRED SKINS) BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 14th November, 1933, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of a tanner of all kinds of furred skins, or a dresser or a dyer of such skins." has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 14th November, 1933, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this

An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed by the Board was approved on 5th March, 1926.

- (3) OVERTIME.—For work done in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed as a week's work.—Time and a quarter.
- (4) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (5) Tools and Appliances.—Every employer shall provide gloves, apron, leggings with vamps attached, or any tools or implements of trade required by employees in the performance of their duties.
